### FLORIDA DERBY HOPEFULS WORK

Lael Stable's unbeaten **Barbaro** (Dynaformer) worked a half-mile in :48 Monday morning at Palm Meadows in preparation for Saturday's GI Florida Derby at

Gulfstream Park. "He worked great," commented trainer Michael Matz. "He's ready to go. He'll van down there on the morning of the race." Barbaro, looking for his fifth straight win in the Florida Derby, has been off since winning the Feb. 4 GIII Holy Bull S. Also working at Palm Meadows yesterday in preparation for the Florida Derby,

Flashy Bull (Holy Bull) worked a half-mile in :49 2/5. Trained by Kiaran McLaughlin, the West Point Thoroughbreds colorbearer finished third in the Mar. 4 GII Fountain of Youth S., but was promoted to second. Owner Marc Wexler has added his Charming Image (Halo's Image) to the list of Florida Derby contenders. Trained by Anthony Pecoraro, the colt has won three straight since being claimed for \$25,000 at Calder last December. "When I first got him I thought he was just an average horse, but now all he seems to do is win," Pecoraro said. "I know it's been against horses that he ranks well against, but he was in a stakes last year. [His old connections] must have thought something about him. He seems to love Gulfstream and the owner wants to take a shot. For \$1 million, you've got to." Third in last year's Dover S. at Delaware Park, Charming Image has won three straight one-mile claiming races at Gulfstream this term, winning for a \$25,000 tag Jan. 25, and for \$40,000 Feb. 6 and Mar. 13.

### HOLIDAY PLANS ON HOLD FOR OUIJA

Lord Derby's Ouija Board (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}) may have her planned vacation cancelled after connections mulled over Saturday's defeat in the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic at Nad Al Sheba. Despite trainer Ed Dunlop originally stating that the five-year-old would be rested after the 12-furlong contest before being brought back in mid-summer, targets in Hong Kong or Singapore are being considered now. "I made a statement before Dubai saying she would have a long holiday after the Sheema Classic, but that is now not a certainty," Dunlop told the Racing Post after the mare's fourth on Saturday. "As a result of what happened, she has not had a hard race and we might well now consider targets in Hong Kong [in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II Cup at Sha Tin Apr. 23] and Singapore [in the G1 Singapore Airlines International Cup at Kranji May 14] for her. We haven't decided about that yet but what we do know is that she will have a European campaign this autumn."

### JUNIOR ASCOT-BOUND

David Sullivan's impressive G1 Dubai Duty Free winner David Junior (Pleasant Tap) is to be aimed at the June 21 G1 Prince of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot, it was confirmed vesterday. In the wake of the four-year-old's 3 1/2-length success in the near-nine furlong event, conditioner Brian Meehan announced that last year's G1 Champion S. hero would head straight to the Royal meet, transferred back to its home after a year's sabbatical at York in 2005. "At the moment the plan would be to run at Royal Ascot," he said. "We will have to see how he comes out of the race, but that would be his target. He flies back on Thursday and there are three months between now and Ascot, so we will take our time. He is pretty fit and is not a gross horse so it will just be maintenance work between now and Ascot. Wherever David Junior goes now, for the rest of his career, he is always going to be the horse to beat." Meehan spoke of the dream start from his new base at the Sangster family-owned Manton estate in Wiltshire. "We wouldn't have expected any better from Manton and you couldn't have written the script," he added. "It is a big responsibility here and it is a big outfit so it couldn't have been better to start like that."

