WILKO ON TRACK FOR WORLD CUP

J. Paul Reddam and Susan Rov's Wilko (Awesome Again), third in last Saturday's GI Santa Anita H., is scheduled to make his next start in the \$6-million G1 Dubai World Cup at Nad Al Sheba Mar. 25. "We'll know

more in a few days," commented trainer Craig Dollase, who explained that the chestnut has yet to return to the track since the Big 'Cap. Twice a winner in England for trainer Jeremy Noseda, the four-vear-old still has just one victory to his credit in this country, his triumph over Afleet

Alex, et al in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile in 2004. Though unable to crack the winner's circle since, Wilko has placed in the GI Hollywood Futurity and last year's GI Santa Anita Derby. He will be back under Noseda's tutelage for his Dubai venture, according to a statement on the trainer's website. "Having spoken to Craig Dollase in California, he felt that with me having a team of people in Dubai that it was a sensible decision for us to take over Wilko's preparation for the World Cup," he said on jeremynoseda.com. "Therefore, one of my staff will fly to collect the horse this weekend. Wilko will then be shipped to Dubai where he is scheduled to arrive on Wednesday. The hand-over should be very smooth as the same people will be dealing with the horse in Dubai as dealt with him when he was with us at two, which included his preparation ahead of the Breeders' Cup. I hope the horse travels well and that we have a problem-free last stage of his preparation into the World Cup. Craig is a key element in that he has had the horse for almost a year and a half. He is in charge of the horse until he leaves America. Craig and myself will be communicating to make sure that we present the horse in as good a shape as possible for the World Cup."

FOO FIGHTER IN DUTY FREE

Brian Martin, the manager for the No Big Deal syndicate which campaigns evergreen Fields of Omagh (Aus) (Rubiton {Aus}), had declared an end to the eight-yearolds' globetrotting days. But Martin has apparently had a change of heart and announced that the winner of last Saturday's G1 Futurity S. will make the trip to Dubai for the \$5-million G1 Duty Free S. "Fields of Omagh is in great form, and I really think he'll be competitive in the Dubai Duty Free," trainer David Hayes said. "He leaves next Tuesday [Mar. 14] and Tony McEvoy will travel with the horse to settle him in, along with his usual track rider [Warren Hughes], and I will join them in Dubai in the last few days before the race." Martin is completely supportive of the decision. "David is a great trainer with a wonderful record with travelling horses," Martin observed. "The horse has come through the Futurity S. extremely well and is on an upward spiral. The Dubai Duty Free fits in with our timeframe and the right distance range. It's a wonderful opportunity and we are all looking forward to taking up the challenge." The addition of Fields of Omagh means there will likely be no fewer than 10 Group/Grade I winners in the starting gate for the Duty Free.

EINSTEIN TO STAY AT HOME

Trainer Helen Pitts has confirmed that Einstein (Brz) (Spend a Buck) will remain in the U.S., bypassing the

chance to run in the \$2-million G2 UAE Derby. "He's young and he's still got a real good campaign here," Pitts said. "He's still got plenty of years ahead of him to go over there." The four-yearold, owned by Bill Gallion and Midnight Cry Stable, has won each of his three starts in 2006. Einstein Equi-Photo including a 7-1 upset of the GI

'TENT' FOLDS Graded stakes winner Your Tent or Mine (Forest Camp), out of action since a runner-up finish to Brother Derek in the GI Hollywood Futurity Dec. 17, will not make the GI Kentucky Derby due to problems in his right front foot, according to Daily Racing Form. "He bruised it, then it abscessed in his toe and it came out his coronet band," trainer Neil Drysdale told DRF. "We're going to have to give him a little time off. He'll probably be able to run by late April, provided everything goes smoothly. It's quite aggravating, but there's no loss of life." The bay colt captured his first two career starts, including the GIII Hollywood Prevue S., prior to the Hollywood Futurity. He had not posted an official workout since...DRF also reports that Peace Chant (War Chant), second-place finisher in the GII San Vicente S. Feb. 12, is off the Derby trail. The son of champion Safely Kept recently had surgery to remove a bone chip from an ankle behind and will be out for several months.

Simon Says...

Trainer D. Wayne Lukas is considering entering **Simon Pure** (Silver Deputy) in next Saturday's Gll San Felipe S., according to *DRF*. A son of the Lukas-trained champion Life's Magic, the dark bay graduated Mar. 2 at Santa Anita (video). "He made a quantum leap going two turns, which is what you want to do," Lukas told *DRF*. "We'll probably step up because we have to get some earnings. My only concern is we're back in 16 days, but there's a lot to be said about running out of your own stall...He's so laid back and takes things in stride." Simon Pure, a \$665,000 FTSAUG yearling, races under the green and yellow colors of Beverly Lewis and the Estate of Robert Lewis.

Velazquez to Ride Bluegrass Cat Mar. 18...

