### 'MAIDEN' TOPS INGLIS FINALE

Battle Maiden (Zim), a seven-year-old mare by Goldkeeper--Kamina (Zim), led the way at Tuesday's finale of the Inglis Australian Select Broodmare Sale on the strength of an A\$625,000 bid from Ultra Thorough-

breds. Champion older mare in South Africa in 2003/2004 and MGSP in Australia, Battle Maiden hailed from the draft of Written Bloodstock. She sold in foal to Good Journey, winner of Canada's GI Atto Mile in 2002. Overall, average and gross were down substantially from last year's sale, a much larger affair that was boosted by Darley's purchase of Mannington (Aus) for A\$2.05 mil-

lion. Last year's average was A\$79,975, compared to A\$53,668 this term, a drop of 32.9 percent. Median, however, was off just slightly in 2006, down 3.7 percent, from A\$27,000 to A\$26,000. "We are very pleased with the results," said Managing Director Reg Inglis. "The majority of vendors have walked away from the sale with their expectations well and truly surpassed. The buying bench included bidders from South Africa, Japan, America, Europe, Korea, New Zealand, and the Philippines, as well as every state of Australia. Commercially bred young mares have never been in stronger demand than at Newmarket over the last few days. # FROM THE DESK OF... Bill Oppenheim



### **EUROPE'S SOPHOMORE SIRES**

There's nothing the owners of a stallion whose first foals are three-year-olds want to see more than a Classic contender. If your stallion was among the leaders of his sire crop as a freshman, a Classic contender deflects all those doubts about whether they train on. If he wasn't among those first-year leaders, a Classic contender can make the difference between attracting mares in his fifth season at stud and, frankly, struggling. Just ask the people booking mares to Aptitude and Point Given, 19th and 33rd respectively on last year's North American Freshman Sire list, but now second and fourth on the 2006 second-crop list (courtesy of bloodhorse.com), compliments of Steppenwolfer and Point Determined.

It works a little differently in Europe. They start later, and their early-season Classics split into mile races (Guineas) and the 10 1/2- and 12-furlong races (Derbies and Oaks). So, for European sophomore sires, the first port of call is the Guineas, and whether the top freshman sires from last year have Guineas contenders. The good news for last year's top three European freshman sires is that all three of them do.

It took a while for Mozart, by Danehill and Europe's champion sprinter of 2001 (Timeform 131), to wrest the title of leading freshman sire away from Bertolini, by Danehill's sire, Danzig, out of Althea's full sister, Aquilegia. Though he spent most of his racing career knocking heads with the best sprinters in Europe, the fact remains he was only two-for-23 lifetime (though best Timeform a very respectable 125), and couldn't even make Darley's stallion roster at Dalham Hall. Until his transfer to Kildangan this year--for what still looks like a dirt cheap €15,000 fee--he stood for £4,000 at Overbury Stud, a Dalham satellite operation in England.

But his three stakes winners last year included Donna Blini, upset winner of the G2 Cherry Hinton S. before taking the G1 Cheveley Park S. She's heading for the May 7 G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket. If Mick Kinane, who rode her to those two 12-1 wins last year, is back on board...well, what's she done wrong?

Donna Blini will be at double-figure odds when she lines up for the 1000 Guineas, but Amadeus Wolf, the best of Mozart's eight stakes horses in 2005, is a solid third favorite (a little under 8-1 on Betfair) for the G1 2000 Guineas, run May 6, the same day as the Kentucky Derby. He closed out his two-year-old campaign with a decisive victory in the G1 Middle Park S., earning a Racing Post Rating (a Timefigure, along the same lines as Timeform) of 120. That would put him very close in the Guineas, in which the two rated ahead of him are the Danehill colt George Washington and the unbeaten Mark of Esteem colt Sir Percy, hero of the G1 Dewhurst S. Incidentally, Amadeus Wolf is out of a Mark of Esteem mare, and this top miling son of Darshaan--who has slipped down to a £7,000 fee for Darley this year, despite having sired a Classic winner himself in his first crop--may be about to become a household name himself once again.

