He's the Man...

Second by a half-length to Rock Hard Ten in the GI Malibu S. to close out his three-year-old season, Lava Man was unplaced in a trio of state-bred stakes at the beginning of 2005. He turned things around with a win in an optional claimer at Hollywood in May and followed that by taking the GII Californian S. June 18. Lava Man erupted in the \$750,000 GI Hollywood Gold Cup July 9, winning by 8 3/4 lengths and earning a 120 Beyer Speed Figure. Third by 3/4 of a length in the \$1-million GI Pacific Classic Aug. 21, the dark bay was well beaten in a pair of big races outside the confines of his native state: he was a distant seventh in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup at Belmont Oct. 1 and 11th in the Japan Cup Dirt Nov. 26. Trainer Doug O'Neill regrouped with his charge, saddling him to collect a nifty paycheck in the Sunshine Millions Classic over this surface Jan. 28. Breaking alertly here, Lava Man went up to contest the pace while accompanied by favored High Limit (Maria's Mon) to his inside and With Distinction (Storm Cat) on the rail. He shrugged off those

rivals after splits of :47 1/5 and 1:11 1/5 and looked to be home free and easy when Magnum came after him. The surprising Argentine gave it his best shot along the rail, but Lava Man had enough in the tank to take his second straight \$1-million race. "He's joined an incredible list [of

Big 'Cap winners], Affirmed, Spectacular Bid, John Henry," noted O'Neill. "I can't even imagine it, but we're in the Big 'Cap books and they can't take that away from us. It's a great feeling." It proved to be a consolation prize for O'Neill, whose champion charge Stevie Wonderboy was recently knocked off the Triple Crown trail. "We're just so blessed, regardless of Stevie Wonderboy's injury. Hopefully, we can keep it going." Lava Man's win was witnessed by 49,089 fans, Santa Anita's largest crowd since the 1990 Big 'Cap. High Limit, the 8-5 favorite, and **Giacomo** (Holy Bull), the 9-2 third choice, were a distant fourth and fifth, respectively. "I just think Lava Man ran a very big race today," said Patrick Valenzuela, who piloted High Limit. "We just got outrun. [Trainer] Bobby [Frankel] always questioned his ability to go the distance." As for Kentucky Derby winner Giacomo, rider Mike Smith said, "He just didn't fire, didn't lay it down. I'm at a loss for words to tell what happened. He hit that one gear to get where I wanted to be. We got to the turn and I asked him to pick it up, but he just kind of put his head up and stayed the same."



First Samurai, winner of the GI Hopeful S. and GI Champagne S. at two, ran into a buzzsaw named Keyed Entry in his seasonal bow. The liver chestnut wound up second in the GII Hutcheson S. Feb. 4 as the winner set a new track record, and was odds-on here in his first attempt at two turns. He assumed command at the start and was allowed to cruise unattended through fractions of :23.86, :48.30 and 1:12. 36. Corinthian rallied three wide on the turn and was going right on by in the stretch when he began to drift in on First Samurai, forcing the favorite to check slightly and angle out. He then began to drift out, which caused the game First Samurai to impede the late-closing Flashy Bull. "This [race] doesn't get him to the first Saturday in May, but it gets him along," said winning trainer Frank Brothers. "The door is open from here--either the Florida Derby [GI, Apr. 1] or the Blue Grass [GI, Apr. 15]." Brother Derek maintained his status as the early favorite for the GI Kentucky Derby. After a triumph in the GII Norfolk S. over track and trip Oct. 2, the California-bred outran his 56-1 odds to be fourth in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Oct. 29 at Belmont, then closed out the year with a win in the GI Hollywood Futurity. He handed the now-sidelined champion Stevie Wonderboy a defeat in the one-mile GII San Rafael S. over this surface Jan. 14, and had been given an easy time of it since by trainer Dan Hendricks. "We had him a little fresh by not doing as much work," said Hendricks. "I'd say I had him cranked about 90 percent." The handsome bay bounced out of the gate and was a bit eager under Alex Solis, but came back to hand on the backstretch as the highly regarded Latent Heat set the pace. He ranged up to take the lead turning for home and edged away as Solis waved the stick at him. "He was a little bit excited before the race," Solis admitted. It took him a while to get on track, but Harlington is now living up to his bluechip pedigree. The \$2.8-million KEESEP yearling broke his maiden in his lone start at two and was tabbed for the Triple Crown after a decisive allowance score at Gulfstream last January, but he wrenched an ankle when sixth in the Feb. 12 GIII Risen Star S. and was out until December. The dark bay came back to take an Aqueduct allowance test Dec. 4 and made it two in a row at Gulfstream Feb. 8. The second choice while taking on stakes foes for the first time, Harlington was on the bridle while rated off It's No Joke through solid splits. He pulled his way to the front from the inside on the far turn and was all out as Contante came flying from the back of the pack for second. "I don't think he's ever been to the lead that soon, and he didn't know what to do when he got there," trainer Todd Pletcher said. "It's just a sign of how enormously talented he is--he's able to race like this without totally focusing. He's come a long way, but he's still not battle tested."

