BIG NAMES NOMINATED TO GUINEAS

A total of 78 three-year-olds have been nominated to the G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket May 6, while 85 fillies are still in the running for the G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket May 7. Both races are sponsored by Stan James and the list of nominees features many of last year's top juveniles. The Ballydoyle-based Group 1 winners George Washington (Ire) (Danehill) and Horatio Nelson (Ire) (Danehill) head the 17-strong draft for the 2000 Guineas trained by Aidan O'Brien, who also has Group 1 winner Rumplestiltskin (Ire) (Danehill) among nine fillies for the 1000 Guineas. O'Brien saddled winners of both Classics, Footstepsinthesand (GB) and Virginia Waters, in 2005. "Trainer Aidan O'Brien and jockey Kieren Fallon came out on top in both Guineas last year and they must have a good chance of making history by doing so again," said Michael Prosser, Newmarket's clerk of the course. "The level and quality of entries for both Classics on the NatWest Rowley Mile are excellent and we are looking forward with great anticipation to the Stan James Guineas Festival May 6 and 7." Other Group 1 winners nominated to the Classics are Amadeus Wolf (GB) (Mozart {Ire}), Donna Blini (GB) (Bertolini), Nannina (GB) (Medicean {GB}), Palace Episode (Machiavellian), Silca's Sister (GB) (Inchinor {GB}) and Sir Percy (GB) (Mark of Esteem {Ire}).



HURRICANE SCOOPS AWARD

Michael Tabor's Hurricane Run (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) has been named France's Horse of the Year in a special poll organised by the publication Courses et Elevage in

partnership with France Galop. Last year's G1 Irish Derby and G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe hero edged out the Niarchos Family's multiple Group 1-winning filly Divine Proportions (Kingmambo) to secure the title. Sunday's inaugural award ceremony at Auteuil racecourse saw Hurricane Run, who was also named champion three-year-old colt, outscore last year's brilliant multiple Classic heroine by a half point in the voting system, determined by selected racing journalists. There was consolation for the Niarchos Family, however, as

Divine Proportions was named champion three-year-old filly after capturing the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches, G1 Prix de Diane and G1 Prix d'Astarte. Ecurie Wildenstein's G1 Ascot Gold Cup victor Westerner (GB) (Danehill) was named older horse of the year, and His Highness the Aga Khan's G1 Criterium International winner Carlotamix (Fr) (Linamix (Fr)) took champion iuvenile honors.

EARLY RETURNS

The three top two-year-olds of 1995 were Maria's Mon, dual Grade I winner of the Futurity and Champagne (and surprise champion two-year-old); and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile one-two Unbridled's Song and Hennessy. They headlined a formidable 'sire crop' whose first foals were born in 1998. Hennessy sired 2000 world champion two-year-old Johannesburg in his first crop and Maria's Mon had 2001 Kentucky Derby winner Monarchos in his. Unbridled's Song was a rocking success right from the start, and Forest Wildcat and Smart Strike completed a powerful sire quintet which has been prominent on the Leading Sire lists ever since. Maria's Mon, currently selling for \$25,000 after standing for \$35,000 from 2002 (the year after Monarchos won the Derby) through 2004, is the cheapest of the five right now and has to qualify as one of the bargains of the year. Only Lava Man's second win in a milliondollar race from two starts this year--thus propelling his own sire, Slew City Slew, into the top spot--prevented Maria's Mon from claiming the top spot as Leading Sire on the North American General Sire List so far this year. As it is, he's a clear second, with four stakes winners and the earners of over \$1-million already in 2006 (this according to www.bloodhorse.com, on Monday).

Though High Limit, who won his second Grade II in the Strub before running fourth in last Saturday's Big 'Cap, is Maria's Mon's biggest name horse this year, it's maybe more significant that two of his four 2006 stakes winners are from his 2003 crop, three-year-olds this year--the first crop sired after Monarchos won the Derby, so presumably out of much better mares.

