VAN CLIEF TO STEP DOWN FROM BC, NTRA

D.G. Van Clief, Jr., president of the Breeders' Cup and Commissioner and Chief Executive Officer of the National Thoroughbred Racing Association since 2004, announced yesterday that he is stepping down from those positions with both organizations, effective the end of the year.

"In the last two years we have positioned the NTRA and Breeders' Cup for success," Van Clief said. "We have overhauled the Breeders' Cup governance structure and elected a capable, energetic Board Chairman in Bill Farish at Breeders' Cup Ltd and Craig Favel at NTRA. We have built consensus

around key strategic priorities and positioned the Breeders' Cup World Championships for future growth. When I assumed management responsibilities for the joint operation in 2004, it was with the understanding that I would do it for two years. Now is the right time to proceed with a management transition." Van Clief was named Founding Chairman of the NTRA and served as its interim Chief Executive Officer until April 1998, when Tim Smith was appointed Commissioner and CEO. After the NTRA and Breeders' Cup combined business operations in 2001, Van Clief assumed the title of NTRA Vice Chairman, in addition to his duties as Breeders' Cup President. He assumed the title of NTRA Commissioner and CEO upon Smith's resignation in 2004. Van Clief has been with the Breeders' Cup since its inception and has served as President since 1996. He received the Eclipse Award of Merit in 1998 for his years of service to Thoroughbred racing. "D.G. has been a guiding force and steady hand throughout the entire existence of both the Breeders' Cup and NTRA, and the industry has been the beneficiary of his exemplary leadership," said Breeders' Cup Chairman Farish. The Breeders' Cup and NTRA's joint management agreement extends through 2010, subject to renewal this year. It is currently under review by the boards of both organizations.

BEWITCHING STELLA

Noble Stella (Ger) (Monsun {Ger}), with jockey Edgar Prado up, put her five rivals to sleep and parlayed her pedestrian early fractions into a half-length victory in yesterday's GIII Bewitch S. at Keeneland. Winner of last summer's GIII Dance Smartly H. at Woodbine, Noble

Stella was third in a pair of Gulfstream stakes this winter, the Mar. 4 GIII The Very One H. and the Apr. 1 GIII Orchid H. at the Bewitch's marathon 1 1/2-mile distance. The dark bay mare was loose on the lead yesterday through fractions of :27.81, :53.37, 1:19.49 and 1:45.28,

and had enough in reserve when **Louve Royale (Ire)** (Peintre Celebre) and **Sweet Science** (Diesis {GB}) challenged her at midstretch to hold on to her first win of the year. "They let me go nice and easy and I took it," said Prado. "My filly ran at Keeneland last year and she went to the lead, too, and she barely got beat a length. Of his charge's off-the-board performance in the Wood, Albertrani said, "Of course, you'd rather see him going to the Kentucky Derby off a better performance, but you know he didn't run his race in the Wood. He's trained well since the Wood and, looking at his Tampa races, I think he deserves a shot." Deputy Glitters, who defeated Bluegrass Cat in the Tampa Bay Derby, will ship to Kentucky today.

STORM CAT COLT TOPS OBS DAY 2 A colt by leading sire Storm Cat topped yesterday's second session of the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's Spring Sale with a final bid of \$275,000. From the consignment of Woodside Ranch, agent, the dark bay colt was sold to Stinson & Farr Farms. He worked an eighth in :10 3/5 at the Under Tack Show. Named Western Gambler, the juvenile is out of the unraced Western Eternity (Gone West), a half sister to Grade I winner Eternity Star and the Group 1 and Grade I placed Eternity Range and Eternal Reve. For the session, 205 two-year-olds sold for \$7,116,800 and an average of \$34,716. The average rose 6.4 percent from a year ago, while the median fell 2.6 percent to \$19,000. Gulfstream Registers Increases in 2006:

Gulfstream Park, which concluded its 87-day 2006 meeting Sunday, has announced gains in handle, but final figures are not yet available. The Hallandale, Florida, oval, in the middle of a rebuilding project, reported an 18-percent increase in wagering on live racing. "Given the challenges that we faced in opening our meet in a partially completed building, we're excited and proud of the numbers that were generated," said Scott Savin, Gulfstream Park president and general manager. "The quality of racing was outstanding, and the consistency of main track and turf course surfaces enabled us to maintain strong field sizes throughout the meet. We were able to introduce our fans to the beginning of a new era in Florida racing, and they responded enthusiastically." The leading owner title at the meet was shared by Darley Stable and Frank Carl Calabrese, who each posted 14 wins. Todd Pletcher easily secured the training title with 60 victories, while his first-call jockey, John Velazquez, led all riders with 86 trips to the winner's circle.

Prospects for Atlantic City Brighten:

Atlantic City Race Course might have a future, after all. Plans to close the 60-year-old racetrack in Mays Landing, New Jersey, after this year's four-day race meet are in limbo. Track officials are mulling plans to rebuild a smaller version of the existing track that would remain open and operate for live racing about four weeks a year. "The prospects for Atlantic City's future are far brighter than they were a year ago," said Hal Handel, the chief executive officer of Greenwood Racing, which owns the track. "We are working our way through a series of governmental development meetings and the result might be a brand new facility capable of a month of live racing and year-round simulcasting in a first class facility. We visualize a small English-style grandstand with simulcast amenities within it. We should know more in next few months as to whether this is dream or a reality." Atlantic City would conduct its live racing meet either before or after the Monmouth Park meet, which, this year, runs from May 13 through Sept. 24. New Jersey racing has been without a strong spring racing meet since Garden State Park closed in 2001. Under the plans being considered, the barn area would be demolished and that land would be developed. The existing grandstand would also be torn down and replaced by the more modern and smaller version. Handel said that some consideration is also been given to having a minor league baseball stadium built on the property.

ALAIN LEQUEUX PASSES AWAY

Former top French jockey Alain Lequeux passed away yesterday, after suffering a stroke last Friday, at the tender age of 58. Son of top jockey Guy Lequeux, he served his apprenticeship with leading trainer Francois Mathet and won his first major race, the now G1 Prix de la Foret, aged 17 aboard the Mme Francois Dupre-owned and Francois Mathet-trained Mirna, a race he subsequently won on four further occasions for trainers Olivier Douieb (twice), Maurice Zilber and Francois Boutin. He also partnered many leading horses for trainers Francois Mathet, Alain de Royer-Dupre, Andre Fabre, Olivier Douieb, Alain de Royer-Dupre, David Smaga and many others. He retired from the saddle 10 years ago to open a restaurant in Chantilly, "Caf, Lequeux", which became a favorite haunt for the racing community. Lequeux's brilliant career in the saddle included wins in all major domestic races apart from the Jockey-Club (French Derby), Diane (French Oaks) and the Arc, although he did finish runner-up in the latter aboard His Highness The Aga Khan's Behera in 1989. He was also the regular partner of G1 Prix Vermeille and G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winner Detroit, but unfortunately lost out on both successes because of a somewhat controversial one-month suspension in 1980. Lequeux also rode on the international scene, winning the St Leger, Japan Cup, Turf Classic, Hollywood Turf Cup, Washington International as well as spending a year in England for trainer Olivier Douieb, winning then the G1 Coronation Cup aboard Rainbow Quest. Alain Lequeux was greatly appreciated and will be remembered, not only as a jockey, but as a person with generosity, friendship and sense of humour and will be sorely missed amongst the European racing fraternity. Funeral arrangements have yet to be announced.
