

LAWYER RON OFF TRIPLE CROWN TRAIL

Lawyer Ron (Langfuhr) will officially miss the balance of this year's Triple Crown after it was announced that the chestnut colt will undergo surgery at Rood and Riddle Equine Hospital today. Trained by Bob Holthus, he is scheduled to have a chip removed from his right hind ankle and is expected to miss about 30 days of training. "We will take care of this minor problem now so that he will be in a great position to participate in the major three-year-old events this summer," said Audrey Haisfield, who last week purchased an 80-percent interest in the colt. "The timing is unfortunate to miss the

rest of the Triple Crown, but our ultimate goal is to have Lawyer Ron in top condition for the [G1] Breeders' Cup Classic at Churchill Downs." The son of Donation (Lord Avie) became one of the leading fancies for this year's G1 Kentucky Derby off six consecutive victories, capped by his success in the G11 Arkansas Derby Apr. 15. The 10-1 sixth choice in the Run for the Roses, Lawyer Ron was forwardly placed for the opening mile, but faded in the stretch to finish 12th. At the conclusion of his racing career, the colt will enter stud at Haisfield's Stonewall Farm in Versailles, Kentucky. To date, he sports a career record of 15-7-1-3 and earnings of \$1,220,008.

VALIXIR HEADS SAIC

Godolphin's **Valixir (Ire)** (Tremolino) heads a field of 13 older horses which will line up for Sunday's G1 Singapore Airlines International Cup at Kranji Racecourse. The winner of last year's G1 Prix d'Ispahan and G1 Queen Anne S. will be partnered by stable jockey Frankie Dettori and will depart from the seven hole. Most recently 14th in the G1 Dubai Duty Free S. Mar. 25, he was only recently committed to this event. "He wasn't definitely coming to Singapore until his final gallop at Newmarket when he convinced the stable he was well in with a chance," said Claire Sparks, head lass for Godolphin. **Field p3**

Kieren Fallon jetted to Chester's historic Roman circuit known as the "Roodeye" for the G3 Chester Vase yesterday and duly produced the goods for the packed enclosures on the progressive **Papal Bull (GB)** (Montjeu {Ire}). A Leicester maiden winner in October, he returned to take a Newmarket handicap Apr. 20 and made his stakes debut in a race which had denied his trainer Sir Michael Stoute since Shergar (GB) won by daylight in 1981. Hemmed in against the rail throughout, the 6-4 pick was swung out to chase down **Dragon Dancer (GB)** (Sadler's Wells) at the top of the short straight and forged ahead in the final 100 yards to score by 3/4 of a length. "He's a typical Montjeu," his rider said. "He's a joy to ride and just keeps on improving. He's still a big baby and this is a tricky track, but he's got a great attitude, is going the right way and is learning all the time. He's done nothing wrong and this would have taught him a lot, especially if you're thinking about the Derby. He's got everything you need for that race and I was impressed." Maraahel, the winner of this event in 2005, was at the bottom of the trifecta in the G1 International S. at York in August, G1 Champion S. at Newmarket in October and G1 Hong Kong Cup at Sha Tin in December. Sixth when tried on dirt on his return in the G1 Dubai World Cup at Nad al Sheba Mar. 25, he was third again behind Muhtaker in the G3 John Porter S. at Newbury last time Apr. 22, and paid a welcome pitstop to this venue to record back-to-back successes in this contest. After a slow break, the bay was driven up to lead by Richard Hills and proved rank on the front end before settling for a lead from Near Dock (Ger) (Docksider). When that rival could not carry him further than the final half-mile, he was allowed to stride on and take control for a smooth score. "He likes it round here and is a very consistent horse," commented trainer Sir Michael Stoute, recording his third win. "He's not quite a Group 1 horse and he's been acquitting himself well in Group 1 races--he gets a mile and a half well and he's well entered." 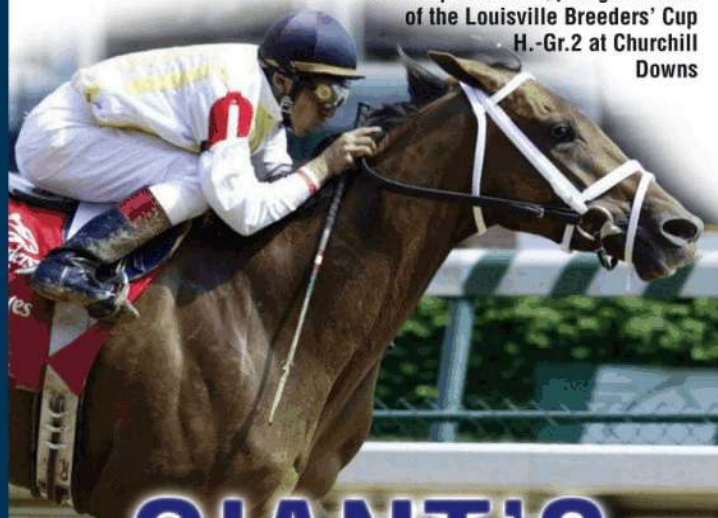

