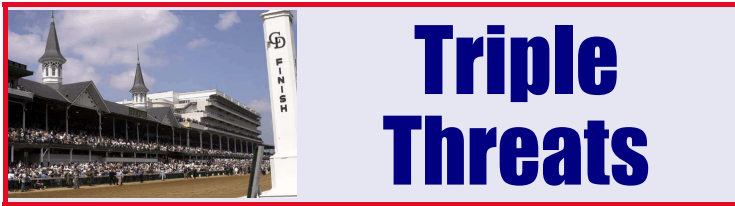

On to Kentucky, Arkansas...

After an exciting weekend of stakes loaded with Kentucky Derby implications, the focus now shifts to next Saturday and the GI Blue Grass S. and GII Arkansas Derby. The races are the last major preps before the Run for the Roses and, save for a runner that may punch his ticket via the Apr. 22 GII Coolmore Lexington, will all but settle the Derby line-up. For

some, like trainer John Ward's **Strong Contender** (Maria's Mon), the Blue Grass is the last chance for graded earnings. For others, it's a chance to iron out the wrinkles in anticipation of the first Saturday in May. That includes dual Grade I winner **First Samurai** (Giant's Causeway), who put forth his final work before

Keeneland's nine-furlong centerpiece yesterday at Churchill Downs. With owners Bruce Lunsford and Lansdon Robbins III looking on, First Samurai breezed four panels in a solid :48 1/5 over a fast main track that wasn't playing particularly fast, his time ranking fourth of 26 on the morning. The Frank Brothers trainee worked in company, breaking off behind a stablemate at the half-mile pole before blowing past in the stretch. He galloped out in a strong 1:00 4/5. "He went really good--really, really good," said jockey Rafael Bejarano, who will be aboard for Saturday's race. "He was well in hand. He was really comfortable, switched leads on the turn and felt really, really relaxed. He worked very easy." The Blue Grass will mark the first time Bejarano and First Samurai have been partnered. Edgar Prado rode the chestnut in his last two, including his win via DQ in the Mar. 4 GII Fountain of Youth in his most recent. **Triple Threats cont. p2**

'HEAVEN' IN JAPANESE 1000 GUINEAS

Kiss to Heaven (Jpn) (Admire Vega {Jpn}) upset a full 18-horse field Sunday to capture the first leg of the Japan's filly Triple Crown, the G1 Oka Sho (Japanese 1000 Guineas-Listed) at Hanshin. Off at 12-1, the bay sat near the back of the pack under Katsumi Ando, then finished with a flourish on the outside to defeat heavily favored **Admire Kiss (Jpn)** (Sunday Silence). "I was just surprised with the win," said the victorious jockey. "I tried to rate her, and she showed a tremendous late kick in the stretch. She is such an impressive, gutsy filly." Despite her longshot odds, the three-year-old was an improving sort with decent credentials. She broke her maiden in her fourth trip to the post in March, then quickly added the Mar. 18 G3 Flower Cup S. to her resume last out.

Keyed Entry Still Possible for Derby...

Following a gutsy but tired third-place effort by favored **Keyed Entry** (Honour and Glory) in Saturday's nine-furlong GI Wood Memorial S., it may have looked to some that the mile and a quarter of the Kentucky Derby would be beyond his scope. Even his jockey, Edgar Prado, declared, "I have one less Derby horse now." (Prado is most likely committed to GI Florida Derby winner Barbaro.) But Todd Pletcher, Keyed Entry's trainer, hasn't made a decision on the Run for the Roses, and yesterday announced that his charge will ship to Churchill next Monday. Explaining his decision, Pletcher said, "At the end of the day, I don't think he ran that bad a race [in the Wood]. Maybe with some adjustments--slowing him down a little bit, [running on] a different surface--who knows? I think he at least ran well enough, and has run well enough every start in his life, that we should at least be here to see how he trains over the racetrack and see how he's doing, and not make a decision, prematurely, one way or another."

