FNYR Proposes Racing Reform Legislation:

Friends of New York Racing, a non-profit research and advocacy group headed by President Tim Smith, has submitted a proposal outlining legislation that would restructure and reform the racing industry in the state. The legislation, the result of a year-long study in conjunction with the Government Law Center of the Albany Law School, would, among other things, broaden the definition of those who are eligible to operate the current New York Thoroughbred racing assets; allow for video lottery terminals at Belmont Park; give the six OTBs the option to join forces with the state's tracks; and permit account wagering clients to make deposits to their accounts via the computer or other electronic means, and not just by telephone. "We hope that as much of this proposed legislation as possible can be adopted this year," said Smith. "It includes many of the key recommendations of our 2005 reports. Its passage would lead to a better business model for New York racing and thus strengthen the upcoming bids for the current New York Racing Association franchise. Most importantly of all, this legislation would increase purses, improve breeding farm economics and help assure the future viability of the industry in New York." FNYR had announced that it would close down its operations once the legislation had been submitted. "While the mission of FNYR was finite in scope and has been completed, much remains to be done to realize the full potential of the New York racing industry," Smith said. "The current business structure is 50 years old, and not surprisingly needs updating. Balancing the needs of racing as a sport and racing as a business will be of critical importance. We think our proposed legislation is a good first step in that direction." For more information, go to www.friendsofnyr.com.





California Seeks Funding for Polytracks:

California Senator Dean Florez is in the process of writing a bill that will seek funding for Polytrack surfaces at California racetracks. The California Horse Racing Board has voted that it will require the state's tracks to install the synthetic surfaces before the end of 2007 in an effort to cut down on racehorse injuries. Florez is working with the CHRB and with members of the racing industry on the wording of the legislation. "The installation of Polytrack is one of many long-term steps needed to ensure that we have a healthy and prosperous racing industry in California," Florez said. "I'm committed to developing a sensible funding mechanism that will accelerate its introduction in our state." The CHRB has scheduled two meetings to provide information and answer any questions regarding Polytrack. Representatives of Keeneland Race Course, which will install a Polytrack oval in time for its 2006 fall meet, will attend the first meeting, set for Mar. 21 at Santa Anita. Trainer Michael Dickinson, who created and patented the synthetic all-weather Tapeta surface for his Maryland training center, will speak at the second meeting, scheduled for Apr. 4 at Santa Anita.
