a mile in 1:40. Donna Barton Brothers was aboard for the move. "It's a little hard to judge over a 'wet-fast' racetrack, but I thought he worked all right," said his trainer, Frank Brothers. "It'll be six weeks between his races, so he needed a pretty good work. He'll probably come back with a half or five-eighths [of a mile work]-probably five-eighths--next week. He's breezed right along, but I just thought he needed a little tightener." First Samurai finished second in the Mar. 4 GII Fountain of Youth S., but was promoted to victory over the since-derailed Corinthian (Pulpit). Brothers added that he was looking for a good effort in the Blue Grass from his charge to ensure a trip to the GI Kentucky Derby May 6. "He's doing fine--he's just got to step up to the plate next time, that's all," he said. "If he runs well there, then he buys his ticket."

chased home War Emblem and Proud Citizen. In between these two thirds at Churchill Downs, another of Dynaformer's sons, Beat All, also filled the show spot in the Epsom Derby before going on to be fourth in Montjeu's Irish Derby.

The question now is whether Dynaformer can finally make the progression to first this year, with the help of his unbeaten


Even Dynaformer's greatest admirers wouldn't describe him as speedy. The writers of the 1988 Classform Annual clearly weren't among those admirers, as their harsh assessment dismissed him as "a moderately useful, decidedly one-paced animal." Classform concluded that "Dynaformer was simply not good enough to compete with the best of his generation," but *The Blood-Horse*'s distinguished team of handicappers, comprising messieurs Kilroe, Hale and Robbins, took a kinder view of his abilities. They assessed his three-year-old efforts at 116, just 11 lbs below the top-ranked Risen Star.

Even so, Dynaformer's lack of acceleration limited him to seven victories from 30 appearances, with two of his best wins coming over 11/4 miles in the GII Jersey Derby and in a mile-and-a-half allowance race on turf, in which he lowered Keeneland's track record. He was also second at Grade II level over 1 5/8 miles. Stamina clearly wasn't a problem.

Barbaro has every right to be effective on both surfaces, as he is the product of two versatile parents. His dam La Ville Rouge was second or third in four graded stakes, at the ages of two and four, with the four dividing evenly between dirt and turf. As two of these good graded efforts were achieved over 1 3/8 miles, Barbaro looks most unlikely to be troubled by the extra furlong he'll have to tackle at Churchill Downs.

He also appears to have enough speed to be able to hold a good early position--an asset he may well have inherited from his broodmare sire Carson City.

La Ville Rouge wasn't at all a typical daughter of this very speedy stallion, who spent the whole of his 15-race career contesting sprints on dirt. Not surprisingly, Carson City later established a reputation as a fertile source of quick-maturing juveniles, such as City Zip and Cuvee, and of high-class sprinters, such as State City, Lord Carson, Five Star Day and Good And Tough.

DON'T MISS BILL OPPENHEIM IN TOMORROW'S TDN

La Ville Rouge's sister Lucky Lavender Girl fitted this template far better, gaining all seven of her wins over sprint distances, as well as finishing third in the GI Acorn S. Lucky Lavender Gal's stakes-winning daughter Lavender Lass is another sprinter.

La Ville Rouge, on the other hand, has quickly shown that she is passing on at least a measure of her stamina, as her first two foals are both stakes winners over 1 1/8 miles, the other being her Saint Ballado colt Holy Ground. The source of her stamina isn't obvious, as her dam La Reine Rouge was by the sprinter King's Bishop out of a daughter of another fast performer in Nearctic. For the record, La Reine Rouge also produced Green Alligator (GIII California Derby) and she was a sister to La Reine Elaine, winner of the GIII Gallorette H.

Perhaps the most interesting aspect of Barbaro's pedigree is that he is out of a mare by a son of Mr.

Prospector. Dynaformer is building up a very encouraging record with granddaughters of Mr. Prospector, as he has also sired the excellent Riskaverse (a dual Grade I winner over 1 1/4 miles) from a daughter of Seeking The Gold and the very good mile-and-a-half filly Ocean Silk from a Kingmambo mare. Dynaformer also struck gold with a mare by Mr. Prospector, siring another Grade I winner in Film Maker, whose

stamina stretched to winning the GII La Prevoyante H. over 1 1/2 miles.

If you trace the family back far enough, you'll find that Barbaro's seventh dam is War Plumage, winner of the CCA Oaks and Alabama S. in 1939, but a more compelling piece of information is that Barbaro followed in the footsteps of Spectacular Bid, Swale, Unbridled, Thunder Gulch and Monarchos when he won the Florida Derby. And we all know what they achieved on the first Saturday of May.