Danehill Dancer, who is making mincemeat of the opposition in early returns among 2006 European sires, is advancing Danehill's claims as a major sire of sires quite convincingly thus far this year (Redoute's Choice is, too, but so far he doesn't shuttle this direction), mollifying the fact that Mozart might well have turned out to be a good sire had he not died after siring just this one crop. Mozart may ultimately depend on Amadeus Wolf to sustain his line, much as Dubawi may have to be the flagbearer for his sire, Dubai Millennium. But none of that lessens the overpowering influence of Danzig, the sire of Bertolini and grandsire of Mozart. He can't lose. Even the number three 2005 European freshman sire, Medicean (by Machiavellian), is subject to the Danzig influence: the 2005 G1 Fillies' Mile winner Nannina--who also goes straight to the 1000 Guineas (she is 8-1)--is out of a Danehill mare.

Kingsalsa, the son of Kingmambo who has four stakes horses among his seven winners so far, has probably been the biggest surprise package among this crop of European sires. Of those who look more like the Derby and Oaks type-sires, it's once again Coolmore vs. Darley, but this time, no Danzig. Fresh from sweeping the 2001 G1 Epsom and Irish Derbies, Coolmore's three-year-old Galileo (by Sadler's Wells out of Arc winner Urban Sea, by Miswaki) defeated Godolphin's five-year-old Fantastic Light (by Blushing Groom's son, Rahy, out of the Nijinsky mare Jood-- thus bred one of the most successful crosses of the last 25 years) in the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. When they next met, six weeks later, in the 10-furlong G1 Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown, Fantastic Light turned the tables. Fantastic Light went on to notch up his sixth Group/Grade I win in the 2001 Breeders' Cup Turf (Galileo ran in the Classic, didn't like it, and finished sixth), but they both retired to their respective studs as first-class sire prospects, though more of the middle-distance, 'Classic' persuasion than their contemporaries from the Danzig line.

So far this year, Fantastic Light does have the edge, having been represented by two middle-distance stakes winners in 2006, in Japan and Germany. But Galileo has looked equally promising. He already has nine winners this year, not least the hugely impressive Red Rocks, who absolutely cruised home in a 10-furlong maiden win at Windsor Monday night. Though this time it was with new Manton trainer Brian Meehan, this was the Wilko team: Frankie Dettori riding a horse Jamie McCalmont had bought privately for boss J. Paul Reddam. It was a performance that just screamed 'Dante.' It's early, early in the European middle-distance season yet, but I'm betting those are two sires whose names we're going to be hearing a lot more of this year: Fantastic Light and Galileo, in either order.

Showing Up has been a "talking horse" ever since he broke his maiden at Gulfstream Park on his debut. That was Feb. 11 going 6 1/2 furlongs, and Showing Up returned exactly a month later to add to his reputation, leading almost throughout to take a Gulfstream Park allowance race by 2 1/4 lengths while setting a new track record for one mile.

Described after that race by his trainer, Barclay Tagg, as having "that raw speed," Showing Up was expected to be a major pace factor in the GI Wood Memorial S., but missed that race with a bruised foot. Thus, this weekend's Lexington S. represented a last chance for Showing Up to make the first Classic. A bump at the start saw Showing Up back in fifth at the first call, rather than disputing the lead as he had in his previous start, but he closed powerfully to score by 1 1/4 lengths from the GIII Gotham S. winner Like Now.

Showing Up came out of the Lexington with a puncture wound in his right foreleg, but if that continues to respond to treatment, he will take his place in the line-up on Kentucky Derby Day. If he does go, he would provide a powerful one-two punch for his owner, Lael Stables, who also have the unbeaten GI Florida Derby winner Barbaro. Showing Up's Derby effort will represent a tilt at history, as the last horse to take the Derby off three starts was the filly Regret in 1915. Of course, Tagg has already carved his own piece of Derby history, winning the 2003 renewal with Funny Cide, a New York-bred gelding.

