#### CAN "DO" SPIRIT AT THE CURRAGH

Decado (Ire) (Danehill Dancer (Ire)) is on the road to the May 27 G1 Irish 2000 Guineas after a hard-fought victory in the G3 Rock of Gibraltar EBF Tetrarch S. at The Curragh yesterday. Despite winning with authority, he looked in need of further than the seven furlongs of the Listed Loughbrown S. at this venue last time Apr. 9, and confirmed that impression with another power-packed finish in this telling trial. Declan McDonogh settled the colt in mid-division through the early stages and was hard at work at halfway, but his travails paid off. Decado continued to respond when switched out to the center of the track, inhaling Sir Xaar (Ire) (Xaar {GB}) on the approach to the eighth pole and increasing his advantage in the closing stages as Hurricane Cat stayed on into a never-dangerous third. "He will go to the Irish Guineas, all being well," trainer Kevin Prendergast commented. "He keeps surprising us and the only doubt is whether he will act on firm ground." #### Brother Derek Handles Delay, Muddy Churchill Strip...

With trainer and horse--and a horde of media types-patiently awaiting his arrival, jockey Alex Solis finally found the Twin Spires of Churchill Downs yesterday

morning after getting lost on his way to the track to put the current favorite for the Kentucky Derby, Brother Derek (Benchmark), through his paces. Conditioner Dan Hendricks originally hoped to work Brother Derek just after the mid-morning renovation break, but had to put those plans on hold when Solis, the colt's regular rider, got lost Benoit driving from Cincinnati after taking a flight from Los Angeles.

Solis drove up an hour late and Brother Derek, with the Panamanian up, finally made it to the track around 9:30 a.m. From there, things went smoothly. Slated to work four furlongs over the muddy strip, Brother Derek was timed by Churchill clockers through splits of :12 3/5, :25 1/5 and :36 3/5 before stopping the clock in :49 1/5. The time was the fourth fastest of 24 at the distance. Brother Derek galloped out five panels in 1:03 flat. "The track had me concerned," Hendricks admitted. "He has never trained or raced on a wet surface and I was a bit worried when I saw the track chewed up early this morning. But the tracks here dry fast and, after looking at it after the [renovation] break, I decided to go ahead. All things considered, it wasn't too bad and I was glad to get the work in and just let him go to strong, long gallops from here. He's plenty fit and this was basically just something for him to stretch his legs." Hendricks noted that Brother Derek's owner. Cecil Peacock, would fly to Louisville Tuesday. #### Asmussen Works Duo...

Trainer Steve Asmussen sent out Derby hopefuls

Vow) to separate five-furlong drills at Churchill Downs Monday morning. Both breezed over the muddy surface under exercise rider Carmen Rosas. Storm Treasure was the first out to the track and worked a solid five panels in 1:00 2/5. "He looked very comfortable, the horse that we're hoping he'd be," said Asmussen, who added that he has not settled on a jockey to ride the GI Blue Grass S. runner-up in the Derby. Leading Asmussen's second set of horses was Private Vow, who earned the bullet for the distance when he breezed in 1:00 flat. "He's just a little quicker

horse and he looked comfortable as well," Asmussen said. In his victories in the GII Futurity S. and GII Kentucky Jockey Club S., and in his third-place effort in his latest in the Apr. 15 GII Arkansas Derby, Private Vow has shown a willingness to rate, something Asmussen has been reinforcing in recent weeks. "Of course, in a race laden with as much speed as there seems to be in there, I'm going to want to Private Vow as relaxed as possible," Asmussen said. "I think that he is fast enough. I'm just concerned if he can go far enough." Asmussen said he would school both horses one more time this week before the Derby.

