FIRST SAMURAI TO STAND AT CLAIBORNE

Bruce Lunsford and Lansdon Robbins III's **First Samurai** (Giant's Causeway--Freddy Frisson, by Dixieland Band), a multiple Grade I winner at two, will stand at the Hancock family's Claiborne Farm upon the conclusion of his racing career. According to a press release, the Paris, Kentucky nursery has purchased an interest in the three-year-old for breeding purposes. "First Samurai will be the first Storm Cat-line stallion to stand at the farm," said Claiborne President Seth Hancock. "He was a brilliant two-year-old and is an outstanding individual. He will be a good fit for a lot of the mares at Claiborne." Winner of his first four starts, including the GI Hopeful S. and GI Champagne S., First Samurai was third in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile last term. In 2006, he added a second in the GI Hutcheson S. in his seasonal debut and most recently was awarded victory via disqualification in the GI Fountain of Youth S. Mar. 4. "Lansdon and I realized how special this horse is and wanted him to have a good home," said Lunsford. "We also wanted to put this process behind us before entering the fray of the Classic season. This will allow us to concentrate solely on what is in the best interest of the horse for the remainder of his racing career."

EINSTEIN SMART CHOICE IN PAN AM

One need not be an ace in quantum physics to see that **Einstein (Brz)** (Spend a Buck) likes the turf course at Gulfstream Park. Three starts, three wins. Pretty basic stuff. Saturday, the Midnight Cry Stable colorbearer tries to make it four straight in Miami in the 12-furlong Captain Morgan GIII Pan American H., part of the Spectacular Saturday IV program. Einstein began the meet with a pair of allowance wins, then staged the 7-1 upset winning the 11 1/2-furlong GI Gulfstream Park Breeders' Cup H. Feb. 25, his first stakes tally. "It's awesome seeing all the potential he's got," said Einstein's conditioner, Helen Pitts, who saddled him to a maiden win at Churchill last November. "He's grown up a lot this winter. He's matured a lot. He's mentally very good and he loves the game, and he has the talent to really take advantage of that. When you've got that combination, it's really exciting." Pitts added that, with an additional half-furlong to negotiate from his latest, Einstein might use his tactical speed Saturday. "Speed is always a big factor," she said, "but fortunately I don't think he needs to go to the lead like he did last time. He can sit off the pace, and that's got to be a big thing in his favor."

RCI GETS CALL FOR A WAGERING CLEARINGHOUSE

In order to help racing jurisdictions get a better grip on just exactly who is betting into their pools, a call was made out at the Association of Racing Commissioners International convention for the RCI to take the lead in forming a "wagering clearinghouse" for secondary betting entities. The RCI convention, which runs through Friday, is being held at the Hyatt Regency Tamaya Resort near Albuquerque, N.M. During a model rules committee meeting, Richard Shapiro, chairman of the California Horse Racing Board, discussed the situation in his state, and how to make the situation better. "In California, the tracks may go out and negotiate with XYZ betting outlet," Shapiro said. "We [the CHR] ask 'Are they betting through our pools?' The answer: 'Yes.' Then, we need to know who they are, that they are properly organized, that their systems are secure, so we know who is wagering into our pools and that is where there is a big breakdown. I'm asking RCI to take the lead on that." Shapiro then proposed for there to be a standard review and approval of all the secondary pari-mutuel wagering entities before they are allowed to enter into the wagering pools. "As we get license applications from our racing associations, there is an attachment for all of the places where they have an agreement for sending the signal and where there are all these secondary betting places that bet through our pool," he said. "They'll be a list of 50 or more and we need to know we're doing the due diligence that they have been fully vetted and checked out."

ARNOLD NAMED ARLINGTON PRESIDENT Roy Arnold has been named president of Chicago's Arlington Park. The announcement was made yesterday by Arlington chairman Richard Duchossois and Andrew Skehan, executive vice president of Churchill Downs Inc., the track's parent company. Arnold will assume his new responsibilities Apr. 11. The 50-year-old New York native joins Arlington after serving 30 years in the United States Marine Corps, most recently serving as the assistant wing commander for the third Marine Aircraft Wing, I Marine Expeditionary Force. "Roy Arnold is a strong leader who, throughout his highly decorated military career demonstrated his ability to identify goals, define and execute strategies to achieve those goals, and deliver exceptional results," said Duchossois. "Those are the very same skills required of racetrack executives as they navigate today's increasingly competitive business landscape. Roy has already invested considerable time and energy learning about the horse racing industry and understands the opportunities we have and the challenges we face." Arlington will open for its 95-day 2006 meeting on May 5.

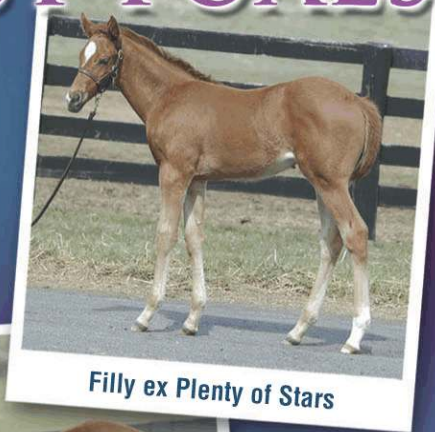

Leparoux Breaks Turfway Record For Wins:

Apprentice jockey Julien Leparoux broke the Turfway Park record for most wins in a single meet when he booted home Harpers Lane to victory in the sixth race Wednesday night. It was the 151st time the Frenchman has found the wire first at Turfway's Winter/Spring

meet. The previous mark was set at the 2004 Winter/Spring meet, when rising star Rafael Bejarano won 150 of his 472 mounts. Harpers Lane was Leparoux's 481st mount this meet. Before last night's racing, Leparoux's Turfway record stood at 151 wins,

98 seconds, 60 thirds from 483 mounts and earnings of \$1,488,799. A native of Chantilly, France, Leparoux started riding professionally last August. His first win came at Saratoga Race Course Aug. 18. Leparoux has been in the United States since 2003, when he began working as an exercise rider for trainer Patrick Biancone.

Jockey Felipe Martinez to Ride Last Race Sunday:

Jockey Felipe Martinez has announced that he plans to retire following his final ride Sunday at Santa Anita Park. "There's no other reason, other than I want to spend more time with my family," the 41-year-old native of Jalisco, Mexico, said yesterday. "My wife, Adriene, and our children, Marcus, Isabel and Isaac, have a home on about an acre of ground in Great Falls, Montana, and that's where we plan to live. Right now, we have no horses there, but that could change." Martinez rides Sam's Ace (In Excess {Ire}) for trainer Doug O'Neill in Saturday's \$1 million GI Florida Derby at Gulfstream Park. Through March 28, Martinez had a career record of 462 wins, 543 seconds, 641 thirds and purse earnings of \$13,374,448 from 5,617 mounts. Martinez said he began riding in 1987.