Showing Up was foaled in Kentucky, but he does have a New York connection in his pedigree. His sire, Strategic Mission, now stands at Questroyal at Liberty Stud in Otisville, New York, after starting his career at Gainesway in Lexington, Kentucky.

Strategic Mission is a son of Mr. Prospector, but, as far as his racing career is concerned, a very untypical one, as he was a late-maturing turf horse. Out of the graded-stakes winning Sultry Sun (previously the dam of MGISWs Sultry Song and Solar Splendor), Strategic Mission was unraced at two, won a maiden from six starts at three, and an allowance on his only outing at four. As a five-year-old, he added two more allowance wins and gained his first black-type when beaten a neck in the GII Keeneland Turf Mile. Kept in training at six, Strategic Mission enjoyed his best season, capturing the GIII Fort Marcy H., finishing second in the John Henry S. and third in both the GII Maker's Mark Mile and GIII River City H. Showing Up comes from Strategic Mission's first crop, which numbered 18 foals, and also includes Panamanian multiple graded winner Golden Strategy.

Showing Up's dam, Miss Alethia, has already produced one extremely capable runner in the shape of Gimmeawink. A son of Elusive Quality (like Strategic Mission, a Mr. Prospector-line horse--in his case a grandson--and like Strategic Mission, at his best at around a mile on turf). Gimmeawink proved to be a versatile runner, at least by current standards, winning six stakes events between distances of six to 8 1/2 furlongs, and taking second in the nine-furlong GIII Pennsylvania Derby.


Miss Alethia is a half-sister to the seven-furlong stakes winner, It's a Rerun, but has more of a stamina runner in the pedigree in the shape of her sire, T. V. Commercial. By turf champion T. V. Lark, T. V. Commercial was outstanding at two, when he captured four stakes, including the Breeders' Futurity and Arlington-Washington Futurity. T. V. Commercial didn't win a stakes event at three, but he did take third in the Kentucky Derby. At four he added the one-mile Chicago H., and the following year took the San Marino H. over 1 1/2 miles. T. V. Commercial went on to sire 27 stakes winners, but few of real-class, and most of his better runners were at their most effective at 8 1/2 furlongs or less.

Miss Alethia also had a minor stakes-winning half-brother in Dot o' Spice, while her \*Hawaii half-sister, Muffled, took second in the GIII Mermaid S., and is granddam of minor stakes winners, Big Twister and Channel Forty Six. Her dam, Shoosh, took third in the Senorita S. She was by the versatile Traffic Judge, winner of the Metropolitan Mile, and the then 1 1/2miles Woodward S. Shoosh was half-sister to the GII Volante H. winner Within Hail; and to Ice Cream Soda, granddam of Presidentialaffair, winner of the GIII Stuyvesant H. and GIII Salvator Mile, and third in last year's GI Pimlico Special. Presidentialaffair is actually bred on somewhat similar lines to Showing Up, as both are by sons of Mr. Prospector out of Nasrullah-line mares, and their second dams are also closely related. Shoosh is also closely related to Admiral's Voyage, now best remembered as broodmare sire of Danzig, but also winner of the Wood Memorial S. and runner-up in the Belmont. Both Shoosh and Admiral's Voyage were by grandsons of Hyperion and were out of half-sisters.

view. Showing Up's grandsire, Mr. Prospector, was born 36 years ago, and it's around 40 years back to the birth year of Showing Up's maternal grandparents, T. V. Commercial and Shoosh. That makes Strategic Mission's dam, Sultry Sun, the youngest of the grandparents, and she was born in 1980. If anything, the pedigree harks

back to the success Mr. Prospector enjoyed with mares from the Nasrullah line (Nasrullah being responsible for Mr. Prospector's own broodmare sire, Nashua, and also appearing in Showing Up's own broodmare sire line as great-grandsire of T. V. Commercial).

As far as Showing Up's classic prospects are concerned, of course, that is somewhat academic. A bigger question is how will he be suited by the Derby distance, especially recalling his trainer's "raw speed" comment. It's our guess that 10 furlongs might not prove to be his ideal trip, although he might be one to watch if he misses the Derby and goes for the Preakness. His background also suggests that be might eventually also be suited by turf.

