The catalogue is 10 percent smaller than last year, but President Jerry McMahon is hopeful that the theory of quality over quantity will be well-received by the

buyers at the 2006 Barretts March Sale of Selected Two-Year-Olds in Training. Bidding begins at 2 p.m. today. "I was concerned that the smaller catalogue would be a problem, but it looks like the buyers are still coming to take a look," said McMahon. "We had great people at the first training preview--the major buyers were certainly in attendance. I think that indicates that they are tak-2005 Barretts Topper ing our sale seriously." Keeping the buyers interested is only part of the battle. For McMahon, the other side

of the sales equation is most important. "In the twoyear-old markets, the consignors are key," he remarked. "The buyers are comfortable with consignors more than they are with a particular venue. If you have consignors who do a good job, that's what attracts the buyers. It really does matter. We have a strong group, but it is smaller than what you find at the Eastern sales because of the proximity of those sales to where the Eastern consignors are based. We'd like to have five or six more Eastern consignors, but the consignors we have do a great job and produce very good horses." While most of the major players are expected to be in the Hinds Pavilion in Pomona this afternoon, there is one man who will be conspicuous in his absence. The late Bob Lewis had been a familiar face at Barretts since he became a member of racing's family in 1990 and he was the leading buyer at the sale last year, picking up five horses for a total of \$3,875,000--nearly 27 percent of the gross. But it is much more than his purchasing power that will be sorely missed this year. "It's hard to describe just how important he was to Southern California, and certainly Barretts was at the top of the list," McMahon said. "He bought his first Thoroughbreds at our sale in 1990. He was really a great friend, and he is irreplaceable, as so many have noted."

ROCKPORT HARBOR INJURED

Rockport Harbor (Unbridled's Song), fifth in Sunday's GIII Razorback Breeders' Cup H., exited the race with a severe cut on his right hind foot, according to The Blood-Horse. The four-year-old originally cut the foot while winning the 2004 GII Remsen S. and the current injury occured over the scar of that cut. It is severe

enough to have connections considering retirement for the starcrossed gray. "The cut is only about a sixteenth of an inch, but the real problem is I can take my fingernail and pull apart the edge of it," trainer John Servis explained to *Blood-Horse*. "And you can see moisture in there. The foot's not real hot, so I don't think it's infected, but it's definitely bothering him. It'll be touch and go for the next four or five

days to see if we even have a shot to get him 100 percent." During an unbeaten juvenile campaign, Rockport Harbor won the GIII Nashua S. and Remsen. He was second in last year's GIII Rebel S, and returned from a 10-month layoff to win the Feb. 11 GIII Essex H. A winner of five of eight starts to date, Rockport Harbor has earned \$324,800.

"We just wanted to give him something easy--a chance to stretch his legs before he gets on the plane tomorrow night," the fiveyear-old's trainer, William "Buff" Bradley said. Also on the Tuesday night flight: Mustanfar (Unbridled), Invasor (Arg) (Candy Stripes), Magna Graduate (Honor Grades), Host (Chi) (Hussonet), Relaxed Gesture (Ire) (Indian Ridge {Ire}) and Gaff (Maria's Mon).

(Barretts March preview cont.) If at First You Do Succeed

Consignor Jerry Bailey was so pleased with his results at the first under-tack show for the Barretts March Sale that he chose to sit out the second with his seven-horse consignment. The entire septet was out at the track Mar. 5, with three getting an eighth in :10 flat--the fastest time at the preview--with four stablemates going in :10 1/5. "You had to love it," Bailey said with a grin. "You never expect every one of your horses to work that well, but we were lucky. They all previewed very well." He added, "I won't work any of them back. They trained all week, Tuesday through Friday, and then the rains came and we haven't been able to track them since. We will just rest on our laurels." Bailey and partner Lance Robinson of Gulf Coast Farms have had their share of success as pinhookers, but the Gulf Coast trio expected to attract the most attention at Barretts this afternoon are all homebreds. "We have about 100 mares," Bailey explained. "Lance started his breeding operation about 12 or 15 years ago, and I got involved four or five years ago. We've grown from 35 to 50 to 75 to 100 mares, but we'll probably plateau in there somewhere. Every year, we cull the bottom end and add a few new ones." In addition to selling off some of the mares and staying involved in the two-year-old sales, Gulf Coast also offers a selection of yearlings at auction every year. "We have sold a lot of yearlings that went on to do well at the two-year-old sales, but we were happy with what we sold them for," Bailey said. "Being at both the yearling and the two-year-old sales just gives us another option when it comes to selling our horses."

