

RECORDS BELONG TO OBS

With a flurry of activity just after the noon hour, highlighted by a bidding war between Buzz Chace and representatives of Darley for a handsome son of Belong to Me, several records fell by the wayside yesterday in

an energized second and final session of the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's March Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training in Ocala, Florida. When the dust settled, OBS saw its 24-year-old record broken for a horse sold at auction. Chace, bidding on behalf of New Jersey real estate developer Al Gold, etched his name into the record books when he went to \$1.8 million for hip 362 from the consignment of Ciaran Dunne's Wavertree Stables. The

previous record at an OBS auction was established in 1982, when K D Princess, the dam of Conquistador Cielo, sold in foal to Timeless Moment for \$1.725 million at the OBS Fall Mixed Sale. Warners, a colt by Dehere, held the OBS March record, set in 2001 on a \$1.05-million bid from Eugene Melnyk. OBS cont. p2-6

Banner Sale for OBS...

With a record price tag for an OBS horse, and new marks for gross (\$31,044,000), average (\$108,545) and median (\$75,000), the 2006 renewal of the March Sale exceeded the expectations of sale officials. Still, Director of Sales Tom Ventura admits to approaching the sale with a healthy store of optimism. "I thought we had put together a pretty good catalog, the best we've had for a March sale," he said. "The consignors targeted some of their top horses for this sale, and going in we felt confident." That confidence received a further boost Tuesday when the opening session--widely regarded much weaker than Wednesday's--concluded with solid gains. "[Tuesday] was a very good session, with the median up so high [50 percent] and the buyback rate at a reasonable level [28 percent]," Ventura explained. "We were confident knowing we had some stars for day two. Everything was in place for a very big day. But did I expect it to be this good? No."

thought he'd bring a lot of money. He was one of the best working horses in the sale, and he did it so easily." Hip 362's work, a :21 flat breeze during the Mar. 11 undertack preview, earned him the bullet for the distance. In addition to his obvious natural talent, added Chace, the colt has a great temperament. "He has been a perfect gentleman around the barn," he said. "He has a great demeanor." Florida pinhooker Jimmy Gladwell, who, along with his wife Martha is part of Darley's two-year-old scouting

team, was on the phone with John Ferguson in Dubai and was philosophical in defeat. "Obviously, we had a tough competitor today in Buzz Chace," said Gladwell. "He's been buying these things for a long time and does a great job, and it's nice to have competition like him around. It keeps us on our toes."

What They're Saying At The Sales...

Consignor Ciaran Dunne (Wavertree Stables), on the \$1.8-million Belong to Me colt:

"People were talking about this horse from July of last year. Before the September sale started, [his owners] had me go look at him. They thought back then he was a special horse. Physically, at 14 months old, he looked like you could put tack on him and bring him to the track. It was a tremendous opportunity for us to get him, and that a guy would put that much faith in you on a horse he thinks that much of. It's great that it worked out for them."

Fortunate Decision...

When the folks at Dapple Bloodstock, formed during the 1990s by Mike Akers, put a handsome son of Belong to Me through last year's Keeneland September Sale, they were testing the waters more than anything. Cataloged deep into the sale as hip 3500, the yearling probably wouldn't draw the attention he deserved, they reasoned, and when bidding ground to a halt at

\$105,000, they were more than happy to buy the colt back. Seven months later, they are looking pretty smart. Yesterday, the bay, bred by Akers, Jeff Bowen and Randy Zeller, brought an OBS record of \$1.8 million. Even given the confidence he

had in the youngster, Akers said the price was far more than he expected. "We thought \$750,000 to a million," he said. "We were fortunate to have to the top players here on him, and they blew past our reserve, which was in the \$500,000 range. We weren't trying to be cute with it. We just let the market set the price." The colt, hip 362, is the first out of the Royal Academy mare Vassar, acquired privately by Dapple from Helen Andrews. Dapple purchased Vassar's dam Dixie Fine (L'Emigrant) for Andrews for \$155,000 out of the 1996 Keeneland November Sale, and bought Vassar following her unsuccessful trip to the 2004 Keeneland January Sale, where she RNA'd for \$57,000 with this colt in utero. Hip 362 was born and raised at Viking Stud in Lexington, and Akers praised the Littrell family operation. "They take care of our mares, and they did a great job with this colt," he said. Vassar, who has a yearling colt by Stormy Atlantic, is due to foal to Johan and is booked to Afleet Alex.

