Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith's George Washington (Ire) (Danehill) yesterday headed the 19 declared entries for Saturday's G1 Irish 2000 Guineas at The Curragh. Aidan O'Brien was responsible for nine entries, with the Newmarket G1 2000 Guineas winner firmly in line to tackle the double last achieved by Rock of Gibraltar (Ire) in 2002. Also engaged at this stage is Michael Tabor's Marcus Andronicus (Danehill). who was touted as a possible for this Classic after finishing runner-up in the May 14 G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains (French 2000 Guineas) at Longchamp. That race's winner Aussie Rules (Danehill) has been left in, but Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor & Faisal Salman's colt is likely to tackle the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club (French Derby) at Chantilly June 4. Heading the opposition is the Listed Loughbrown S. and G3 Tetrarch S. scorer Decado (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) and trainer Kevin Prendergast is hoping that the going stays on the soft side. "He seems to act on soft ground and he hasn't been tried on dry ground so why change it," he told the Racing Post. "Let's hope it stays that way for the rest of the week as he's in good shape and hopefully we'll get him there in one piece." Paul Hensey, racecourse manager for The Curragh, is bewildered by the recent heavy rain. "If the Guineas were today we would be able to race," he said yesterday. Arch Hall, who ended 2005 with a win in the trackand-trip Sir Barton S. last November, had a successful winter south of the border, winning an Oaklawn allowance in February before runner-up efforts in the Mar. 12 GIII Razorback Breeders' Cup H. and Apr. 12 GIII Fifth Season S. for trainer Anthony Reinstedler. Away slowly, the bay sat just off the early leaders, moved to the lead with a three-wide move into the straight and drove clear to the wire. PREAKNESS OVERNIGHT TV RATINGS DOWN SLIGHTLY

by Lenny Shulman, courtesy The Blood-Horse The overnight ratings for NBC's coverage of the Preakness Stakes May 20 indicated a small drop-off in viewers from 2005's numbers. The overnights, which measure viewership in 54 major markets, gave the overall telecast a 5.7 rating and a 14 share, down four percent from last year's 5.9/14. With one rating point equal to 770,000 viewers, the Preakness, from Pimlico Racecourse in Baltimore, Md., was seen in approximately 4.4-million homes. The share indicates the percent of TV sets that were tuned to the race. The pre-race portion of the one-hour, 45-minute telecast, from 5 p.m.-5:45 p.m. EDT, registered a 4.0/10, down fractionally from 2005's 4.2/10. The race portion of the show, 5:45-6:45, yielded a 7.0/16, down three percent from a 7.2/17 last year. Nevertheless, the Preakness telecast was the highest-rated sporting event televised May 20. ABC will telecast the Belmont S. June 10 from New York.

Seeing an unbeaten filly confirm her classic potential with a Group 1 victory would normally be a happy experience, but the success of Roberto's grand-daughter Germance in the Prix Saint-Alary had some sad undertones. Of course the weekend was meant to be a celebration of the Roberto male line, but one bad step by Barbaro simultaneously robbed American racing of a potential Triple Crown winner and a major ambassador for the sport. Then there's the fact that Germance is by Silver Hawk, whose owner Mahmoud Fustok was killed in such senseless circumstances earlier this year. Germance's win also acted as a reminder that there won't be many more chapters to add to Silver Hawk's fascinating life story. She belongs to the penultimate crop by the pensioned Airdrie stallion, who has 25 two-year-olds in his final crop, sired at the age of 24.

Brereton Jones went so far as to describe Silver Hawk as "fabulous" when he announced that the son of Roberto was being retired at the end of 2003. And who could quibble with his choice of adjective? Silver Hawk's total stakes winners stands at more than 70 and Germance is no less than his 14th Group 1 winner. Her predecessors are the European classic winners Benny The Dip, Lady In Silver and Mutafaweq; two other Europeans in Devil River Peak and Magnificent Star; top American performers Hawkster, Memories of Silver, Red Bishop, Silver Ending, Zoonaqua, Hawk Attack and Wonder Again; and Japanese champion Grass Wonder.

Altogether, Silver Hawk sired more than 30 group or graded winners, which is quite an achievement, as he wasn't heavily used.

