

PEGASUS SOARS AT KEENELAND

California-based trainer Patrick Biancone didn't necessarily come to Keeneland's Two-year-old in Training Sale in Lexington with pockets overflowing, but landed the eventual salestopper nonetheless. Bidding from the far side of the sales pavilion, the Frenchman went to

\$1.05 million for a colt by
Fusaichi Pegasus from the consignment of Sequel Bloodstock.
The dark bay was bred in New
York by Chester and Mary
Broman and is the first foal produced by Indy Glory (A.P. Indy).
"He's a very good horse, very
well-bred, very sound and had
lovely action," said Biancone,
who said that he put together a
partnership comprised in part of
current clients, including Martin
Schwartz, Fabien Ouaki, Richard

Giacopelli and Lewis Lakin. Of his purchase he added, "He's not a sprinter and looks like he'll go a distance. I saw him in January and fell in love with him then, and we were just waiting for him to come to the sales. He's very well-balanced and very well made." With looks and pedigree, Biancone wasn't surprised at the topper's seven-figure pricetag. "He's probably worth that as a yearling. We know he's a good mover and I couldn't see why he'd make less. The first produce can be anything." Campaigned by the Bromans, Indy Glory, a full sister to Stephen Got Even, was purchased in utero for \$350,000, went on to bank \$283,422 and was placed in the GII Black-Eyed Susan S. and the GII Monmouth Breeders' Cup Oaks at three. Becky Thomas' relationship with the Bromans stems from their partnership in the New York stallion Hook and Ladder. Thomas was given the task of selling this horse in the absence of Barry Eisaman, who consigns the Broman's other twoyear-olds, but does not come to this venue. Hip 184 worked an eighth of a mile in :11 on Apr. 10, but the time did not concern Thomas. "He's an awesome mover and he owned the track when he went out there," she commented. "He's a big and impressive horse." Keeneland cont. p2

NO DOUBT ABOUT THIS CHOICE

Demand was expected to be strong for the offspring of Redoute's Choice (Aus) at this year's Inglis Easter Yearling Sale, and the Arrowfield stallion was able to meet those expectations. Three of his offspring broke the seven-figure barrier at Tuesday's opening session of the sale, including the day's topper, lot 128, a A\$2-

million colt who was purchased by Victoria-based Rob McAnulty. The bay, a half-brother to South African G1SW Suntagonal (Aus), was bought on behalf of a syndicate and will be trained by David Hayes at Lindsay Park. A total of seven yearlings sold for A\$1 million or more, including sons from the first Australian crops of Elu-

sive Quality and Rock of Gibraltar (Ire). "It's been an amazing day's selling from the very kick-off and to sell seven horses over A\$1 million in one day is just sensational," said Managing Director Reg Inglis. "We're very much looking forward to the next two days." An active international bench including Shadwell's and Darley's Angus Gold and John Ferguson, respectively, engaged in battle with a domestic bench that managed to adeptly return fire in several forays to secure the most sought after youngsters. cont. p5

TATTS BREEZE-UP KICKS OFF

Tattersalls' 18th Breeze-Up Sale, which begins after racing in Newmarket at 5 p.m. this evening, looks to be the strongest-ever renewal on paper with some eyecatching pedigrees to turn the heads of potential buyers. There are 206 lots catalogued and the entries breezed before racing on Newmarket's Rowley Mile yesterday morning. Despite agents such as John Ferguson, Angus Gold and Demi O'Byrne being at the Inglis Easter Sale in Australia, there are some high-profile figures in Newmarket this week, including members of the Maktoum family, Coolmore partner Michael Tabor and representatives of the Yoshida family. "The breeze went extremely well, we have a top-class catalogue and I think we saw some very smart two-year-olds on show this morning," said Tattersalls Marketing Director Jimmy George. cont. p7

Better Late than Not at All...

It was something of a frustrating afternoon for consignor Niall Brennan, who RNAd not only the A.P. Indy-Dream Supreme filly, but also several other six-figure horses. Teamed with Mike Ryan on hip 202 late in the sale, Brennan finally got a good horse sold when James D. Conway, agent, landed the son of Distorted Humor for \$850,000. Purchased by Ryan for \$140,000 out of the Keeneland September sale, the California-bred colt came equipped with a nice pedigree as he is a full brother to Crackup, a \$50,000 Barretts May two-year-old who went on to bank over \$290,000 for owner Stan Fulton. Brennan's other big sale on the day was hip 187, another colt by Distorted Humor which was knocked down to RBTS for \$350,000.

