BERNARDINI WINS; BARBARO SERIOUSLY HURT Bernardini (A.P. Indv) gave Sheikh Mohammed's

Darley Stable its first American Classic victory in yesterday's GI Preakness S., but the racing world was rocked by a serious injury sustained by **Barbaro** (Dynaformer) during the opening furlong of the race. He is scheduled



to undergo surgery at New Bolton this afternoon, according to Gale Luciani, a spokesperson for the clinic. The Kentucky Derby winner broke through the gate prior to the start, but was away alertly once reloaded. After a halffurlong, the dark bay took an apparent bad step and ran

several strides essentially on three legs, favoring his injured right hind ankle. Jockey Edgar Prado did a masterful job pulling up the colt just past the finish line and was joined shortly thereafter by trainer Michael Matz, who immediately vacated the grandstand to attend to his stricken horse. Dr. Larry Bramlage, the on-call veterinarian for the American Association of Equine Practitioners, explained that Barbaro had suffered a condylar fracture of the cannon bone in his right hind as well as

a comminuted fracture of the first phalanx and there is also a piece off a sesamoid. Barbaro was fitted with a first-aid splint and was loaded on the equine ambulance to be transported back to the barn. He was to be transferred to New Bolton, one of the leading equine hospitals

in the Midlantic region, and about a 80-mile trip from Baltimore. Dr. Dean Richardson will preside over the surgery. Despite the seriousness of the injury, Bramlage initially commented that there was a "reasonable chance to save" the colt. He later told the *Reuters* news agency, "There are some major hurdles. There are at least a couple of aspects of it that are very life threatening for him. His career is over. This will be it for him as a race horse. Under the best of circumstances, we're looking to try to save him as a stallion."

Belated Debut, Meteoric Rise...

Bernardini didn't make it to the races until shortly after the New Year, but he was off slowly in that Jan. 7 bow at Gulfstream Park and raced evenly thereafter, finishing fourth to Exclusive Quality. There may have been an excuse for that effort, as Lasix was added for a Mar. 4 maiden in Hallandale, and the colt responded in kind, taking a one-turn mile event by a widening 7 3/4 lengths. He missed an allowance engagement Apr. 8 due to a foot bruise but recovered from that in good order and made his next and most recent start in the GIII Withers S. at Aqueduct Apr. 29. Settled just off the pace that afternoon, he inhaled the leader turning for home and went on to score by 3 3/4 lengths, despite Javier Castellano dropping his stick in the stretch.

How the Race Was Won...

As expected, GIII Gotham S. winner Like Now (Jules) was quarter-horsed away from the gate and set the pace as Sweetnorthernsaint applied pressure from the outside. Bernardini, third past the stands the first time, secured a nice position in fourth down the backstretch, but jumped on the bit when Brother Derek (Benchmark) drew alongside at about the five-furlong pole. Asked to accelerate on the far turn, the Darley runner made an eyecatching move into contention, was angled to the outside and went on to a convincing victory. "I waited until about the three-eighths pole and I knew I had so much horse that I had to go," commented winning rider Javier Castellano. "At the quarter pole, I knew that I had it won." Trainer Tom Albertrani wasn't always quite that confident. "I was a little concerned when I saw him get passed by Brother Derek, I thought maybe we weren't running our race today, but when he came back into the picture, I knew it was all over from there." In other post-race developments, jockey Kent Desormeaux reported that Sweetnorthernsaint grabbed a quarter out of the gate, while HRTV indicated that Brother Derek bled during the race. Peeress was off to a late start, but began to blossom last spring. She followed a smooth score in the Listed Michael Seely Memorial S. at York's Dante meeting with a second in the G3 Princess Elizabeth S. at Epsom on Oaks day. She came back to take the G2 Windsor Forest S. at Royal Ascot at York 12 days later before finishing third behind Soviet Song (Marju {Ire}) in the G1 Falmouth S. in July. Returning to Newmarket in early October, she took advantage of the rain-soaked turf to win the Sun Chariot before running fourth in the G2 Challenge S. at that track a fortnight later. Making her 2006 bow yesterday, she was settled under cover in mid-pack, made smooth progress into the teeth of the headwind to lead with 1 1/2 furlongs remaining and never looked likely to be caught despite the game chase of the runner-up. "She deserves this," jockey Kieren Fallon said. "She's gone from strength to strength and is a lovely filly to ride." Connections revealed that the G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot June 20 was the next target, where she is likely to meet Majors Cast and Lockinge favorite Soviet Song, who stayed on at the one pace to be fourth. Better Talk Now was a 27-1 bomb when he upset the 2004 GI Breeders' Cup Turf at Lone Star, but has established himself as one of the more consistent performers in the division since. Last year, the gelding registered wins in the GIII Fort Marcy H., GI United Nations and GI Man o' War S. He failed to defend his title in the 2005 Turf, running a disappointing seventh, then shipped to Tokyo to run 12th in the G1 Japan Cup in November. Better Talk Now was allowed to trail the seven-horse field as stablemate and rabbit Shake the Bank (Sandpit {Brz}) set surprisingly relaxed splits of :48 1/5 and 1:12 fractions. Always close, Artie Schiller forged to a daylight lead in upper stretch, but Better Talk Now came calling with his run and, between 'Artie' and Dreadnaught, got the nod on the line. "[He] is so honest," said winning trainer Graham Motion. "It amazes me he went off at 7-2. This isn't his distance, don't forget. I felt about as confident today as l've felt for a while." Derby Italiano cont.

