After finishing her juvenile campaign with a Grade I win, Diplomat Lady was a distant runner-up behind division leader Balance in two starts this term. "The last couple of races we've been a little bit disappointed with her finishes," admitted trainer Christopher Paasch. Hoping for a different outcome in yesterday's GII Stonerside Beaumont S., Paasch gave jockey Cornelio Velasquez instructions to put Diplomat Lady right into the mix. "I told [jockey] Cornelio [Velasquez] to let her break real sharp today," the trainer explained. "I think it got a little deep down the lane; she got a little tired in the race." The victory likely earned Diplomat Lady a trip to the May 5 GI Kentucky Oaks. "She's a versatile filly; she wins around two turns, comes back here today and wins around one," Paasch said. "I think she impressed enough that I've already talked to [owner] Mr. [Charles] Cono and I think if she comes out of the race well, you'll see her at Churchill."

Favored India (Hennessy) was never far back, but failed to fire and finished fourth. "She ran even; she just never put in any effort," jockey John Velazquez said of the beaten favorite. The race was marred when GII Santa Ynez S. winner **Dance Daily** (Five Star Day) suffered a condylar fracture of the right front leg at the top of the stretch and was humanely euthanized.



UK Program Offers Pasture Evaluation:
