

Earlier this week, shipping restrictions were eased folowing an Equine Herpes outbreak, allowing Maryland-based horses to enter New York races. "He's been training excellent," said Tombetta. "The Gotham is the next logical spot for him to race and is part of our natural progression through the spring."

Cause to Believe Heads to Hawthorne...

Cause to Believe (Maria's Mon), who posted an impressive four-length victory in Saturday's California Derby at Golden Gate, is expected to make his next start in the GII Illinois Derby at Hawthorne Apr. 8. "At this point, we're about 75 percent sure," trainer Jerry Hollendorfer told Blood-Horse. Chicago native Peter Abruzzo purchased a 25-percent interest in the roan, for an undisclosed amount, following the colt's victory in the GIII EI Camino Real Derby Jan. 29. "[A start in the Illinois Derby] was my plan even before Peter Abruzzo came aboard," added Hollendorfer. "I like the timing of the race and, if we can keep the horse sound, the Illinois Derby is next." The three-year-old is not currently nominated to the Triple Crown, but his connections are expected to pony up the \$6,000 late nomination fee prior to the Mar. 25 deadline.



BARRETTS BABIES ARE TRIPLE THREATS

After working a quarter in :20 4/5 during the preview, Brother Derek (Benchmark) was hammered down for \$275,000 at the 2005 Barretts March Sale. The



handsome bay is now the star of the West Coast three-year-old crop, picking up his third straight graded-stakes win in the Mar. 4 GII Santa Catalina S., and giving Barretts bragging rights as a place to buy future Triple Crown candidates. Brother Derek is one of a half-dozen graduates of last year's March Sale that has already joined the ranks of graded-stakes winners, and the 10 that topped the sale have Brother Derek Benoit all had their pictures taken at least

once. "It's great," said Barretts President Gerry McMahon. "We have six that are gradedstakes winners so far, and that's out of a relatively small sale. They acted like stakes winners here last year and you love to see them actually do it on the racetrack." How does the 2006 catalogue stack up to last year's? "It is comparable," McMahon said. "It may be a little lighter in pedigree, but not much. The average pinhook price is comparable to last year." One that got away last year was Wild Fit (Wild Wonder), who RNA'd at \$240,000. Raced by the partnership of Brewer Racing Stable and Murray Smith, who had consigned her to the Barretts sale, the gray filly was first or second in all four starts at two, winning the GI Del Mar Debutante and running second in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. She was sold to John Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith for \$3 million at the Fasig-Tipton November Sale and was the co-favorite of the fillies named for Pool 2 of the Kentucky Oaks Future Wager when it closed Mar. 5. The 2006 March Sale gets underway tomorrow, with bidding beginning at 2 p.m.

He's Like a Brother to B.C.3...

"He may not know it, but Mr. Peacock's family has grown because of Brother Derek. We are all members of the clan." That's how John Brocklebank feels about the colt he sold at Barretts last year. In partnership with

Shane Chipman, Brocklebank operates B.C.3. Thoroughbreds, which purchased the Cal-bred for \$150,000 as a KEESEP yearling and sold him to Cecil Peacock for \$275,000 as a Barretts March juvenile. Brocklebank knew right from the start that Derek was out of the ordinary. "Right from the get-go, I knew how good he



was," said the Utah native. "We move them along at a pretty good pace and most horses, at some point, get a little soft and let you know you need to back off on them. But Brother Derek was one of those horses that handled everything we did with him--he jumped through every hoop. We thought we had something special, and he went on to walk his talk, so to speak."

Born and raised in the Beehive State, Brocklebank was a promising football player in high school, earning a full ride to the University of Utah. But his interests were not focused on the gridiron. "My family wasn't involved with horses, but I was the kind of kid who dreamed about Flicka," he explained. "I always wanted a horse, but I couldn't have one until I got to high school. I got this little Arab mare and I was bitten by the bug. I went to college for a couple of years, but once you are into horses, you just can't think of anything else."

Brocklebank started out with Quarter Horses, buying for owner David Payne. "We were quite fortunate," he said. "I was with him for 16 years, and we had about three world champions together. Then I decided to get into the Thoroughbred business." Cont. p2

Supply in Demand...

After getting his feet wet in the Thoroughbred industry on his own, Brocklebank joined forces with Chipman four years ago, forming B.C.3. Thoroughbreds. The two find partners (the 3 in B.C.3.) and buy yearlings with the express purpose of selling them as two-year-olds. They made their Barretts debut in 2003, selling three juveniles for an average of \$115,000. In 2004, they only sold two, but one was a Lord Carson filly that was purchased by Bob and Beverly Lewis for \$450,000. Named Paragon Queen, the chestnut filly was second in the GIII Debutante S. and was favored in the Sorority S., but tragically suffered a fatal injury in that race. Business grew last year, as B.C.3. sent 14 through the ring, with eight sold.