THIRD MRLS CASE CONFIRMED IN FLORIDA; MEETING SET

An Arabian mare in Marion County, Florida, aborted a 310-day gestation (the foal was born dead) on March 13 that was confirmed as having mare reproductive loss syndrome (MRLS), according to Dr. Dana Zimmel, of the University of Florida's College of Veterinary Medicine.

The first case was a Thoroughbred foal from the University of Florida research herd born on March 18 that died on March 20. The second case was a Quarter Horse foal born on March 25 that died on March 26 on a private farm. Both mares foaled in Alachua County, and both foals were born alive, were hospitalized, but were euthanized due to their deteriorating conditions.

Zimmel said there is still one suspect case that was a late-term abortion from a Thoroughbred mare from the University of Florida breeding herd. The University of Florida herd of research mares lives near Ocala, Fla., (in Marion County) until about 30 days prior to foaling, when they are brought to the university's farm in Alachua County. Eastern tent caterpillars, which have been linked to MRLS, were reported in fields with the dams of the first two foals; no report was available for the third foal. THE BALLYDOYLE REPORT

O'BRIEN UNCOVERS HIS RICHES by Tom Frary

Aidan O'Brien yesterday unveiled his main hopes for the 2006 campaign during the annual press day at Ballydoyle. Not surprisingly, it was last year's brilliant G1 Phoenix S. and G1 National S. winner **George Washington** (Ire) (Danehill) who was at the center of the attention. That is the way the colt likes it, according to his conditioner.

"He looks down on everyone and every horse," he said yesterday. "He has that arrogance about him. He just has so much ability, but he is a bit of a bully and that's what makes him so good."

George Washington is heading to Newmarket for the May 6 G1 2000 Guineas. He may have company in the mile Classic in the shape of last year's G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere hero Horatio Nelson (Ire) (Danehill) and the unbeaten Art Museum (Storm Cat), while Rumplestiltskin (Ire) (Danehill) will fly the flag in the fillies' equivalent May 7.

"Rumplestiltskin has wintered well and at the moment the plan is to go straight to Newmarket," he said. O'Brien also has a select team of seven older horses to call upon, headed by last year's G1 St Leger winner Scorpion (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) and GI Breeders' Cup Turf runner-up Ace (Ire) (Danehill), and he has a clutch of unexposed sophomores as back-up.

"You would be hoping that there is a nice bunch of horses there," he commented. "When the two-year-olds are as strong as last year you hope that they'll come good again at three, but we'll approach this year cautiously. We'll try and keep them right--the horses are reasonably fit, but they are not sharpened up yet, because of the soft ground. That is a lovely way to have them."

As in previous years, Ballydoyle will descend on The Curragh Sunday, when a host of Classic contenders will be put through their paces in separate gallops after racing.

"We hope to bring the likes of George, Horatio and Art Museum and a few more to The Curragh," O'Brien explained. "They all believe they are great at the minute, so its important that Kieren sits on them all." O'Brien also cast doubt on fielding a representative in this year's GI Kentucky Derby. "I'd imagine Kentucky is out of the equation at the moment," he added. "The horses we were looking at were Art Museum, Frost Giant and Hurricane Cat, but I don't think any of them will be ready. I'd imagine probably not this year." Kieren Fallon was also on hand to talk up his hopes for the coming season and was particularly sweet on the Listed Blenheim S. scorer Art Museum.

"You can see how well they've done from two to three, which is a great sign, and George Washington is a serious horse," he said. "He was very good last year and you can see how well he has done. I have always loved Art Museum--he is one of my favorite horses. He has everything you'd like--he's a brilliant mover and travels well. He does everything for you and he has an engine, quickens and is a special horse to ride."

He added that the maiden **Hitchcock** (Giant's Causeway--Beware of the Cat, by Caveat) is his "dark horse" for this term.

THREE-YEAR-OLDS

What O'Brien said about the leading sophomores:

GEORGE WASHINGTON (IRE), c, **Danehill**--Bordighera, by Alysheba

"He put on 45-50 kilos over the winter and has grown up a lot. He is more relaxed than Footstepsinthesand and he has that natural confidence about him. He has the arrogance that often goes with brilliance, and he believes in himself so much that he would look over every horse and person in front of him. I don't think we've ever had a miler with such pace--he is very fast. Whether he gets the mile trip is a slight worry, but Kieren thinks he will. We won't know until we try and if he doesn't, he'll go back sprinting."

