Blood-Horse

BARBARO 'FEELING GOOD'

Two days after undergoing surgery to repair multiple fractures in his right hind leg, **Barbaro** (Dynaformer) was continuing to make progress in his recovery, his surgeon

Dr. Dean Richardson said Wednesday morning. "Barbaro is doing very well," Dr. Richardson said. "He's actually better today than he was even [Monday], and he was pretty good yesterday. He's pretty agile. I was telling [owners] Roy and

Gretchen [Jackson] that he's done a couple of things that manifest his level of comfort. One of which is he was actually scratching his left ear with his left hind leg, which is his good leg. When I was in working with him this morning, he kind of waved at me with his left hind leg. He's feeling very good and he's walking very well in the limb and has absolutely normal vital signs today--his temperature, pulse, respiration, attitude, appetite." Correcting a statment from an early press conference, Richardson said that there are actually 27 screws--and not 23--in Barbaro's injured leg. Despite Barbaro's progress, Richardson reiterated that the Kentucky Derby winning colt has a long way to go before his recovery can be considered complete. "I've tried to emphasize before that bad things can happen at any time with horses who have had these kind of injuries," he said. "Good things take a long time to happen. It will be a few months before we know if we have this thing anywhere close to being healed. The single most important thing is that we are maintain his level of comfort on the fractured limb. If we can keep him comfortable on his right hind limb, that is the most important thing in a horse in terms of healing a catastrophic fracture. We obviously look at indications of infection, in terms of blood work, and any local heat pain or swelling."

The Jacksons Meet the Press...

The Jacksons also appeared at the press conference, making their first public statement since the Preakness. Roy Jackson began by thanking several individuals,

including jockey Edgar Prado, trainer Michael Matz, the Pimlico outsiders and the on-track veterinarians who first reached the injured horse. Jackson said Barbaro was insured for mortality and breeding purposes, but declined to reveal how much the policy was worth. "We've run through the gamut of emotions from the Kentucky Derby of euphoria to the devastation of the Preakness in our family," he said. "I think we've gone

through our own personal feelings. I think the sad part is in Barbaro's case that the American public won't get a chance to see him continue his racing career." It was also announced at the press conference that the Barbaro Fund has been launched. The proceeds from that fund will benefit the New Bolton Center. Prado Speaks Out...

Speaking publicly for the first time since last Saturday's Preakness, jockey Edgar Prado appeared on the MSNBC television program "Live and Direct" Monday evening. "I'm very devastated by this whole situation," the soft-spoken Panamanian said. "All weekend I was praying for Barbaro and hope that he'll make a speedy recovery." Prado indicated that he was "excited" to be aboard Barbaro and had every indication in the pre-race warm up that the colt was going to perform well. "He was feeling so great in the post parade—he was ready to run his race," he explained. "As soon as he heard a little noise before the start, he broke through the gate. Because he was feeling so good, he was ready to do his business." He added that he, like many other equine professionals, sees no correlation between the gate incident and the subsequent injury. "He was feeling so good in the post parade, he was jumping out of his skin and I was very comfortable with that," Prado explained. "He was ready to lunge the gate. When the last horse went into the gate, he heard a noise and thought it was time to go. I thought it was nothing major. I took my time and checked everything and saw that he was fine. I don't think this contributed to this horse's injury in this particular case." As for the injury itself, he stated, "It was like a bad dream. Unfortunately, that's part of racing and a bad part of racing. When the gates opened [for the start of the race], I guess he took a bad step. I heard something and I didn't take any chances. I pulled him up and tried to make sure he was OK." Prado's thoughts turned immediately to the horse. "Definitely I was thinking about the horse more than anything else. He wasn't really at full speed at the time. I tried to pull him up pretty straight and tried to relieve the pressure of my body on top of him. I jumped off the horse right away and tried to comfort him, but I think the damage was already done. Barbaro is a very athletic horse, a very smart horse. He realized that something was wrong and he didn't put up any resistance or any fight. He was in shock and so was I." Prado said that he is scheduled to travel to Chester County "Thursday or Friday" to pay a visit to the Kentucky Derby winner.

