#### **OBS MARCHES IN**

The Ocala Breeders' Sales Company begins its March Selected Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training this morning at the OBS complex in Ocala, Florida, with the first of two sessions getting underway at 11:00 a.m. Some

535 juveniles have been cataloged for the event, about 100 fewer than in 2005. The March Sale has gained momentum in recent years, spurred on by the success of horses that have passed through the ring here. The 2004 renewal produced **Eclipse Award-winning** 

sprinter Lost in the Fog, and no fewer than 11 stakes winners have come out of last year's sale. The most notable of that lot is Cause to Believe, a son of Maria's Mon that Becky Thomas's Seguel Bloodstock sold to trainer Jerry Hollendorfer for just \$30,000. With five stakes wins to his credit, Cause to Believe is one of California's leading Triple Crown hopefuls. Noting the improving quality of horse being offered, OBS officials

are quick to credit the consignors for the sale's good fortunes. "It's the consignors we have to be thankful for," said OBS Director of Sales Tom Ventura. "They're very comfortable now selling any level of horse with us in March. They're not concerned about selling an upper-end horse here and the money not being here, be-

cause it is. Some of the bigger consignors, Leprechaun and [Niall] Brennan and Wavertree, have brought a better group than they have in the past to this sale." That, according to Ventura, could equate to a prosperous 2006 event. "When we're able to catalog horses by A.P. Indy and Danzig and Distorted Humor--very popular bloodlines--along with the athletic horses that buyers have become accustomed to getting here, it looks to me like it will add up to a good sale," Ventura commented. "We'll see [today] and Wednesday if that bears out." Hip Happenings, p4-5

#### A TOUGH ACT TO FOLLOW AT ADENA

Last year's Adena Springs Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale saw the average rise 118 percent to a record \$85,130, the median soar 122 percent to a record \$60,000 and the sales topper, a colt by Golden Missile, bring a record \$500,000. The sixth renewal of the event, held last night at Adena Springs South in Williston, Florida, did not realize quite such lofty figures, but the Adena connections were satisfied with the results nonetheless. "It's tough to keep improving once you reach a certain level," said Adena South farm manager Mark Roberts. "But the sale was good, the buyback rate was down from last year and overall we were pleased." He added, "The market has been very selective and you seem to be at a disadvantage by not breezing. But there seems to be plenty of money for good horses. The group of buyers here is getting stronger because the sire power is getting stronger every year and the sale is becoming more popular. It's great to have guys like Mike Ryan and John Kimmel and Mike Machowsky patronize our sale." The sales topper could have been hip 52, a son of El Prado (Ire) out of a halfsister to MGISW Free House, but Adena Springs owner Frank Stronach bought the gray back for \$675,000. He indicated that the reserve had been set at \$750,000, and that he was later approached by two parties interested in a partnership. If he sells a share in the colt, however, Stronach will retain the stallion rights. The Austrian businessman would have liked to see bigger prices for his two-year-old offering, but he was philosophical. "It's the old saying--when you sell you expect more, and when you're buying you think you paid too much," Stronach said. "But we came here to sell; we sold [62.5] percent of the horses, which is better than the national average." Adena Sale cont. p2-3

#### Still Laughing...

The star of the Barretts March Sale six days ago, boasting both the top colt and the top filly, Distorted Humor was a hot prospect once again at Adena

Springs. The highest-priced two-year-old on the evening was hip 54, a daughter of the WinStar stallion out of SP Kris Is It (Kris S.). She was purchased for \$400,000 by bloodstock agent Mike Ryan, who also bought the Adena sales topper last year. "They come in all shapes and sizes, but

they run," Ryan said of the Distorted Humor progeny. "It doesn't matter what sort of mare they're out of, they run." A May foal, yesterday's topper is a half-sister to SP Wise Investor (Belong to Me), from the family of Japanese stakes winner Select Green (Capote) and SW and GSP Outrigger (Gulch). "I thought she was the best Distorted Humor filly I'd ever seen, or one of the best," Ryan said. "I liked her size, and she had a great chest and was very correct. She has plenty of natural speed, but being out of a Kris S. mare, there's no reason to think she won't go two turns."

#### Singing The Blues...

Mike Ryan warmed up for his sales-topping effort early in the night, going to \$280,000 for hip 11, a bay filly by El Prado (Ire) out of MSW and GSP Blue Begonia (Seeking the Gold). Named Blue Carnation, the Floridabred is from the family of graded winners Morning Frolic, Biding Time and Be Cool. She was purchased for the same anonymous client as the marquis Distorted Humor filly. "She showed plenty of speed during the breeze," said Ryan. "She had a very nice pedigree and great presence. The way she is bred, she looks like she'll want to go two turns."



