"When I got him on the outside, I

knew that he would do it because he has a lot of heart," winning rider Frankie Dettori told *Sky Sports*. "From that draw I had to give two lengths away to everybody, but he's a great horse. He jumped really slowly and the American horse was much faster than us. I couldn't get the position I wanted just behind the leaders, but once I got him out, I knew he would battle, and he quickened up brilliantly." Cont p2

Private Purchase Pays Off For Godolphin...

Electrocutionist won five of his first seven starts on the grass while racing in the colors of Earle Mack. The bay began his career in Italy with two straight scores,

then ran second by a nose to subsequent GI Breeders' Cup Turf winner Shirocco (Ger) in the 2004 G1 Gran Premio del Jockey Club. Freshened up after that game performance, he began his 2005 campaign with a victory in the G2 Premio Carlo d'Alessio May 22, then added the June 19 G1 Gran Premio di Milano. Given some time off for his first start outside of Italy, he delivered the goods at odds of 9-2 in the G1

Juddmonte International S. at York Aug. 16. Making the trip across the pond for the GI Canadian International S. Oct. 23, he was put up to third as the 6-5 chalk. Purchased privately following that start, Electrocutionist made his dirt debut for team Godolphin a winning one, scoring by a decisive seven lengths in the G2 Maktoum Challenge Round 3 last out Mar. 2. Kept in midpack after breaking from the dreaded one hole here, he began to find his best stride when switched to the outside on the turn for home. Dettori stayed busy on Electrocutionist in the stretch and the five-year-old got rolling in the late stages to run past the dueling American leaders. "He didn't like the sand being kicked in his face and he was really struggling at one point, but he's so tough," Godolphin racing manager Simon Crisford said. "He gives 110 percent and once Frankie showed him some daylight, he really quickened up."

Breeders' Cup Main Target...

After the blaze-faced bay posted his biggest career victory under the lights at Nad Al Sheba last night, Crisford revealed that he will target the Breeders' Cup World Thoroughbred Championships at Churchill Downs Nov. 4. "He will go for the Coronation Cup [June 2] and the King George [July 29] before ultimately going to America for the Breeders' Cup," he said.

Big Effort From Team America...

Although the American two-year winning streak came

to end in this year's World Cup, the trio of Brass Hat, Wilko and Magna Graduate (Honor Grades) certainly did their country proud, finishing second, third and fourth, respectively. The Todd Pletcher-trained Magna Graduate tired after vying for early command, but the duo of Brass Hat and Wilko put on a show for the Dubai faithful, locking horns

throughout the stretch before getting run down late by Electrocutionist. "He ran a great race," trainer Buff Bradley said of Brass Hat. "Everybody knows that he's one of the best now." Brass Hat's regular rider Willie Martinez was equally pleased. "He spotted that other horse [Electrocutionist] and he was coming back," Martinez said. "What a race, what can I say? I'm so proud of what Brass Hat

has done for us." Wilko, upset winner of the 2004 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile S., was also game in defeat. "He ran a really good race," said Garrett Gomez, who was in the irons on Wilko. "The horse gave 130 percent. I couldn't ask for a much better performance than he gave me other than to win."



He finally had his picture taken in his next outing, the Arima Kinen Dec. 25 at Nakayama, where he inflicted the first defeat on Japanese Triple Crown hero Deep Impact (Jpn). Favored to pick up where he left off, the nearly black horse came rolling out of the gate and went up to show the way, with Relaxed Gesture (Indian Ridge {Ire}) giving chase. Heart's Cry began to pick up the pace approaching the long Nad Al Sheba straight and came home an authoritative winner. The grand old warrior Collier Hill, third in this race last year, improved to be second. "For an eight-year-old with knackered joints, he's run another amazing race," his jockey, Dean McKeown, told PA Sport.



Purchased privately in September, Discreet Cat made the trip to the desert in the winter and finally made his first start sporting the Godolphin blue silks in a Nad Al Sheba allowance, scoring impressively by four lengths Mar. 9. Making his stakes debut here, the bay stayed within striking distance, began to hit his best stride on the turn for home and blew his rivals away in the stretch to win impressively by an eased-down six lengths. "It was a great performance by Discreet Cat," winning rider Frankie Dettori commented. "He surprised me by going so easily in the race and was travelling like the winner all the way around. They went a real lick and he settled off the pace. He took me there on the bridle and kept going. I am sure he can stay further."

Will He Stay or Will He Go...

With only three races under his belt and the Kentucky

Derby rapidly approaching, connections of Discreet Cat have a tough decision to make in the coming weeks. "We might go early for a prep race like the [GI] Blue Grass S. [Apr. 15] or go there with just the two runs this season under his belt," Godolphin racing manager Simon Crisford commented. "He lacks experience, and that was one of the reasons why we needed the

horse to do the talking himself. We have to decide

which way to go now. He might not be a horse to back up too quickly and we need to decide if he is ready for Kentucky. He is still quite an immature colt, but I think this race will have done him a lot of good." Godolphin founder Sheikh Mohammed was also not ready to commit to future plans just yet. "The way that Discreet

Cat won means we can think positively about the Kentucky Derby, but we will have to wait and see how he comes out of this race before deciding what to do," he commented.

