Lukas Rules Out Preakness For Simon Pure

An expected small field for the May 20 GI Preakness S. got even smaller vesterday when trainer D. Wayne Lukas said that **Simon Pure** (Silver Deputy), fourth in the GII Arkansas Derby in his most recent, would not compete in the second leg of the Triple Crown. "I think I'm going to pass," said Lukas, a five-time winner of the Preakness. "There are some opportunities here, and I looked at the field and I just don't know that I'm ready to take those horses on at this point." Lukas pointed to Barbaro as one reason he was opting out of the race. "I think he should scare a few horses away--me included," said Lukas. "I thought he did that very, very professionally and very easily. He clearly was the best horse, and it's not always the best horse that wins the Kentucky Derby. But in this case I think he was clearly the best horse. Obviously, some of the horses behind him had excuses, but they're going to have to step up to beat this horse." The June 17 GIII Northern Dancer S. at Churchill was possible for Simon Pure, added Lukas.

Jury Still Out on Lawver Ron's Preakness Chances

After it looked likely that Lawyer Ron would miss the Preakness S. with a hind ankle injury, trainer Bob Holthus said yesterday that a decision had still not been made. "We're going to take some further X-rays [Wednesday]," said Holthus of the colt, who ran a disappointing 12th in last Saturday's Kentucky Derby. "He's got a little something in his right hind ankle that the new owner's veterinarian is a little bit concerned about. My veterinarian and myself feel that it's probably been there a long time." Just prior to the Derby, a majority interest in Lawyer Ron was sold by the Estate of James Hines, Jr. to a group including Stonewall Farm's Audrey Haisfield. "We do have to respect their opinion because they now own 80 percent of him," said Holthus. "We're going to X-ray him this afternoon. If you see him going to the track in the morning, I think they had him out of the Preakness a little early."

Hemingway's Key Joins Preakness Field

Trainer Nick Zito has added Kinsman Stable's Hemingway's Key (Notebook) to the list of contenders for the May 20 GI Preakness S. The colt was most recently eighth in the Apr. 22 GII Coolmore Lexington S. "I had this in mind from day one because I thought he was Belmont material," Zito explained. "He trains better than he performs in the afternoon, but the light bulb just hasn't come on yet."

Barbaro Returns to Track

Kentucky Derby winner Barbaro (Dynaformer) returned to the track yesterday for the first time since Saturday's victory. The colt jogged at the Fair Hill Training Center in Elkton, Md, 60 miles from Pimlico, where he will attempt to win the second leg of racing's Triple Crown in the May 20 GI Preakness S. "He looks like he came out of the race well," said trainer Michael Matz. "I think he still has something left in the tank. Right now we have to take the Preakness and hopefully, if we can get by the Preakness, we have three weeks before the Belmont. We just have to take it one race at a time at this point." GIII Withers S. winner **Bernardini** (A.P. Indv) worked five furlongs at Belmont Park yesterday in 1:01 4/5, galloping out in 1:13 4/5. "It was an excellent move," said trainer Tom Albertrani. "He ran nicely entering the stretch and picked it up in the lane."

JOCKEYS IN FAVOR OF AMENDING 'HORSE-RACING ACT'

Eclipse Award-winning jockey John Velazquez said he would be in favor of an amendment to the Interstate Horseracing Act of 1978 that would provide funding for workers' compensation insurance for jockeys, exercise riders, trainers, and backstretch workers. Velazguez was one of three witnesses to testify before the House Committee on Energy and Commerce Subcommittee on Oversight and Investigations in Washington, D.C., May 9. U.S. Rep. Ed Whitfield, who chairs the committee, and Rep. Bart Stupak said during the hearing they are considering legislation that would allow for a percentage of revenue from simulcasts to go toward funding insurance premiums. The IHA governs interstate simulcasts, or the sending of signals across state lines. It requires approval from racetracks, horsemen's groups, and regulators before signals can be transmitted. "I personally believe we need a federal solution in this area," Whitfield said. Whitfield was one of the lawmakers who facilitated the 2005 Congressional inquiries into backstretch health and welfare issues, insurance, and the Jockeys' Guild. Stupak said his office is researching legislation that would allow jockeys and exercise riders to collectively bargain. "Our government is not only failing in its duty to protect jockeys and exercise riders from the oppressive practices of the racetrack, it is actively preventing these riders from protecting themselves by permitting the racetracks to break up any attempts by the jockeys and exercise riders to act collectively to improve their working conditions," he said. 

Broward Commissioners OK Gulfstream Village:

Broward County commissioners voted Tuesday night to give the go-ahead to a plan for the construction of residential, retail and office space on Gulfstream Park property. The plan will alter 64 of the racetrack's 240 acres, with 750,000 square feet of retail space, 140,000 square feet of office space, 1,500 condominiums, a 500-room hotel and 2,500 seats for movie goers. There will also be 225 affordable housing units built, a portion of which will be on site. The commission approved the plan by a 6-3 count. It still requires the approval of the city and regional planning council. If those approvals are given, construction could begin this year. The estimated \$1.2-billion project is expected to be finished in 2014.

Zoffinger: NJSEA Best Qualified to Run OTBs:

Responding to critics who believe that bidding for offtrack-betting facilities in the state of New Jersey should be opened to private enterprise, George Zoffinger, president of the New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority deemed that eventuality "dangerous" and seeks to insure that any real estate deal is "beyond reproach," according to the Harness Tracks of America newsletter. The NJSEA holds the licenses for each of 15 OTBs that have already been authorized in the state, but they will operate just nine of them. The other halfdozen have been licensed to Pennwood Racing, a subsidiary of Greenwood Racing Inc., parent company of Philadelphia Park. Zoffinger and the NJSEA have recently been under fire in the state capitol of Trenton for the significant delays in getting off-track-betting operational.