## MORE DISTANCE? SWEET

by Lucas Marquardt

Speculation over a Kentucky Derby contender's ability to handle a mile and a quarter always reaches fever pitch at this time of the year, and this season is no different. Two Derby hopefuls that sparkled at a mile and an eighth, the farthest anybody's been thus far, in their most recent efforts are **Brother Derek** (Benchmark) and **Sweetnorthernsaint** (Sweetsouthernsaint). Brother Derek won the GI Santa Anita Derby by 3 1/4 lengths

in front-running style, while Sweetnorthernsaint came from just off the lead to annex the GII Illinois Derby by 9 1/4 lengths. Perhaps because of their running styles, and certainly because of their status as favorites for the Derby, both are apt to be at the center of such speculation. That's especially true in a year where the Derby looks to

be chock full of speed. But their respective trainers are confident that a mile and a quarter won't be an issue on the first Saturday in May.

Michael Trombetta, the Maryland-based conditioner of Sweetnorthernsaint, said about his charge yesterday, "He always finishes up strong. He's had numerous riders getting to where we are today, and the consensus is that distance will not be a problem."

In the Illinois Derby, the dark bay came home his last eighth in a sharp :12 1/5 and his final time, 1:49 4/5, earned him a 114 BRIS speed figure, one of the best of his crop.

In terms of pedigree, Trombetta said that he doesn't pay too close attention to a horse's genetic background, adding that he relied more on his riders to help him determine how far a horse wants to run.

ning," said Trombetta. "To see this horse kick on in the last eighth in :12 in a longer race and have lots left...this guy definitely wants to do it [go long]."

Sweetnorthernsaint was scheduled to arrive at Churchill Downs yesterday, while Trombetta planned to take an early-morning flight today.

Like Trombetta, conditioner Dan Hendricks believes the Derby's 10 furlongs are within his charge's scope. Brother Derek is typically on or near the lead in his races, and while that running style can be a drawback as the distances get longer, he's had no problems so far in his six races at a mile or more. He's five for six in those routes, all at the Grade I or Grade II level.

Furthermore, Hendricks said that Brother Derek has the tactical speed to stay off what should be a hot pace in the Derby, but added that he wouldn't be too far back.

"He'll be forwardly placed, it's just going to depend on whether someone goes out there really, really fast and silly, like last year," said Hendricks, in reference to Spanish Chestnut's rapid pace in the 2005 Derby. "If that scenario comes up, we're just going to have to take it as it comes and decide what to do. He's got enough speed to be where he wants going into the first turn. He's not going to get caught up in a lot of traffic."

In order to encourage Brother Derek to rate, Hendricks worked him in company with a stablemate Monday at Santa Anita, where he officially covered seven furlongs in 1:28 4/5.

"He doesn't typically work in company, because we've had him so fresh all year that he's a little aggressive," said Hendricks. "We thought going into the Derby that we should put a horse in front of him and give him a little bit of that experience. It worked out very well. Probably my mistake was I put an older horse who's a super work horse in front of him, and he followed him around there. That other horse worked [five furlongs] in a minute, or :59 and change, and it wasn't visually impressive in that he didn't go up and take over that other horse. But Alex [jockey Solis] said that he had him in hand, that he got him to relax, and he got a lot out of it. He got a ton of dirt in his face and still came home in a decent :12 in his last eighth."

Hendricks said that Brother Derek emerged from the work so well that they considered bringing him back to the track yesterday morning to expend some energy. Of his plans on the runup to the Derby, Hendricks concluded, "We'll ship Thursday [to Churchill Downs], which will give me three days to gallop--Friday, Saturday and Sunday. Alex Solis will come in Monday morning and give him a light breeze, maybe a half [mile], maybe five-eighths, and we're set to just gallop into the Derby."






STEVE SAVRO DIES Prominent Canadian owner Steve Savro died Apr. 24 in Toronto, Ontario. He was 78.
