#### LAWYER RON OUT OF PREAKNESS PICTURE

Trainer Bob Holthus said yesterday that Lawyer Ron (Langfuhr), a disappointing 12th in Saturday's GI Kentucky Derby, emerged from the race with some swelling

to a hind ankle and will most likely not make an expected engagement in the GI Preakness S. "Looks like we probably aren't going to come," said Holthus from his Churchill Downs base. "We looked at the x-rays and saw some inflammation in the right hind ankle. Unless something good happens before Saturday, it doesn't

look favorable." Lawyer Ron was considered one of the favorites for the Run for the Roses off six straight victories leading up to the race, including a win in the GII Arkansas Derby. A majority interest in the chestnut was purchased just prior to the Derby by Stonewall Farm's Audry Haisfield, who will stand the colt at his Kentucky nursery upon retirement.

#### High Finance a Possible for Preakness...

West Point Stable's High Finance (Talk Is Money), an impressive allowance winner at Belmont Park last Thursday, is now under consideration for the

Preakness. "We'll wait to see how things unravel in the next couple days which will give us a better idea," said his trainer, Rick Violette, Jr. Never off the board in five starts, High Finance broke his maiden by 9 1/4 lengths in his fourth trip to the post at Keeneland Apr. 15, then came right back to win a one-mile entry-level allowance in New York by five

lengths last week, stopping the clock in 1:34 4/5 (104 BRIS). The colt, a \$120,000 FTKJUL yearling purchase, was produced by a three-parts sister to young sire Five Star Dav.

Back in 1955, the favorite for the Kentucky Derby was Nashua. The previous year's champion two-year-old, Nashua, would go on to take the Preakness and Belmont Stakes, and end his sophomore

campaign as both champion three-vear-old and Horse of the Year. In the Kentucky Derby, however, he was surprised by Swaps, a Californian invader who subsequently also revealed himself to also be a true great.

Nashua subsequently defeated a below-par Swaps in a

match race, but as far the Derby was concerned, Swaps had the last-laugh, siring the 1963 winner, Chateaugay.

As a sire, Nashua was responsible for 77 stakes winners, but while he was represented by three C.C.A. Oaks winners--Shuvee, Marshua and Bramalea--at the highest level he was generally a disappointment as a sire of colts, as well as a sire of sires, and there's never been a Derby winner from the Nashua male line. Thus, his legacy to the breed has primarily been as broodmare sire of sires Roberto (out of the aforementioned Bramalea) and Mr. Prospector. And it's through this pair that Nashua may well be the key ancestor in the pedigree of the 2006 GI Kentucky Derby winner Barbaro (ironically, Secretariat, a grandson of Nashua's sire Nasrullah, similarly disappointed as a sire of sires and also made his greatest mark as a broodmare sire of sires. In that role he is doubled in the pedigree of Barbaro's Derby runner-up Bluegrass Cat).

Barbaro's Roberto strain comes through his sire, Dynaformer. Although Dynaformer earned both his graded victories--the GII Jersey Derby and GII Discovery Handicap--on dirt, much of his considerable reputa-

tion has been made as a sire of turf horses (he himself set a course record for 1½ miles on that surface), and of course Barbaro opened his career by going three-for-three on the grass, including wins in the Laurel Futurity and GIII Tropical Park Derby. Despite the turf proclivities of many of his offspring, we can note that Dynaformer had already

been responsible two third-place runners in the Kentucky Derby in Perfect Drift and Blumin Affair. Perfect Drift went on to defeat Horse of the Year Mineshaft in the GI Stephen Foster H., and Dynaformer is also responsible for other dirt Grade I winners Starrer and Critical Eye.