HURRICANE RIVALS ON THE RUN Michael Tabor's **Hurricane Run (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) was yesterday supplemented to Sunday's G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup at The Curragh, where he looks likely to meet a diminished field. Last year's G1 Irish Derby and G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe scorer will face a maximum of five rivals in the 1 5/16-mile contest, with Roldvale Ltd's **David Junior** (Pleasant Tap) only a possible at this stage. Trainer Brian Meehan has yet to commit the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic hero and ground conditions will determine his participation. "The best they're hoping for is yielding and that would put us off," he said yesterday. "He's a good, fast-ground horse, so we'll play it pretty cool with him, but this is one of the best opportunities to take on Hurricane Run." Jockey Jamie Spencer is booked to maintain his partnership with the four-year-old David Junior and he is also hoping for a drying week. "It will be interesting to see what Brian does between now and the weekend, but he wouldn't want extremes of ground," he added. "Very soft ground would blunt his speed." Trainer Jim Bolger has left in the multiple Group 1 winner **Alexander Goldrun (Ire)** (Gold Away {Ire}), but has stated a preference for Saturday's G2 Ridgewood Pearl S. at the track, while Aidan O'Brien might not be represented in the race, despite leaving in last year's G1 Breeders' Cup Turf runner-up **Ace (Ire)** (Danehill).

While the enduring memory of the 2006 Preakness S. will be of the cruel injury which struck Barbaro, the remarkable winning effort of Bernardini should not be overlooked. On only his fourth lifetime start, Bernardini produced a dominant display to score by 5¼ lengths from Kentucky Derby favorite Sweetnorthernsaint while recording a Beyer Speed figure which was higher than that achieved by Barbaro in the Derby.

Bernardini's victory corrected something of an anomaly in the stud career of his sire, A.P. Indy. The leading sire of classic-distance U.S. dirt runners over the last decade or so, A.P. Indy had never previously been represented by a winner of one of the Triple Crown events, his nearest efforts being seconds by Aptitude in the Kentucky Derby and Belmont S., and seconds by A P Valentine in the Preakness and Belmont S. A.P. Indy daughters have had a little more success in the classics, with Secret Status capturing the GI Kentucky Oaks and GI Mother Goose S., and Jilbab the GI CCA Oaks. Of course, the narrow focus of Triple Crown races aside, A.P. Indy's record is quite exceptional, a fact which is reflected in his \$300,000 stud fee.

To date he has 88 stakes winners from his first 10 crops, including Horse of the Year Mineshaft and champion two-year-old filly Tempera, and in addition to Bernardini and the two fillies mentioned above, his Grade I winners also include the aforementioned Aptitude and A P Valentine, Golden Missile, Symboli Indy, Tomisue's Delight, Stephen Got Even, Friends Lake, Passing Shot, Sweet Symphony, Runup the Colors, A. P. Adventure and Royal Indy. This year he is represented by graded stakes winners, A. P. Warrior and Teammate, both three, and Master Commander, who took the GIII William Donald Schaefer H. on the Preakness S. undercard.

One factor which comes to mind with regard to A.P. Indy and the classics is that, even though he was himself a juvenile Grade I winner, several of his best offspring have reached their peak either later in their three-year-old career or as older horses. In the case of Bernardini, however, a dose of early maturity is supplied by his dam, Cara Rafaela. A member of the first crop of Quiet American, Cara Rafaela was a juvenile standout, winning the GI Alcibiades S. and GI Hollywood Starlet S., and taking second in the GI Matron S. and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies.

Pedigree Perspectives cont.

Cara Rafaela failed to captured a black-type event at three, but continued to display excellent form, capturing seconds in the GI Ashland S., GI Santa Anita Oaks, GI Las Virgenes S. and GII Black-Eyed Susan S. (over the track where her son would earn classic glory 10 years later), and thirds in the GI Kentucky Oaks and GI Mothern Goose S. Sidelined after that race, Cara Rafaela was much less effective when she returned at four, although she did add a win the restricted Pico Pico S. at Fairplex Park. She had produced four foals prior to Bernardini, the best of which was her first offspring, the GI Santa Anita Oaks third Ile de France (Storm Cat).