"We've never played the numbers game with him and have limited his book in terms of numbers, and he rewarded us with a fantastic career," was Jones' summary.

The limited numbers were definitely intentional throughout the majority of Silver Hawk's career, but possibly not always during its early stages, when he occasionally struggled. I suspect that he would never have made it to the top without the support of Fustok's Buckram Oak broodmares, which supplied Lady In Silver and Magnificent Star, and Jones's Airdrie mares.

American breeders could be forgiven for not clamouring for his services when he commenced stallion duties at a fee of \$12,500 in 1983. He was, after all, an unfamiliar name to them, having won nothing more important than a Group 3, and he wasn't the most imposing of individuals, being somewhat short-legged, with a rather plain head. **Cont. p4**

Consequently, none of Silver Hawk's first six crops contained more than 34 named foals, with his fifth crop, born in 1988, numbering only 16 even though his fee had sunk to \$2,500 in 1987.

The fact that Silver Hawk's fee then rose to \$5,000 in 1988 and \$10,000 in 1989 before leaping to \$40,000 in 1990 gives some idea of the impact made by his second and third crops, which produced a combined total of 10 stakes winners from 61 foals. His fee was as high as \$75,000 by 2002, when Germance was conceived.

One aspect of Silver Hawk's career which has always intrigued me is that some of his ancestors combined a spirited, highly charged temperament with high achievement. Roberto, for example, had a strong dislike of the starting stalls as a two-year-old. Even more of a character was Silver Hawk's broodmare sire Amerigo. This hot-blooded son of Nearco won the Coventry S. in the style of a champion at two, but disappointed badly at three before being sold to the U.S.

"A reputation as a rough customer came with him across the Atlantic," read the *Bloodstock Breeders*' *Review* report on Amerigo, "and he fully justified it, turning the saddling paddock into a Wild West display and dining on chunks of his attendants. But he could run as well as he could fight."

A dash of temperament or nervous energy in a racehorse often transmutes into success in a stallion, and Amerigo had a remarkable record. He came up with 20 stakes winners from only 126 named foals, including Fort Marcy, America's Horse of the Year in 1970, and Gris Vitesse, the Prix Jacques le Marois winner who produced Silver Hawk.

Silver Hawk wasn't free of these quirks. *Racehorses* of 1982 alluded to his temperament, pointing out that he had a reputation for being nervous as a three-year-old and reported that he sweated up freely when he finished fourth as the favorite for the 2000 Guineas and when second in the Irish Derby. He was also third in the Derby, but cracked a cannon bone after his Irish Derby run and never raced again.

It therefore came as no surprise when John Gosden described Silver Hawk's Derby-winning son Benny The Dip as a very excitable horse--a hyper-neurotic creature.

Silver Hawk wasn't short of stamina and his progeny have shone in Britain's longer classics. His Derby contenders prior to Benny The Dip included Silver Wisp, third in 1992, and Fahal, fourth in 1995. He also sired Mutafaweq, winner of the 1999 St Leger, and Minds Music, runner-up in the 1995 Leger. Mutafaweq's exploits no doubt provided some of the inspiration behind the mating which produced Germance. He was out of a well-connected daughter of Caerleon and so is Germance. Her dam Gaily Tiara was bred in Ireland, but then headed for Japan--as did so many of Caerleon's daughters after the Group 1 successes of Shinko Lovely and Biwa Heidi. Although Gaily Tiara was just an ordinary winner, she comes from a highly successful family and Fares Farms must be more than happy to have bought her last November for \$200,000, in foal to Distorted Humor.

Germance was listed in the catalogue as being unnamed, but she made a winning debut in the French Provinces 13 days after her dam's sale. This year, after warming up with another win in the Provinces, she has established her quality with a pair of group victories in Paris.

Germance's second dam Majestic Role was also a classy performer. After a winning debut over seven furlongs at two, this daughter of Theatrical was runner-up to the champion French filly Coup de Genie in the G1 Prix de la Salamandre. Majestic Role continued to be highly tried at up to two miles the following year and had little to show for it, except for being beaten less than five lengths in the Oaks.