A Hundred Reasons to Buy...

Bidding on behalf of Centennial Farms, Don Little jumped in the fray at \$600,000 and walked away with hip 137 yesterday. Maurice Miller, who gave \$475,000 for the bay at last year's Keeneland September sale, consigned the colt for himself and partners Tom Van Meter and Jim Crenshaw. "We were here specifically to buy one top, fancy colt for some investors of ours," Little commented. "We had about three on our list and this was our top prospect. We were fortunate to get him in one bid. He was very athletic and worked great [1/8 of a mile in :10.2 Apr. 10]. He had a terrific pedigree, right into the fourth and fifth dam. It's a real strong depth of pedigree--a great Darby Dan family--and he's got a classic stallion pedigree which we're looking for to be successful on the racetrack." The Apr. 13 foal is a son of Desert Angel (Desert Wine) and is a half brother to GIII Razorback H. winner Desert Air (Manzotti), the multiple graded-stakes placed Desert Demon (Manzotti) and stakes winner Sand Saint (Manzotti). Little said the colt would get 30 to 60 days off and would then be sent to the New York barn of trainer Jimmy Jerkens.

Sobhy Sonbol, acting on behalf of Ahmed Zayat, signed the winning ticket on the May 14 foal, who is a half sister to the crack California sprinter of years past Raw Gold (Rahy). "She's the nicest horse in the sale," Sonbol commented. "She's got the body, the pedigree, she's fast and she's a very sound filly. She's definitely stakes quality. "I knew the first time I saw her that she was going to be a good one and that my job was going to be easy," Miles added. "I love bringing horses here. It's very horse friendly. I like bringing well-bred fillies here where people recognize pedigrees." Based in Charlottesville, Virginia, Miles' main client is the Eldon Farms of Mr. & Mrs. Kenneth Luke.

It wasn't just that hip <u>99</u> breezed a quarter-mile in an impressive :20.3 at the Apr. 10 under-tack show. It was the way that it was accomplished. The exercise rider lost his right stirrup and was forced to dig his

lower leg into the colt's torso, but the colt still managed to post that bullet work. It all came together yesterday when the gray brought \$725,000 from Jimmy Bell, bidding on behalf of Sheikh Mohammed's Darley operation. "We were very excited about him. He trained well, he looks well and he's a big, stretchy colt," Bell said of the Kirkwood Stables consignee. "To go in :20.3 is very good. I'm not sure if carrying the stirrup or not carrying the stirrup made a difference, but he sure looked good at all points and galloped out very

well. He's the kind of colt that we're interested in--a very scopey, athletic, precocious looking two-year-old. He was one of our very top prospects in the sale. We spoke with John who spoke with Sheikh Mohammed and he gave us the green light." Consignor Kip Elser was obviously satisfied with the results. "We were very pleased. I think that was good value for the money," he said. Referring to the incident during last Monday's work, Elser added, "We got a good story out of it, but I hope it never happens again. It just shows what a wellbalanced, efficient mover he is. Give the rider all the credit in the world, but you can't do that on a horse that's in any way erratic." A \$50,000 short yearling purchase out of the OBS Winter Mixed Sale, the son of Five Star Day--Authorized Staff (Relaunch) was an RNA from the Fasig-Tipton July sale, when bidding stalled at \$140,000.

Pair of Fillies for Stonestreet...

Bloodstock agent John Moynihan, acting as agent for his client Jess Jackson's Stonestreet Stables, gave just over \$1 million for a pair of nicely bred fillies. Early in

the session, Moynihan signed the ticket at \$460,000 on hip 14, a Maryland-bred filly by Not For Love out of Petrouchka (Red Ransom). "She's beautiful, physically," he said. "Those are the kind that we're looking for. She trained beautifully, worked unbelievable over the racetrack. She has a lot of scope, and hopefully it'll all work out for us." She was consigned by Randy Miles, agent for Eldon Farm, Hip 101 Horsephotos who paid \$110,000 to acquire the




filly at last summer's Fasig-Tipton July sale. Moynihan was also the successful bidder on hip 101, going to \$575,000 for a filly by Forestry. Consigned to the sale by Eddie Woods, agent, the dark bay is the second foal produced by Barefoot Dyana (Dynaformer), a multiple stakes and graded-stakes placed winner of \$432,548. "I watched her train all week," said Moynihan. "The one filly [hip 14], I didn't expect her to bring that much and this filly I thought had a chance to bring a little bit more, so it all evened out." Hip 101 was a \$70,000 buyback at last year's Fasig-Tipton July sale.