Career Score for Dunne...

"If this is what \$2 million feels like, I'd hate to feel \$16 [million]. That would be beyond me." That's what Ciaran Dunne deadpanned shortly after selling the topper through his Wavertree Stables. "You know, being prejudiced or not, we thought he was the best horse coming into the sale and thought, five, six, maybe seven [hundred thousand]," added Dunne.

"But cheers to Buzz Chace. Obviously, he thought as much of him as we did." It was Dunne's biggest score as a consignor, but the Irishman wasn't about to accept credit for the accomplishment. "The people that made this happen are my crew; my wife Amy, Mark Edmonds, John Howard, Sal Ruivera," said Dunne. "We have a tremendous bunch of grooms and riders that have been with us for a long time. These are the guys that make this happen. Basically, all I am is a traveling shoe salesman. It's not me. I'm lucky to have these guys here that can get this done for me."

Livin' on a Prayer...

Songandaprayer enjoyed a banner day during the second session at OBS, capped by the stallion's final offering of the afternoon, which brought \$485,000 from Motohide Aoki's Greenhill Stud. Purchased to race in Japan, the Apr. 8 foal is out of the eight-year-old mare Daisy Dukes (Ghazi). Consigned by Eisaman Equine, the juvenile recorded the fastest breeze of the first session Mar. 11, sprinting an eighth of a mile in :10 flat. "We didn't think we could get him, because we thought he would bring about \$1 million," said Hidenori Gyoda, agent for Greenhill Stud. Explaining the interest in the colt, Gyoda added, "We liked everything about him. He is a gorgeous animal, has a lot of muscle and plenty of pedigree." Also bringing a healthy return for her sire was hip 290, bought for \$200,000. Bobby Hurley of Devil Eleven Stable signed the ticket for the Florida-bred, who is out of Sister James (Diablo). Consigned by Off The Hook LLC, the \$50,000 OBSAUG recorded the co-fastest time of :10 flat for an eighth Mar. 11. The eight-year-old stallion enjoyed his biggest score of the day with hip 357, who brought \$650,000. In total three juveniles sold for a total of \$1,335,000, averaging \$445,000.

It's All in the Chace...

Day Two at OBS may have started off to a shaky start, but when things finally got moving, records were left in tatters. Sitting by the back walking ring, agent Buzz Chace, acting on behalf of New Jersey real estate developer Al Gold, didn't miss a beat, handing over \$650,000 for hip 357, a colt by sophomore sire Songandaprayer. Purchased for the Double H Stables of Norma Hess and Marianne Hesse, the chestnut, who was consigned by Hartley/De Renzo Thoroughbreds, will be trained by Todd Pletcher. "To tell you the truth, I thought he'd go higher, given the people who were on him," said Chace. "He's by a hot sire [Songandaprayer], in fact he stands like his father..he's a really nice horse." Out of the 14-year-old Valid Appeal mare Valid Expression, the \$105,000 OBSAUG yearling purchase covered a guarter mile in :21 flat during the first breeze session Mar. 11. Consignor Dean De Renzo, who came over to offer Chace a congratulatory pat on the back, was all smiles after the sale. "We thought he was a really nice colt, and of course we're always pleased with a sale like that," said De Renzo. "We knew he'd sell well. I never try to have a number in my head coming into a sale, but he's a real good horse and we knew he'd do all right."

Darley Rebounds With Indian Charlie Filly...