WILKO ON TRAVELS AGAIN Paul Reddam and Susan Roy's Wilko (Awesome Again) has a choice of Stateside options following his gallant third in Saturday's G1 Dubai World Cup at Nad Al Sheba. Trainer Jeremy Noseda revealed that the four-year-old, who found only Electrocutionist and Brass Hat too strong in the 10-furlong contest, would return to Newmarket before being prepared for a tilt at either the May 29 GI Metropolitan H. or GI Stephen Foster H. June 17. "The horse ran a really good race," Noseda said on his website jeremynoseda.com. "It was a brave performance from him. He had a real good crack at trying to win and just got beaten out of it inside the last furlong. But we were really pleased with his effort. The plan is for him to return to Newmarket this weekend when we will have a look to see how he has come out of the race." Wilko left the Noseda barn for Craig Dollase after his defeat of Afleet Alex in the 2004 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile at Lone Star Park, but was transferred back after a winless campaign last term. However, despite the switch to Newmarket, Noseda confirmed that Wilko's main targets will remain in the States. After listing the Stephen Foster and Met Mile as possible targets for Wilko, Noseda added, "Whether he has a run in the interim remains to be seen. There's a possibility that he could have a crack at something in Europe. But without any question, he's a superior horse on dirt than on the turf."

David Junior, purchased with Meehan and Merry for \$175,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Calder juvenile sale, won the G1 Duty Free. Wilko, purchased for \$75,000 at the Keeneland September Yearling sale, was third in the G1 World Cup and Jack Sullivan, purchased with Meehan for \$145,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Calder sale, was third in the G2 Godolphin Mile. Gaff, purchased with Heiligbrodt Racing at the Keeneland September sale for \$100,000, was fourth in the G1 Golden Shaheen.

"No wonder some of the Maktoum brothers are now supporting him strongly," was a comment I made in this column in the fall of 1999, after Red Ransom's daughter Perfect Sting took the GI Garden City Breeders' Cup H. Of course the Maktoums' involvement with this son of Roberto has increased markedly since then, to the extent that Red Ransom left Kentucky to ply his trade at Sheikh Mohammed's Dalham Hall Stud from 2004.


Sheikh Mohammed and his Godolphin team also stepped in to buy Red Ransom's son Electrocutionist during a lavish spending spree late last year. At the time Electrocutionist's trainer Valfredo Valiani said,

"I always believed he would have achieved even more next year." Valiani's prophecy has already come true, although in a very different way from what he probably imagined. Instead of sticking with the turf, which had yielded Group 1 victories in the Gran Premio di Milano and Juddmonte International, Godolphin took the bold decision to try the five-year-old on the Nad Al Sheba dirt course.

Their reward for this boldness has been two wins from two starts—a seven-length romp in a Group 2 on Electrocutionist's dirt debut and a determined victory over Team America in the G1 Dubai World Cup.

I have never been sure whether the Nad Al Sheba surface--a mixture of fine dune sand, silt and clay--represents as big a change to a turf specialist as, say, your average American dirt course. Certainly the Maktoum brothers and Godolphin have enjoyed plenty of success with turf horses in the World Cup, winning with Singspiel in 1997, Almutawakel in 1999, Dubai Millennium in 2000 and Moon Ballad in 2003, as well as going very close with Swain against Silver Charm in 1998.

Electrocutionist's pedigree provided encouragement that he too could make the transition. Although Red Ransom's northern hemisphere progeny have earned roughly two-thirds of their earnings on turf, rather than dirt, his grandsires are the outstanding dirt performers Hail to Reason and Damascus. *Cont. p4*

Red Ransom himself showed plenty of flair on the main track. After making a spectacular debut at Saratoga in 1989, when he set record figures of :56.8 for five furlongs, he followed up with a six-furlong victory at Belmont in 1:09.8.

These displays were good enough to make Red Ransom winter favorite for the Kentucky Derby. Unfortunately, he managed only one more start, but Mack Miller's recommendation that Red Ransom was "the most talented individual I have ever trained" was enough to guarantee considerable interest in the Roberto colt when he retired to Vinery.

