Made the usual Zito second-out jump and looked like a Derby contender when he paired that figure at Calder. The slight backward move at Gulfstream might be excusable as a bounce off two efforts, but the Tampa race that followed was really bad, and at this point his condition is suspect. If he's going anywhere soon he needs to move forward now, but he's not fast enough with these regardless.

2 Church Service Pulpit 30-1 Is way too slow to compete in this very strong Gotham.

3 Eagle Head Devon Lane 30-1 Ran a good one in his second start, and may have a future, but comes back on only two weeks rest while trying to stretch out. A bounce is much more likely than the necessary forward move.

4 Like Now Jules 15-1 Wasn't much as a juvenile, but moved up considerably over the last couple of months, along with most of McLaughlin's barn. This one gets about a point in weight from the favorites, has a pedigree that's okay for distance on both sides and has figures good enough to make him a borderline contender.

5 Putonyerdancinshuz Malibu Moon 50-1 Is undefeated, but he would have to improve about 6 Thoro-Graph points (about 11 lengths at this distance) to make a serious impact here.

6 Achilles of Troy Notebook 9-5 Moved up with the addition of Lasix in December, and his last two have been enormous. Some of the Paraneck horses in recent years have been pushed hard and raced close together over the winter, but this one has had his recent races nicely spaced, and there is no reason to think he won't fire big again, which makes him the most likely winner. This horse is already running fast enough to be a major factor in the Triple Crown races, and his full sister was late developing. The big danger is that he could be peaking too soon, and tailing off in May.

Ran once last summer, and something presumably went wrong since he didn't reappear until Gulfstream. He ran very well, then put in a giant effort over a sloppy track in his last. Will take lots of money because of his connections, undefeated record and big last-out figure, but he is the kind we like to bet against: the big jump to a huge effort for an early-season 3yo is likely to take a toll, especially with a horse that previously went to the sidelines, and he'll be trying two turns for the first time. The fastest horse, but a bet-against.

8 Sunshine Alpine Gold Case 10-1 Is trained by the recently hot Gary Contessa, and will take some money because of that and his strong finish in a sprint stakes. But he would have to improve quite a bit to get seriously involved here, and Gold Case's runners tend to do better short (see TGI in sire profile).

9 Greeley's Legacy <u>Mr. Greeley</u> 15-1 Is by a sire of late developers, and shows a pattern of gradual development that paid off with a good one last time. But that effort is likely to cause a bounce, and the requisite forward move is unlikely.

10 Sweetnorthernsaint Sweetsouthernsaint 5-1 Has made only three starts on dirt, and all were very good, especially his last when stretched out. He's had six weeks since and gets about a point in weight from the only two faster than him going in, which are plusses, but he's drawn outside, which is not. Still, a contender.

11 One Way FlightPrecise End20-1Has an ouchy pattern with figures that are only borderline here, and the post hurts.

Overview - **Keyed Entry** might bounce enough to get out of the exotics, so the right play might be exotics, mostly with **Achilles of Troy** on top.

RMTC UPDATES PROGRESS OF INITIATIVES Officials with the Racing Medication and Testing Consortium provided an update on current and future initiatives at a press briefing held at The Jockey Club offices in Lexington, Kentucky yesterday. The report included the RMTC's model penalty guidelines for medication violations, which were made available earlier this year and are in the adoption process in California, Kentucky and Washington. According to Dr. Scot Waterman, executive director of RMTC, the consortium examined a comprehensive list of drugs individually to establish a "penalty class" before creating a grid that matched drugs with recommended penalties. The most significant penalties are reserved for drugs with no therapeutic purpose in the horse. In addition to trainers, owners with multiple violations and veterinarians could also be sanctioned. "We want to force owners to be more involved," said Waterman. "If they're on the hook, we might be able to stop some of this in the first place." Throughout 2006, the RMTC will be working with veterinarians, pharmacologists and researchers to develop withdrawal times and threshold levels for therapeutic medications with the intention of creating a national manual similar to one that is available in Canada, listing therapeutic medication withdrawal times for horsemen and veterinarians. "If we can pull this off," said Waterman, "withdrawal times across state lines will change racing completely in the U.S. and will cut the number of positives in half." Waterman also indicated that the RMTC is funding more than \$600,000 in research into performance-enhancing drugs, therapeutics, contaminants and "unknown" substances. It was also announced that the Big Event Team, which consists of teams of experienced investigators from the Thoroughbred Racing Protective Bureau, Standardbred Investigative Services and state racing commissions, will be on site to coordinate backstretch security at 23 major racing events in 2006.