"We've been able to buy some really good horses for not a lot of money, and that has helped us move up the ladder," Brocklebank said. "We built our reputation with the scrubs, and now our investors allow us to buy better and better horses. We're kind of proud of that."

Yearlings purchased by B.C.3. don't follow the conventional route to the juvenile sales. Instead of heading to farms in Florida or California or Kentucky, they are broken and prepped in Utah.

"Utah is home, but training there does put us at a disadvantage," Brocklebank said. "It's not so hard on the horses, but it is very hard on the guys. In the winter, the high might be 15 degrees, and it gets down to zero. It's tough to keep the guys warm."

The extreme temperatures also affect the way the horses are prepared.

"We have to move the horses right along so we can get the first work into them before the track freezes," he continued. "We want to stress their bones so they develop properly. Then we get the freeze and back off and do some work in a \$6 million indoor arena at a cityowned complex. That does neat stuff for their minds-there are all kinds of others horses in there, barrel racers and roping horses and jumpers. They are exposed to all that, so when they get to the track, there isn't much they haven't seen."

Successful Experiment...

Brocklebank has listened to the argument against buying horses at the two-year-old in training sales, but he doesn't buy it. "You hear a lot of negative comments about two-year-old sales," he said. "We train a little harder than some people think we should, but I think the training they get for the sales is a vital tool for preparing them for racing.

"When you are trying to build bone density, you have to do it while they are young--if you don't, you have missed the boat. By stressing them at a younger age, you build proper bone, proper muscle fiber. The body is adapting to the stress and it gives them a leg-up on getting to the races sounder and stronger. When you surprise a horse with that kind of stress on race day, that's when they can come unraveled."

He added, "As a group, two-year-old consignors are drafting in the eighth and ninth round at the yearling sales--we don't have a chance at LeBron James and Kobe Bryant--but, year after year, our horses excel. The proof is in the pudding."

In 2004, Brocklebank purchased three yearlings for

B.C.3. that ended up on the 2005 Experimental Free Handicap. He has 17 ready to go through the ring at Barretts Tuesday and pegs hip 17, a colt by Richter Scale, as the star of the consignment. Named Call Zoll, the bay worked a quarter in :20 4/5 at the first under-

tack preview. He was an \$85,000 KEESEP purchase, with Craig Tillotson, who was part of the Brother Derek trio, as B.C.3.'s partner.

"He is named after Craig's lawyer, who is an athlete and one of the toughest guys I know," Brocklebank said. "I said, 'perfect, I have a horse just like him.'"

He added, "Only four horses ever sold at Barretts have worked a guarter in :20 and change [including Brother Derek], and all four are graded-stakes winners. This colt has trained extremely well and he has a monster of a stride to him. We have high expectations."

THE RUSSIANS ARE COMING

There is a new name on the list of consignors for the Barretts March Sale. Gennadi Dorochenko comes to Pomona by way of Golden Gate Fields by way of Rus-

sia. He has a group of five ready to sell for the partnership of Inexpo Ltd. Tuesday.

Dorochenko, who celebrates his 47th birthday on sale day, was born into the racing industry.

"I have been all my life with horses, since 1975," he ex-

plained. "I was born in South Russia, which is like Kentucky. There are a lot of horse people, a lot of good horse farms. My mother worked with horses, my father was a blacksmith. A love of horses has been handed down from generation to generation."

A rider in his native country, Dorochenko made the move to the U.S. in 1993 and was a member of the Golden Gate jockey colony for nine years. He tried to double as a jockey and trainer for a short time, but had to take his tack to Delaware Park to do it, as the racing rules in California do not permit someone to hold both licenses. His owner convinced him to return to the West Coast, however, and he is now trying his hand as a pinhooker. "It's the first time in my life that I've done it," he said. "My owner said let's do it, so we'll see how it works."

Dorochenko purchased four of his quintet at Fasig-Tipton Kentucky in October and the fifth at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Sale in September. What was he looking for in his yearlings?

"First, you have to know the bloodlines, then you look at the conformation and third you must have luck to buy a good horse for not a big price," he remarked. "It is like when a sculptor looks at a piece of rock--he already sees what it will look like when he has finished with it. When I buy a horse, I already know what he will look like in the future. It's very important to be able to see that when you buy young horses." Dorochenko brought the yearlings, which cost a total of \$150,000, back to Northern California and enticed a few friends from Russia to come over and help get them ready for the sales. But, after spending the last five or six months working with the babies, he is not happy about sending them through the ring. "I don't want to sell them, it's like selling my children," he said. "If I could, I would keep them and train them, because I know they are good horses. But my owner wants to see how this works, and I know they will get good homes with good trainers. That's very important."

The Russian horseman believes that those who take

his horses home will be pleased with their purchases. "They are training very good, they are feeling good and they are healthy," he said. "I know that whoever buys these horses will be very happy. They are 100 percent sound, they are well broken and I know they can run."



The quickest during the first preview was hip 176, a filly by Tale of the Cat

from the family of Kentucky Derby hero **Hip 176** Jim Firios Bold Forbes and GISW Saratoga Six.