This race marked the return of GI Breeders' Cup Sprint hero Silver Train (Old Trieste), but it turned out to be Mister Fotis's day to shine. Runner-up to Medallist in the GIII Deputy Minister H. 13 months ago, the Florida-bred didn't get his picture again taken until Dec. 17, when he romped in the Kenny Noe Jr. H. at Calder and earned a 113 Beyer Speed Figure. That effort may have taken a toll on him, however, since he could only manage a sixth in the Sunshine Millions Sprint Jan. 28. Mister Fotis breathed down the neck of Middle Earth (Dixieland Band) through a half in :44.92 before assuming command at the top of the stretch. Sir Greeley took a good run at him late, but the wire came just in time for Mister Fotis. "He broke really good," said winning rider Rafael Bejarano. "I tried to hold him back, because there was so much speed in the race, but he was running good. At the top of the stretch I let him out a little bit, and when I saw that other horse [Sir Greeley] coming at me I let him out some more. He took care of everything from there." It was an inauspicious seasonal bow for Silver Train, who ran seventh. "I was concerned he wouldn't run on this track," commented trainer Rick Dutrow Jr. "I didn't see him ever look like he was ever going to run his kind of race at any point. We'll see how he comes out of it. We'll point for the Carter [GI, Apr. 15, Aqueduct,]." win at Calder in the Hollywood Wildcat Breeders' Cup H. Apr. 30, then posted a game triumph in the GII New York H. July 2 at Belmont. A yielding course proved her undoing when she ran sixth in the GI Beverly D. S. at Arlington Aug. 13, and she was given a respite. Wend returned to action Oct. 9 at Keeneland and just failed to run down subsequent champion Intercontinental (GB) in the one-mile GII WinStar Galaxy S., and wound up her year with a sixth in the GI Breeders' Cup F/M Turf at Belmont Oct. 29. The even-money favorite here, Wend led eagerly through fractions of :46.53 and 1:09.53. She had another gear left in the stretch and fended off a valiant Brunilda. "She broke okay and Edgar put her in the race right away," commented winning trainer Bill Mott. "There were clicking right along, but he wasn't asking her to do it, although she did have a horse on her hip. I wasn't surprised that she ran well. I think horses run good fresh." Wend will now head back to her old Kentucky home. "We'll look at the Jenny Wiley [GII, Apr. 15] at Keeneland and the mile race at Churchill on Derby Day [GIII, Churchill Downs Distaff Turf Mile, May 6]," Mott added.

Lee Freedman, trainer of fourthplace finisher Perfect Promise, will wait a couple of days before deciding whether to ship her for the G1 Dubai Duty Free S. Mar. 25.



The Jockey Club Adds Microchip Database:

The Jockey Club has announced that it will now maintain a central database of microchip numbers for Thoroughbreds. Using the free service, Thoroughbred owners and breeders can report and look up microchip numbers on TJC Interactive Registration. To be included in the database, a horse must have a Live Foal Report on file with the Registry, and the owner or breeder must have an active IR account. Matt Iuliano, vice president of Registration Services for The Jockey Club, spoke on the subject at the University of Arizona's Race Track Industry Program symposium in December. He reiterated remarks made during that presentation, saying, "Micro chipping will not be a requirement of registration, but when used in conjunction with current means of identification, such as markings, DNA parentage verification, color photos and lip tattoos, micro chipping can provide additional confidence when identifying a Thoroughbred."

Ho Improves After Surgery:

Jockey Sunny Ho, who suffered a serious head injury during a spill at Golden Gate Wednesday, was showing "significant improvement" Friday at Highland Hospital in Oakland, California, Dr. David Seftel told Daily Racing Form. Ho, 44, fell when his mount, Sport Tommy Boy, suffered a fractured right front leg during the seventh race at Gold Gate Wednesday. He was on his feet after the accident, but collapsed and stopped breathing while waiting to be taken to the hospital for tests. The Hong Kong native was transferred to Highland Wednesday night and underwent emergency surgery to stop bleeding on his brain; by Friday he was conscious and responding to doctors.