Before leaving Dynaformer, we can also observe that he is something of a reversal in trends as recent sires of Kentucky Derby winners go, in that he is both an established leading sire (although his fee was once as low as \$3,500) and that he is a proven source of stamina. Prior to this year, 10 of the last 14 Derby winners had been sired by horses standing at \$15,000 or less at the time they sired the Derby winner, and it also seemed that traditional staying-type stallions were being surpassed by horses whose careers tended more to the sprinter/miler-type, the previous four winners being by Our Emblem, Distorted Humor, Elusive Quality and Holy Bull (a very fast horse who could stretch his speed to 1½ miles).

Barbaro's Mr. Prospector strain comes through his broodmare sire Carson City, a son of Mr. Prospector. A precocious two-year-old and high-class sprinter, Carson City was, until his death in 2004, one of the most reliable sires of speedy and precocious horses in the country. Oddly enough, Barbaro's dam, La Ville Rouge turned out to be a very untypical Carson City. She was four times graded placed, those performances including thirds in the 2000 renewals of the GII Long Island H. (an off-the-turf affair that year) and the grassy GII Sheepshead Bay H., both at 11 furlongs.

Like Barbaro and Dynaformer, La Ville Rouge was effective on both turf and dirt, and, in addition to her Long Island H. effort, was beaten only a length in the GIII Tempted S. on the main track at two.

It appears that La Ville Rouge was something of an anomaly, as her sister, three-time stakes winner and Grade I placed Lucky Lavender Girl, was a sprinter, as is Lucky Lavender Girl's stakes-winning daughter Lavender Lass. Against that, we can note that La Ville Rouge's half-brother, Green Alligator, did win the GIII California Derby. Barbaro's granddam, La Reine Rouge, won the Toddler S., a juvenile sprint, and was a daughter of the sprinting King's Bishop, but she was also half-sister to La Reine Elaine, successful in the GIII Gallorette S., a new track-record holder for 8 1/2 furlongs at Pimlico. Another half-sister to La Reine Elaine, Marlodge, was unplaced in her only start, but is the granddam of the young Cherokee Run stallion During, winner of four graded events, including the GII Swaps S., GII Jerome H. and GII San Fernando Breeders' Cup S. With his stamina up to 11/2 miles virtually guaranteed on pedigree, and with his proven performance on grass, it would be fascinating to see Barbaro tackle Europe's best in a race like King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S. or Prix de l'Arc de Troimphe as a four-year-old.

In our introduction to this article, we mentioned that Barbaro has a double of Nashua, through Bramalea, the dam of Roberto, and through Gold Digger, the dam of Mr. Prospector. What we haven't yet mentioned is that this pair have more in common than their sire: Bramalea's dam, Rarelea, is by a son of Bull Dog out of a mare by Blue Larkspur, while Gold Digger's dam is by Bull Dog out of a Blue Larkspur mare, thus giving Rarelea and Gold Digger, a very similar genetic background.

It may well be that the shared background is what has been particularly instrumental in making the Roberto/Mr. Prospector combination a rather potent one. As far as Dynaformer is concerned, the cross has been a very profitable one, as it has produced four other stakes winners, headed by Grade I scorers Film Maker and Riskaverse. In all, Roberto and Mr. Prospector are combined within the first four generations of at least 150 stakes winners, and in addition to last year's champion three-year-old Afleet Alex (a reverse cross to Barbaro, being by a Mr. Prospector-line stallion out of a Roberto-line mare) they include other such well-known horses as Rock Hard Ten, Hollywood Wildcat, Maid's Causeway, First Samurai, Shamardal, You, Dubawi, Johar and Tweedside. NELSON ON COURSE FOR DERBY Aidan O'Brien issued an upbeat bulletin yesterday regarding Susan Magnier and Diane Nagle's Horatio Nelson (Ire) (Danehill), who will be pointed for the G1 Epsom Derby June 3. Despite finishing only eighth in Saturday's G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket, last year's G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere hero has pleased his connections. "We were delighted with Horatio Nelson," O'Brien told PA Sport yesterday. "We knew he was a little bit behind in fitness and is the type of horse who will need racing to get him there. We said to [jockey] Mick [Kinane] that he would need it and come on a good bit for it, and Mick said he's had a blow just going into the 'dip' and he was kind to him. He's taken the race very well and we would really look forward to the Derby with him-there's a lot to come from him. He'll probably go straight to Epsom. I would imagine that's what we are thinking at the moment."

