Moore. "She's a nice type," Moore said of the session topper. "She was a very genuine performer and a great racemare." Our Egyptian Raine is in foal to Good Journey. Although buying on behalf of new European-based clients. Moore indicated the mare would remain in Australia and would be bred back to Redoute's Choice (Aus). Also from the dispersal, three-time South African Group 1 winner Paraca (Arg) (Kitwood) attracted a final bid of A\$800,000 from South African agent Robin Bruss and his Northfields Bloodstock Sales Pty. The sixyear-old, South Africa's champion juvenile filly of 2001-2002, is also in foal to Good Journey. Through two of the broodmare sale's three sessions, Inglis has sold 293 mares for a total of A\$16,089,050 and an average of A\$54,911. "There has been good competition for mares at all levels of the market today," said Inglis Managing Director Reg Inglis. The sale concludes today, with 278 lots scheduled to begin selling at 12 noon. 


According to the Jockey Club, Swain's 2005 book at Shadwell Farm amounted to only 12 mares (with six of those mares coming from the Shadwell broodmare band). This sad statistic suggests that American breeders have almost totally fallen out of love with this very good horse, considered by many to have been unlucky not to defeat Awesome Again and Silver Charm in the 1998 Breeders' Cup Classic.

Even though Swain veered right across the Churchill Downs track to finish near the stands' rails, he was still good enough to account for such as Victory Gallop, Coronado's Quest, Skip Away, Touch Gold, Arch and Gentlemen on his first appearance on an American dirt track. His connections had been persuaded to opt for the Classic rather than the Turf by Swain's tremendous display earlier in the year in the Dubai World Cup, when he had failed by only a short head to defeat Silver Charm.

It was these excellent efforts which no doubt persuaded the Maktoum brothers to stand Swain in Kentucky, rather than in Europe, where he had taken consecutive editions of the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S.

Also, Swain would have come into direct competition with his magnificent sire, Nashwan, had he been based in Britain. I suppose that Swain could have returned to Britain after Nashwan's premature death in 2002, but by then he would have come into competition with another of Godolphin's top international performers, Fantastic Light, whose second dam, Kamar, is a sister to Swain's dam, the Grade I-winning Love Smitten.

The problem which a horse like Swain faces in today's American industry is that many breeders wouldn't consider him to be either fast enough or precocious enough.

Unraced at two, he made his first three starts over 1 3/4 miles, winning all three of them including the G3 Prix du Lys. It wasn't until he was six, when he won the G1 Irish Champion S., that he finally recorded his first success at a distance short of 1 1/2 miles.

With this history of middle-distance excellence, it is easy to overlook the fact that all four of Swain's grand-parents were stakes-winning two-year-olds. One of them, Blushing Groom, was a fast-maturing colt who could almost be described as the ultimate in two-year-old dynamism.

Under the circumstances, it isn't so surprising that Swain has now sired three individuals which have won important Guineas trials, on each occasion receiving help from some fast or precocious bloodlines in his mates. Dimitrova--later to become a Grade I winner in the U.S.--won the Leopardstown 1000 Guineas Trial in 2003, the same year that Muqbil won the G3 Greenham S., and now he has come up with Nasheej. This very talented filly was winning for the fourth time in six starts, and the third time at group level, when she gamely held on to win the G3 Dubai Duty Free S.

Nasheej's dam El Nafis was sold by Shadwell at Keeneland's 2002 November Sale, while in foal to Swain. Her price was only \$36,000 and she was transferred to Florida, where she visited Straight Man in 2003 and Delaware Township in 2004. She was back in the sales ring early in 2005, this time making \$42,000.

Exactly why El Nafis has sold for such comparatively low prices is hard to know. The blame certainly doesn't lie with her bloodlines, as she has some very high-powered bloodlines. She is a daughter of Kingmambo, one of the highest-priced stallions in the U.S., and she's out of Ghashtah, a Nijinsky mare bought by Shadwell for a whopping \$2,300,000 as a weanling.

Combining Kingmambo with mares with Nijinsky blood has produced several major dividends, such as the outstanding British filly Russian Rhythm (out of a Nijinsky mare), the St Leger winner Rule of Law (out of a mare by Nijinsky's son Royal Academy) and the Japan Cup hero Alkaased (out of a mare by Niniski, another son of Nijinsky). El Nafis wasn't in the same league as these Group 1 winners, but she did win over a mile at two.

That's not the end of El Nafis's glamorous connections. Ghashtah was a sister to Seattle Dancer, the colt who still holds the record price for a yearling, at \$13,100,000. Seattle Dancer was a very good racehorse--twice a winner at the Group 2 level--without being nearly as good as his Classic-winning half-brothers Seattle Slew and Lomond.

Mention of Seattle Slew is a reminder that he, too, has played a significant role in Kingmambo's rise to the top. It was Seattle Slew who sired the dam of Lemon Drop Kid and the second dams of two other very good colts in the outstanding Japanese colt El Condor Pasa and the Group 1-winning Dubai Destination. In other words, El Nafis' bloodlines had the potential to produce something out of the ordinary.

As Kingmambo is a son of Mr. Prospector, a leading sire of broodmares, there was always every chance that this horse, who combined Classic performance with a classic pedigree, would also quickly make his mark in this area.

Kingmambo's daughters were represented by their first Group 1 winners in 2005, when Maids Causeway won the Coronation S. and Suzuka Mambo landed the spring edition of the Tenno Sho. Woodlander and Manbala were other 2005 group winners out of daughters of Kingmambo, and there will surely be plenty more to come this year.

CHRB To Study Multi-Year Racing Dates:

The California Horse Racing Board has announced that it will be holding a series of meetings aimed at developing long-range plans designed to safeguard the health of Thoroughbred racing in the state. With the future of some of California's five privately owned racetracks in question, the CHRB will study the possibility of allotting dates on a multi-year basis, thus ensuring that the tracks will remain in operation for the duration of the dates contracts. A new committee, the Race Dates and Strategic Planning Committee, will focus on the issues. CHRB Chairman Richard Shapiro and Vice Chairwoman Marie Moretti will both serve on the committee. "The committee plans to meet both earlier in the calendar year and more often than in past years to review what is in the best interests of the industry and the public," Shapiro said. "I already have discussed the subject with all track owners in the state and nearly all of the organizations. We tried to discuss their views, concerns and philosophies of how California should move forward. I have not suggested or concluded what a final outcome will be to anyone. I have stated that I want to see racing promoted, and the best program presented within the state." He added, "Our job as racing commissioners is to protect and enhance the sport throughout the state. We are not doing our job if we sit by and wait until the last minute to find out that one of our tracks intends to cease operating." While it is not Shapiro's intent to threaten racetrack owners with the new committee, he does forsee changes within the industry in California. "It is imperative that we strategically plan the future of horse racing in this state, and part of that discussion must include commitments from the track owners not only to continue racing, but also to refurbish their facilities and to promote their meets," he remarked. "Personally, I think it is worth consideration to allocate multi-year racing date contracts to track owners. This would obligate the tracks to operate for the terms of their contracts and would also contain conditions under which they would be obligated to operate."
