BARBARO COMFORTABLE AFTER SURGERY

The racing world turned its focus on the University of Pennsylvania's New Bolton Center yesterday as the clinic's Chief of Surgery Dr. Dean Richardson labored for more than five hours to try and save Lael Stables' Barbaro (Dynaformer). According to Richardson, the operation went as well as could be expected and the colt was resting comfortably last night. "The surgery was very difficult," he admitted, but added, "We were able to get the appropriate metal implants in the leg to help hopefully fuse his fetlock joint and stabilize the limb to the point where he would be able to be salvaged as a stallion. He got up from anaesthesia without any injuries...and he is, at this very moment, extremely comfortable on the leg. He practically jogged back to his stall. Right now he's very happy, he's eating, things are good, but I've been doing this too long to think that day one is the end." The surgeon remarked that the blood supply to the injured limb was good, but his prognosis was still guarded. "No one's going to want to hear this, but, to be brutally honest, there's enough of a chance of things going wrong that it's still a coin toss," he said, adding, "Horses with this type of injury are very, very susceptible to lots of other problems, including infection because of the severity of the injury and the amount of metal that's put in the leg to fix it. The other big problem is that horses are very vulnerable to laminitis. He will be monitored very closely in all regards." Trainer Michael Matz, who observed the surgery, was visibly relieved afterwards. "I felt much better when we were walking him to his stall just now than when we were loading him onto the ambulance to come here," Matz said. "Last night I didn't know what was going to go on--now I feel he has a chance." Barbaro suffered a condylar fracture in his right hind cannon bone, a fractured sesamoid and a dislocated fetlock, and the long pastern bone had shattered into more than 20 pieces. Richardson remarked that, while some catastrophic injuries are the result of an existing condition, that was not the case here. "I could see no evidence of pre-existing injury," he said. Barbaro is expected to remain at New Bolton for a recovery that could last several months, and may undergo a second surgery to change the cast in a week or 10 days.

Bernardini Exits Race in Good Order...

A day after his rousing victory in the second leg of the Triple Crown, Darley Stable's GI Preakness S. win-

ner **Bernardini** (A.P. Indy) was reportedly in good order. Conditioner Tom Albertrani said that Team Darley would wait a few days before deciding weather the colt would target the Triple Crown's third leg, the GI Belmont S. in New York June 10. Should Bernardini start in the 1 1/2-mile race, he would be Albertrani's

second runner; the trainer confirmed that GIII Tampa Bay Derby winner **Deputy Glitters** (Deputy Commander), eighth in the GI Kentucky Derby, was a probable for the Belmont. With the tragic circumstances surrounding the Preakness, Albertrani admitted that it was 2 a.m. before he fully appreciated his colt's outstanding effort. "The phone was ringing in our room and woke me up," he said. "It was room service. We had ordered an early breakfast, and they called up to make sure they got the order right. I didn't get back to sleep right away. That's when it hit me: 'Hey, we won the Preakness!'"

No Belmont for Brother Derek...

Cecil Peacock's **Brother Derek** (Benchmark), fourth in Saturday's Preakness, was scheduled to fly back to trainer Dan Hendricks' base in California yesterday and will not return to the East Coast for a tilt in the GI Belmont S. "We'll go back to California and regroup," said Hendricks. Brother Derek had a less-than-ideal trip when he dead-heated for fourth in the GI Kentucky Derby, and didn't have a great trip in the Preakness either, much to the chagrin of Hendricks. "All I wanted was a clean race," he said. "He banged his head pretty good when he broke from the gate and he got off bad. When [jockey Alex Solis] had to grab him [to avoid Barbaro], he got on the muscle and was never able to run his race. It could have been worse. Though Laverock's late-closing style has often got him into tight spots, everything fell into place yesterday as he delivered a telling kick to record a career-best. Third in the G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud at two, he captured the one-mile G3 Prix de Fontainebleau last April, but didn't win again until his final 2005 outing, the G3 Prix Andre Baboin at Lyon-Parilly in October. The dark bay beat only one home on his four-year-old bow in the Apr. 23 G1 Queen Elizabeth II Cup at Sha Tin, and arrived here as an outsider looking for a reversal of fortune. Slowly away, he was reserved in rear by Davy Bonilla early and still had only one rival behind in the false straight. Traveling easily on the final turn, Laverock guickened through the pack to cut down Krataios in the final 100 yards before holding the late rush of Manduro. "He does absolutely nothing at home and always needs his first run badly, so he definitely needed it in Hong Kong," commented trainer Carlos Laffon-Parias. 

Sent out to a pair of allowance wins in Arlington last summer by trainer Anthony Granitz, Take D'Tour joined the David Fawkes barn after concluding her 2005 season with a well-beaten sixth in the Shocker T. H. at Calder in October. In her first start for Fawkes, she ran a tired sixth in Tampa Bay's Wayward Lass S. Mar. 4, then responded to the class drop to annex a one-mile Gulfstream allowance by four lengths Mar. 30. Take D'Tour took a similar event by 10 lengths Apr. 14, with Balletto back in fourth, and was testing the graded waters for the first time here. On her toes and looking good in the post parade, the handsome chestnut was hustled out under Cornelio Velasquez and was allowed uncontested: 23 1/5 and: 46 1/5 splits. After completing three quarters in 1:10 4/5, she lengthened away impressively as Balletto put in a solid run to be second. "She was really rank in the paddock and I told Cornelio, 'You'll be on the lead,'" said Fawkes. "When they went an opening quarter in :23 1/5, I was very happy. I didn't think she'd ever win this race that easy." Fawkes said the June 17 GI Ogden Phipps H. at Belmont was the next likely target for his charge.