Close, But No Cigar...

Keeneland was on the brink of setting a record price for a juvenile filly sold at auction., but bidding on hip 144 stalled out at \$2.395 million and the filly by A.P. Indy out of multiple Grade I winner Dream Supreme (Seeking the Gold) was led out of the Keeneland sales pavilion unsold. "Close, but not close enough," said Edward Sexton of Kinsman Farm, who was selling the attractive dark bay through the Niall Brennan Stables agency. "[The reserve was] a little bit more than that," Sexton said. "She was in there for people to buy her, she was there for sale. She's a good filly. If she brought her money, we'd sell her. If not, we'll bring her home and race her." Despite the inability to get the job done, there was little dismay among the connections. "We're not a bit disappointed," Sexton submitted. "She's a top-class filly, she's a stakes filly. Money is not the issue with Mr. Steinbrenner. We've got the whole family, so we thought we'd bring here. I'm surprised she didn't get the money." As for what happens next, Sexton added, "More than likely she'll be going to Bill Mott. Then when she goes out and wins a stakes race, she'll be worth twice as much. Now was the time to buy. You never buy the finished goods."

Baby Steps Forward...

After a 2005 April sale that was surprisingly disappointing, there was a small bump in the major statistical categories yesterday. Just 87 horses were reported as sold, but the average increased by 30.6 percent, while the median was up by 15.4 percent. "I think the sale started a little slow, but found its pace, and overall, it was a successful exercise," said Keeneland Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "The median was up. There's no mistake that having a large contingent of Japanese helped the middle market and they were extremely busy and the top end was very good. We didn't have a Zayat here last year, that certainly helped. Stonestreet was busy this year. When you have new players at that level, it does help." Addressing the 76 horses that were withdrawn prior to the sale, he commented, "It's a performance sale. The way the two-year-old market is...the investment in these horses is very high. If a horse has a minor blemish, these people have too much money involved in them to put them through here. The two-year-old market has evolved so much over the last 20 years. When they buy these horses, they pay retail prices, not wholesale prices. If there's a minor blemish that comes up, they have to stop on these horses. They can't push or force them. The consignors are looking after their horse."

No. One Choice at Inglis...

Australia's leading freshman sire of 2004, Redoute's Choice has built on that promising start with six individual Group 1 winners this year, including a trio of twoyear-olds in Miss Finland (Aus), heroine of the A\$3million G1 Golden Slipper S.; and Nadeem (Aus), winner of the A\$1-million G1 Blue Diamond S. Yesterday's session topper, a son of the Last Tycoon (Ire) mare Urge to Merge (Ire), was offered by Arrowfield and bought by Rob McAnulty, who is now off to Phuket, Thailand, after buying his top prospect. "We are concentrating our business on buying colts with stallion pedigrees--you can't buy them overseas," explained McAnulty. "Plus, Australian racing is so good that breeders really want to race in this country." McAnulty added, "I love Last Tycoon mares, but at the end of the day the horse has got to be an athlete, and we judged him to be the best athlete on the ground. We had a budget of A\$2 million and would not have spent one cent over that. We did not have our first bid until A\$1.7 million and then we thought, 'Why die wondering?' and went to A\$2 million." McAnulty, who will race the colt as part of a syndicate, felt he was fairly priced. "The horse is already syndicated and going to David Hayes to train, which makes it a lot easier," he said. "He is not expensive; we are in a global business, there are 10 of us in him all taking A\$200,000 worth."

On Target...