Cara Rafaela was half-sister to another very talented performer in Abaginone. A son of Devil's Bag, Abaginone combined brilliant speed with glass-like legs. Indeed, such was his fragility that he faced the starter just 10 times in three years of racing. He won seven of those 10 starts, and put up some memorable displays, including in the GIII Los Angeles H., where he set breathtaking fractions, only to be caught late by that year's GI Breeders' Cup Sprint runner-up Paying Dues, who forced a dead-heat; and the GIII Portero Grande H., where recorded a 116 Beyer as he crossed the line six lengths clear of the runner-up, Grade I winner Dramatic Gold, with that year's champion sprinter Lit de Justice off the board. Abaginone retired to stand at stud inexpensively in New York and after a slow start had a big year in 2005 when he was represented by Grade I winner Acey Deucey and graded-stakes winner Uncle Cammie. However, this run came too late to rescue Abaginone's U.S. career, as he was sold to Mexico in 2003.

Oil Fable, the dam of Cara Rafaela and Abaginone, was only a minor winner, but owned an excellent pedigree, as she was by Spectacular Bid out of Northern Dancer's graded-stakes winning daughter Northern Fable. The next dam, Fairway Fable, a stakes-winning daughter of Never Bend, is granddam of English Group winner Majmu, and third dam of Muhtathir, a Group 1 winning miler in France, and Hook and Ladder, a dual graded-stakes winning sprinter by Dixieland Band, who is now at stud in New York.

It's an oft-stated fact that A.P. Indy's sire Seattle Slew and Mr. Prospector came from the same immediate female line (Seattle Slew's granddam being inbred to that family), and that the pair have frequently worked well together. This is particularly so for A.P. Indy, who has sired at least 28 stakes winners on the cross, including Bernardini, and other Grade I winners Sweet Symphony, A. P. Adventure, Jilbab, Tomisue's Delight and Mineshaft. What is interesting here, however, is that other than Capote, until the arrival of A.P. Indy, Seattle Slew and his sons had not flourished with mares descending from Mr. Prospector through Fappiano.

Other than those by Capote, or by an A.P. Indy line horse, there is only graded-stakes winner by a Seattle Slew line stallion out of Fappiano line mare). A.P. Indy, however has recently been flourishing with the Fappiano line. He has Grade I winner A. P. Adventure and Japanese stakes winner Aratama Indy out of Fappiano mares; and in his current three-year-old crop, Bernardini and GII San Felipe S. victor A. P. Warrior out of mares by Quiet American, and the GII Bonnie Miss S. victress, Teammate out of a mare by another Fappiano son, Rubiano.

Quiet American might particularly be playing into the La Troienne background in A.P. Indy's pedigree. Seattle Slew's dam has the sisters Striking and Busher 3x3, and A.P. Indy's second dam is by Buckpasser, who is out of Busanda, a three-parts sister to Striking and Busher (all three being by War Admiral out of daughters of La Troienne). Quiet American is inbred 3x2 to Dr. Fager, whose broodmare sire, Better Self, is by La Troienne's son, Bimelech, out of a War Admiral mare.

crop by Songandaprayer who cost \$200,000 at the 2004 Fasig July yearling sale, had already won the six-furlong GIII Hirsch Jacobs S. for three-year-old sprinters by 10 lengths, running a Beyer speed figure of 107. Interestingly, like Bernardini, Songster debuted at Gulfstream Park in January and, like Bernardini, was also making

his fourth lifetime start. Could be a trend here, an angle for trainer Albertrani, who was scoring at a 22-percent clip for the year before Saturday--bet anything he sends out that is making its fourth start, having made its first start at Gulfstream in January.

We'll never know whether Bernardini, who ran a sparkling Beyer 113 when easily disposing of surprise GI Kentucky Derby favorite Sweetnorthernstain, would have derailed Barbaro's Triple Crown bid had the Derby hero not broken down. In reality, the larger tragedy renders it a somewhat meaningless question.