INTERNATIONALS PREP FOR SAIC The six international challengers for Sunday's \$\$3-million (\$1.77 million) G1 Singapore Airlines International Cup at Kranji were further acquainted with the track during trackwork yesterday morning. Godolphin's Valixir (Ire) (Trempolino) cantered over the sand track and is not likely to do much more, explained travelling head groom Claire Sparkes. "He did his final piece of work at Newmarket before he shipped here, and it's just a question of keeping him happy and ticking over between now and Sunday," said Sparkes. "He'll have a mile canter on Wednesday and Thursday morning on the grass and then step up to the mile and a quarter on Friday morning." Falstaff (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}), third in the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic in March, trailed a workmate by over six lengths at one point, but inhaled that one, getting his final eighth of a mile in :11.90. Trained by Mike de Kock, he is scheduled to continue his career in Singapore following this race.

NEW GROUP 2 AT YORK Officials at York racecourse yesterday announced that there will be an additional group race run on the Knavesmire this year known as the G2 York S. Replacing the banished G2 Scottish Derby previously run at Ayr, the 10-furlong £100,000 contest will be for three-year-olds and up July 29. "This is a brand new race over the same distance as the [Aug. 22] G1 Juddmonte International," Marketing Manager James Brennan commented. "It is designed to fit horses looking for a run between the G1 Eclipse S. [at Sandown July 8] and International and we're delighted to secure it." As expected, York will also stage the Sept. 8-9 Ladbrokes St Leger Festival, which has been transferred from Doncaster due to that track's redevelopment. "It is a treat for us to be hosting the oldest Classic and we're very much looking forward to having a Classic to add to the excitement of having the Royal Ascot meeting last year," Brennan added.

#### **IMPERIOUSNESS**

As I hope you've noticed, I'm not one of those writers who starts out with a dictionary definition. But if there is ever an appropriate time, it's this week, and the word for this week is "imperiousness," the nominative case of "imperious," meaning, according to my Chambers dictionary: "assuming command; haughty; tyrannical; domineering; peremptory; authoritative." I think that about sums it up, don't you?

Imperious performance number one, chronologically, was George Washington brushing aside his 13 rivals in Newmarket's English G1 2000 Guineas. Only two horses ever got into this race: the frontrunner Olympian Odyssey, who stuck on manfully, once headed, to finish third; and George. Previously unbeaten Sir Percy (who looked to me like he might have appreciated a bit of cut in the ground) finished well for a clear second, but was never going to trouble the winner. The rest might as well have been in a different race, though the Jeremy Noseda-trained Araafa, a 66-1 outsider from Mull of Kintyre's first crop, was noticed staying on quite well to grab fourth. You'd have to fancy him to get some big black type next time out. The Racing Post rated the GW procession at 127, which is sufficiently respectful.

We're eligible to hear a lot of theory about what, on paper, contributes to making George Washington a superstar. It's probably relatively simple: Danehill, Grandera, and the Danzig-Alydar cross. This is all top-drawer stuff. If Danehill had stuck to the script and not contrived to die in the middle of the 2003 stud season, at the age of 17, he'd probably be standing for as much as Storm Cat now. You don't need me to recite the tale; suffice to say that after he returned from Europe, having stood the 1996 Northern season in Japan, Coolmore realized that he really was a budding superstar, and they stepped up the level of mare they bred to him. By the end of last year, his Northern Hemisphere A Runner index had climbed from around the 2.50 mark in the late 1990s, to over 4.00. He thus stepped right in to replace Nureyev in the World Top Five, ranking him right up there with Storm Cat; his own sire, Danzig; A.P. Indy; and Sadler's Wells.