#### Mister Triester Confirmed Out of Derby...

Last weekend's Derby Trial S. third-place finisher Mister Triester (Old Trieste), who sat 20th on the list of graded-stakes earnings, will not compete in the Kentucky Derby, it was confirmed yesterday. "Mr. Hughes [owner B. Wayne] said he will not go," said Seth Semkin, racing manager for Hughes. "Mr. Hughes felt it would be too much for the colt after his recent start." The defection means that West Point Thoroughbreds' Flashy Bull (Holy Bull) moves into the 20th spot, and a stall in the Derby starting gate. "That's good," said Kiaran McLaughlin, who trains Flashy Bull. "We were training him to run in the Derby. We didn't have an alternate plan." Now the waiting game begins for the connections of Sunriver (Saint Ballado). The GI Florida Derby third now occupies the 21st position on the earnings list. The Derby is restricted to 20 starters.

Trained by Barclay Tagg, Showing Up breezed four furlongs in:49 3/5 yesterday at Belmont, which Tagg admitted wasn't exactly what he was looking for. "It was a little slower than I wanted him to go, but

we just wanted him to stretch his legs," he said. "Everything is on go, as long as everything goes well." Tagg said he was keeping a close eye on a puncture wound Showing Up suffered during his Lexington win, which could determine the colt's Derby future. Trainer Todd Pletcher on Sunriver (Saint Ballado)'s prospects of making the Derby (he currently sits on the bubble at 21st on the graded-earnings list following Mister Triester's defection): "Darn right I'd like to run him. I think he's doing great right now and I'd like to see him get his chance." ... Trainer Bob Baffert plans to ship Bob and John (Seeking the Gold) and **Point Determined** (Point Given) from California to Kentucky today, where they will join Baffert's third Derby entrant, Sinister Minister (Old Trieste). ... Cause to Believe (Maria's Mon) showed some feistiness before and after his morning gallop at Churchill yesterday, prompting trainer Jerry Hollendorfer's assistant Galen May to quip, "I have a new name for him: Cause to Be Mean."

'Lady' Works; 'Cherries' Replaces Press Camp... Diplomat Lady (Forestry), winner of the Apr. 13 GII Stonerside Beaumont S. at Keeneland last out, tightened the screws in advance of Friday's GI Kentucky Oaks with an easy half-mile breeze at Churchill yesterday. The last horse to work Monday over the muddy track, the Christopher Paasch trainee came out around 9:50 a.m. and went four furlongs in :51 1/5 (21/24) under jockey Alex Solis. "I would prefer to see her go in :49 and change," Bonnie Paasch, Christopher's wife, admitted. "But the track was so deep and cut up that I told Alex to take care of her. She looked like she went smoothly all the way and came back fine, not blowing a bit." Solis rides Diplomat Lady for the first time in the Oaks. In other Oaks news, Press Camp (Comic Strip), narrow winner of Golden Gate's Apr. 8 San Ramon S., will not ship out for the race, according to trainer William E. Morey. "The filly has not been right the last two days and she has got to be 100 percent," Morey said. "I think she will be fine, but the timing is bad. If the race were next week, we might be all right." Taking Press Camp's spot in the Oaks is trainer Bernie Flint's Red Cherries Spin (With Approval), whom Flint claimed for \$75,000 out of a nine-length winning effort at Keeneland Apr. 15. "I think she's bred to go long," said Flint about the filly, who has never been farther than 6 1/2 furlongs and who will have to be supplemented by owner Naveed Chowhan at a cost of \$25,000. "I know

damn good and well it's going to be a tough race--it's

never going to be an easy race at that distance."

It has been a long road to the top for Krataios, but the six-year-old finally garnered the group success that had looked a mere formality in his sophomore year. Third in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains in May 2003, he was hit by injury afterwards and was limited to three runs the following season, including a fourth in this race. He looked to be getting back on track with scores in the Listed Grand Prix de Marseille at Marseille-Borely last November and in the Mar. 16 Listed Prix Altipan on his return this term, but suffered a troubled trip when fifth in the G3 Prix Edmond Blanc over course and distance last time Apr. 1. Never far off the early pace here, he was committed at the quarter pole and swept clear of the long-time leader Kendor Dine for a resounding score. "Everyone could see he was unlucky last time," conditioner Carlos Laffon-Parias said. "This time, he got a true-run race and could show his full potential. He's in the G1 Lockinge S. [at Newbury May 20], but we will keep him at home and most probably go for the G1 Prix d'Ispahan [at Longchamp May 21]." After Saint Liam's win in the Breeders' Cup Classic, I wrote that "Quiet American's rise up the broodmare sire list has been one of the features of this season." Well, that rise is continuing in fairly spectacular fashion, with stakes winners out of Quiet American's daughters adding plenty of impressive victories to their expanding portfolio.