Barretts President Jerry McMahon on the state of the market:

He worked a quarter in :20 4/5 at the first preview; the four horses sold at Barretts March that broke the :21 barrier went on to win graded stakes. He will try to follow in the hoofsteps of last year's ill-fated topper, the \$1.9-million What a Song, and 2005 graduate Brother Derek. The latter exited this consignment after a:20 4/5 trial, went on to win the GI Hollywood Futurity and is one of the early favorites for the GI Kentucky Derby after going two-for-two this year. "It's kind of a neat plateau he has reached," said B.C.3. partner John Brocklebankof the Richter Scale colt. "I try not to shoot off about him too much, because I don't want to jinx him, but it's hard not to brag about him. When you see a horse work in :20 and change, and come out of it in fine fashion, you are probably looking at quite an athlete." Named Call Zoll, he was an \$85,000 KEESEP yearling purchase.

A first graded winner is a significant landmark in the career of any stallion, but especially so when the stallion was the highest-priced new stallion of his year.

The stallion I am referring to, you will probably have guessed, is Point Given, who got off the mark when his son Go Between narrowly landed the GIII Palm Beach S. two days ago--on the same day that Point Given's sire Thunder Gulch was successfully represented by Balance in the GI Santa Anita Oaks.

Point Given's initial fee of \$125,000 put him in a league of his own among the first-season sires of 2002, with Tiznow next in line at \$30,000. Needless to say, Point Given's standing took a serious knock when he could finish no higher than 33rd among 2005's leading first-crop sires. His figures stood at only two winners from 17 runners, and his slow start was reflected in some disappointing sales figures. His second-crop yearlings, sired at an adjusted fee of \$75,000, achieved a median of only \$30,000, and his third-crop foals, again sired at \$75,000, averaged \$24,100.

People had every right to expect more of Point Given, even allowing for the fact that his size and his stamina might combine to limit his success as a sire of juveniles. After all, his size--he stands nearly 17 hands-hadn't stopped him from being rated the second-best juvenile male of 2000, when he won three of his six starts, beginning in August at Del Mar. His victories in the GIII Kentucky Cup Juvenile S. and the GI Hollywood Futurity book-ended a pair of Grade I seconds, including an excellent effort in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile.

The important thing to remember is that Point Given was an even better three-year-old. A winner of the last two legs of the Triple Crown, he went on to dominate both the GI Haskell and the GI Travers and his only loss, in the Kentucky Derby, was totally forgotten by the time of the Eclipse voting. An undisputed winner of the three-year-old male award, he was also a decisive victor for the Horse of the Year title. His achievements earned him a first book of 104 mares, with 71 live foals.

There was always every chance that Point Given's progeny would also start to shine in their sophomore year, and this is beginning to happen. One son, Great Point, was a good second to Barbaro in the GIII Holy Bull S. over a mile and an eighth last month and now Go Between has taken the GIII Palm Beach S. over the same distance on turf. We might also soon be seeing the likes of Point Determined and Point of Impact start to go on to better things.

Although turf racing never entered Point Given's agenda, it isn't surprising that Go Between is flourishing on the green stuff. His dam Mediation, an Irish-bred daughter of Caerleon, ventured onto the main track only once in 11 starts in the U.S., having earned a Timeform rating of 110 during a busy three-year-old season on the turf in Ireland.

I must admit to having been a fully paid-up subscriber to Caerleon's fan club, and I admired him both as a racehorse and sire. An unbeaten two-year-old, Caerleon went on to win the French Derby and the Benson and Hedges Gold Cup (now the Juddmonte International). He was also a very attractive, well-bred individual who cost \$800,000 as a yearling in 1981.

Having seen him develop into a champion sire, capable of getting a very wide range of high-class winners in a wide range of countries, I fully expected him to become a major success as a sire of broodmares. This belief was influenced by the fact that his sire Nijinsky and grandsire Northern Dancer had been champions in this area, and his pedigree also featured the name of Princequillo, who racked up eight titles as champion sire of broodmares.

Altogether, this member of the famous La Troienne family looked assured of stardom as a broodmare sire, but that hasn't materialised. With over 1,700 offspring of racing age to the end of last year, Caerleon's daughters could hardly fail to have produced some important winners, with such as Stuka, Avonbridge, Patavellian, River Keen, Dimitrova, Mutamam, Taiki Shuttle and Mutafaweq among his Group 1 winners. However, there haven't been many superstars and I feel a little cheated.

Mediation was one of Caerleon's speedy winners, with the mare inheriting her speed from her female line. Go Between's second dam, Redeem Herself, was a useful Irish sprinter and the next dam, Redowa, was a sister to Yellow God, a top-class two-year-old who was second in the 2000 Guineas, and to St Alphage, sire of the champion sprinter Sandford Lad.

Although there is plenty of speed in Go Between's female line, both his sire and broodmare sire were Classic winners over a mile and a half, so there is every chance that he will stay a mile and a quarter--and continue improving.