One of those on the bubble of making the Derby in terms of earnings is Pletcher's **Sunriver** (Saint Ballado), whose third in the GI Florida Derby yielded a \$100,000 paycheck--his only graded winnings. He's currently 21st on the list of Derby possibles. "I thought he ran well enough in the Florida Derby, he's an improving horse, and I think he'll appreciate this racetrack," said Pletcher. "We're obviously watching the earnings status closely and, I would say, that sometime after the 15th of April, I've got to make a decision on whether we're going to roll the dice and train him up to the Derby or if I'm going to have to take a look at the Lexington." Pletcher added that **My Golden Song** (Unbridled's Song), seventh to Sweetnorthernstain in the GI Illinois Derby over the weekend, has officially been removed from Derby consideration.

This notable trial for the June 11 G1 Prix de Diane (French Oaks) at Chantilly threw up an interesting contender as **Germance** stamped her authority on this tight renewal. As with most of Jean-Claude Rouget's challengers in these Parisian contests, she remained something of an unknown quantity after wins at Bordeaux-le-Bouscat in November and at Toulouse on her sophomore bow Mar. 15. Switched off in rear early by Ioritz Mendizabal, she quickened under hands and heels to wear down **Alix Road** with 100 yards remaining before comfortably holding **Sanaya** and **Christophe Soumillon**. "She is a very talented filly and that was her first real test," her trainer commented. "She passed it brilliantly and quickened really well, We'll take our time to decide, but she could go straight to the Diane."

Saturday's Kentucky Derby trials highlighted exactly why Thoroughbred breeding has such a wide range of devotees. While the GI Wood Memorial was won by Bob and John, whose sire Seeking the Gold commanded a fee of \$250,000 in 2002, the Derbys at Santa Anita and Hawthorne reminded everyone that you don't necessarily need bottomless reserves to breed a live hope for Triple Crown honors.

The trials were also a reminder that you don't need to be based in Kentucky to produce a Kentucky Derby candidate. Brother Derek, hero of the GI Santa Anita Derby, is a son of the California-based Benchmark, who stood for \$5,000 in 2002, while Sweetnorthernst, a wide-margin winner of the GI Illinois Derby, is by the Florida-based Sweetsouthernst, who stood for \$2,500 (one-hundredth of Seeking the Gold's fee).

Both these stallions are achieving more than could reasonably be expected, and it's worth pointing out that Sweetsouthernst, with only 91 named foals in his first two crops, has sired the Santa Anita Derby second General John B. and King's Bishop S. third Better Than Bonds in addition to his Illinois Derby winner.

But it is Bob and John who possesses the type of pedigree one hopes to find in a Kentucky Derby winner. This Stonerside homebred is now on offer at 8-1 with Ladbrokes, with Brother Derek at 3-1 and Barbaro, Discreet Cat and Lawyer Ron also on offer at 8-1. However, most of the other European bookmakers have Bob and John between 10-1 and 14-1, with the longer odds reflecting the fact that Bob and John has five lengths to make up on Brother Derek from their meeting in the Hollywood Futurity four months ago.

These longer odds are possibly also a reflection of the recent record of Wood Memorial winners in the main event. Only one Wood winner--Fusaichi Pegasus (a Stonerside co-bred)--has gone on to win the Kentucky Derby since Pleasant Colony completed the double in 1981 (but Empire Maker, Captain Bodgit and Easy Goer all found only one too good for them at Churchill Downs, and the Stonerside-bred Congaree was third).

As Funny Cide, Monarchos and Go for Gin all warmed up for their Derby victories with the runner's-up spot in the Wood Memorial, perhaps we should be keeping a close eye on Saturday's second Jazil, who gave every indication that he'll benefit from the extra 220 yards at Churchill.

The interesting link between Bob and John and Jazil is that they are both by Seeking the Gold (a runner-up in the Wood Memorial) out of daughters of Deputy Minister.