Coincidentally, Majestic Role's finest moment as a broodmare came when she visited Silver Hawk in 1996. Their daughter Aiglonne became a Group 3 winner over 1 5/16 miles towards the end of 2000, adding to the motivation for sending Gaily Tiara to the Airdrie stallion.

As you can see from Germance's catalogue-style pedigree available on *TDN*, Majestic Role was a half-sister to Fair of the Furze, a high-class racemare and an even better producer. One of Fair of the Furze's stakes winners was White Muzzle, a Derby Italiano winner who was rather unlucky not to win an Arc, and another was Elfaslah, dam of the G1 Dubai World Cup winner Almutawakel.

Germance should also stay well enough to tackle the Arc, but her immediate priority is to provide Silver Hawk with his second win in the G1 Prix de Diane.

In time she will also have bright prospects as a broodmare, as other daughters of Silver Hawk have already produced the likes of Castledale, Ticker Tape, Playful Act and Percussionist (winner of last week's G2 Yorkshire Cup). Unfortunately, it hasn't been a similar success story with Silver Hawk's stallion sons, but Grass Wonder--a brother to Wonder Again--may change that, as he already has two group winners in Japan this year.



TDN Book Review by Bill Finley

You've probably never heard of Leslie Jones. Why



would you? The now 8year-old mare couldn't run. Not even a little bit. She started 23 times and never won a race. Her career ended after she was pulled up in a nothing race at a lessthan-nothing track--a

\$4,000 maiden claimer at the Northampton Fair in 2002. She was just a slow horse.

For that reason, did she deserve to be neglected, to be abused, to be slaughtered? To most people, the answer is no. But never before has someone answered it so eloquently and powerfully as writer Dave Joseph and Pulitzer-Prize winning photographer Jon Kral. They are the team behind the moving new book, "Saving Leslie Jones" (Long Wind Publishing, 110 pages, \$55).

"Saving Leslie Jones" consists of 17 stories, each about people who have saved horses from neglect or slaughter and/or horses who escaped the grisly fate (a trip to a slaughterhouse) that awaited them. In each person, horse and story, there are similar themes: heroism, rebirth, redemption, kindness, trust, the human spirit.

Leslie Jones was a broken horse, in body and spirit, when she arrived at the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation's Exceller Farm in Poughquag, New York.

"You could have beaten her with a pole and she probably wouldn't have cared," TRF volunteer Melissa Leo told Joseph. "She had given up."

Indeed, Leslie Jones's story tells you a lot about one of racing's worst side. Until she reached the safe haven provided by the TRF, mankind had treated her horribly. She was emaciated and could barely walk. That is why she had lost her will to live. But the real focus of this story-and this book-is not about neglect or abuse but about how horses like Leslie Jones can be healed and reborn and how there is a reciprocal relationship with them and their caretakers. We make them feel better. They make us feel better about ourselves.

Leslie Jones was not yet whole at the time the story was written, and she may never be. But she is better and her will to live has returned.

Stories of human redemption also resonate throughout the book. Like Leslie Jones, Jay Schleifer was broken. Schleifer was an emotionally crippled heroin addict who was, he recalls in the book, "Living in gutters, literally, and sleeping in abandoned buildings." He stole to get drug money and was, of course, caught. Sentenced to the Wallkill Correctional Facility, he was just looking for an easy prison job when assigned to work with TRF horses at the farm.

There, something magical happened. Quite simply, the broken-down old horses made him a better person. "These horses gave me love and tenderness," he said. "They gave me an opportunity to bond in an emotional way, which is something that my criminal life had completely taken away."

Today, Schleifer is sober and works as an alcohol and substance abuse counselor at the Hale Creek Correctional Facility.

Schleifer found solace and a better life through his work with retired race horses, but what does Kelly Young get out of it? She's the angel of New Holland, the barbaric place in Amish country where horses come to die. There, racing's castoffs are sold, normally for a couple hundred dollars, to killer buyers who make a small profit by shipping them to and turning them over to the slaughterhouses.

She goes to New Holland every week and plucks as many horses as she can out of the hands of the killers. She estimates she has saved the lives of 500 horses. Why? Because it's the right thing to do.

Joseph covers racing and other sports for the Sun-Sentinel in South Florida. His words are emotional, moving and poetic. Kral's photography is emotional, moving and beautiful.

You must have this book.