Bearing in mind that Red Ransom's fee has varied from \$7,500 to \$75,000, it isn't surprising that his results have fluctuated too. The odd aspect of his career is that it has been some of his highest-priced crops which have been comparatively disappointing. Electrocutionist is one of only three stakes winners among the 72 named foals in Red Ransom's 2001 crop, sired at a fee of \$65,000, and there is so far only one stakes winner--not at graded level--among the 60 foals in his 2002 crop, sired at a fee of \$75,000. Will he perversely do better with his 2003 and 2004 crops, sired at \$45,000 and \$30,000, respectively? However they fare, there must be high hopes of Red Ransom's first English crop, which numbers around 120 yearlings, especially as his early Australian crops have produced eight group winners (around 4.5 percent group winners to foals, which is an improvement on his American figures).

Although there are some unsatisfactory aspects to Red Ransom's record, the important thing to remember is that he is capable of siring winners of considerable class, including Perfect Sting, Intikhab (who was rated the best horse in Europe in 1998), Casual Look (Oaks), Ekraar, Bail Out Becky, Sri Pekan and Electrocutionist. Sri Pekan, by the way, continues to make amends for a slowish start, with group winners in Britain and Hong Kong already this year.

The fact that Electrocutionist is out of a daughter of Arazi will also have encouraged Godolphin to experiment with him on dirt. Even Arazi's disappointing record as a stallion (which included only one Grade I winner in

Congaree) cannot dim the memories of his breathtaking display in the 1991 Breeders' Cup Juvenile. Already a triple Group 1 winner on turf in France, Arazi handled the Churchill Downs dirt so well that he had five lengths to spare over Bertrando at the finish.

Arazi retired to Dalham Hall at a fee of £20,000, and no one can say that he wasn't given every chance. For example, his mares in his first season included Gesedeh, a winner of the G3 Prix de Flore with a Timeform rating of 117. What's more, Gesedeh was a half sister to the exceptional stayer Ardross and the smart filly Larrocha (who contested Cigar's Dubai World Cup in 1996).

Gesedeh was also a half sister to some successful broodmares, notably Adrana (dam of the Queen Anne S. winner Alflora) and Thistlewood (second dam of the 2005 St Leger winner Scorpion).

In the circumstances it is no surprise that three of Gesedeh's daughters have so far produced group winners, even though none of these daughters earned black type. Reem Dubai, a non-winning daughter of Nashwan, is the dam of Royal Dubai (G3 Preis der Winterkonigin) and Royal Highness (G2 Prix de Malleret), while the unraced Dancing Brave filly Dance On The Stage is the dam of Robertico, winner of the 1998 German Derby. *Cont. p6*

Electrocutionist's dam Elbaaha was quite a useful performer at up to 1% miles. Incidentally, she is another good example of the excellent value that can sometimes be found at Keeneland's January Sale, as she was sold for only \$60,000 at the 2001 sale, while carrying Electrocutionist.

Electrocutionist has already earned the equivalent of nearly \$5 million, with the prospect of plenty more to come. Interestingly, Godolphin have outlined a summer campaign on turf for the five-year-old, rather than try to follow the example of Street Cry, the dirt specialist who followed his 2002 World Cup victory with challenges for the GI Stephen Foster H. and GI Whitney H. Electrocutionist's program is more likely to resemble Swain's 1998 campaign, which featured victories in the King George and the Irish Champion S., sandwiched between narrow defeats in the Dubai World Cup and Breeders' Cup Classic.

NAISSANCE ROYALE (IRE) (f, 4, Giant's Causeway--Net Worth, by Forty Niner) was tested to the wire in her 2006 bow, but showed the same kind of heart that earned her a victory in last season's GII Lake Placid S. The Irish-bred began her career in France, where she placed second in the G3 Prix Vanteaux in May before running fourth in the G1 Prix Saint-Alary a few weeks later. She concluded her European stand with an offthe-board finish in the G3 Prix Chloe in early July. She beat the talented My Typhoon (Ire) in the Lake Placid in her American debut, but just failed to last in the Oct. 15 GI Queen Elizabeth II Cup at Keeneland, finishing fourth, and was shelved. Sent off the public's prohibitive 1-2 choice here, she closed with a rush to join the leaders going into the far turn and at the top of the stretch had just Esplanade (King of Kings {Ire}) to get by.