Unbridled's Song himself ranks sixth on the General Sire List so far this year, so he's certainly upholding the form in no uncertain terms, while the other three, all thoroughly proven sires now, also figure in the rankings.

Quite an interesting sidelight is that both Maria's Mon and Unbridled's Song are grays, and both out of mares by Caro. He's proving guite influential, is Caro, who was himself the only really important horse sired by Fortino II, a son of Grey Sovereign. From quite a stout bottom line. Caro has been much more an influence for stamina than was the speedy Grey Sovereign himself, and it's increasingly looking like he's a big influence for class, too. Another gray sire with Caro in his pedigree is Linamix, whose sire Mendez was by Bellypha out of a Caro mare. It's not just the color that's coming through here.

Of course, I can hardly go a week without mentioning the (first foals in) 2000 'sire class,' and this top group is very prominent again. Distorted Humor, the Pivotal of America, had another good week, even though his 2-5 shot Da Stoops could only finish third in the off-the-turf Baldwin S. at Santa Anita. The three-year-old New York-bred Sharp Humor was the upset winner of the GII Swale, and four-year-old It's No Joke finished third in the GII Gulfstream Park H. (dual Classic winner Funny Cide, from his first crop and now six, only seventh). There may be disappointments, but, like Pivotal, it seems like there is always a new good Distorted Humor popping up somewhere.

Distorted Humor currently ranks 10th on the General Sire List, and, remarkably, four other F2000 sires occupy four of the next five slots: only Mr. Greeley (12th, first foals 1997) breaks the string. The others are: Tale Of The Cat (11th); Stormy Atlantic (13th); Awesome Again (14th); and Elusive Quality (15th). Grand Slam and Wild Rush are also among the GSL Top 40.

Two other sires who had really big weekends were Pulpit (F1999, 47th GSL) and Holy Bull (F1996, 34th GSL). Pulpit would have had an even better weekend had not Corinthian, clearly best, absolutely had to come down, from first to third, in the GII Fountain of Youth. As it was, Pulpit had two other stakes winners on Saturday, both bred and owned by Claiborne: the fiveyear-old mare Wend won the GIII Honey Fox at Gulfstream; and their three-year-old colt Laity won the John Battaglia Memorial at Turfway. Holy Bull had last year's GI Kentucky Derby winner Giacomo, but he could only finish fifth in the Big 'Cap. However, two of this year's three-year-olds each finished second in Saturday's big two-turn three-year-old races. Flashy Bull, never out of the first four in eight lifetime starts, finished third (promoted to second) behind Corinthian and First Samurai in the GII Fountain of Youth. Perhaps more impressive was Sacred Light, who put in a powerful finish behind Brother Derek in the GII Santa Catalina.

This brings up another sire who's having a good year: number two third-crop sire (behind Giant's Causeway, 9th on GSL) so far in 2006 is More Than Ready, with four Northern Hemisphere stakes winners this year. On this week's General Sire List on bloodhorse.com, you will find: number 31, Forest Wildcat (F1998); 32, Hennessy (F1998); 33. More Than Ready (F2001); 34. Holy Bull (F1996). Nothing wrong with being in the 30's on that list.

Selling British Racing...

For several reasons--principally prize money, but also exposure to overseas markets because so many British racehorses are sold abroad to continue their racing careers (historically caused by dismal prize money)-there are significant moves afoot to market the transmission of British racing more comprehensively to other countries and continents. An issue which is complicating this effort is about to be resolved by the British Horseracing Board within the next month. Historically, final declaration of entries in Britain is made '24-hours' (the morning) before, rather than '48-hours' before.


The trainers, led by the redoutable Mark Johnston, are dead set against changing to 48-hours 'decs,' arguing that the fact that British horses are trained off-track (so must almost always ship to the races), plus the unique British weather patterns (which can result in ground changing from hard to soft in 24 hours), mean that 48-hour declarations would straightjacket their flexibility and hurt the product. Of course, it's all about gambling, the handle, and how much comes back to the owners in prize money, and Britain wins the prize for the most difficult system to understand, hands-down.

