

World Cup Notebook cont. Echoes of Big Jag...

California-based sprinter Thor's Echo (Swiss Yodeler) might be coming in a bit under the radar for Saturday's \$2-million G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen, but trainer Doug O'Neill's assistant Leandro Mora is reminded of another swift West Coast runner. Mora worked as an assistant to trainer Tim Pinfield when the ill-fated Big Jag set a stakes record of 1:08.1 in 2000. Mora convinced O'Neill to send Thor's Echo to Dubai because of the straight course at Nad Al Sheba. The four-year-old, coming off a second to Proud Tower Too (Proud Irish) in the Sensational Star H. Feb. 19 at Santa Anita, has been reluctant to switch leads. "I asked Doug if we could sign him in to the Dubai Golden Shaheen, and the owners [Royce S. Jaime Racing Stable and Suarez Racing] agreed," Mora said. "He's lazy to switch leads but if he doesn't do it here, it won't matter." Thor's Echo schooled in the paddock Wednesday evening. "We were worried about Thor's Echo because he's a bad kicker, but he hasn't kicked out here at all." Mora will also saddle Whilly (Ire) (Sri Pekan) for O'Neill in the \$5-million G1 Dubai Duty Free. The blaze-faced bay was runner-up in the 1777-meter contest last year, but will have to face 15 rivals this time. "Sixteen horses is a little too much, but you have to do what you have to do," Mora said. "I won't mind if he doesn't win, but it would be great if he could finish second again."

More of a Gesture...

Moyglare Stud homebred **Relaxed Gesture (Ire)** (Indian Ridge {Ire}) hasn't raced since winning the GI Canadian International in October at Woodbine, but is ready to take on a top-flight field in the \$5-million G1 Dubai Sheema Classic. "The horse is doing very well and everything is a go," said trainer Christophe Clement. The 2400-meter turf contest appears to be shaping up as a very challenging race, with the likes of champion **Ouija Board (GB)** (Cape Cross {Ire}) and Japanese star **Heart's Cry (Jpn)** (Sunday Silence) as primary threats. "When you're running for \$5 million, you will have a good field, and the only way to compete is to be in it," said Clement.

Bailey Making His Book...

Recently retired jockey Jerry Bailey, who won the G1 Dubai World Cup four times, has tabbed Magna Graduate (Honor Grades) as his pick in the \$6-million showcase this year. "I can't see it being a very fast pace, and that could be an advantage to a horse like Magna Graduate," said Bailey of the four-year-old who has displayed a stalking style in his U.S. races. His trainer, Todd Pletcher, also likes his chances. "He's shipped well and he's trained well," he said during Thursday's Breakfast with the Stars. "And he's getting over the ground [at Nad Al Sheba] extremely well, so we're very hopeful he's going to run his best race." The colt was a tired fourth to Brass Hat (Prized) in his only run this season, the GI Donn H. Feb. 4. He "needed a race," according to Pletcher. "His American form fits very well with the other American horses here," he added. "It looks like he might be a little bit of an outsider in the public's eye, but he might be a shorter price at home."

McLaughlin Hoping for a Double...

Kiaran McLaughlin, who was a top trainer in Dubai for three seasons in the mid '90s, has a pair of live runners for Sheikh Hamdan Saturday. He will saddle Uruguayan Triple Crown winner Invasor (Arg) (Candy Stripes) in the \$2-million G2 UAE Derby and Mustanfar (Unbridled) in the \$5-million G1 Dubai Sheema Classic. Southern Hemisphere horses have been very successful in the Derby, and McLaughlin thinks his charge can do so as well. "We actually think we have a better shot to run well in this race than with Mustanfar," said McLaughlin. The Sheema could be "the toughest race on the program," he explained. "But we're hopeful and we'll see what happens." Invasor has "done everything right and he's trained very well," said McLaughlin. As for Mustanfar, the five-year-old has returned from a lengthy break last year as a bigger, stronger horse. "He's running better than ever and he looks better than ever," McLaughlin said. Richard Hills will ride both Mustanfar and Invasor.

Galpin Well Represented on Card...