#### The Midas Touch...

Mike Ryan also picked up the top-selling colt yester-

day, going to \$330,000 for hip 104, a son of Touch Gold out of SP Tina Dynamite (Dynaformer). Ryan was acting as agent for a different client than the one who purchased the fillies, but would not identify the buyer, saying only, "He's a guy I buy yearlings for every year." The Irish horseman was making only his second trip to the Adena sale, but he is sure to be active at the venue in the future. "I'm glad I came here and edu-

cated myself last year," he said. "I worked the sale pretty hard [Sunday and Monday] and I think the horses I bought could be any kind. They look like mile-and-aneighth or mile-and-a-quarter horses."

#### Awesome, Mon...

Hip 92, a son of Awesome Again out of Reggae Queen (Dynaformer), will be carrying the colors of Centennial Farms after realizing a final bid of \$300,000 last night. Centennial President Don Little Jr. signed the ticket for the bay, named Dancing Preacher. The colt's second dam is SW Valid Victress (Valid Appeal), who produced champion and GI Breeders' Cup F/M Turf winner Perfect Sting (Red Ransom). "He had a beautiful walk from the side and was just a real solid colt," Little said. "He'll go to the farm in Virginia and finish his training there. When he's ready to go, he'll let us know." Praising the Adena juveniles, Little added, "What's nice is that they haven't done a lot of the early breezing, and they fit into our program."







#### Mullins Charges Work...

Choctaw Nation (Louis Quatorze) turned in his final major work before Saturday's G1 Dubai World Cup yesterday at Nad al Sheba. The Jeff Mullins trainee, who will be making his first start for new owner Sheikh Rashid bin Mohammed al Maktoum in the World Cup, went 1200 meters in 1:12.88. Choctaw Nation was third in last year's World Cup. Mullins also sent out Captain Squire (Flying Chevron) for a scorching halfmile breeze of "45 and change," according to the conditioner. The seven-year-old gelding was prepping for Saturday's G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen. He was third in the 2003 renewal of that race.

G1 Dubai Duty Free hopeful The Tin Man (Alleged) worked 1200 meters at Nad al Sheba yesterday in 1:13.85. "He seemed to get over it pretty good," exercise rider Crystal Brown said after the drill. "He had to go way on the outside with the dogs up and he looked around a little, but he seemed to do it pretty well."

Jet West (Western Fame) worked a half mile yesterday in :46.50. "He looked just like he did at Santa Anita," commented trainer Ted West. "He looked like he was moving good and taking to the track well." Winner of the California Cup Sprint H. last November and most recently fourth in the Feb. 18 GII San Carlos H., Jet West is entered in Saturday's G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen.

Trainer Doug O'Neill sent out G1 Dubai Duty Free hopeful Whilly (Ire) (Sri Pekan) and Golden Shaheen entrant Thor's Echo (Swiss Yodeler) to work yesterday. Last year's Duty Free runner-up, Whilly went six furlongs in 1:13.79 over the main track. Thor's Echo went five furlongs in a bullet :59.40.

South African trainer Mike de Kock sent out a gaggle of World Cup card runners to work yesterday over the Nad al Sheba turf. Duty Free contender Irridescence (SAf) (Caesour) went 1000 meters in 1:00.13 with jockey Weichong Marwing in the irons. Fellow Duty Free entrant Tyson (SAf) (Silvino) went 1000 meters in 1:01.27. G2 Godolphin Mile hopeful Lundy's Liability (Brz) (Candy Stripes) clocked :22.2 for the final 400 meters of his workout. Sheema Classic hopeful Falstaff (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) clocked his final 400 meters in :22.7, with fellow Classic entrant Oracle West (SAf) (Western Winter) covering his final 400 meters in :23.8.

#### Cordero Enjoying Dubai Experience...

Retired Hall of Fame jockey Angel Cordero, the regular exercise rider for World Cup hopeful Magna Graduate (Honor Grades), thought he would know what to expect on his first trip to Dubai; he had seen Nad al Sheba on the Nintendo game Gallop Racer. But Cordero is even more impressed with the real thing. "It's beautiful here," Cordero said yesterday. "I am very impressed. It's like a dream. I've never seen stuff like this before. The hotels are like palaces and everyone is so helpful. I just hope we win--that would make it even nicer." In addition to the Todd Pletcher-trained Magna Graduate, Cordero has also picked up freelance morning rides on G2 UAE Derby hopeful Dominguin (Per) (Domingo) and G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen runner Gaff (Maria's Mon).

When the great Danzig died at the start of the year, there weren't many major races missing from the 29-year-old stallion's wide-ranging résumé. The most glaring omission was undoubtedly the Kentucky Derby, the only Triple Crown event to slip through Danzig's net.

When his first-crop sons Stephan's Odyssey and Chief's Crown filled the place and show spots behind Spend a Buck in the 1985 Derby, it seemed only a matter of time before a son of Danzig received the rose garland, but it wasn't to be.

Instead it was left to his son Polish Navy to fill the void, when he sired the 1993 winner Sea Hero, and Danzig's influence also shone through in 2000, when Danzig's daughter Angel Fever was responsible for Fusaichi Pegasus, and in 2003, when Distorted Humoranother out of a Danzig mare-sired Funny Cide. Now there seems to be a growing possibility that Danzig could also make his mark on the 2006 Derby, this time via his son Langfuhr, sire of the very progressive Lawyer Ron.