HORATIO NELSON (IRE), c, Danehill--Imagine (Ire), by Sadler's Wells

"Kieren has always raved about him. He's a great model and is not a slow horse--not by a long way. Hopefully being out of Imagine, he'll get a mile and a half, and he's very well-balanced. If he doesn't go to Newmarket he could to Leopardstown for the [Apr. 23] G3 Ballysax S. That is a possible route, but I would hate to say that is more likely at the moment. He either goes to Newmarket [for the 2000 Guineas] and then goes straight for the [June 3] G1 Epsom Derby, or else there is the Ballysax and then the G2 Leopardstown Derby Trial [May 14]. He put on 55 kilos over the winter, so that usually says that they have done well. They have to have the physique to do that, but he is slowly coming back down now."

ART MUSEUM, c, **Storm Cat**-Totemic, by Vanlandingham

"He is a big horse and has done real well. He is a Storm Cat, so he is a real good ground horse and you mightn't see him until May, but he fits in there as a possible 2000 Guineas horse. He is the closest thing we have ever had, in the way he works and the way he behaves, to Giant's Causeway. He is relaxed and runs with his head out--there is always more there and he looks in the mold of 'your man.' His two runs were very nice last year and we'd be hoping he could get a mile-he might get a mile and a quarter."

RUMPLESTILTSKIN (IRE), f, **Danehill**--Monevassia, by Mr. Prospector

"Hopefully, we'll get her to The Curragh next weekend for a racecourse gallop and if everything goes well there, we'll be looking at Newmarket [for the G1 1000 Guineas] for her. She has won around Longchamp and acts around there, so could go for the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches [French 1000 Guineas May 14]. She is a little bit tricky in that you just have to produce her lateshe pulled herself up when she hit the front in the G1 Moyglare Stud S. After the Guineas, if everything goes well, you'd be thinking of the G1 Irish Guineas [at The Curragh May 28] and then the G1 Coronation S. [at Royal Ascot June 23]. You wouldn't be sure that she'd be a filly that will get an Oaks trip."

IVAN DENISOVICH (IRE), c, Danehill--Hollywood Wildcat, by Kris S.

"He is in good shape and might go to Longchamp for one of the trials [Apr. 23 G3 Prix de Fontainebleau] He kind of lost his way after his run in France [when second in the G1 Prix Morny] and then he ran fourth in the G1 Middle Park S. and Kieren blamed the soft ground that day. We'll try and keep him on a bit of nice ground this year and he is a possible for the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains [French 2000 Guineas at Longchamp May 14]."

FROST GIANT, c, Giant's Causeway--

Takesmybreathaway, by Gone West

"He is coming along lovely. It wouldn't be fair to start him next week in the soft ground, but a lot of these horses have early May deadlines so if we don't get them out in trials, we will take them away for a gallop. He has done very well."

HURRICANE CAT, c, **Storm Cat**--Sky Beauty, by Blushing Groom (Fr)

"He won at Newbury [in the G3 Horris Hill S.], funnily enough in bad ground. He is lazy at home, so it's just going to take a while to get him fit, but he could go further than a mile and could arrive around the time of the G2 Dante S. [at York May 18]."

RACE FOR THE STARS, f, <u>Fusaichi Pegasus</u>--La Lorgnette, by Val de l'Orne (Fr)

"She is a big filly and loved Newmarket when winning [the Listed Oh So Sharp S.] last year. She'd get a mile well and she is another possible 1000 Guineas filly."

SEPTIMUS (IRE), c, <u>Sadler's Wells</u>--Caladira (Ire), by Darshaan (GB).

"He ran third in the G1 Racing Post Trophy and the ground was very heavy that day--Kieren thought he didn't handle it. He is going nice and he could start off in one of the Derby trials, possibly the Ballysax or something like that."

ALEXANDROVA (IRE), f, <u>Sadler's Wells</u>--Shouk (GB), by Shirley Heights (GB)

"Kieren loved her when he rode her [to be second] in the G1 Fillies Mile and she is an Oaks type filly. She is a filly that appreciates an ease in the ground and bends her knee plenty."

Of the unexposed types, of which there is an abundance this year, O'Brien pointed to the unraced **Grafton Street (Ire)** (Danehill--Bells are Ringing, by Sadler's Wells), **Benjamin Franklin (Ire)** (Danehill--Adjalisa {Ire}, by Darshaan {GB}), and the above-mentioned Hitchcock as "lovely horses who could be anything." He added, "We've never had as many unraced three-year-old maidens of that caliber, but last year we were rolling with the two-year-olds doing so well, so we were not under pressure to run these ones. Of those that haven't run, we think they are high-class maidens"