Richard Galpin doesn't personally own any of the 79 horses that will compete for the \$21 million on offer tomorrow evening, but that doesn't mean he won't have a rooting interest. Galpin has amassed an impressive record over the past years, purchasing yearlings and two-year-olds out of American auctions before sending them to Europe to begin their careers. Some of his purchases, most equipped with pedigrees better suited to dirt tracks as opposed to European turf courses, are repatriated and have struck at the highest level, including Buy The Sport, winner of the GI Gazelle H. in 2003; and Wilko (Awesome Again), the 2004 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile hero who will carry the hopes of Galvin in tomorrow night's \$6-million G1 Dubai World Cup. The hard-knocking chestnut was hammered down to Galpin for \$75,000 at the 2003 Keeneland September sale. David Junior (Pleasant Tap), a \$175,000 purchase out of the 2004 Fasig-Tipton Calder sale, has remained overseas for his entire career and posted his most important success last time out, taking the G1 Champion S. at Newmarket Oct. 15. The four-year-old faces a stern test in the \$5-million G1 Dubai Duty Free S. Gaff (Maria's Mon), purchased by Newmarket and Bill Heiligbrodt for \$100,000 at the 2003 Keeneland September sale, actually made one start in this country at two before being shipped to Ireland, where he was a Listed winner and twice placed in Group 3 company. He is three-for-four since being returned to the States, including his narrow victory in the GIII Mr. Prospector H. at Gulfstream Park Jan. 7. He is one of five U.S. sprinters in the \$2-million G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen. Jack Sullivan (Belong to Me) is the horse for the course at Nad Al Sheba, having won back-to-back runnings of the G3 Maktoum Challenge (Round 2). The five-yearold, a \$145,000 graduate of the 2003 Fasig-Tipton Calder sale, has just that one start to his credit this term and, instead of stretching out for the World Cup, will cut back in distance for the \$1-million G2 Godolphin Mile. Should any one of the guartet manage to win, expect Galpin to be among the biggest cheerleaders.

FRAVEL EMBRACING HIS NEW ROLE For the first time since 1997, the Board of Directors of the National Thoroughbred Racing Association has a new front man. Craig Fravel, the Executive Director of the Del Mar Thoroughbred Club, is accepting his new challenge with open arms, and is eager to get to the business at hand. "One of the first things we need to do is to take look at whole organization to make sure it is structured in the right way to market the sport and reach out to constituency and position the sport for the long haul," said Fravel, who also has unity as one of his goals. "The NTRA and Breeders' Cup share a common goal and that involves securing long-term membership agreements from the tracks. By doing that, we can avoid focusing on shorter-term issues and free up management to do their jobs," he offered. Despite something of a bumpy road in recent years, Fravel sees sunnier skies ahead for Thoroughbred racing. "I always used to be optimistic, but every now and then you have all this infighting and things look bleak," he stated. "But right now I feel things are on the upswing. There are not only technical advancements, but also qualitative improvements. I am a very big advocate of Polytrack and I think that if we can keep animals around and in the game, that is going to go a long way towards increasing popularity." Polytrack installation has been mandated in California and Fravel is supremely confident in the virtues of the artificial surface. "If Polytrack proves itself, like I think it will, it's going to be the single most important advancement to happen in 15 years since simulcasting came on," he commented. Fravel is also optimistic about the ability of the NTRA and partners to increase exposure to the game, but says, in the end, it all comes down to the equine athlete. "We're optimistic about ESPN as our new broadcast partner and I think that will lend itself to a new audience. We're also working on structural enhancements to create more coherent connection of races to the Breeders' Cup in terms of TV presentation and I think that will create a lot more interest. But in the end, it all comes down to the horses and if we can do the right thing to keep them healthy, I think that can have a profound impact on the future of the game."



FUEGO HAS GUINEAS AIM Derrick Smith, Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's Fairyhouse maiden winner El Fuego (Fusaichi Pegasus) is being aimed at the May 6 G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket, it was announced vesterday. Unraced since graduating at first asking over six furlongs in August, the colt was handed a vote of confidence by conditioner David Wachman. "I'm very happy with El Fuego--he's wintered well," Wachman said. "The plan at present is to go for the 2000 Guineas, but I'll have to speak to the owners and see what they want to do closer to the race." Wachman rates the colt higher than last year's G3 Greenham S. hero Indesatchel (Ire), and, like that stable stalwart, El Fuego may be asked to tackle one of the Classic trials. "He wants good ground, so that would be all important in deciding whether or not he has a prep race first," the conditioner added. "I wouldn't mind going straight to Newmarket, but the ground is the key--if it's good he'll get a run first, if not then he won't. We have a better chance of getting decent ground in England, so that would be more realistic--something like the G3 Craven S. [at Newmarket Apr. 20] or the G3 Greenham S. [at Newbury Apr. 22] could be on the agenda, but we'll see. Indesatchel did well for us last year and won the Greenham--at this stage I would say that El Fuego compares favourably with Indesatchel. He has very little experience, having only had one run and I'm not sure about the form, but time will tell how good he is." El Fuego, a son of The Minstrel mare Nemea, was a \$700,000 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga yearling.
