She began Irridescence Andrew Watkins to buck and subsequently be-

came entangled on the paddock

railing. "The swelling has gone from her stifle area and she is not sensitive to the touch anymore," said her trainer, Mike de Kock. "The scabs where she cut herself are almost off, too." Irridescence is slated to join conditioner John Hammond's string in France after her Hong Kong trip, where she is expected to campaign during the fall. Connections say a return to Nad Al Sheba for the 2007 Duty Free is in the cards.

KILLER B'S HEAD DERBY, OAKS FUTURES

Brother Derek (Benchmark) and Balance (Thunder Gulch) have been installed the morning-line favorites in the third and final round of the Kentucky Derby and Kentucky Oaks Future Wagers, respectively. Both pools will open for betting tomorrow and will run through this Sunday, Apr. 9. Mike Battaglia has installed Brother Derek, perfect in his two starts this season, as the tepid 7-2 choice over last weekend's GI Florida Derby winner Barbaro (Dynaformer), who starts at 5-1. The mutuel field, which includes all other three-year-old not among the 23 individual interests, is 6-1. Balance is also a 7-2 favorite, well clear of the next horse, Wild Fit (Wild Wonder), an 8-1 chance on Battaglia's line. The mutuel field of all other sophomore fillies is the seccond betting choice at odds of 5-1. Over a million dollars has already been invested in the first two pools of the KDFW. NEW STATISTIC: ANOTHER SIX-PERCENT SOLUTION

There have now been more than 25,000 'A Runners' since we began counting them in 1983, so it works out to right around 1100 new A Runners each year. As you'll remember, an 'A Runner' is a runner whose earnings in a calendar year rate him among the top two percent of runners that year, in whichever jurisdiction he is racing: the U.S., Canada, the U.K., Ireland, France, Germany, or Japan. In the U.S., the current threshold is about \$110,000 in a year; in Japan, the two-percent threshold in 2005 was about \$478,000. The APEX sire statistics we have always published are based on these annualized earnings calculations; now, for the first time, we are publishing a cumulative statistic, career percentage of A Runners/Foals of Racing Age. For this statistic, each horse is counted once as an A Runner, no matter how many years he was counted as an A Runner for his sire's calculations. This could be called an 'individual A Runner', or 'unique A Runner.' Whereas a sire's APEX (Annual Progeny Earnings index) ratings can be compared to the cumulative average-earnings index, his "percentage of A Runners/Foals" can be compared to the 'percentage of Stakes Winners/foals."

In this regard, the ability to look back 20 years reveals how and when the results of a key statistical measurement have changed. Let me explain. First, I went through our sire list, and selected, just subjectively, 128 sires which I decided count as 'very significant sires'; quite a few of them have died in the past few years, like Danzig and Unbridled, but were still assigned APEX ratings for 2005 (meaning they had 10 or more three-year-olds of 2005), and I thought it would be quite useful to be able to measure the current bright young things against some of the greats who still figure.

I excluded sires with first three-year-olds of 2005 (Giant's Causeway's sire crop), then initially divided the 128 sires into an 'older' group of 62 sires with first foals 1996 and earlier, and a 'younger' group of 66 sires with first foals over the five-year span 1997-2001.

I then ran a 'Top 15' table for each group, older and younger. When I looked at the 'older' group, though, I saw that only four of the 15 had their first foals in the 1990's, while 11 had their first foals back in the 1980's. And of all 15, only two had their first foals in the 1990's, and are under 20 years of age--you guessed it, A.P. Indy (first foals 1994) and Kingmambo (1995). When I subdivided them further, I found that the 27 sires whose first foals arrived in 1982-1990 averaged 7.81 percent A Runners/foals, while the 35 sires with first foals 1991-1996 averaged 6.12 percent A Runners/foals. That's a 22-percent decline in average percentage from the top sires of the 1980's to the top sires of the early 1990's. Either the earlier sires were 22 percent better than the later ones, or the later sires were already suffering, statistically, from the big-book dilution of mare quality which we've already been able to measure in other ways--or both.

