Ouija Board (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}), winner of last season's G1 Audemars Piguet Hong Kong Vase, returns to Hong Kong for today's G1 Queen Elizabeth II Cup at Sha Tin. Lord Derby's globe-trotting filly makes her second start of the season after finishing fourth in the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic at Nad Al Sheba Mar. 25.

"We are alive to all the concerns about the pace, especially over the shorter trip, and I think you will see something different this time, with Ouija Board closer to the front," her owner commented. Showing Up reported home a four-length winner going 6 1/2 furlongs in his Gulfstream debut Feb. 11. Favored at odds of 8-5 when stretched out to one mile in a Gulfstream allowance Mar. 11, he didn't disappoint, scoring by 2 1/4 lengths. He was forced to miss the Apr. 8 GI Wood Memorial S. due to a bruised foot, but had no problem taking the step up in company for his two-turn debut here. Kept within striking distance as Like Now (Jules) fought through :23 1/5 and :46 4/5 splits, he was swung out for the stretch run and fought his way to the front after a long drive. "He had a month between his first two races and he had a month between his last race and this race," Tagg continued. "Ideally we were going to go in the Wood, but it didn't

work out, and we couldn't go in the Blue Grass, so this was our last chance. But there's only two weeks before the Kentucky Derby and he's not a big, robust horse. He has to be in tip-top condition. I'm not going to put him into a tough race. Probably good judgment and good sense would say not to run, but there is only one Kentucky Derby and he's done everything we've

asked of him, so you think you have to give him a chance." Like Now, winner of the Gotham S. last out Mar. 18, was game in defeat. We'll talk to the owner, but I think we'll probably look at the [GI] Preakness S. [May 20]. It's a little easier spot. He's a gelding and we want to have some fun with him this year. Fresh from saddling Killybegs (Ire) to win Thursday's G3 Craven S. at Newmarket, Barry Hills pointed another arrow in the direction of the May 6 G1 2000 Guineas as Red Clubs put up a polished display here. The dark bay was streets ahead of his four rivals on his twoyear-old achievements. The only question mark concerned the trip, as his best form had come over six furlongs last term. Red Clubs won the G2 Coventry S. at Royal Ascot at York in June, finished third in the G1 Phoenix S. at The Curragh and second in the G2 Gimcrack S. at York in August, and was second again in the G1 Middle Park S. at Newmarket in early October over the shorter distance. His previous try at seven panels resulted in a fourth in the G1 Dewhurst S. Initially rank in front here, he settled when provided with a lead by Zato (Ire) (Zafonic) by halfway before taking over again approaching the quarter pole. In no danger thereafter, he was geared down in the closing stages to comfortably account for Marcus Andronicus, who closed steadily from the rear under Kieren Fallon. "I have thought about going to the French Guineas [G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains at Longchamp May 14] with this horse and taking Killybegs to Newmarket, but we would have to supplement him for France, so the likelihood is that they will both run [in the G1 2000 Guineas May 6]," Hills told PA Sport.
