Even with three consecutive scores under his belt by a combined 27 1/2 lengths, the jury was still out on Lawyer Ron (Langfuhr), but after his determined 3/4length victory in yesterday's Southwest S. at Oaklawn Park, it looks like he's going to start receiving the respect he deserves. The chestnut earned his diploma in his sixth call to the post, then finished third in a grassy allowance at Churchill Nov. 5 and fourth in the Grand Canyon H. Nov. 20. He made his return to the dirt in an off-the-turfer at Louisiana Dec. 9 and hasn't tasted defeat since. Allowed to set easy fractions in the Diamond Jo S. at Evangeline Downs New Year's Eve, he cruised home to an 8 1/2-length victory. Heavily favored here off his win in the Jan. 14 GIII Risen Star S., which produced a 106 Beyer, he rattled off: 23 1/5 and :48 splits and held Steppenwolfer (Aptitude) safe. "You worry about a lot of things at his short price, among them hoping he breaks well," winning trainer Bob Holthus said. TANAKA ENTRY LOOMS LARGE

Owner Gary Tanaka appears to have a stranglehold on today's GII San Luis Obispo H. at Santa Anita, sending out Atlando (Ire) (Hernando (Fr)), King's Drama (Ire) (King's Theatre {Ire}) and Aubonne (Ger) (Monsun {Ger}). Atlando notched the GIII Knickerbocker H. in his U.S. debut last October and has two starts under his belt this season, finishing second in the Jan. 1 San Gabriel H. and fourth in the GII San Marcos S. Jan. 22. King's Drama, winner of the GI Sword Dancer Invitational S. last summer, looks to get back on track after finishing 16th in the G1 Japan Cup Nov. 27. He appears to be the controlling speed. Aubonne, the lone female entered, defeated the boys in a pair of contests while racing in France back in 2004. She comes in this off a victory in the La Zanzara H. Jan. 27. Connections of The Tin Man (Affirmed) decided to skip this event in favor of the G1 Dubai Duty Free S. at Nad Al Sheba Mar. 25. "I'd be sorry if he got there and was a little [tired]," trainer Richard Mandella told Daily Racing Form.



Breaking from the six hole with Victor Espinoza aboard, she dueled five wide through an opening quarter of :21 2/5, began to edge clear on the turn for home and won under wraps. "We like to win like that," trainer Bob Baffert commented. "She's extremely fast and they usually are when they're built like that. I think I'll probably run her in the [GI] Humana Distaff on Derby Day [May 6]...we'll let her tell us. If she's doing great, it could be that race." Due Sasso (Scenic {Ire}), the slight 5-1 favorite, took the lead a furlong from home, but Nadeem hit high gear in the stretch and swooped late to win going away, with stablemate Miss Finland rallying for second. Hayes, who returned to Australia in August after 10 years in Hong Kong, has dominated the juvenile scene, winning 25 races, including 10 stakes. In addition to the top two here, he has the unbeaten filly I Got Chills (Aus) and stakes-placed Churchill Downs (Aus) heading for the Apr. 8 G1 AAMI Golden Slipper S. at Rosehill.



ALL EYES ON SILENT WITNESS Silent Witness

(Aus) (El Moxie) makes a much-anticipated return to the races in this afternoon's G1-HK Centenary Sprint Cup at Sha Tin, an event he has won the past two seasons. The six-year-old has not faced the starter since annexing the G1 Sprinters' S. at Nakayama Oct. 2 and was forced to abandon a three-peat attempt in the G1 Hong Kong Sprint due to a virus he likely contracted in guarantine prior to his return to Sha Tin. While the domestic competition includes horses Silent Witness has routinely thrashed over the past three years, today's 1000meter test will likely prove to be his toughest race to date. Trainer Tony Cruz elected to give the gelding the month of December off and has brought the reigning Horse of the Year along slowly. The bay has exhibited some signs of rust since being put back into training, including a third-place finish in a Feb. 7 barrier trial over 1000 meters, where he struggled home five lengths behind Hong Kong Sprint winner Natural Blitz (Aus) (Maroof), a rival he faces this afternoon. However, his recent trackwork has been much sharper and he has dropped 15 pounds since the barrier trial three weeks ago. In other Group 1 action, G1-HK Stewards Cup hero Russian Pearl (NZ) (Soviet Star), champion miler Bullish Luck (Royal Academy) and G1 Hong Kong Vase third Best Gift (NZ) (Bahhare) square off in the Hong Kong Gold Cup. The 2000-meter heat was supposed to feature the return of Vengeance of Rain (NZ), but the G1 Hong Kong Cup victor has been put away for the season by trainer David Ferraris.