Arrowfield also consigned the second-highest priced yearling on the day, lot 51, for A\$1.6 million. This Redoute's Choice colt out of Singles Bar (Aus) (Rory's Jester {Aus}) went to trainer Len Freedman for a syndicate. The bay, a full-brother to stakes-winner Not a Single Doubt (Aus), was produced by a half-sister to leading sire Snippets (Aus). "I think he's great value-you have to expect to pay these sort of prices, and with all the speed in the family he's got to be a very, very good two-year-old for next season," Freedman said. Arrowfield's John Messara was understandably pleased with the day's results. "This is roughly what was expected," he said. "They are top-notch colts by Redoute's Choice, the strongest two female pedigrees in the sale by him, but we didn't want to raise our expectations too high. I was not confident--I was too nervous about him having to maintain what he did last year at Easter, but he certainly has done that and more." In 2005, Redoute's Choice had 35 yearlings sell at this sale for an average of A\$611,714.

Get a Piece of the Rock...

Tuesday's highest-priced filly was lot 81, an A\$1.3 million representative from the first Australian crop of Danehill's champion son Rock of Gibraltar (Ire). Consigned by Coolmore Stud, she was purchased by New Zealand owner/breeder David Ellis. "Myself and our trainer Mark Walker thought she was the best on type in the sale," Ellis said. "She's got a phenomenal pedigree, and presents a great investment for breeding when her racing days are over." The brown filly was produced by Subterfuge (GB) (Machiavellian), who is already the dam of Hong Kong standout Scintillation (Aus) (Danehill) and Australian multiple Group 2 winner Shania Dane (Aus) (Danehill). She is from the staminaladen family of G1 Derby S. hero Slip Anchor (GB).

Lots to Watch at Tattersalls...

Willie Browne's co. Tipperary-based Mocklershill Stables, long one of the event's top vendors, has 24 lots catalogued this year. Many watching the morning workouts yesterday felt that a Green Desert colt out of G3 Park Hill S. heroine Alexander Three D (Ire) (Pennekamp), Lot 128, could be not only the star of Browne's draft, but possibly the whole sale after his solo spin. Bred by Castleton Lyons owner Dr. Tony Ryan, the colt had been bought in utero when Alexander Three D was acquired for \$1.7 million at Keeneland November in 2003. Sent through last year's Tattersalls October sale, he was bought back for 310,000 guineas. Also impressive yesterday was Lot 58, a Rock of Gibraltar (Ire) colt who cost Browne 165,000gns as a yearling; as well as Lot 145, a Dynaformer colt knocked down to Hartley/De Renzo for \$150,000 at Keeneland in September. Con Marnane's Bansha House Stables, whose draft 12 months ago included subsequent Group 1 winners Amadeus Wolf (GB) and Palace Episode, is another well-represented vendor. Lot 196, a Monashee Mountain colt bought for just €30,000 at Fairyhouse in September, was among Marnane's standouts. Another was Lot 61, a well-connected El Prado (Ire) filly who cost \$110,000 at Keeneland seven months ago. the GI Kentucky Derby and will not contest any of the Triple Crown races. Godolphin representatives said yesterday the three-year-old colt would instead be shipped to the U.S. and stabled at Belmont Park, and would be pointed toward major races in the second half of the season. "Discreet Cat is a

really promising young horse, but after assessing the situation, Sheikh Mohammed has decided that he would prefer to give him more time," explained Godolphin's Racing Manager, Simon Crisford. "We see him as an important horse for Godolphin, both later this season and next year. He won't actually be three until May, so we want to give him time to develop. Although we have no specific targets in mind for him at the moment, Discreet Cat will not be running in any of the Triple Crown races." Purchased privately last year after breaking his maiden at Saratoga, Discreet Cat was shipped to Dubai for the winter, where he won a conditions race and the UAE Derby on the Dubai World Cup undercard.

A FAMILY AFFAIR

On a 300-acre farm in Oregon resides Miss Soft Sell, bred by Mary Caldwell, the 78-year-old widow of the late, great Keeneland lead auctioneer Tom Caldwell and mother of current Keeneland baritones Scott and Cris.

There is no family more excited than the Caldwells these days. For the first time, Mary, her two sons and her daughters, Georgeanna and Karen, will attend the races together to watch their product Brother Derek in the Kentucky Derby May 6.

Bred and raised by the Caldwell family, 13-year-old Miss Soft Sell, herself an Oregon-bred and one of just three Thoroughbred mares on the small farm, did not produce a black-type performer until her fourth foal, Don'tsellmeshort (Benchmark), took a trio of California-bred stakes and was third in the GII Laz Barrera Memorial S. in 2004. Her next foal, Swissle Stick (Swiss Yodeler) was a \$600,000 Barretts March Two-Year-Old after being sold by the Caldwells for \$70,000 as a weanling at the 2002 Keeneland November sale.