The Golden Age for sires of the 1980's is gone. Danzig has sired 14.75 percent A Runners/foals; Storm Cat 12.88 percent; even Sadler's Wells, with 194 'unique A Runners' from almost 1800 foals, has sired almost 11 percent A Runners/foals. A.P. Indy must be a really great sire to have 12.65 percent A Runners/foals, as none of the other 101 sires whose first foals arrived in 1990 or later (except Danehill, first foals 1991, 10.06 percent) even has 10 percent A Runners/foals.

When you look at the 35 prominent sires with first foals 1991-1996 (Table 4), and you see these sires collectively had 6.12 percent A Runners/foals, that looks a good figure to me; it also correlates strongly with our findings a couple of years ago that "six percent is the new 10 percent" as far as Stakes Win-

ners/foals was concerned (assuming that 'A Runners' and 'Stakes Winners' are roughly equivalent, which I am confident they are). Then the tables showing the top 15 sires with first foals 1991-1996 (Table 2) and first foals 1997-2001 (Table 5) make more sense.

The leaderboards showing the top 15 sires from 1991-1996 and the 1997-2001 sires are, in another way, a study in contrasts. There are no surprises among the names you see on the 1991-1996 Top 15; however, six of the top 15 are dead, and Kingmambo, age 16, and A.P. Indy and El Prado, age 17, are the youngest.

On the other hand, there are some surprises among the 1997-2001 Top 15. Distorted Humor (9.92 percent) in the top spot is not one of those surprises: every measurement we've come up with in the past two years makes him America's number one young sire. Smart Strike (9.91 percent) is ultra-consistent, though officially inflated Canadian earnings for some of his runners have undoubtedly helped. Monsun (9.45%), sire of last year's GI Breeders' Cup Turf winner Shirocco, may benefit from limited competition in Germany. Unusual Heat (8.39 percent) is undoubtedly helped by having knocked out sound, hard-knocking runners who have benefitted from the California breeding program. But they are all three very good sires, very consistent sires of money-spinners.

Archers Bay (9.38 percent in just two crops in Canada) and Jules (7.04 percent in North America, including Peace Rules, also very good in Argentina) have both unfortunately died. Just under the seven-percent mark, this group gets a bit more conventional, headed by Maryland's top sire, Not For Love (6.91 percent), and also including the likes of Unbridled's Song (6.69 percent), Texas's Valid Expectations (6.54 percent), Kentucky's Alphabet Soup (6.25 percent) and the aforementioned Forestry and Pulpit; and Britain's new German import, Tiger Hill (6.06 percent). With the other six Kentucky sires on this list at \$25,000 and up, it does make Menifee (6.87 percent, \$15,000) and Military (6.58 percent, \$10,000) look like even bigger bargains.

Colt Bias...

On the three alphabetical lists (Tables 3, 4, 6) the three additional right-hand columns break down each sire's total number of 'unique' A Runners into males ('colts') and females ('fillies'). Because these ratings are earnings-based, and because colts do have greater earnings opportunities than fillies, there is a natural bias toward colts among A Runners: of the more than 25,000 A Runners, almost exactly 60 percent are colts, 40 percent are fillies. Therefore each sire should, naturally, have 60 percent colts among his A Runners. The right-hand percentagefigure shows you the 'colt' percentage for each sire, ranging from Hennessy (88 percent colts, 21 of 24) to Thunder Gulch (17 percent colts, 4 of 23). Remember, though, 60 percent colts is normal: 50-50 is a slight filly bias.

Triple Threats

Waters Get Deeper for Derek...

As the calendar creeps closer and closer to that first Saturday in May, the waters deepen and the competition gets stiffer. Those facts are not lost on trainer Dan Hendricks, who has the enviable task of tightening the girth about Brother Derek (Benchmark), the pro-tem divisional leader, who gets his final Derby prep in Saturday's GI Santa Anita Derby in Arcadia. Hendricks knows he's the target on the weekend, but is relishing the role of the favorite. "The pressure of [being the target] it is minimal in my situation," he said during a national teleconference vesterday. "I have a real good outlook. [Owner] Cecil Peacock and I talk every day and we get a good laugh over it because it's a lot of fun. I keep telling him, 'What kind of trouble have you gotten us into with this horse. Do you know where we're at now with this situation?' and he laughs and he says he blames me." Actually, blame it on the horse. Brother Derek has not taken a misstep this season, with victories in the GII San Rafael S., at the expense of champion Stevie Wonderboy, and in the GII Santa Catalina S. There's a new cast of characters on Saturday, but Hendricks welcomes the challenge. "Point Determined (Point Given, second in the GII San Felipe S. Mar. 18) was just coming around, learning what it's all about, and he ran a very good race. A.P. Warrior (A.P. Indy, half-length winner of the San Felipe) turned it around and ran one of his best races and he ran a good time. I think they're moving forward and they should be formidable foes." Nonetheless, Hendricks expects to accept the trophy on Saturday. "I definitely have the horse to beat. I have the right style at this track." And four weeks down the line? "As far as the Derby goes, you have to have three or four horses that are in the top spot: Barbaro and myself, maybe Lawyer Ron and there will be another one. The problem that I see is the style of the Derby is going to be against me a little bit with my speed."

BELMONT COVERAGE TO REACH TWO

HOURS Officials at ABC Sports, which has the rights to the coverage of the GI Belmont S., have announced that the broadcast of this year's race, scheduled for June 10, will expand to two hours from 5-7 p.m. Eastern time. This year marks the first since 1999 that ABC will cover the final leg of the Triple Crown. NBC previously held the rights to all three races, but the New York Racing Association entered into a five-year agreement with ABC/ESPN to cover the race beginning this year. The normal format for the Triple Crown races was a 90-minute broadcast, though in the several years in which a Triple Crown could have been completed in the Belmont, NBC routinely allowed their coverage to continue well past their 1 1/2-hour allotment. ESPN, owned by the same parent company as ABC, will provide additional coverage from Belmont in the week leading up to the race and from 12 noon on raceday.

THE BALLYDOYLE REPORT

O'BRIEN UNCOVERS HIS RICHES: PART II by Tom Frary

At Ballydoyle's annual pressday Sunday, Coolmore trainer Aidan O'Brien talked about the many talented members in his stable. Tuesday's *TDN* offered a rundown of the operation's sophomores. Today, older horses and juveniles are the focus. Here's what O'Brien had to say:

OLDER HORSES

SCORPION (IRE), c, 4, Montjeu (Ire)--Ardmelody (Ire), by Law Society

"He could be a Coronation Cup and King George horse, as he's a fast ground horse and didn't enjoy the ground in the Arc and at Doncaster [when winning the G1 St Leger]."

ACE (IRE), h, 5, Danehill--Tea House (Ire), by Sassafras (Fr)

"He gave Shirocco a race [when second] in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf and is very durable. If he was going to the G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup [at The Curragh May 28], you'd like to get a run into him beforehand."

AD VALOREM, c, 4, **Danzig**--Classy Women, by Relaunch

"He is well ready and he is in the G3 Gladness S. [at The Curragh] on Sunday, but the ground is important to him and he could start in the G1 Lockinge S. [at Newbury May 20]. He could be one for those high summer mile races, like the G1 Sussex S. [at Goodwood Aug. 2]."

YEATS (IRE), h, 5, <u>Sadler's Wells</u>--Lyndonville (Ire), by Top Ville (Ire)

"We hope Yeats can make up into a [June 22] G1 Ascot Gold Cup horse and there are races at York [the May 19 G2 Yorkshire Cup] and Sandown [the G2 Henry II S. May 29] on the way.

TIGER DANCE, c, 4, <u>Storm Cat</u>--Mariah's Storm, by Rahy

"We ran him in the G2 Challenge S. at Newmarket, but he didn't a clear run and was sixth. He could be a nice horse going seven furlongs and a mile."

TWO-YEAR-OLDS

O'Brien revealed that the juveniles are about three weeks off a run and that Newmarket's Craven meeting could be used to introduce one of the early types. Of those that have made an instant impression, he pointed to two colts by freshman Rock of Gibraltar (Ire) out of Qui Liz (Benny the Dip) and out of Masskana (Ire) (Darshaan {GB}); two Danehill colts out of L'On Vite (Secretariat) and Pipalong (Ire) (Pips Pride {GB}) and a colt by Storm Cat out of Johannesburg's dam Myth (Ogygian). "It could be May before we get them going with them, so we might have to take them to England, as you'd like to have the Royal Ascot two-year-olds out by the end of April or early May," he said.
