\$3-MILLION COLT SMASHES AUSSIE RECORD

Redoute's Choice continued to be the clear choice of bidders with a record-smashing A\$3-million son of the hot sire leading the way at yesterday's second session of the Inglis Easter Yearling Sale. South African trainer

Charles Laird made the historic final bid on the colt out of Deja Slew (Slew o' Gold), passing the previous Australian record price of A\$2.5 million set by another son of Redoute's Choice at this sale last year. Redoute's Choice's hot streak continued a little under an hour later when Tim Stakemire, bidding on behalf of Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa Al Maktoum,

made a winning bid of A\$2.3 million for a yearling out of Exact (Aus) (Marauding {NZ}). Both seven-figure yearlings were consigned by Yarraman Park. After the two sales, an ecstatic Arthur Mitchell of Yarraman said, "It's been a great sale. I had no idea it would make that much. This just might be the best 24 hours of my life...and we might beat it again [Thursday]." Mitchell is slated to offer champion Alinghi (Aus)'s full sister as lot 451 at the concluding session. Laird, who warmed up for his record-breaking purchase with a A\$1-million Giant's Causeway colt Tuesday, was prepared to go even higher today. "We really wanted this one, we knew this was the one," Laird said. "We have the best colt at the sales; he's an attractive woman on the street you know, he talks to you." The sale topper will head to South Africa for Laird's big owner Marcus Jooste. Through two days of selling, Redoute's Choice's progeny are averaging A\$881,750; they included five of the top 10 lots during Wednesday's session. Easter Sale cont. p2

Inglis sold 73 yearlings yesterday for a total of A\$25,380,000 and an average of A\$347,671. The median was A\$220,000. Through two days, a total of 240 yearlings have brought A\$68,710,000, for an average of A\$286,292 and a median of A\$180,000. The cumulative average is up a smashing 36.4 percent over a year ago, when 262 yearlings sold for A\$54,998,000 and an average of A\$209,916. "I didn't think the \$2.5-million record would be broken," admitted Inglis Managing Director Reg Inglis. "Although we were very confident going into this sale, it has way surpassed our wildest expectations. This is the greatest sale we've ever seen." The sale's final session gets underway today at 10:30 a.m. The Easter Weanling sale begins Sunday.

Sir Michael Stoute has saddled seven winners of this contest since 1985. His streak rests this year on the shoulders of Michael Tabor, Susan Magnier and Derrick Smith's City of Troy. Unbeaten in his first two summer starts at conditions level at Newbury and Doncaster, his upward progression was halted with a disappointing fourth in his first real test, the G2 Royal Lodge S. over course and distance in late September. A pulled muscle was diagnosed for that flop and Tabor is hopeful he can get back in the Guineas picture today. "I think he's done very well over the winter and I'm looking forward to him running a big race," Tabor said Tuesday. "We'll have to decide after that what he does." Barry Hills ended a 23-year Craven drought with subsequent G1 2000 Guineas winner Haafhd (GB) in 2004 and relies on John Grant's Killybegs, who followed a third in the G2 Champagne S. at Doncaster with a short-head second to Aussie Rules in the G3 Somerville Tattersalls S. here in September. Peter Chapple-Hyam's sophomores started the meeting with a vengeance and the maiden Cousteau flies the flag this time. Runner-up to two smart colts in Papal Bull (GB) and Book of Music (Ire) at Leicester and here, respectively, he carries a measure of stable confidence. "Cousteau is a good horse," Chapple-Hyam said. "He's been working with [Tuesday's maiden winner] Aeroplane, so I have to run him." Richard Hannon has annexed four renewals, with three coming since 2000, and saddles the unbeaten Gin Jockey, who has been off since taking the valuable Prix des Yearlings at Deauville in August.

2YO SALES: FLORIDA RULES

The Titans have voted with their feet: they're in Australia this week, at the Southern Hemisphere's leading sale, Inglis's Sydney Easter Yearling Sale, along with several other top 'Northern' outfits with Southern Hemisphere operations. They are down there buying for those operations, of course. The six-month time difference--but more importantly, the buoyant Thoroughbred industry in the Southern Hemisphere--make Sydney Easter the number-one destination for all buyers who want to race horses foaled between August and December each year. That includes quite a few international buyers, as well as native Australasians who, as often as not, are displaying the firepower to keep some of their best prospects in Australasian hands. Whether these sales could have surged in the last few years without the influx of top Northern stallions working dual-hemisphere seasons is a moot point: the stallions are there, and the fact that home-grown stallions like Redoute's Choice (by dual-hemisphere sire Danehill), Encosta de Lago (by dual-hemisphere sire Fairy King), and Zabeel (by New Zealand's great import, Sir Tristram) are siring just as many seven-figure Southern yearlings as the current imports is testimony to the influence of those earlier 'dual' sires.