After needing seven tries to break his maiden in Europe, the Irish-bred, British-raced Stratham has now notched three wins in four U.S. starts, including this initial graded tally. Despite his lengthy winless streak in Britain, Stratham was admirably consistent as a juvenile in 2005, hitting the board in five straight races before breaking his maiden at Salisbury last June. Moved to Tim Yakteen's stable later that year, he won the restricted Pinjara S. at Santa Anita Oct. 30 in his first stateside outing. He put up an honest effort coming off the long break when fourth in the Mar. 18 Pasadena S., then found room on the rail in his next as he scampered through to victory in the Apr. 15, one-mile La Puente S. at Santa Anita. Let go at 7-1 odds despite his recent form, the bay, with David Cohen in the irons, raced along in a perfect tracking spot in third as Corazondelcampeon (Comic Strip) set the pace. Cohen gave his mount the green light as they turned the corner and Stratham responded gamely, outfinishing the hard-trying New Joysey Jeff. 



Five Definite for Belmont Stakes...

A quintet of three-year-olds have been confirmed for the June 10 GI Belmont S., including Steppenwolfer (Aptitude), who skipped the Preakness after running third in the May 7 GI Kentucky Derby. The gray worked five furlongs in 1:00 1/5 over the Belmont training track yesterday morning. "It made sense to give him the time and wait for the mile and a half," trainer Danny Peitz said. Jazil (Seeking the Gold) was also pointed for the final jewel in the Triple after the Derby, where he finished in a dead-heat for fourth with Brother Derek. Trainer Bob Baffert will send GI Wood Memorial winner Bob and John (Seeking the Gold) in from California for the race. Seventeenth in Louisville, the colt went six furlongs in 1:10 4/5 at Santa Anita Saturday. Stablemate Point Determined (Point Given), ninth in the Derby, also breezed, going five panels in :59 4/5. There is a slim chance he will join Bob and John in the gate on the second Saturday in June. "Both horses worked great," Baffert said. "I think a mile and a half is going to really suit Bob and John." But, he added, "Even though Point Determined is by [2001 Belmont winner] Point Given, he doesn't have the same style Point Given had." Also definite for the Belmont are Preakness third Hemingway's Key (Notebook) and Oh So Awesome (Awesome Again), who finished third in Friday's Match the Hatch S. in the slop at Belmont. That colt was making his U.S. debut after starting his career in Europe. "The whole reason Team Valor bought him and sent him here was to run in the Belmont," said his trainer, Jimmy Jerkens.



I read Bill Oppenheim's Polytrack analysis (Turfway Polytrack, Sires, Sire Lines and Branches, TDN, 5-17-06) with interest. This surface is certainly new "turf" and it will be interesting to see which pedigrees gravitate towards it. One thing that you may or may not be aware of was the variation of the Turfway surface from the standard Polytrack formula. I had been perplexed when watching the races at Turfway this winter at seeing the "rooster tails" that the horses were kicking up. This was not consistent with what I had witnessed at Newmarket and at Highpointe Training Center, where we have partnered to install an uphill Polytrack. There is minimal kickback at either of these facilities, which reflects that these tracks are not "cuppy" in contrast with Turfway. I had a chance to visit with Nick Nicholson on the topic and he revealed that in their fear that the track might freeze with its location near the river, they modified the Polytrack formula additional fiber was added and the amount of binding wax was reduced. This is probably what created the extreme kickback and contributed to the slower times. Even so, the numbers showed it to be an overwhelming success in preventing catastrophic breakdowns. In the 2004/05 season, there were 20 horses that had to be removed from the track, either in the morning or during the races, with the horse ambulance. In the 2005/06 season, there were three. From an owner's standpoint, that is astronomical. If fewer horses are being hauled off, then that probably means that there should be statistically fewer injuries that require either surgery or giving horses time off caused by the wear and tear of dirt tracks. Perhaps two of Polytrack's greatest attributes are: 1) when the formula is correct, horses are always training over even ground in the morning, unlike the undulating ground of dirt tracks after horses have trained over them; and 2) it drives maintenance cost down for the racetracks, which creates the incentive for more tracks to consider its installation and thus create the benefit to the horse.

Turfway is in the process of removing the fiber and will add more wax when the weather gets warmer. Hopefully, this should readjust the formula to where it should tighten the track up. Another windfall for Turfway (which certainly needs one) is the ability to use the track as a training center in the off-season at \$7/stall, creating another revenue stream for a struggling racetrack. Statistics that may be interesting to follow as more Polytracks are installed are starts per horse, and field spread (the margin from the first horse to the last) compared to traditional dirt surfaces. This last one will be very interesting when Keeneland has installed theirs. As we all know, Keeneland probably had the largest field spread in America-so many horses disliked the surface, they would run down, speedy-cut, and run poorer races if they didn't have an affinity for it. Smaller, lighter horses seemed traditionally to do better at Keeneland than big powerful horses--Sinister Minister fits this model. Keeneland is to be commended for being a progressive industry leader and bringing this new technology to America. It is probably the single most important innovation in our industry since the introduction of the starting gate. At any rate, the analysis and comparisons in evaluating Polytrack should be great reading and I look forward to any that you may consider writing in the future. This is "uncharted ground" so to speak, and you have started the ball rolling on trying to understand what it will mean to our breed. I look forward to future columns.