The folks at Darley suffered defeat when Buzz Chace outlasted them for the record Belong to Me colt, but Sheikh Mohammed's organization got a fine consolation prize in hip 368, an Indian Charlie filly that brought a final bid of \$1 million from agent Jimmy Gladwell. As on Tuesday when he bought the session's Deputy Commander topper, Gladwell was on the phone with John Ferguson back in Dubai. Hip 368 was by far the highest-priced filly ever to go through the ring at OBS March, eclipsing Yankee Victor's daughter Yankee Million, who elicited a \$575,000 offer from Narvick International at the 2004 renewal. Hip 367's quartermile work in :21 1/5 at the Mar. 11 show--a tick slower than the sale topper--caught the eye of several members of the Darley team. "Jimmy Bell [Darley representative] was here earlier in the week, and he really liked her a lot," said Gladwell. "Martha [Jimmy's wife] saw her breeze last week--I was in California--and was very impressed with her on the race track. We've watched her train all week, and she's just done everything she needs to do. John isn't real keen on buying a lot of fillies at the two-year-old sales, but this filly seemed pretty special." Hip 368, a half sister to stakes-winner V Formation (Proud Birdie), was consigned by Mike and Britt Mulligan's Leprechaun Racing. She was a \$67,000 Fasig-Tipton July yearling. It was the second time in three weeks that Leprechaun consigned a seven-figure filly to auction; a Johannesburg filly from their draft made \$1.2 million at Fasig-Tipton Calder.

Charming Lady...

Kentucky Derby winner Silver Charm was among the hottest commodities around in his heyday, and yesterday a hint of his past charm was recaptured when a gray filly by the champion brought \$320,000 yesterday in Ocala. Out of the unraced Deputy Minister mare Trusty Lady, a half-sister to multiple graded stakes winner and Grade I-stakes placed Klassy Kim, the \$75,000 KEESEP yearling was purchased by Castletop Stables. "She was the nicest filly in the sale," said Castletop's Mort Topfer, who owns the farm with his wife Bobbi. "We are absolutely thrilled we got her." Working in a sharp: 10.1 during the first breeze session Mar. 11, the filly is likely to be sent to the barn of Jimmy Toner. "She brought more than I thought she would bring," explained consignor Eddie Woods. "Yes, I'm very happy with the price. I thought she might bring \$250,000 or thereabouts.

"Silver Charm is an exported horse now, so he's not the flavor of the month," explained Woods. "That's good money for a horse that's kind of off the boil. She's a beautiful filly." Castletop manager Neal Winick added, "Everyone has been down on Silver Charm, but we couldn't fault her. She has a very good mind and her pedigree is strong. She was worth the price." Castletop also acquired a \$400,000 Five Star Day colt during Tuesday's session.

New Owner Talla Flexes Muscles for Orientate Filly...

Michael Talla, who in 1978 co-founded of The Sports Club Company, Inc., a far-reaching and successful chain of luxury sports and fitness clubs, made his first foray into Thoroughbred ownership last year, buying a few yearlings. Yesterday, he added to his fledgling stable with the purchase of hip 295, a filly by Orientate. Bidding on behalf of Talla was California trainer John Sadler, who, leaning against the pavilion wall to the left of the ring with a cell phone pressed to his ear, landed the big dark bay filly for \$400,000. "I thought she looked really great on the track," said Sadler. "I thought she previewed sensationally. She's a big filly, scopey, and has a lot of speed. I think she'll run around two turns--she galloped out very fast." Sadler said she would be sent directly to California before resuming her training. "We'll get her ready for the summer," Sadler added. "She won't be an early runner. She'll probably be pointed toward Del Mar." Sadler said Talla would race primarily in California. By the 2002 champion sprinter, hip 295 is out of the unraced Smellin Salty (Salt Lake) and is a half to MSW & GSP August Storm (Storm Creek). Niall Brennan Stables consigned the May 1 foal, who was purchased by C & K Stable for \$90,000 at last year's OBSAUG sale.

Johannesburg Colt Brings Half Million...

Three weeks after a daughter sold for \$1.2 million at the Fasig-Tipton Calder juvenile sale, freshman sire Johannesburg saw a son do him proud in the sales ring. Yesterday, hip 376, a CloverLeaf Farms II hombred, brought a \$500,000 phone bid from Coolmore agent Demi O'Byrne. "That was about where I thought we were coming into the sale," said Fernung about the price, adding with a laugh, "But when some of those horses started going into the millions, I started dreaming. But that's a good price for that colt. He's a homebred out of a mare that wasn't real expensive, so it was good." For Fernung, the price reflected the colt's quality. "He's a big handsome horse, and he's got enough pedigree that he could be any kind," he said. "He's a really nice horse." Hip 376 worked an eighth in a snappy: 10 1/5 during the Mar. 11 preview, the cosecond-fastest of the day. He's out of the stakes-placed General Assembly mare Whenourshipcomesin, who suffered a twisted intestine in the weeks following the birth of hip 376 and had to be put down after complications from surgery.