But Miss Soft Sell was just getting started and the Caldwell family's fortune was about to increase.

Returned to Rivers Edge Farm to be bred back to Benchmark, Miss Soft Cell produced a bay colt on Mar. 31, 2003.

"We knew we had a really good colt," Scott Caldwell said. "A lot of people were looking at him. Fred Seitz sold him for us and Fred knew we had a nice colt, too."

Consigned by Seitz's Brookdale Farm to the 2004 Keeneland September sale, the colt was knocked down [by Cris Caldwell] to John Brocklebank for \$150,000 to be resold as a juvenile. As he was a California-bred, the decision was made to send the horse to the Barretts March sale, where he was purchased by trainer Dan Hendricks for his client Cecil Peacock.

These days, two-time Grade I winner Brother Derek finds himself at the head of nearly every list of Derby contenders, leading to the family reunion in Louisville.

"We've had a couple of other really nice stakes winners that we've raised, but nothing like this," Caldwell explained. "This is our superhorse, our once-in-a-lifetime horse. To have him with someone like Dan Hendricks, who's been a friend of the family for ever and ever and with all that Dan's going through, to me this is the next Disneyworld production. With what Dan's been through and his wife and a little, tiny farm in Oregon putting a horse of this caliber onto the racetrack--pretty exciting thing I think."

Scott, 54 years of age who looks at least 10 years younger than that, says that the entire ride thus far has been a fountain of youth of sorts for his mom.

"It's been awesome for her. This is making her life right now," he explains. "She lost our dad and you can imagine what that was like for all of us. And then to have this opportunity come along, it's really started her life all over again. She's excited again about life and it's engaged her into the business again."

And what would dad have to say right now about Miss Soft Sell?

"I think my dad would say 'sell,'" Caldwell offers.
"He used to tell me, when I used to trade a lot of cattle, 'Son, you'll never go broke making a profit,' and there's obviously a lot of profit involved in this one. But it's making mom happy and that's what's important to all of us right now."

Despite all the potential and the allure of a big score, Caldwell expects his mom to keep the no sale sign out.

"The phone's ringing off the hook, but I think the word's gotten out that she's not for sale and it's not a matter of price, she's just not for sale," he explains. "I don't think she has any designs now or in the future of selling her. I think this will be our foundation mare and we'll go from there."

With the attention she's gained from the exploits of Brother Derek, Miss Soft Sell has earned the right to be sent east instead of south for her next trip to the breeding shed. Her potential mates include Distorted Humor, Storm Cat and Vindication, but Caldwell is quick to add that it is a business decision only.

"We have no issues at all with Benchmark and Rivers Edge--they've been great to us," he says. "Benchmark is a great horse. She's been bred twice to him and both are stakes winners, and it's hard to go against that connection. But you also realize that with a \$7,500 or \$10,000 stud fee, there's a maximum you can attain at auction. We found this out [in 2004] with this great colt--he only brought \$150,000 and that's all he was worth. Now we think that if we go with one of these other horses we're looking at, maybe he's the million-dollar horse."

Miss Soft Sell is the dam of a two-year-old full brother to Swissle Stick and has a yearling colt by Silver Charm. Her foal of 2006 died after running into a fence.

But that should not detract from a terrific time at the Downs in two weeks' time.

"It's already been a great ride and maybe it'll get even better," Caldwell adds.



She comes from the minnows amongst the training profession, had to give weight to all and decided to go sideways down the infamous "dip," but Speciosa still emerged on top in this contest. Though the bay was penalised for her exploits in the G2 Rockfel S. over course and distance in October and--according to her trainer Pam Sly--was in need of a run, the 9-1 shot defied the odds from the front under an enterprising ride by Michael Fenton. Despite veering away from her rivals across to the stands' rail inside the final quarter, the lone figure was still a length too good for Spinning Queen at the line, booking her ticket to the G1 1000 Guineas back here May 7. "I did say to the owners that she was not 100 percent fit," her conditioner explained. "What we've done is just on the all-weather, as we haven't been able to get on the grass as it's so firm." Speciosa had shown a tendency to wander when breaking her maiden at Beverley in August before finishing third in the G2 May Hill S. over a mile at Doncaster the following month. Her Rockfel upset was unexpected, but she is beginning to earn serious respect now and has an agenda to match. "When she won at Beverley she went over to the stands and I don't know why she veers--we put a ring bit on, but she still does it," Sly added. "She was a bit of a minx last year, but she's a lot better now and she'll go to the Guineas. We've got the English Guineas, the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas [at The Curragh May 28] and then the G1 Coronation S. [at Royal Ascot June 231."