The cross of Danzig over Alydar mares was an immediate success, including dual GI Breeders' Cup Mile winner Lure (foaled 1989), and many others, including SW Aurora (1988), who was out of the great Althea and and later the dam of Arch; and Bertolini, by Danzig out of Althea's full sister, Grade II winner Aqualegia. In all there are 14 A Runners (through the end of 2005) by Danzig or Danzig-line sires out of Alydar mares, and 29 A Runners out of all Danzig-line sires out of all Alydar-line mares. No fewer that seven of these are among the 30 A Runners out of Alysheba mares. Interestingly, six of those seven, including Grandera, were foaled in 1998-1999. As Bordighera had already produced Grandera, a Danzig-line Grade 1 winner by Grand Lodge, it wasn't the biggest surprise in history that George Washington topped the 2004 Tattersalls October 1 yearling sale, at 1,150,000gns.

#### Meanwhile, Across the Pond...

A little under eight hours after George Washington's imperious demonstration, Barbaro trounced the GI Kentucky Derby field equally imperiously. Amazingly, as has been extensively reported, by the same ace breed-

ers, Lael Stables. As far as the Derby goes, I never get tired of pointing out the difference between going nine furlongs in the first four months of the year, and 10 furlongs a week later.

In Barbaro's case, it made an eight-point difference on the Beyer scale: a colt who had run a Beyer 103 when he won the GI

Florida Derby came back five weeks later, over a furlong more, and ran a Beyer 111. This was not a bad bunch he humbled, either, and he's going to most likely have to beat at least two of the major contenders going into the race again in the GI Preakness in just 10 days' time. Brother Derek ran a race full of merit from the 18 post; he was basically caught wide the whole way, and finished with good courage to dead heat for fourth. He's going to be a big danger to Barbaro's Triple Crown bid at Pimlico, and so could post-time Derby favorite Sweetnorthernsaint, who ran well for a long way at Churchill.

It will not be a cakewalk at Pimlico, and, in a way, the Preakness can be the most significant race of the three. Way back in 1973, when our readers now under the age of 33 weren't even born, Secretariat beat 12 rivals in the Derby, beating Northern Dancer's track record by three-fifths of a second. Many people considered the Belmont, which he literally won by a 'pole,' his greatest race, but it wasn't. When Sham fell back on the backstretch, either failing to stay or having had his heart finally broken, Secretariat had only to cruise home over rivals 40 pounds his inferior. It was the Preakness, where Derby two-three Sham and Our Native re-opposed, which to my mind was the most impressive of Secretariat's Triple Crown wins. Secretariat trailed the six-horse field coming out of the clubhouse turn, but in a furlong he was 2 1/2 lengths in front, and he won by 2 1/2. He was the greatest racehorse I've ever seen in America. It took horses the caliber of Secretariat, Seattle Slew, and Affirmed (Alydar second all three times, remember) to win the Triple Crown. It was 25 years between Citation and Secretariat, and it's 28 years since Affirmed. I hope Barbaro wins it, and I think he could be good enough to do it. But he's no lock.

#### More Danehill ... Dancer

At least the G1 English 1000 Guineas is a recognized Classic. Nobody's ever known quite what to do about the GI Kentucky Oaks. Logically, it should be the first leg of a Fillies' Triple Crown, but Pimlico's GII Black-Eyed Susan S. has never really been the same standard as earlier races like the GI Santa Anita Oaks or Keeneland's GI Ashland S., and New York keeps pushing what used to be their Triple Tiara series back in the calendar: this year the one-mile GI Acorn S., which is really an American 1000 Guineas, isn't run until Belmont day, June 10. The most logical sequence would be the Kentucky Oaks, the nine-furlong GI Mother Goose, and the 10-furlong GI CCA Oaks, but this year there is almost two months between last Friday's Kentucky Oaks and the July 1 Mother Goose.