Jockey John Velazguez has confirmed that he will ride WinStar Farm's Bluegrass Cat (Storm Cat) in the GIII Tampa Bay Derby Mar. 18, according to The Blood-Horse. That colt is trained by Todd Pletcher, who will also send out Keyed Entry (Honour and Glory) the same day in the GIII Gotham S. at Aqueduct. Velazquez, Pletcher's first-call rider, was aboard Keyed Entry during that colt's track-record setting victory in the GII Hutcheson S. Feb. 4. "As much as I wanted to ride Keyed Entry, I'm not losing anything at all riding Bluegrass Cat, because he's the horse to beat right now in the Kentucky Derby," Velazquez told The Blood-Horse. "If Keyed Entry wins the Gotham, he would be one of the horses to beat, too. I hope [Keyed Entry's co-owner] Jack [Wolf] understands and doesn't close the door on me, because I really want to ride his horse. I believe both horses are going to win. They're training super and they're both very talented. I like Keyed Entry because he ran very fast in his last race and does things so easily. I'm not saying this because I ride for Todd, but in all honesty, of all the Kentucky Derby contenders I see in the Daily Racing Form past performances, they would be my first two picks."

FINAL NEGATIVE TESTS FOR EHV-1 The final four horses being held in isolation in Maryland have tested negative for equine herpesvirus, allowing the Maryland Department of Agriculture to lift the "General Animal Hold Orders" on the detention barn at Pimlico and an isolated barn at Bowie. Those four horses are free to return to their original barns and resume normal activities. "These negative tests bring this EHV-1 outbreak to official closure in Maryland, as all hold orders have been lifted and there are no reported signs of the virus anywhere in the state," said State Veterinarian Guy Hohenhaus. "This is good news for all of Maryland's horse owners and related businesses. We thank all parties involved for their patience and diligence in stopping the spread of the virus. While this event is now over, we remind all horse owners that a robust vaccination program is important." The outbreak of the virus resulted in the euthanization of three horses at Pimlico and one at Laurel. Nearby states banned shippers from Maryland, and Laurel was forced to cancel its Grade II stakes on Presidents' Day weekend.

(ERA), a coalition of Thoroughbred owners and breeders, announced its interest in the franchise to run the three major New York tracks, the New York Thoroughbred Breeders, Inc. (NYTB) released a statement outlining its position. The tracks--Aqueduct, Belmont and Saratoga--are currently operated by the embattled New York Racing Association (NYRA), whose franchise runs through Dec. 31, 2007. Bidding for the franchise is expected to begin this year. NYTB's statement read:

The NYTB is committed to legislative initiatives calculated to guaranteeing that New York Thoroughbred breeders, owners, and horsemen continue to have the necessary incentives and rewards that will insure the ongoing success of Thoroughbred racing in New York. The NYTB believes that the successful operation of the NYRA franchise is a matter of overarching importance to the entire Thoroughbred industry and that the NYTB has a vital role to play in the ongoing dialogue concerning the future of the NYRA franchise. The Board of Directors of the NYTB has not endorsed any prospective successor to the NYRA for the NYRA franchise and, at the present time, has no intention of aligning itself with any of the groups seeking the franchise. The NYTB recognizes that under existing legislation the NYRA will remain the franchisee until Dec. 31, 2007.

The ERA has the backing of, and is closely associated with, the New York Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association (NYTHA), which has an equity position in the venture. In related news, NYTB Executive Director Dennis Brida issued a statement yesterday to clarify that he was not an ERA board member and that he was "in full accord with the position of the Board of Directors of the NYTB."

KY Milkshake Testing Suspended Due to Lack of Vets:

The Kentucky Horse Racing Authority has suspended pre-race testing for milkshakes due to the dismissal of two veterinarians, according to *Associated Press*. That leaves only three veterinarians to run the tests instead of the five that are authorized. Jim Gallagher, the KRHA's executive director, indicated that testing could resume once one of the vacancies is filled. According to Gallagher, there have been no positive tests since the testing was implemented in 2005. Both Ellis Park and Churchill Downs began random pre-race testing for milkshakes last year. Turfway followed suit, but an outbreak of equine herpesvirus in December led to a halt in the testing, and the suspension continued once concerns over the disease abated.

NO SERIES, NO PROBLEM FOR QE II CUP Despite the abolition of the World Racing Series, the G1 Audemars Piguet Queen Elizabeth II Cup has attracted 90 nominations at the first closing stage, including 22 Group or Grade I winners from 14 racing jurisdictions. The top-ranked horse among the early nominees is David Junior (Pleasant Tap), who upset the G1 Champion S. at Newmarket last October. Pride (Fr) (Peintre Celebre) and Maraahel (Ire) (Alzao), second and third in that event before filling the same positions in the G1 Hong Kong Cup in December, are also possible, as is Touch of Land (Fr) (Lando {Ger}), recent winner of the G2 Jebel Hatta in Dubai and fourth in the Hong Kong Cup. Two previous winners from the International Races are also among the early nominees. Ouija Board (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}), victorious in last year's G1 Hong Kong Vase, and Alexander Goldrun (Ire) (Gold Away (Ire)), successful in the 2004 Hong Kong Cup, could pay a return visit to Sha Tin. Ouija Board is eligible for a bonus of HK\$1 million should she tack on a win in the QE II Cup. Greys Inn (Zabeel {NZ}) joins Irridescence (SAf) (Caesour) and Tyson (SAf) (Silvino) as entrants from the South African stable of Mike de Kock. American-based horses comprise seven entries, including Grade I winners Shakespeare (Theatrical {Ire}), Einstein (Brz) (Spend a Buck), Relaxed Gesture (Ire) (Indian Ridge {Ire}) and Host (Chi) (Hussonet). The QE II Cup, run over 2000 meters Apr. 23, carries purse money of HK\$14 million (\$1.8 million).