Fifteen months ago I tried to work out in this column why Seeking the Gold was having an unusually quiet

time. I added that "he probably represents a very acceptable risk at his current fee," and suggested that there was every chance that he would bounce back. I'm pleased to say he is doing so. His impressive daughter Pleasant Home put him back on the Grade-I map with her victory in the Breed-

ers' Cup Distaff, and Seeking the Ante, Seeking Slew and Wanderin Boy also became graded winners in 2005. Now Bob and John and Jazil are leading a crop which sold for up to \$1.8-million as yearlings.

Coincidentally, Deputy Minister was another top-class stallion who inexplicably went off the boil. After siring a succession of Grade-I winners, including four in his 57-strong 1994 crop, Deputy Minister became champion sire in 1997 and 1998. Although his fee and profile rose accordingly, he has come up with only one Grade-I winner, in Canada, from his last eight crops of racing age.

While Deputy Minister has been struggling as a sire, his reputation as a sire of broodmares has grown and grown, thanks to the Grade-I successes of such as Sarava, Halfbridled, Redattore, Magistretti, Request For Parole and Bahamian Pirate. His daughters have earned him a top-five finish in each of the last four years, with only Mr. Prospector keeping him off the top in 2002 and 2003.

The Deputy Minister mares responsible for Bob and John and Jazil--Minister's Melody and Better Than Honour--were both Grade I-placed stakes winners. Minister's Melody had a rather frustrating record, as she won only one stakes race, the Gill Arlington Heights Oaks, but was second in five others, including the GI La Brea.

This pair aren't the first daughters of Deputy Minister to do well with a son of Mr. Prospector, previous graded-winning examples being Smart Strike's son Tenpins, Woodman's daughter Woodland Melody and Conquistador Cielo's son Lone Star Sky.

I said earlier that Bob and John had a pedigree worthy of a Kentucky Derby winner. His dam was a \$400,000 yearling, her appeal stemming partly from the fact that her dam, the stakes-placed My Song For You, was a three-parts sister to Capote. This champion juvenile, who became winter favorite for the Kentucky Derby following his Breeders' Cup Juvenile victory, was by Seattle Slew, whereas My Song For You (a dual winner on dirt and turf) is by Seattle Slew's son Seattle Song, a Grade-I winner at up to 1 1/2 miles.

My Song For You was bred to stay reasonably well, as her dam Too Bald was also responsibly for Vaguely Noble's magnificent son Exceller, an 11-time Grade-I winner from 1 1/4 miles to nearly two miles in Europe and North America, as well as for the successful stallion Baldski.

Too Bald--a Broodmare of the Year--was another very good performer at up to 1 1/16 miles and the next dam

is Hidden Talent, winner of the Kentucky Oaks and Ashland S. and sister to Heavenly Body, one of the best juvenile fillies of 1959. Heavenly Body lives on as the third dam of the outstanding Arc winner Sakhee, while Hidden Talent is the third dam of Broad Brush. This winner of the 1986 Wood Memorial winner

went on to finish a creditable third in the Kentucky Derby. Don't be surprised if history comes close to repeating itself with Bob and John next month.

TRAINER MARTIN PLEADS GUILTY IN CONNECTION WITH GAMBLING RING

Seven of the 17 men indicted in January 2005 for their roles in a multi-million dollar illegal gambling ring have pleaded guilty, including trainer Gregory Martin, who admitted in federal court March 22 that he affected the outcome of a race by illegally administering a baking soda, sugar, and water mix (commonly known as a milkshake) to the horse A One Rocket just prior to his 10-length victory in a Dec. 18, 2003, race at Aqueduct.

Martin, son of Hall of Fame trainer Frank "Pancho" Martin, faces up to five years in prison, an additional three years of supervised release, and a \$250,000 fine. Sentencing is scheduled for June 29.

The 88-count indictment, issued by the United States attorney in the Southern District of New York, alleged, among other things, the gambling ring bet \$200 million through off-shore and Native American rebate betting operations in violation of the Travel Act and Wire Act. Three of the men have alleged ties to the Gambino organized crime family.