The trainers are 'demanding' that those arguing for 48-hour decs (racecourses, TV, and those involved in trying to market the product internationally) somehow prove what the direct financial benefits will be, saying the BHB 'promised' not to rule in favor of 48-hour decs without detailed guarantees. Good try.

It might all come down to the owners, which is fine-some (though not all) would say this is how it should be. But I was alarmed to see Racehorse Owners' Association (ROA) chief executive Michael Harris refer, in a statement in Sunday's Racing Post, to his concern about 'the additional costs and disruption' which would be caused by 48-hour decs.

Disruption to whom? To the owners? Or are the owners in the thrall of the trainers, not really thinking for themselves in this matter? If so, they should think again. To me, it seems as plain as the nose on your face (as they say). Here is my view: as a gambler, the more time you have to study the form the better--especially when it's someplace you're not familiar with, physically. I know a lot of gamblers, and they spend a lot more than what we used to call in America 'the \$2 bettor.' Anybody who thinks serious gamblers will bet serious money without feeling confident that they understand the form is in cloud-cuckoo land, that I will promise you.

Except for the short-term inconvenience to trainers, which they will solve, there is no downside to the potential of the greater dissemination of British racing overseas. You need only go to the Horses in Training Sale at Tattersalls in Newmarket every October to see how respected British racing is worldwide. There is a thirst, internationally, among gamblers and racing professionals alike for this product--and especially with the U.S. still, absurdly, struggling with the morality (and tax opportunities) of internet gambling, not to mention race-day drugs. Well, the world is waiting. The trainers are right about one thing: this is an absolutely critical decision which will affect the future prosperity of British racing for years. But they're on the wrong side of the argument here. Owners of Britain, vote for your own interests. Vote for progress. Vote for 48-hour decs! Cont. p4


Lava Man started his career racing for his breeders Lonnie Aterburn and Eve and Kim Kuhlmann. After three outings on the dirt, Lava Man was switched to the turf, and on that surface he showed useful form, winning a maiden and a \$40,000 starter handicap at Golden Gate, as well as an allowance race at Bay Meadows. Dropped in for \$50,000 at Bay Meadows, he was claimed by trainer Doug O'Neill for STD Racing Stable and Jason Wood. Straight off the claim, he came back to collect the Pomana Derby Trial, and later in the year, showed form of a much higher lever with a half-length second to Rock Hard Ten in the GI Malibu S. Lava Man struggled in his first three races as a four-year-old, but after taking an optional claimer at Hollywood Park, he captured the GII Californian S., then stunned the field for the GI Hollywood Gold Cup, storming home 8 3/4 lengths clear of Borrego. Third to Borrego in the GI Pacific Classic, Lava Man left his form behind when shipped out of state for his last two starts of 2005: the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup and Japan Cup Dirt. This year he has started twice, and has taken \$1-million events on both outings, his GI Santa Anita H. triumph being preceded by a win in the Sunshine Millions Classic.

Lava Man is by the 22-year-old Seattle Slew stallion Slew City Slew. Like Lava Man, Slew City Slew improved considerably with age. He didn't claim his first black-type race until he was four, when he took the GIII Salvator Mile and three other stakes, but he was even better at five, when he gained victories in the GI Gulfstream Park H. and GI Oaklawn H. Slew City Slew has been a useful sire over the years, with 34 stakes winners from 12 crops, but he had never been represented by a Grade I winner until last year, when both Lava Man and the GI Ashland S. heroine Sis City achieved that status. Prior to their arrival, Slew City Slew's best representatives included Canadian Horse of the Year and champion three-year-old colt Win City, millionaire Maysville Slew and graded winners City By Night, Natural Selection, Evansville Slew, Swap, Archer City Slew and Shamrock City.