Inglis catalogued over 100 fewer horses this year (492) than last (598), yet, with the opening-day gross up 16 percent in spite of there being 17 percent fewer yearlings through the ring, there must be a very good chance that, by the time the sale ends tonight, it will have broken the A\$100-million mark. Last year's sale grossed A\$90 million, but with fewer than 10 percent not-solds in Tuesday's opening session, an A\$100-million sale looks very much on the cards. It is a parallel universe, but it can be nothing but good news that the industry down there is doing so well.

Meanwhile, up north, we have been having two major two-year-old sales this week. With their best catalogue ever, Europe's leading Thoroughbred auctioneers, Tattersalls, has a chance to dislodge Barretts as the world's number four two-vear-old sale in terms of total gross, and to dislodge OBS March--which itself was up a third in average this year--as number four two-yearold sale in terms of average. Tattersalls's sale had already more than doubled in gross, average, and median since 2001. To a great extent, this is simply Europe's two-year-old-in-training market catching up with its American counterparts. Doncaster has already established there is a buoyant market in Europe for the \$40,000 two-year-old; we expect Tatts to comfortably break the \$100,000 barrier for a two-year-old sale for the first time in Europe.



Keeneland wrapped up the five-sale major North American two-year-old market Tuesday, with just 87 two-year-olds (59 percent of the 147 sent through the ring) selling, although those that did sell grossed \$18,440,000, and averaged \$211,954, up 31 percent from last year, and only about three percent below the 2004 peak of \$217,941. As far as it goes, that is a good enough result. You could say the same thing about Barretts last month, when 93 two-year-olds grossed \$14,361,000, and averaged \$154,419. But, with 713 two-year-olds sold in the five major North American sales, it's surely telling that barely a quarter of those were sold in the two major sales outside Florida.


Market Share: Fla vs. Non-Fla '06



You might be tempted to slightly underrate Florida's performance in the two-year-old market because of the \$16-million horse, but that would be way wrong. In 2003, the last year North America's two-year-old saletopper did not sell at Calder, 743 two-year-olds sold at the five sales, grossing \$93,674,500 and averaging \$126,076; 36 percent of the gross that year was attained outside Florida.

By the close of business Tuesday, the five-sale gross had increased 48 percent in four years, and the average had increased 55 percent. The three Florida sales (OBS February and March, and Fasig-Tipton's Calder sale, on Feb. 28 this year) had seen a 77-percent increase in gross, by over \$46 million, while the two non-Florida sales, Barretts and Keeneland, had lost three percent, from \$33.6 million in 2003, to \$32.8 million. That may not sound like much, but, in a market that's grown by 48 percent, it translates into a 19-percent increase in market share for Florida, but a 34-percent drop in market share for the other two sales.

While all but three percent of this year's \$12-million increase in gross at Calder can be attributed to the difference in the price tags between last year's \$5.2-million sale-topper and this year's \$16-million Forestry colt, even the new world record Thoroughbred at auction does not really distort the Fasig Calder's sale pre-eminence in the two-year-old market: it was already the world's number-one sale of two-year-olds.

In 2003, Calder's gross represented 31 percent of the whole five-sale market; by last year it was 41 percent, and this year it was 45 percent. As the five-sale market has grown 48 percent in gross since 2003, the two OBS sales combined have grown 42 percent; so, even though their market share has dropped slightly (33 percent to 31.7 percent), they are still very much part of the buoyant Florida two-year-old market. In fact, their earlier 'select' sale grossed less than two percent more this year than in 2003: their big growth has come in their later 'select' sale, at which the gross has jumped by 71 percent in the same period. As for Keeneland, their two-year-old sale may just be a victim of this market only having a certain amount of depth for the six-figure two-year-old, and maybe most of them are being bought in February and March. As for Barretts, the fact that their premier sale doesn't even see 100 listed sales anymore is surely more a reflection of the dismal fields now prevalent in California racing. Twenty years ago, the Hollywood Park two-year-old sale was the hottest one in the country, but now Calder, and Florida, rule supreme in the North American two-year-old market.

TATTERSALLS: OPENING NIGHT BONANZA

We expected fireworks on the opening night of the Tattersalls two-year-old in training sale last night, and we got them. As detailed elsewhere in this issue, 75 two-year-olds sold for 5,656,000gns, an average of 75,413gns. If they sustain that pace through tonight's final session, the sale will end up grossing over \$20 million, and averaging around \$135,000. They are on course for a 78-percent rise in gross, and a 50-percent rise in average. If that's how it finishes up, it would actually catapult Tattersalls into the number three spot among North American/European two-year-old companies in terms of their main sale's gross. In other words, if they do finish up grossing over \$20 million, that would be more than either Barretts (\$14.3 million) or Keeneland (\$18.4 million) grossed for their main twoyear-old sales this year. Though, in both those cases, they were one-day sales with fewer horses and higher averages. Nonetheless, it would qualify as very big news, and means that in the future, we'll have to expand our view of the major two-year-old sale market, which will now include six sales from five sales companies--two in Florida, and one each in California, Kentucky, and Newmarket.