Fair enough: Edgar Prado probably deserves the Eclipse Award this year for managing to pull Barbaro up in time to at least give him a chance to survive, and the fact that the focus this week has been more on Barbaro than Bernardini is actually great news for racing, because it shows how many people actually do care about the horses, that they are not just numbers, not just 'the six horse.' The *Blood-Horse* reported that their on-line site's record number for 'hits' was shattered Saturday night, and then again Sunday morning.

His breakdown was one of those horrible moments in American racing when a champion goes down: Andy Beyer likened it to Ruffian in the 1975 match race with Foolish Pleasure; I thought immediately of Go for Wand's awful breakdown in the 1990 Breeders' Cup. No matter where you watched the race, there was palpable distress in the air on Saturday, and Bernardini's win was almost a footnote. Connections weren't exactly hopping around high-fiving each other on the winner's stand; in fact, I thought John Ferguson did a great job in conveying the enthusiasm of the winner's camp as well as the anguish and concern of everybody who loves horse racing during the presentation. Racing was delivered another pulverizing body blow Saturday, so the concern for Barbaro at least provides us hardened professionals some welcome reassurance that the outside world actually does care a little bit.

Whatever might or might not have happened had Barbaro stood up, Bernardini was always travelling like a winner Saturday, and he did register a Beyer number of 113, two points higher than Barbaro's Derby-winning 'fig.' You want to say 'it would take an act of God' for Bernardini not to win the Belmont, considering his sire, A.P. Indy, won it on the way to becoming one of the top sires for North American racing, but after last weekend you wouldn't care to tempt fate like that. Let's just hope Bernardini gets the days in the sun the Preakness suggests he should, and that Barbaro survives.

Sheikh Mohammed's Godolphin operation may be in the doldrums over here in Europe--just about everybody is, considering the weather, except for Sir Michael Stoute. (Stoute has won with 36 percent of his starters this season, 43 percent this month, including four Oaks preps in the last two weeks.) But Tom Albertrani's Pimlico double was supplemented by a third Darley stakes win Saturday. This was registered by Changing Weather, a Storm Boot colt who had cost \$260,000 at OBS last March, and won Churchill Downs' six-furlong Matt Winn S. for trainer Eoin Harty. Ryan, you can chalk up a stakes win for this filly in her next start. Second to her was Beta, a half-sister to Bago by Selkirk, who is about as hot a sire this year as Michael Stoute is a trainer. That's pretty hot.

LADY HEADS 1000 CAST

Cheveley Park Stud's **Confidential Lady (GB)** (Singpiel {Ire}) yesterday headed the 22 remaining fillies for Sunday's G1 Irish 1000 Guineas at The Curragh. Connections have yet to confirm the G1 1000 Guineas runner-up for the Irish equivalent, with the ground being a determining factor. "She went nicely in a spin this morning," Cheveley Park Stud's Managing Director Chris Richardson told *PA Sport* yesterday. "We haven't made a decision yet whether she goes to Ireland on Sunday, or wait until later the week and go to Epsom. The ground will be a consideration and it will depend on how the filly is and how [trainer] Sir Mark [Prescott] feels the filly has come on since the Guineas. She may need the extra four or five days, in which case we will wait and the owners will see the list of entries for Ireland and we will start to make a plan." Malih L. al Basti's **Nasheej** (Swain {Ire}), who was third at Newmarket May 7, also featured among the entry, while Aidan O'Brien has left in five fillies, including Susan Magnier's G3 Leopardstown 1000 Guineas Trial S. winner **Queen Cleopatra (Ire)** (Kingmambo) and 1000 Guineas also-ran **Race for the Stars** (Fusaichi Pegasus). Other notables include Khalid Abdullah's impressive Listed Michael Seely Memorial S. winner **Short Dance** (Hennessy) and Jaber Abdullah's G2 Lowther S. heroine **Flashy Wings (GB)** (Zafonic), who was also down the field in the Newmarket version. Her trainer, Mick Channon, was another who expressed concern over the state of the ground at The Curragh yesterday. "I want to run her, but I don't think the ground is going to be any good," he told *PA Sport*. "They tell me it was barely raceable at the Curragh yesterday. At this stage I would have thought that it is very unlikely that she will run. But saying that, we are in there, we're prepared and we're ready to go, but she won't run if the ground is soft."