Swan Song for Hartley/De Renzo...

Consignors Dean De Renzo and Randy Hartley concluded an outstanding two-day stand at OBS with hip 402, a filly by Unbridled's Song that was knocked down to Reynolds Bell Thoroughbred Services, agent, for \$550,000. "She's a wonderful filly, and with her pedigree, there's no risk," said De Renzo afterwards. "If she goes out there and gets some black type, she's worth twice that, I think. We thought it was a good move by the operation that purchased the horse." From the family of GI Del Mar Oaks heroine Bail Out Becky, hip 402 was produced by a Dixieland Band half-sister to GISW More Than Ready named Always Ready. De Renzo said that he and Hartley had purchased hip 402, now named Siempre Lista, privately as a yearling. "Then we put her into training on Oct. 1, and she did everything right," he said. With a compact five-horse draft (five others were scratched) that grossed \$1,970,000, Hartley/De Renzo averaged \$394,000 with their consignees. It ain't \$16 million for a single horse, but pretty solid numbers by anybody's standards, and De Renzo said they came to OBS March expecting good things. 




Triple Threats

CAT'S OUT OF THE BAG The highly regarded Discreet Cat (Forestry) will make his stakes debut for Godolphin in Saturday's G2 UAE Derby, but a decision on the unbeaten colt's participation in the U.S. Classics will come later. "It is really too early to be talking about the Kentucky Derby," said Simon Crisford, Godolphin's racing manager. "We will watch him Saturday night and see how he gets on. He has a lot of natural talent and speed, though he is very short of experience and long on the hype so the horse has got to do the talking for himself now. If he wins and wins well...then Sheikh Mohammed will make the decision about whether we head for the Kentucky Derby or give the horse a little more time. [He] strikes us very much as a colt who could get better as the year goes on. He is still very immature, but he has so much potential and talent. Maybe the horse will tell us that a longer time between his races will help him, and also tell us that he is a miler."

ACHILLES BACK Paraneck Stable's Achilles of Troy (Notebook), vanned off after finishing fifth as the favorite last Saturday in the GIII Gotham S. at Aqueduct, was diagnosed with muscle spasms in his back and is expected to recover quickly. "His upper back was hurting him, so we had one of our vets come out and do some work on him," said trainer Frank Amonte Jr. "He'll be fine." A leg injury had been suspected immediately after the Gotham. "His left foot was a little warm the day after the race, but he's fine now," said Amonte. "We took him out this morning and tack-walked him in the shedrow. He was bouncing all over and feeling great. At least now we know what was bugging him." The grey had been slated to contest the GI Wood Memorial Apr. 8, but his connections are now expected to point him for the GII Arkansas Derby at Oaklawn a week later.



WASHINGTON PLEASES FALLON Kieren Fallon has revealed to *The Sportsman* that Magnier, Tabor and Smith's **George Washington (Ire)** (Danehill) has wintered well. The Ballydoyle jockey partnered the G1 Phoenix S. and G1 National S. winner in a recent workout and said he was on course for the May 6 G1 2000 Guineas. "George Washington has done very well both physically and mentally over the close season," he commented. "He worked with a bunch of stablemates recently. Without a doubt he is the best two-year-old I have ever ridden, and we obviously have high hopes for him carrying on this year--he's a real superstar."

My comments refer more to the latter part of the article where Bill comments on Ray Paulick's on-line article on Bloodhorse.com with reference to the Jackson/Narvick case (click here). Having been both an agent and broker in the thoroughbred horse business for 32 years, I quite agree with his suggestions about commissions on sales. Does an owner not agree to pay his lawyer or accountant for work performed? While an agent does not charge on an hourly basis, he is certainly entitled to a fee for work on behalf of his client. We, at Pegg Thoroughbred Consultants, always have a written agreement with our major clients stipulating a retainer, commission or any other compensation. Presumably, Mr. Jackson was interested in establishing a long term relationship with Narvick to help him build up his racing and breeding business. In that case, paying a fair commission and/or other compensation, would encourage Narvick to work harder on his behalf, and obtain the best possible purchase prices for their client. The buyer is ultimately going to pay, one way or the other. Why not make it cleaner up front to begin with? Peter J. Pegg