GODOLPHIN HOPES STRETCH OUT Godolphin firmed up their early Classic plans on Tuesday when conducting a series of racecourse gallops at Nad Al Sheba. After Opera Cape (Ire) (Barathea {Ire}) and Silca's Sister (GB) (Inchinor {GB}) came out on top in seven-furlong workouts, the duo were confirmed on course, respectively, for the May 6 G1 2000 Guineas and fillies' equivalent the following day by Racing Manager Simon Crisford. Of last year's G1 Prix Morny heroine Silca's Sister, who galloped with Royal Proposal (GB) (King's Best) and G1 Prix Marcel Boussac third Deveron (Cozzene), he said, "Silca's Sister was the most impressive of all our workers and did a really nice piece of work. She's very fit and has had an excellent winter, so she's booked her ticket to the 1000 Guineas. [Jockey] Frankie [Dettori] was very pleased with her and she handled the watered track really well. The gallops were probably not as informative as in previous years and they weren't races, as we had already identified what our Guineas horses were. Silca's Sister is a very straightforward filly and definitely appears to have trained on. She represents really good each-way value in the Guineas." Opera Cape, who took the G3 Solario S. at Sandown in August before finishing second in Longchamp's G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere and third in the G1 Dewhurst S. at Newmarket in October, will line up for the colts' mile Classic after pleasing in his spin. "He worked nicely and he's a very solid, nice colt," Crisford added. "If he can reproduce last year's form, he belongs in the 2000 Guineas, but he needs to improve a fair bit to be troubling the fancied contenders there." Also on show was the G1 Racing Post Trophy winner Palace Episode (Machiavellian), who will be aimed at the G2 Dante S. at York May 18 and the G1 Sussex S. winner Proclamation (Ire) (King's Best), destined for the May 20 G1 Juddmonte Lockinge S. at Newbury. "Palace Episode is a little bit behind schedule, so the Dante looks like a good option for him as he'll definitely stay the trip well," he continued. "In the last month or so, he's really begun to turn the corner and do very well. Proclamation has had an excellent winter and hasn't put a foot wrong at all. He had a solo spin on the turf yesterday and really enjoyed himself--his action was excellent and he's going to go to Newbury and, all being well, then head to Royal Ascot for the G1 Queen Anne S. [June 20]."

NAKHEEL DECISION DELAYED Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's Nakheel (GB) (Sadler's Wells) will have a course of physio this week to determine whether the unbeaten colt makes the May 6 G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket. Trainer Mark Johnston revealed early this week that last year's Listed Silver Tankard S. winner had worked disappointingly. "He didn't work well and was stiff and sore afterwards," Johnston said yesterday. "Sheikh Hamdan's vet is coming over from Australia and will have a look at him on Friday. It depends what happens after that, but it is obviously a big worry to us and I couldn't say whether he will go for the Guineas at this stage."

NANNINA WARMS UP Cheveley Park Stud's Nannina (GB) (Medicean {GB}) was the latest in a series of Classic contenders to enjoy a racecourse gallop as she covered the Rowley Mile at Newmarket. Last year's G1 Fillies' Mile heroine was partnered by Robert Havlin over six and a half furlongs and quickened up at the end of the spin under the watchful eye of trainer John Gosden. "She did like the ground today and it was a nice workout--six and a half furlongs in a cross wind would be as much as you would want to do," Gosden told *PA Sport*. "All she wants now is some warmer weather. A filly like her is crying out for it to bring on her that little bit more."

FUND SET UP TO AID DISABLED JOCKEYS

A group of racetracks and racing organizations are joining with the Jockeys' Guild to raise funds for the immediate needs of permanently disabled riders. A release from the Thoroughbred Racing Associations said a campaign is underway to raise \$1 million by June 15 to help 60 disabled jockeys. Those involved are Churchill Downs Inc, Magna Entertainment Corp., the New York Racing Association, Sam Houston Race Park, the Thoroughbred Racing Associations, the National Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association, the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association, and the National Thoroughbred Racing Association. The funds will flow through NTRA Charities - Permanently Disabled Jockeys Fund. NTRA Charities is a 501 (c) (3) charity. A 10-member board will oversee the distribution of the money--three representatives of the Jockeys' Guild; racetrack representatives from Churchill, Magna, and a TRA track designee; an NTRA representative on an interim basis, and three representatives of horsemen's groups, including the National Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association. "Many of these disabled jockeys are facing financial concerns because of health care costs, or simply require help in meeting the needs of day-to-day living," said Chris Scherf, executive director of the Thoroughbred Racing Associations. "We hope that horsemen and tracks throughout North America, along with others associated with Thoroughbred racing, will join our organizations in donating to this worthy effort. As we offer interim help to these permanently disabled jockeys, our organizations will continue to work with the Jockeys' Guild toward a long-term solution that will ease the concerns of these retired riders and enable them to live with dignity and in comfort."