From a racing viewpoint, the most notable events of the weekend may have been the victories of Sinister Minister and Lawyer Ron in their respective Classic trials. For those interested in pedigree patterns, however, the weekend also threw-up two real gems in the distaff graded scorers in Wend and Ready to Please.

One of the top turf fillies of 2005, Wend won five straight on the grass, including the Hollywood Wildcat Breeders' Cup H. and Gll New York H., before loosing her next three. She opened this campaign with a wire-to-wine win in the Glll Honey Fox H., and the reversed tactics to come off the pace and take this weekend's Gll Jenny Wiley S. at Keeneland.

Wend is a member of the third crop of Pulpit, himself a member of the first crop sired by A.P. Indy, and the first horse to draw attention to A.P. Indy as a sire of sires. Like so many horses in the present extremely volatile marketplace, Pulpit has seen his stud fee rise and fall in roller-coaster fashion, but the 12-year-old is currently at an all-time high, being booked full for 2006 at a fee of \$80,000.

While his fee may have gone through some ups and downs, there has been one constant to Pulpit's stud career, and that is the ability to come up with at least one really good horse in every crop. He had four firstcrop stakes winners, headed by Essence of Dubai, successful in the GII Super Derby, GII Norfolk S. and GII UAE Derby, as well as Japanese multiple-graded-scorer Pit Fighter. From the second crop came six stakes winners, of which the best were the GII Lane's End Breeders' Futurity and GI Hopeful S. victor Sky Mesa; and Stroll, successful in several graded stakes including the GI Woodward Reserve Turf Classic. The third season is a tough one for many stallions, but for Pulpit, it yielded another six stakes winners, including, in addition to Wend, the GI Wood Memorial hero Tapit; Purge, who ended his career with a win in last year's GI Cigar Mile; and graded scorers Fifth Overture and Ecclesiastic. The GII Peter Pan S. winner Oratory, whose very promising career was stopped by injury, was one of three stakes winners from Pulpit's fourth crop, and his fifth crop, currently three-year-olds, includes Corinthian, who was first past the post in the GII Fountain of Youth S., but was disqualified (and who is currently sidelined with a hairline crack in a hind ankle) and Laity, a stakes winner at two and three. Before leaving Pulpit, we should note as a result of a conservative policy by his management, his first six crops have averaged what is by todays standards, a fairly modest number of just under 53 foals per crop, with only the fifth crop topping 60, and this gives him a very creditable eight percent stakes winners to foals total to date.

Wend is out of the Topsider mare Thread, heroine of the Palisades S. and Audubon Oaks. Thread is half-sister to the stakes-winning Cox's Ridge filly Hitch, and out of Knot, a daughter of Majestic Light who captured the Debutante S. as a two-year-old. The third dam, Loop, is another stakes winner, by virtue of a victory in the Athena H. By Round Table out of the Mother Goose third Lea Moon, Loop was a sister to two very accomplished runners in Duel, winner of the Charles H. Strub S., and Monitor, winner of the Arkansas Derby in a new track-record. Loop's granddam, Lea Lark, is ancestress of numerous well-known performers including Lea Lane, Leallah, Miswaki, Singletary, Voodoo Dancer, Lacovia, Eternity Star, Martial Law, Lujain, Almutawakel, White Muzzle, Ballingary, Aristotle, Flamenco, Starborough, Sir Beaufort, Clever Trevor General Challenge, Notable Career, A P Valentine and young sire Jump Start (the last five from the same Seattle Slew line as Pulpit, and the last two by A.P. Indy). cont. p13

