GANA FACIL, DAM OF UNBRIDLED, DIES

Gana Facil (Le Fabuleux--Charedi, by In Reality), the 25-year-old dam of 1990 Kentucky Derby winner Unbridled died in early February at Coolmore Stud in Ireland, according to Blood-Horse. Frances Genter purchased Gana Facil for \$275,000 from the Tartan-Nerud dispersal at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky sale in November of 1987 and also purchased the mare's first foal, a weanling colt by Fappiano at the same sale for \$70,000. The colt was named Unbridled and, in addition to his emotional Derby win for Genter, he also captured the GI Florida Derby and GI Breeders' Cup Classic and was named champion three-year-old of 1990. Coolmore purchased Gana Facil in 1995 for \$1.35 million at the Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale. She is also the dam of GI Wood Memorial S. winner Cahill Road. The Blood-Horse also reported the death of Fair to All (Al Nasr {Fr}--Gonfalon, by Francis S.), the dam of Grade I winner Honour and Glory (Relaunch). The 20-year-old unraced mare died at Ashford in February.

Achilles of Troy Works for Gotham

New York's leading Kentucky Derby contender Achilles of Troy (Notebook) worked an easy five furlongs in 1:03 2/5 at Aqueduct yesterday and remains on target for the Mar. 18 GIII Gotham S. "He went to the pole a little more aggressive than usual and he finished up as good as he always does," jockey Ramon Dominguez said after the work. "I was very happy with him." Achilles of Troy is coming off authoritative wins in the Jan. 7 Count Fleet S. and Feb. 11 Whirlaway S. Others considered possible for the 1 1/16-mile race include: Barbican (A.P. Indy), Greeley's Legacy (Mr. Greeley), Refinery (Victory Gallop), Strong Contender (Maria's Mon) and Sweetnorthernsaint (Sweetsouthernsaint).

Derby Post Draw Open to Public

The 2006 Kentucky Derby post position draw will be held in downtown Louisville's Fourth Street Live! entertainment and retail district and will be televised live on ESPN. The new location will allow the public to attend the post draw for the first time.

HIGH WATER MARK

Though it was universally predicted that Fasig-Tipton's Calder Two-Year-Old Sale on Tuesday would be stronger than ever, I don't think anybody--at least, anybody outside the camps of the two principals--expected that would mean a new world record price for a Thoroughbred, \$16-million for the Forestry colt out of the Unbridled mare, Magical Masquerade. (Interestingly, the sale's high filly, a \$1.1-million daughter of Johannesburg, also bought by Demi, is also out of an Unbridled mare). Now we know what the horse is worth when the two Titans hook up and nobody blinks, not for a very long time: \$16-million.

In the last two years, we've witnessed the fall of many records set during the 1980s, most notably the new record \$384-million gross racked up by last year's Keeneland September Yearling Sale, driven by the \$187-million in Book 1 sales--an average of \$503,263 for the 372 Book 1 yearlings sold. I mention these figures because there was speculation that Calder could out-average even Book 1. In fact, Tuesday's average was almost exactly \$100,000 below the Book 1 average, in spite of the new recordholder.

From the statistician's point of view, the best thing about the new record holder is that it removes the suspense: even in a market as buoyant as this one, there was always that sceptre of that one last, seemingly unassailable \$13.1-million price tag for Seattle Dancer at the 1985 Keeneland July Sale. Now, 21 years later, it's a former record; we march on, secure in the knowledge that this new record market has now completely defined itself. It's also a sign of this new era that the record came at a two-year-old sale. When you look at the list of good horses already out of last year's two-year-old sales, including Stevie Wonderboy and Brother Derek (see accompanying table, information compiled by *Market Watch*), it's not hard to understand why, either. *Cont. p5*

Yet, this new record demonstrates in some ways how the market has, and hasn't, changed. When we heard about the new record, it was 1-100 that the game's two Titans--Coolmore and Darley--were the winner and direct underbidder, in either order; in this case, Demi O'Byrne for Coolmore was the winner, John Ferguson for Darley the underbidder. All reports have suggested it was the two Titans at least from \$3-million on, and, in fact, the only bid in the whole sale over \$2-million we can be certain came from someone other than Demi or John was Dale Romans's winning \$2.2-million bid for the sale's second highest-priced colt, who was by Forestry's sire, Storm Cat. However you cut the cake, there's absolutely no new evidence that anyone other than the Titans will consistently bid over \$3-million for horses. In a sense, all Tuesday's new record shows us is how far the Titans are willing to go, these days, for the very best.