JONES DEFENDS PAYMENT OF COMMISSIONS TO FORMER JACKSON ADVISOR

by Ray Paulick, courtesy The Blood-Horse Airdrie Stud owner Brereton C. Jones said he paid consulting fees and commissions of at least \$130,000 after two Keeneland sales to trainer Bruce Headley, one of six defendants in a lawsuit filed by California winemaker Jess Jackson for fraudulent misrepresentation in the purchase of horses and horse farm property. Jones made the admission during a sworn deposition taken Feb. 24 in Lexington. The deposition was included as a supporting exhibit in a motion--filed in Woodford County District Court Thursday in Versailles, Kentucky--attempting to subpoena additional information from Airdrie Stud on horses purchased by Headley. Also included in the motion was Jackson's amended complaint against Emmanuel de Seroux and his Narvick International bloodstock agency; bloodstock agents Brad Martin, Frederic Saugue, Fernando Diaz-Valdez; trainer Headley; and Buckram Oak Holdings, a company operated until recently by Mahmoud Fustok, who died last month. The suit, filed in California by Jackson and his Four Star Stables and Stonestreet Thoroughbred Holdings, seeks nearly \$18 million plus punitive damages. It alleges the defendants defrauded Jackson through a conspiracy involving secret, undisclosed commissions in private and public auction bloodstock acquisitions and in his purchase of Buckram Oak Farm in Kentucky. In the deposition, Jackson attorney Richard Getty asked Jones about two specific checks made out to Headley for \$17,000 and \$86,687.50 and a line item in an Airdrie Stud accounting sheet that indicated payment of \$27,000 for a "consulting fee." Rockport Harbor to Stay in Training:

Multiple graded-stakes winner **Rockport Harbor** (Unbridled's Song), who reinjured his right hind foot when finishing fourth in last Sunday's GIII Razorback H., will



be kept in training for the time being. The four-year-old underwent a procedure in his Oaklawn Park stall yesterday, where a blacksmith "cut away no flesh, only scar tissue," according to trainer John Servis. "The wall seems OK, but it is going to be touch and go for Rocky the next four or five days," Servis said. "He is in no discomfort." Owner Rick

Porter went into more detail, according to *The Blood-Horse*. "The initial findings are cautiously optimistic," Porter told

the publication. "[The blacksmith] cut away the scar tissue on the hoof and found some additional bacteria, which he cleaned out. He could not see deep into the foot because we didn't want to cut into the meat of the foot. What he saw was promising. The most important decision was to make a special shoe to protect that quarter of his hoof that has been damaged and patched. The blacksmith asked John not to exercise him for four or five days. He said that Rocky should feel like he has a new foot within a couple of days or less.' But Porter added, "There is no quarantee that he won't encounter additional problems when John begins to bear down on him with long gallops." Concluding the colt's career had been mentioned following this latest injury, but Porter elaborated, "Retirement is postponed and we will continue to train him toward a race in the future. The timing is uncertain. As long as he progresses and holds up under aggressive training, we will continue to keep him in training. In the event he develops soreness in his foot, we will probably retire him. It is day by day, week by week. We're optimistic and hoping for the best."

Nasty Affair Dies:

Multiple-stakes winner and producer Nasty Affair (Nasty and Bold--L'Affaire, by Seventh Landing) was euthanized Mar. 9 due to the infirmities of old age. The 22-year-old mare won seven stakes and was second in the GIII Vagrancy H. and GIII First Flight H. She is the dam of multiple stakes-winner Donna Doo (Spend a Buck), graded-stakes winner Mountain Affair and graded-stakes placed Hell Cat (Tabasco Cat). Her final foal is a yearling Hold That Tiger filly. She was owned by Atlanta-based Long Grove Bloodstock LLC President Steven Sansone and was buried at Indian Creek Farm in Paris, Kentucky. "I had her for just over two years," Sansone said. "She was very successful on the track and as a [broodmare]. Mike Evans and his staff at Indian Creek handled her with great respect. She will be missed."

Steward Makes Declaration in Intercontinental Case:

Gina Powell, a former California associate steward, testified Wednesday that Sam Templeton, the director of Del Mar security, stated that he did provide information to the board of stewards, California Horse Racing Board investigators and CHRB Executive Director Ingrid Fermin regarding the late Lasix shot received by Intercontinental (GB) before the running of the GII Palomar H. at Del Mar last September, and that the information was forwarded well before the running of the race, according to The Blood-Horse. The Lasix shot was administered 40 minutes late, but Fermin has maintained that neither she nor the stewards knew about the problem prior to the race. In her declaration however, given to Los Angeles attorney Ronald Caswell under penalty of perjury, Powell said, "Templeton told me [shortly after 12:20 p.m.] he had forwarded all materials and information to the front-side offices, specifically to the Board of Stewards, CHRB investigators and Fermin, for them to review and scratch the horse." Powell added that she had radioed Fermin to discuss the infraction, but that Fermin never responded. Intercontinental won the Palomar, but when the infraction came to light, the owners of at least two of the other runners in the field requested a redistribution of purse money. Scott Chaney is investigating the case for the CHRB and is expected to deliver his recommendations to the board Mar. 22.