Gold for Sale Suffers First Defeat...

Japanese Horses Prove They Belong...

In the late 1990s, Japanese horses began proving their quality overseas, with horses such as Agnes World, El Condor Pasa, Seeking the Pearl and Taiki Shuttle all winning Group 1 events on the European continent. But as the new millennium rolled around and the Japanese breeding industry continued its ascent into prominence, horses raised in the Land of the Rising Sun began to make their mark. It was at Nad Al Sheba in 2001 that Japan effectively announced its arrival on the world scene, as Sunday Silence's son Stay Gold

(Jpn) defeated the home team's Fantastic Light in the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic and the mare To the Victory (Jpn), also by Sunday Silence, ran second to Captain Steve in the G1 Dubai World Cup. Japan went on to score an unprecedented Group 1 treble in that year's Hong Kong International Races that December when Stay Gold took the G1 The Japanese contingent at Nad Vase, and American-bred Eishin Preston and Agnes Digital won the G1 Mile and

G1 Cup, respectively. Despite the recent retirement of stalwarts Zenno Rob Roy (Jpn) and Tap Dance City, the future of racing in Japan remains in the very qualified hooves of yesterday's winners, not to mention Triple Crown hero Deep Impact (Jpn), GI American Oaks victress Cesario (Jpn) (Special Week {Jpn}) and Lincoln (Jpn) (Sunday Silence), a winner yesterday at Nakayama.

Hopefully, he will be back next year."

It was a rough day for British champion jockey Kieren Fallon. Fallon was delayed by heavy traffic on his way to the track and missed his first ride of the night. Court Masterpiece (GB) in the G2 Godolphin Mile. The Ed Dunlop trainee finished sixth with Mick Kinane in the irons. Fallon's only other mount, superstar Ouija Board (GB), was among the favorites in the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic, but may have been put off her game by the commotion of the opening ceremonies and finished a non-threatening fourth. "I was worried about her going down to post," Fallon explained. "She didn't like the vibrations and the noise of the fireworks. She travelled OK, but never picked up for me--she was not herself."

No Chance to Shine for Irridescence...

Team Valor's Irridescence (SAf) (Caesour) ran into the fence while acting up in the walking ring prior to the G1 Dubai Duty Free S. and was scratched. "She got her stifle hooked on part of the rail," said Team Valor President Barry Irwin. "It's a long way to come for nothing...and we were really hopeful, too." 

LAWMAKERS AGREE ON \$5M LOAN TO NYRA

New York lawmakers are backing a deal to provide a \$5-million loan to the New York Racing Association and provide a \$2-million infusion of funds to a Thoroughbred breeding and development fund. The financial agreements were made Mar. 24 between Senate and Assembly negotiators working on a 2006 state budget for New York. The NYRA and breeding fund provisions would be included in a budget lawmakers hope to pass by Mar. 31. It would then need Gov. George Pataki's approval. The NYRA loan from the state replaces a deal announced previously in which the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey would purchase a piece of land at Aqueduct racetrack from NYRA for \$5 million. The Port Authority already gave NYRA a \$1-million advance for that project. The new deal, legislative negotiators said, would see NYRA repay the Port Authority the \$1 million, with interest. The state would then loan NYRA \$5 million from the administrative account of the state Lottery Division. The loan would be repaid by NYRA at a 4-percent interest rate by Dec. 31, 2007, the day the NYRA franchise to run Aqueduct, Belmont and Saratoga expires. The reigning champion sprinter and Horse of the Year in Hong Kong won the Sprinters' S. in Japan last October, but was pulled from a three-peat attempt in the G1 Hong Kong Sprint suffering from the effects of an illness. Returned to action in the G1-HK Centenary Sprint Cup Feb. 26, he failed to display any of his prior brilliance, finishing a well-beaten seventh, his first defeat at sprint distances. Today's race will decide his immediate future. "If he runs in the first three, then I will agree to his staying in training for the [G1-HK] Queen's Silver Jubilee Cup over 1400 metres [Apr. 15]," da Silva commented. "But if he can't run in the first three for no obvious reason, then that's it. I'll be sending him to Australia for a good rest." The Derby features a showdown between ante-post favorite Viva Pataca (GB) (Marju {Ire}), formerly Comic Strip (GB), winner in two of three Hong Kong starts, but untested at the 2000-meter trip; and Hello Pretty (Aus) (Distorted Humor), a brilliant 1 3/4-length winner of the Mar. 4 G2-HK Derby Trial over Sunny Sing (Ire) (Sri Pekan). The Hong Kong Derby, won last year by the top-class Vengeance of Rain (NZ), carries purse money of HK\$14 million (\$1.8 million).