Triple Threats

Like Now Works at Belmont...

John Dillon's GIII Gotham S. hero **Like Now** (Jules) worked a half-mile in :49.31 yesterday at Belmont Park under the watchful eye of trainer Kiaran McLaughlin. "He did it very well," the conditioner commented. "I'm

extremely pleased with the workout. We had Garrett Gomez on him this morning and he will tentatively ride him in the Preakness if Todd Pletcher and Bob Baffert do not run anything. Fernando Jara has done nothing wrong on this horse, but the owners would like someone with more experience in these big races."

The bay, winner of the Fred "Cappy" Capossela S. prior to the Gotham, was most recently a good runner-up to Showing Up in the GII Coolmore Lexington S. at Keeneland Apr. 22. The latter returned to be an excellent sixth in the Kentucky Derby.

Lewis Michael On the Fence...

Frank Calabrese's **Lewis Michael** (Rahy), fourth to Sweetnorthernstain in the GII Illinois Derby Apr. 8, remains under consideration for the Preakness, though trainer Wayne Catalano is noncommittal. "We're up in the air on this," he explained. "We're going to call an audible. We want to stay on track. We were going to go in the [GII] Peter Pan [at Belmont May 20]. We have it between the Preakness and the Peter Pan, but we're on the fence. Who knows, Barbaro might scratch out, you know how horse racing is. We're leaning towards the Peter Pan." Lewis Michael, out of a half-sister to champion turf horse Kitten's Joy, made his name on the grass, winning the Grand Canyon H. at Churchill Downs last November before running third to Barbaro in the GIII Tropical Park Derby at Calder Jan. 1.

Hendricks Questions Luck of the Draw...

In a national media teleconference yesterday, Dan Hendricks questioned the random draw procedure used in choosing posts for the GI Kentucky Derby. The trainer of **Brother Derek** (Benchmark), who suffered a wide trip during the Derby after drawing post 18 in the 20-horse field, Hendricks suggested that graded-stakes earnings should dictate the order in which post positions are chosen. "It shouldn't be a lottery draw. They should have the horse that earned the most draw first," he said. "Graded stakes [earnings] should mean something." Hendricks went on to say that Brother Derek's Derby, "may have been the best race he's ever run, considering the post and the trip he had." Since his horse, "bounced out of the race great," Hendricks expects a more competitive race in the GI Preakness S. "The smaller field will make all the difference--everybody should have a good trip," he offered.

Zito Inclined to Enter Hemingway's Key...

This year marks the 10th anniversary of Louis Quatorze's victory in the second leg of the Triple Crown and, after sitting on the sidelines for the Derby, will take a crack at the Preakness with Kinsman Stable's **Hemingway's Key** (Notebook). Perfect in a pair of juvenile starts late last year, the chestnut has been beaten by a combined 41 3/4 lengths in four stakes starts this year, including an eighth-place effort in the Lexington S., where he was nine lengths adrift of Showing Up. Despite those efforts, Zito is undaunted. "He has been touting me," he said. "We will find out if he is a good one or a bad one next Saturday. It is certainly not the first time I've been touted by a three-year-old."

New Issues Added to Racing's Legislative Agenda

Horse racing's legislative agenda continues to expand. Reps. Ed Whitfield (R-KY) and Bart Stupak (D-MI), chairman and ranking minority member of the House Committee on Energy and Commerce Subcommittee on Oversight and Investigations, respectively, have indicated that they will press for new federal legislation that would enable jockeys to engage in collective bargaining and would amend the Interstate Horseracing Act to give jockeys a voice in the approval of interstate simulcasts. Meanwhile, a scheduled hearing on the Internet Gambling Prohibition Act (HR 4777) before the [House Judiciary Committee](#) has been postponed until next week.