The chestnut, named Magic Land, worked an eighth in :10 1/5. She brought \$30,000 as an FTMSEP yearling.

Murray Smith must have felt like she was dreaming during last year's Barretts March Sale. Smith sent out



five horses, including the \$1.9-million sales topper What a Song, and sold four for an average of \$567,500, good enough to earn her the honor of the leading consignor. "It was exciting--all the stars aligned," she said.

The one lot that went unsold turned out to be subsequent GISW Wild Fit, but Smith was not surprised that the filly did not reach her reserve.

Wild Fit Sherackatthetrack

"She had a bump on her shin," she explained. "She did it on the

gate and that scared everybody off. I can't blame the buyers--she was a big horse with a shin and it looked like you would have to give her time off right off the bat, when you wanted to be going on with her."

Smith had mixed results at Fasig-Tipton Calder, seeing several led out as RNAs, but selling a Maria's Mon colt for \$150,000 and a Songandaprayer filly for \$500,000.

"If you had an athlete that worked well and vetted well, it was unlimited the amount of money it could bring," she said. "But I thought a lot of really good horses did not get sold. Buyers maybe didn't feel they could afford the horses they wanted, so they missed out on the ones in the \$200,000 to \$300,000 range. There were also a lot of people there to watch the sale and to be there for the excitement, but maybe they weren't prepared to buy.

"In Florida, between the four sales, you have an enormous amount of horses to choose from," she added. "But at Barretts, the local guys only have the opportunity to buy in March and in May. There might be more people eager and willing to buy, and they are buying at all different prices."

Smith is feeling good about the small but select group she has fielded for Barretts 2006.

"I started out with six for the sale, but two came up with shins and one will mature a little later; I will take them to later sales," she said. "But the three I have here are a great little group. The Exploit colt (<u>hip 47</u>) worked super and the Songandaprayer (<u>hip 46</u>) is a real big colt that breezed in a very respectable :21 3/5.

"The Wild Wonder colt (<u>hip 146</u>) is a late May foal and he maybe hasn't come into his best yet, but he still worked a quarter in :22 [at the first preview]."

Still, Smith isn't counting on the fireworks of 2005.

"To be quite honest, that's the best way to be," she said. "You don't ever expect them to bring a couple million dollars. You have to keep a level head, enjoy the ride and hopefully hit a few homeruns along the way."

John and Marsha Antonelli were ecstatic after the Fasig-Tipton Calder Sale Feb. 28. The Antonellis bred the top-selling filly that day, a daughter of Johannesburg out their mare Piedras Negras (Unbridled) that was



purchased for \$1.1 million by Demi O'Byrne. It wasn't the Antonellis that scored at Calder, however--they had sold the filly to Leprechaun Racing for \$112,000 as a Fasig-Tipton July yearling, and Leprechaun turned the eye-catching profit seven months later. But the Antonellis

were more than satisfied with the final result.

"I am as happy as all get out when the horses I sell go on and do well," John Antonelli said. "It builds your reputation. Sure, there was that one moment where we thought, 'If only,' but we were excited as we could be to see her sell like that."

The Antonellis had planned on having a trio of twoyear-olds to sell at Barretts March, but buyers will now have to wait until the Barretts May Sale to get their hands on another Antonelli-bred.

"We have three absolutely drop-dead gorgeous babies in the sale, but the Touch Gold grew up too quickly," the California native offered. "He can run like the wind, but he got a little skinny and back at the knees, so we had to pull him out. And the Came Home has sore shins. We could make him look all right and he would sell well, but I won't sell a horse that I wouldn't want to buy personally.

"As for the Forest Wildcat filly, she is exceptional as well, but we decided we're going to keep her. We want to develop our own broodmare stock, because it is tough to find quality mares in the long-term. I think she would sell for a hefty amount, but I think its wiser to race her, then put her into our broodmare band."

Antonelli, who runs a document-imaging company in Whittier, California, purchased a 20-acre property in Santa Ynez four years ago and credits much of his success to farm trainer Greg Fanning. How did he and his wife get into the Thoroughbred business?

"I had money to throw away, apparently," he quipped, adding, "My good friend, Tom Stull, owns Tommytown Thoroughbreds, and he introduced me to the sport. He has a major operation in Santa Ynez, 100 mares and 100 babies. We had one racehorse in partnership, but I decided that probably wasn't where my satisfaction lay. I wanted to create something ongoing. I was more interested in the broodmare business."

Named J & M Thoroughbreds, the Antonelli operation is on a much smaller scale than Tommytown, and that's how they like it. "I'd like to have 15 to 20 quality mares and raise quality babies," Antonelli said. "We'll stay in that small niche. When you are too big, you can't give the horses the attention that they need. We are on top of each and every baby, constantly. If you have a big operation, you can't do that.

"If we can't provide a quality product and quality service, you shouldn't be doing business with us, period," he added. "That's been my philosophy all along, and it is the same in the horse business."