There was a time when this Classic proved beyond the reach of the domestically trained colts, but there was a sea-change in 2002 when Rakti (GB) ended a 14year drought stretching back to Tisserand (Ity). Italy has welcomed a successful home defence on three of the last four occasions and, while it is too early to suggest it has returned to the fold, the Derby Italiano is no longer an easy touch for overseas raiders. Rattle and Hum, who represents the Camici family responsible for Groom Tesse (GB) two years ago, attempts to become the first to complete the G2 Premio Parioli (Italian 2000 Guineas)-Derby double since 1969. That elusive feat has been attempted three times since 2000, most recently by Ramonti (lty), who found only one too good in his quest 12 months ago, but Rattle and Hum may be better equipped for this test with a pedigree suggesting the mile of the Parioli was his minimum. His convincing defeat of Royal Power (Ire) in the Apr. 23 Classic at this venue has already been franked by that rival's subsequent win in the G2 Mehl-Mulhens-Rennen (German 2000 Guineas), and there is no reason why the Parioli third Adorabile Fong should reverse placings here. Camici is also responsible for Monachesi, who easily beat Miles Gloriosus in the Listed Premio Botticelli on the Parioli undercard and is a potent second string. If any trainer is capable of upsetting a home celebration, it is Andre Fabre, who has supplemented Gentlewave. That colt followed a success in the Listed Prix Maurice Caillault at Saint-Cloud Mar. 18 with a late burst to take the Apr. 17 G2 Prix Noailles at Longchamp, but lost his unbeaten tag to Numide (Fr) in the G2 Prix Hocquart at that track May 8.

With Hurricane Run (Ire) still in the picture, France's status quo looks set in stone, but that behemoth is currently abroad and there are major domestic prizes going begging. Late to start, Corre Caminos has made giant strides since a winning debut at Saint-Cloud in May. His last four starts have all come at this venue--he took the G3 Prix du Prince d'Orange in September before flopping the following month when seventh in the G2 Prix Dollar. Beaten just a half length by G3 Preis der Winterfavoriten and G3 Preis der Deutschen Einheit hero Manduro in the G2 Prix d'Harcourt Apr. 9, the gelding made the leap forward to best that rival by five lengths in the Apr. 30 G1 Prix Ganay. While Manduro faces a stiff task attempting to close that gap, his stable companion Archange d'Or may fit this unique distance. Typical of Andre Fabre's best sophomores, he was on an upward curve last year when winning the Listed Prix Pelleas at Chantilly and G2 Prix Eugene Adam at Maisons-Laffitte. Subsequently disappointing when eighth in the G1 Prix du Moulin here in September, he made a pleasing return to finish on the heels of Manduro and Corre Caminos in the d'Harcourt and bids to provide his trainer with his seventh renewal of this event. Of the milers stepping up in trip, Turtle Bowl warrants respect. He makes his first start since winning the G3 Prix de la Jonchere and G1 Prix Jean Prat at Chantilly last summer.

Germance heads a host of hopefuls for the June 11 G1 Prix de Diane, and she can cement her claims for that Chantilly Classic by extending her perfect record here. As with trainer Jean-Claude Rouget's 2004 winner Ask For The Moon (Fr), she followed the standard pattern of stepping up from the provinces to debut in group company in Paris. Her length defeat of Sanaya in the G3 Prix Penelope at Saint-Cloud Apr. 10 suggested there was more to come. "I was very happy with Germance's performance at Saint-Cloud," her conditioner said. "The going was good to soft that day, but I think she goes on any ground. We hope she can win this Group 1 race and, if she runs well, then the plan is to go to the Prix de Diane at Chantilly. We will see how she is after that and, if she is well, we will look at mileand-a-half races later in the season. She is out of a Caerleon mare and has the pedigree to stay further." Whether Sanaya, who was also runner-up in the G3 Prix Cleopatre at Saint-Cloud May 1, can reverse form with Germance remains to be seen, but the names of His Highness the Aga Khan and Alain de Royer-Dupre have been on this trophy on two occasions since 1989 and she should not be written off. Andre Fabre boasts an impressive tally in this race, with last year's heroine Vadawina (Ire) becoming his seventh success. He relies on Mayoress, who looked to have a bright future when taking a conditions event at Maisons-Laffitte May 3.

Third in the G1 Prix Royal-Oak in October 2004, he returned 12 months later to win that contest at the expense of **Reefscape** and **Shamdala**. He had beaten the former and Ostankino in the G2 Prix Kergorlay at Deauville in August before suffering a troubled trip and eventually dead-heating for second with Ostankino behind Reefscape in the G1 Prix du Cadran here on Arc day. RUMPLESTILTSKIN INJURED

Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor and the Niarchos Family's **Rumplestiltskin (Ire)** (Danehill) will miss next Sunday's G1 Irish 1000 Guineas at The Curragh due to an injury, *Racing Post* revealed yesterday. Last year's G1 Moyglare Stud S. and G1 Prix Marcel Boussac winner disappointed when seventh as the 3-1 favorite in Newmarket's G1 1000 Guineas May 7. "Rumplestiltskin has injured a ligament close to her pelvis and will be doing nothing for four or five weeks," trainer Aidan O'Brien told the *Post*. "She had a short break when she came home and the problem only became evident in the past few days when she started back working. Unfortunately, she won't be going to the Irish 1000 Guineas or to Royal Ascot. She will need time and it will be later in the season before she runs again."