Lava Man's dam, Li'l Ms. Leonard was a hard knocking sprinter who raced on the West Coast, and won eight of 18 starts for earnings of nearly \$120,000. Lava Man is her third foal and third winner. Li'l Ms. Leonard's sire Nostalgia's Star is a name very rarely seen in pedigrees. A son of the Silent Screen stallion Nostalgia, Nostalgia's Star was a handicap ace in the mid-1980s, earning over \$2 million and capturing such races as the GI Charles H. Strub S., GII Hawthorne Gold Cup and GII Gallant Fox H. As a sire, Nostalgia's Star has virtually sunk without a trace: he was responsible for just one minor stakes winner, and Lava Man is his only stakes winner as a broodmare sire.

Lava Man's pedigree is also distinctly light in the direct female line. His granddam Pink Native never ran, and Li'l Ms. Leonard was her only winner. Pink Native's dam Pink Khal did somewhat better, winning 12 of 57 starts, although this netted less than \$50,000. The first stakes winner prior to Lava Man which one hits in the direct female line is Pink Khal's brother, Jobil. He won six races, including the State Fair H., but the standard of these races can be gauged by the fact that his lifetime earnings amounted to just \$7,514. A better horse was C. Q. Cady, a half brother to Pink Khal, who ran only at two, when he captured four of six starts. Three of those were stakes, including the Golden Gate Juvenile Dinner S. Another half sister, Joquill, produced the minor stakes winner Nuquill, and is ancestress of several other minor stakes winners.

Slew City Slew is a product of the Seattle Slew/Prince John cross. This was a very successful cross at one stage and, including Lava Man, it has produced seven Grade I winners, although the failure of the Prince John male line to breed on has seen the effectiveness of the cross diminish in recent years. Seattle Slew himself was out of a mare by a grandson of Prince John's sire Princequillo, so he was basically bred the same as Slew City Slew. Lava Man takes this a step further; since his dam is also by a Prince John-line stallion, Seattle Slew, Slew City Slew and Lava Man represent three successive generations of what is essentially the same cross. *Cont. p6*

Lava Man's broodmare sire Nostalgia's Star actually provides a double dose of Prince John, who appears 3x4 in his pedigree (a horse with an intriguing pattern, Nostalgia's Star was also inbred 3x3 to Herbager). Adding back the Prince John strain seems to have been particularly good for Slew City Slew as that strain appears in the dams of at least 10 of his stakes winners, including Grade I winners Lava Man and Sis City, and graded winners Natural Selection and Swap.

Nostalgia's Star does more than just reinforce the Prince John strain, as in his dam we find not only Prince John, but also Ambiorix and the great tap-root mare Grey Flight. Slew City Slew's granddam, Esirnus, has Prince John's sire, Princequillo, Ambiorix and Grey Flight all within the first three generations of her pedigree, so she has a very similar background.

NY HORSEMEN EYE FRANCHISE PURCHASE A

coalition of New York horsemen and breeders are forming a venture to operate racing and video lottery activities at facilities now being run by the New York Racing Association. The new company, Empire Racing Associates, LLC, officially begins operations on Mar. 9. "Operating racing in New York is about protecting jobs, green space, and the historic character of the New York tracks," Charles Reiss, a longtime Thoroughbred owner who is one of the initial board members of the new venture, said in a press release. "It is also about ensuring that these New York assets are managed and developed for New Yorkers by New Yorkers while protecting revenue sources to the state. There is no reason racing can't return to its former position of prominence in the sports world." ERA has received the endorsement of the New York Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association. NYTHA will have an equity position in the venture, but ERA will be operated as a separate entity. "I am pleased the board of NYTHA voted unanimously to support this initiative," said Richard Bomze, president of the NYTHA. Jeff Perlee, former New York State Lottery Director, has been named ERA's Chief Executive Officer. Among the group's immediate plan: participation in 2006 racing reform efforts, development of business strategies and plans for the franchise assets, communications with the Ad Hoc Committee on the Future of Racing and additional communications with owners, trainers and breeders on the importance of the franchise bidding process. Board members and investors in ERA include: Jared Abbruzzese, Sr., Dennis Brida, Gary Contessa, Marty Cunningham, Terry Finley, Mike Hess, Sr., John Leonard, Robin Malatino, Joe McMahon, Thomas Newkirk, Charles Reiss and Jeffrey Tucker.