Langfuhr did well in the Derby two years ago, when his son Imperialism chased home Smarty Jones and Lion Heart, having warmed up with victories in the San Vicente and San Rafael, plus a third-place finish in the Santa Anita Derby. Lawyer Ron's qualifications are at least as impressive as Imperialism's and he has surely added to his appeal by proving in the GIII Rebel S. that he doesn't need to go off in front to produce his best form. He has now followed Smarty Jones's example of winning the Southwest S. and Rebel S. and will next try to emulate the 2004 Derby hero in the GII Arkansas Derby.

The question is whether Lawyer Ron will have enough gas left in the tank by the time he lines up at Churchill Downs, when--all being well--he will be racing for the 15th time.

Such a heavy campaign isn't unprecedented among recent Derby winners, as Charismatic was racing for the 15th time--and eighth time as a three-year-old--when he sprang his surprise in 1999. Real Quiet and Sea Hero had been kept busy, too, the Derby being their 13th and 11th starts, respectively, but such an aggressive approach is pretty unconventional nowadays, as Giacomo and War Emblem were racing for the eighth time; Smarty Jones, Funny Cide, Monarchos and Silver Charm for the seventh; and Fusaichi Pegasus and Grindstone for the sixth.

On the plus side, Lawyer Ron's races this year have been quite well spaced and he has some pretty tough individuals among his immediate ancestors, including Langfuhr. In competing 11 times as a three-year-old and 23 times in all, Langfuhr showed that he had inherited an ample measure of the durability displayed by three of his four grandparents.

Northern Dancer was born as late as May 27, but that didn't stop him racing nine times as a juvenile and his victory in the Kentucky Derby came on his 15th start--16th if you include an exhibition race in Florida. Those starts were packed into a 10-month period, so Northern Dancer was as tough as he was talented.

Danzig's dam Pas de Nom raced 42 times over four seasons, whereas Langfuhr's broodmare sire, Briartic, raced at least 13 times in each of his first four years on the track, ultimately retiring as a veteran of 63 races. We shouldn't forget either that Langfuhr is inbred 3x3 to Nearctic, who packed 47 starts into four years of action.

In view of this background, is it any surprise that many of Langfuhr's progeny are admirably tough? His principal earners, Wando and Mobil, raced 23 times and 29 times respectively, with both winning over the Kentucky Derby distance.

Those two came from Langfuhr's second crop, and their two-year-old exploits contributed to some excellent figures in 2002, when Langfuhr's first-crop daughter Imperial Gesture completed a Grade I double in the Beldame S. and Gazelle H.

The promise of these first two crops was sufficient to produce a surge in Langfuhr's popularity. He covered 144 mares at Vinery in 2003, for 105 live foals, and his continued success resulted in a book of 141 mares, for 115 live foals, in 2004, when he stood at an increased fee of \$25,000 in his first season at Lane's End Farm. Although demand for his services fell quite steeply when his fee was raised to \$30,000 in 2005, there is every reason to think that Langfuhr is heading for a profitable few years, with his crops of 2004 and 2005 being his largest so far.

Lawyer Ron's emergence from his sire's fifth crop maintains Langfuhr's record of having sired at least one graded winner per crop. These graded winners are out of a wide variety of mares. Imperial Gesture was foaled when her dam was a veteran of 24, while Imperialism is out of a mare who once changed hands for \$4,500, and the GIII winner Jambalaya is out of a mare sold for the equivalent of \$5,363 in 2003.

Lawyer Ron is also out of a mare, Donation, who struggled to find a buyer. She was bought back by the late James T. Hines Jr for only \$1,000 at Fasig-Tipton's 2003 December mixed sale, and was then sold privately. She visited Hines' stallion Elhayq in 2004.

Donation is by Lord Avie, a champion two-year-old who probably never quite succeeded in shaking off the stigma of being a son of the minor winner Lord Gaylord. Even so, Lord Avie, who just about stayed 1½ miles, sired some very good winners, with much of his success coming through his daughters. Among them were the Grade I or Grade II winners Magical Maiden, Ode, Fly For Avie, Metamorphose, Witchful Thinking, Feasibility Study, Avie's Fancy and Avie's Gal.

In view of this lengthy list of talented distaffers, it isn't surprising that Lord Avie is occasionally making his mark as a broodmare sire, with such as Miss Houdini, Our New Recruit, St Averil and Lawyer Ron among his daughters' best efforts. The interesting one here is Miss Houdini, as this winner of the Del Mar Debutante was also sired by a son of Danzig, Belong to Me.

Although Lawyer Ron's first three dams are by none-too-fashionable stallions in Lord Avie, Mr Redoy (a Grade I winner over 1½ miles) and Rambunctious, his female line traces to Obedient, a half-sister by Mahmoud to Missy Baba. This famous mare is ancestress of A.P. Indy, Summer Squall and Lemon Drop Kid, so Triple Crown success is nothing new for this female line.