Among the good winners since the Breeders' Cup Classic are A.P. Warrior (Gll San Felipe S.), the high-class Australian two-year-old Mentality (G1 Champagne S.), Wild Gams (Glll Cicada S.), Spellbinder (Gll San Antonio H.) and now Bernadini (Glll Withers S.). This list of important winners makes even more impressive reading when added to the previous stakes winners out of Quiet American broodmares, such as Horse of the Year Saint Liam, Ugo Fire (G3 Park S.), Cherry Mix (G1 Gran Premio del Jockey Club), Whywhywhy (Gl Futurity S.), Congressionalhonor (Glll Bay Meadows Derby), Flying Glitter (Glll Monmouth Oaks and Glll Indiana Oaks), Two Trail Sioux (Gll Fleur de Lis H.) and Lunarpal (a Grade Ill winner of the Bashford Manor S. and Kentucky Breeders' Cup S.).

What makes Quiet American's achievement all the more eye-catching is the fact that, to the end of 2005, he had only 89 daughters with racing-age progeny and their total representation was 187 foals. You've got to admit that 13 graded winners from 187 foals is a stunning achievement. Another 20 daughters come on line this year, boosting the total number of racing-age foals out of Quiet American mares to nearly 250, so you're going to be hearing more from this 20-year-old son of Fappiano.



Quiet American's achievement becomes even more admirable when I remind you that, so far, most of his successful broodmare daughters come from his early crops, sired when he was far from flavor of the month.

Everything seemed to conspire to make life difficult for Quiet American in the years leading up to his retirement to Gainsborough Farm in 1992. For a start, he began his racing career in Europe, a region which generally doesn't seem to bring out the best in the Fappiano line.

Even a trainer as talented as Sir Michael Stoute struggled with Quiet American, who made his debut early in his sophomore season in a nine-furlong graduation race at Ripon. Quiet American vied for favouritism but could finish only a modest third. Worse followed when he started second favourite for a 12-furlong maiden at Salisbury, where he faded to eighth.

Sheikh Mohammed's team quickly concluded that the colt would stand a better chance of realising his potential in America. Two races at around nine furlongs in California completed Quiet American's three-year-old campaign and he won them well enough to earn a considerable step up in class as a four-year-old. After a promising second in the GI Charles H. Strub S., Quiet American suffered a back strain which kept him out of action for over three months. However, he returned to defeat Bayakoa in the GIII San Diego H. in August before confirming his improvement with a second in the GI Woodward H.

Trainer Gary Jones then aimed Quiet American for the Breeders' Cup Classic, only to be thwarted by the selection committee who denied him a place in the over-subscribed line-up. This decision incensed Jones, and the racing world learned why a week later when Quiet American swept home nearly five lengths clear of some of the U.S.'s best sprinters in the GI NYRA Mile H., in a time of 1:32.80.

Quiet American's mixed fortunes continued at five. Something presumably went wrong after he had finished fourth on his reappearance, as he was retired in May, with his arrival too late for the 1991 season.

Quiet American was therefore six when he covered his first book of mares and he maintained a fee of only \$10,000 through his first five years. Despite being reasonably priced, he had only 32 named foals in his first crop, 22 in his second and 27 in his third. His popularity only began to rise in 1995, when his first crop surprised many people. It was by less than \$30,000 that he failed to take the freshman sire title from Farma Way, who had 40 runners compared to Quiet American's 14. But among those 14 were Cara Rafaela, Hidden Lake (later to become the champion older filly of 1997), Quiet Dance (now the dam of Saint Liam) and American Tango.