Here's another perspective. I use this method infrequently, but it's sometimes relevant: subtract the saletopper. Sales company totals Tuesday night showed 154 sold (a much better 67 percent of those sent through the ring, compared to last year's 55 percent), for a gross of \$62,187,000, and an average of \$403,812--increases of 24 percent and 18 percent respectively. But it would be a huge mistake to therefore say 'the market' is up by 20 percent over last year. No. What happened is that the new record Thoroughbred poleaxed the numbers: one horse was more than 25 percent of the sale's gross, and added \$100,000 to the average. If you subtract this year's \$16-million horse and last year's \$5.2-million saletopper, the tables would look like this:

2006 minus Saletopper:

153 sold - \$46,187,000 gross - \$301,876 average 2005 minus Saletopper:

146 sold - \$44,932,000 gross - \$307,753 average

So, in fact, knocking out the saletoppers, the gross was up three percent, and the average down two percent, from last year's sale. This corresponds to the fact that the sale median in fact remained at \$200,000. It wasn't that it was so much greater a sale than in 2005. Full marks to Fasig-Tipton: they produced a \$16-million auction Thoroughbred, smashing the last relevant record standing from the 1980s. But it wasn't like everybody went crazy, and that's probably a good thing.

Sophomore Standings...

We're now two months into 2006, and about to embark on that most critical of times for sires whose first foals are now three-year-olds. The accompanying table (page 7) combines earnings statistics from the Blood-Horse site (www.bloodhorse.com) with our own TDN 'appearance' statistics. While we would be worried on behalf of the 'droppers' if they were in the same position in 2006 earnings in another two months (examples: Songandaprayer, 4th to 10th; Forest Camp, 6th to 16th; and Tiznow, 1st to 19th), these are actually almost meaningless now. Tiznow, for example, already has two stakes-placed fillies this year, and if his Well Armed even hits the board later this month in the G2 UAE Derby, he will just about be back in first.

Two things look significant to me on this list: first, that eight of the current top 10 are by Mr. Prospector-line sires (two by Carson City; one by Forty Niner, and another by his son, End Sweep; one by Gone West's son, Mr. Greeley; one by Gulch's son, Thunder Gulch; and one each, representing Fappiano, by Unbridled and his son, Unbridled's Song); and, second, the two young sires in the current top 10 who have jumped 15 places or more since the end of 2005: Aptitude (19th to fourth) and Point Given (33rd to seventh). Expect further progress from those two. *Cont. p6*

Dateline Jukkasjarvi...

The fashionistas may have Hugo Boss, but last week a little troupe of us from Britain and Ireland had our own 'Boss Hugo.' This was Nordic Wilderness Tours guide Kent Hugosson, universally known as 'Hugo,' and commander of our little team of seven people and 28 dogs (that's four per team) as we mushed along the Tornealven (River Alven, covered by three feet of ice) near the village of Jukkasjarvi, 800 miles north of Stockholm, in Sweden, and two degrees above the Arctic Circle. As some of you will remember-particularly Mark Brooking, of Taylor Made--last year around this time we visited Plockton, just up the road in Scotland. This year we flew into Kiruna, a town of 20,000, on a 165-seat SAS plane from Stockholm with no empty seats. Partially this is because of Kiruna's kilometer-deep, high-quality iron ore mine, but even more so because the nearby village of Jukkasjarvi (pronounced You-cuss-YAR-vee) is the site of the original and deservedly world-famous Ice Hotel, built anew for the 16th time last December, and hosting plenty of fashionistas of its own, from all over the world, from then until the ice, and the ice hotel, melts around the end of April. However, our little band of mushers, which consisted of five fifty-somethings (Lou and myself; Paul Wade and Joy Foster, from Wokingham, near Ascot; and Waterford, Ireland, property developer Des Purcell), plus thirty-somethings Tony Gilbert and Laura Patterson, from Gloucester (near Cheltenham), and (fifty-something also) Boss Hugo, was on a slightly different mission. We had a blast. It's proper wilderness, meaning there were four nights in cabins with no electricity or running water; but we had a great group, everybody pitching in to get the fires going, the dogs fed, and the saunas lit. We had two nights of the Northern Lights, plus a two-hour sunset on our last afternoon mushing, which was almost 360-degrees pink sky. The mushing was really fun, and we got plenty of great views where you could see 50 miles of taiga and tundra. Temperatures ranged from minus 25F to just under 40F, so sometimes you wear a lot of layers. We finished off with last weekend in Stockholm, and can I recommend two great fish restaurant, Wedholms Fisk Bar and Eriks Bakficka (Eric's back pocket), both within easy walking distance of another strong recommendation, the Hotel Diplomat, on Strandvagen. The Swedes were on a little bit of a high themselves; their 3-2 victory over Finland in last Sunday's ice hockey final was their seventh Gold of the Winter Olympics. All in all, an exhilarating experience, I would have to say; highly recommended, and you do not think about your work.

2006 Jockey Club On-Line Fact Book Available:

The 2006 Jockey Club Fact Book is now available on the organization's web site, www.jockeyclub.com. The printed edition of the guide, published annually for the past 16 years, will be available in early May. The fact book shows that U.S. purse money declined 0.7 percent in 2005 to \$1,085,005,415, with the steepest declines in West Virginia and Kentucky. Gross purses in Kentucky dropped by nearly \$7 million against 2004 purses, which included the \$5-million bonus paid to Smarty Jones after his victory in the Kentucky Derby. Total handle on U.S. Thoroughbred races in 2005 declined for the second consecutive year, falling 3.6 percent to \$14,561,288,951. The Fact Book also includes statistics on the breeding and sales sections of the racing industry.