So whether we can call the Kentucky Oaks one of four weekend Classics is open to debate, and the fact the winner ran a Beyer 92 (about a Timeform 104, and 23 points slower than the Derby) wouldn't help the cause, either. The race provided third-crop sire Lemon Drop Kid with his first Grade I winner in the 'person' of Lemons Forever, who had won an Oaklawn allowance (Beyer 86) and run third in Turfway Park's GIII Bourbonette (Beyer 76) in her previous two starts. Ermine, a filly from the first crop by the Padua (in Florida) Danzig horse, Exchange Rate, was second.

There was an inch and a half of rain at Newmarket



Saturday night and Sunday morning, and the going for Sunday's English 1000 Guineas went from good-to-firm (firm in places) to soft. The all-conquering Danehill Dancer has always been good for soft-ground horses, so it wasn't the biggest shock in history that Speciosa, a filly by Danehill Dancer who had led all the

way to win the G3 Nell Gwyn a little under three weeks previously, repeated the dose in the Guineas. Soft-ground group winner Confidential Lady finished second, ahead of Nasheej, a Swain filly who had won Newbury's seven-furlong G3 Fred Darling S., the other recognized key 1000 Guineas prep.

Last year's European champion two-year-old filly, Rumplestilskin, was never at the races (in season, might not have liked the ground, either), while the filly with the best form in the field, last year's G1 Fillies' Mile winner Nannina, from Medicean's first crop, positively hated the ground, and trailed in second-last. The race was assigned a Racing Post Rating (RPR, like a Timeofrm rating) of 115, which was 12 points off George Washington's winning 'fig,' and was probably about right.

Among all four races, there were a total of 10 runners from their sires' first crops, obviously now three-year-olds. Steppenwolfer's Kentucky Derby third was worth \$200,000, and gave his sire, Aptitude, the number one ranking in 2006 earnings among North American sophomore sires. Ermine's second in the Kentucky Oaks sent Exchange Rate into eighth spot on the same list. The two European leaders, Mozart and Bertolini, each had a top six-furlong two-year-old Grade I winner in a Guineas, but both patently failed to stay: Amadeus Wolf in the 2000, and Donna Blini in the 1000. But, on Saturday, another Mozart three-year-old colt, Dandy Man, beat 'olders' in the G3 Palace House S., a five-furlong sprint, which this year had 23 runners. It's a lot of Danzig, especially in Europe, especially up to one mile--have I mentioned that before?

"It was over a year since his last victory, so it was nice to get him winning again," Noseda said. "It was really just a racecourse workout for him. He will now head to the Lockinge with the proviso that he will only run if the ground is good or faster." Noseda also said that Saleh al Homaizi and Imad al Sagar's Araafa (Ire) (Mull of Kintyre), who was fourth in Saturday's G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket, would be aimed at either the Irish equivalent at The Curragh May 27 or the Listed Heron S. at Goodwood May 25. "I was thrilled with his run in the Guineas," he said. "We feel vindicated having a crack, despite him missing his planned 'prep,' the Free Handicap a couple of weeks earlier. He's returned from the race in good order and I will be discussing the horse's options with the owners in the next couple of weeks." He also confirmed that Sir Robert Ogden's unplaced G1 1000 Guineas runner La Chunga (More Than Ready) could revert to sprinting. "Our chance disappeared with the rain," he added, "Because of that we are still left with a doubt in our mind about whether she really stays a mile. Sunday's race proved inconclusive. I would personally have a hunch that she would be better over sprinting distances. I will soon be talking to her owner Sir Robert Ogden and his racing manager Barry Simpson about future targets. But I think it's more than likely that she will be prepared for a shot at one of the Royal Ascot sprints."

DANTE NEXT FOR EPISODE Godolphin have confirmed Palace Episode (Machiavellian) on course for next Thursday's G2 Dante S. at York. Last year's G1 Racing Post Trophy winner will debut for his new connections in the extended 10-furlong contest. "We are very pleased with him," said Simon Crisford, Godolphin's racing manager.