Cara Rafaela ranked third behind My Flag and Golden Attraction among the fillies on the Experimental Free Handicap, having won the GII Alcibiades S. and GI Hollywood Starlet S. on either side of her second in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. She was second or third in five more Grade I events during a luckless three-year-old season. It is Cara Rafaela who produced Bernadini for Sheikh Mohammed. Her best previous effort was her Storm Cat filly Ile de France, a good third to You and Habibti in the GI Santa Anita Oaks.

As I said last fall, the most likely explanation for Quiet American's success as a broodmare sire is his very unusual pedigree. He is inbred 3x2 to the outstanding Dr. Fager and 4x3 to Cequillo, a mare who left a considerable legacy. Although Dr. Fager lived long enough to sire only 255 foals, his daughters numbered Fappiano, Shared Interest, Cure The Blues, Too Chic and Quiet American among their Grade I winners.

Several of Quiet American's good broodmares are also inbred. Warrior Queen, the dam of A.P. Warrior, is inbred 3x3 to Mr. Prospector and inbreeding to Mr. Prospector appears in the pedigrees of several of their other graded winners, including the Australian gelding Mentality. Other daughters, including Cara Rafaela, are inbred 4x4 to Nearctic. Two of their best winners, Bernadini and A.P. Warrior, are by A.P. Indy, a horse inbred 4x3 to Bold Ruler.

It may also be valuable to remember that Quiet American mares have already produced group/graded winners to Bluebird, a son of Storm Bird, and to Storm Cat's sons Forestry, Forest Wildcat and Tale of the Cat. As Ile de France was by Storm Cat himself, this adds up to a compelling motive for sending Quiet American mares to Storm Bird line stallions, especially if the Quiet American mare has a line of Northern Dancer.

In concentrating on Quiet American, I risk overlooking Bernardini himself. This lightly raced colt has every right to develop into a Triple Crown contender, as he is by a champion sire out of a Grade I winner from a leading family. His third dam is Northern Fable, a Grade IIIwinning daughter of Fairway Fable, and his fifth dam is Fairway Fun, a stakes-winning daughter of the outstanding producer Fast Line.

Fast Line produced the 1972 Prix Morny winner Filiberto, but it has been her daughters which have kept her name to the fore. Her unraced daughter Trick Chick produced the top performers On The Sly and Northern Trick, while Trick Chick's smart sister Fairway Fun founded the very successful branch responsible for the top miler Muhtathir and Cara Rafaela. Fast Line's Kentucky Oaks winner White Star Line has established another flourishing branch, and the CCA Oaks winner Magazine and the Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud winner Mirio descend from other daughters of Fast Line.



# BILL WOULD HIKE CAP ON NEW YORK BREEDERS' AWARDS

The cap on the amount of money available for breeders' awards in New York would be hiked under legislation proposed by the head of the Senate Racing Committee. Sen. William Larkin wants to increase from 50 percent to 65 percent the aggregate award fund for New York-bred awards for breeders to reflect an increase in the number of restricted races for horses bred in the state in recent years at New York Racing Association tracks.

Last year, the New York Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund was unable to disperse about \$350,000 in breeders' awards because the statutory cap of 50 percent had been hit. The situation resulted in money being shifted to other fund categories while breeders of New York Thoroughbreds found themselves not getting the advertised fund levels because the overall fund cap was met.

New York-bred horses are eligible for an additional 20 percent award, an amount the fund could not give last year. NYRA increased the number of New York-bred restricted races from 495 in 2001 to 722 last year.

"This has no fiscal implication to the state," said Dennis Brida, the outgoing executive director of the New York Thoroughbred Breeders. "This is money that comes from the percentage of handle that goes to the breeding and development fund from (off-track betting) and live racing." For the complete story, click here.