Wend's own dam, Thread, has a fascinating pedigree, as her sire, Topsider, is out of Champion Drumtop, and both Drumtop an Thread's granddam, Loop, are by Round Table out of Nasrullah mares, giving her three-quarter relatives 2x2. Pulpit builds on this considerably as his grandsire, Seattle Slew, is out of a mare by Poker, another Round Table/Nasrullah cross, while his fourth dam, Monarchy, is a sister to Round Table. This gives Wend three crosses of Round Table, all through three-quarter relatives, along with another cross of a sister. Of course, Round Table is a son of Princeguillo, and the cross which produced Poker, Drumtop and Loop (Princequillo/Nasrullah) is reverse both in Seattle Slew (an extended Nasrullah/Princequillo cross) and in A.P. Indy's maternal grandsire, Secretariat. Before leaving this pedigree, it's worth noting that Round Table was equally formidable on dirt or turf, and his influence might have something to do with the fact that six of Pulpit's 12 graded stakes winners have earned that distinction on the grass.

Ready to Please, who took the GII Fantasy S. at Oaklawn on Friday has an even more intense pedigree pattern. She is a member of the second crop of More Than Ready, a young horse who is off to a very fast start. His first crop has already produced nine stakes winners, including Ready's Gal (a half-sister to the dam of Ready to Please), who is winner of the GIII Hillsborough S. and GIII Lake George S., and the graded placed stakes winners More Moonlight and More Than Promised. There are already six stakes winners in More Than Ready's second crop, including Ready to Please, English group winner La Chunga, and the gradedstakes-placed R Loyal Man. We should also note that More Than Ready's first Southern Hemisphere crop saw him lift a crown as Australia's Leading Freshman Sire for the 2004-2005 season, and has already produced eight stakes winners, including the G1 Victoria Derby winner Benicio, and G1 Champagne S. victor Carry On

Ready to Please is out of the unraced Pine Bluff mare Guilty Pleasure. Since Pine Bluff is by a son of Northern Dancer out of a Halo mare, he is bred on a reverse cross to More Than Ready's sire, Southern Halo, who is by Halo out of a Northern Dancer mare. That is not all, however, as More Than Ready's dam, Woodman's Girl, is by a son of Mr. Prospector out of a mare by Naskra, while Exquisite Mistress, the stakes-winning granddam of Ready to Please, is by a son of Naskra out of a mare by Mr. Prospector's brother, Search For Gold. So, More Than Ready's sire is a reverse cross to the broodmare sire of Ready to Please and his dam is a reverse cross to the dam of Ready to Please, and this also means of the 16 names in the third generation of More Than Ready's pedigree, eight are repeated in the third generation of Ready to Please's dam. Ready's Gal, the gradedstakes-winning three-parts sister to Ready to Please, merely has Mr. Prospector/Search For Gold 4x3 and Naskra 4x3, with More Than Ready's dam being a reverse cross to the dam of Ready to Please. Since Ready to Please and Ready's Gal are the first two graded stakes winners from More Than Ready's first two crops, this probably isn't a coincidence.

KENTUCKY RACING AUTHORITY'S OPERATING BUDGET CUT

By Leslie Deckard, courtesy of The Blood-Horse The 2007-08 operating budget for the Kentucky Horse Racing Authority will be a little lighter after 40 percent of its funding was removed by the state General Assembly. Speaking during an April 17 KHRA meeting, La Juana Wilcher, Environmental and Public Protection Secretary, which oversees the authority, said the loss of funds would leave the authority scrambling on how to pay for its programs, such as staffing the new breeders' incentive fund and tighter medication policies. The loss of funding comes after the legislature opted to withdraw a daily operating assessment paid by racetracks to the KHRA based on the number of live race days. Under the current structure, Thoroughbred tracks pay \$3,500 per live racing day, and Standardbred and Quarter Horse tracks \$1,750. The KHRA will collect about \$1.2 million in fee assessments from state racetracks in the 2006 fiscal year, which ends June 30. The fees will not be collected beginning July 1. For instance, Turfway Park, which just concluded a 69-day meet, would have retained \$241,000 if the assessments were not in place. The Red Mile, a Lexington harness track, would retain more than \$70,000 during a typical meet. According to Sen. Damon Thayer (R-Georgetown), the racetrack assessment was withdrawn after state auditor Crit Luallen found the KHRA has dubious statutory authority to levy assessments against racetracks. The authority's operating budget currently is about \$3 million drawn from three sources. In addition to the \$1.2 million in fees paid by racetracks, the KHRA also receives about \$1.3 million from licensing and other fees, and \$500,000 from the state General Fund.
