#### NO BELMONT FOR BERNARDINI

Darley's impressive GI Preakness S. winner **Bernardini** (A.P. Indy) will not be aimed at the third leg of the Triple Crown, the GI Belmont S. June 10. "Bernardini has had three quick races in succession, and Sheikh

Mohammed [Darley head] feels that the colt deserves a break before his next target, which will be determined in due course," said Darley's Jimmy Bell after talking with the operation's bloodstock advisor, John Ferguson. "Given the fact that Bernardini only broke his maiden in March and won a

Grade I race in May, we feel that he climbed the ladder of competition quite quickly." According to Bell, the July 29 GII Jim Dandy S., Aug. 6 GI Haskell Invitational H., and Aug. 26 GI Travers S. are possible races for Bernardini, with the GI Breeders' Cup Classic being the ultimate goal.

#### **BLACK-EYED SUSAN MAY BE APPEALED**

ClassicStar has filed the initial paperwork to appeal the finish of last Friday's GII Black-Eyed Susan S. (video) at Pimlico. In the nine-furlong event, ClassicStar's Smart N Pretty (Elusive Quality) set the pace, then drifted out just a bit under jockey Noberto Arroyo, Jr. to bump Regal Engagement (Cat Thief) in the stretch before drawing off to hit the wire 3 1/2 lengths ahead of her rival. Stewards reversed the order of finish after ruling interference. "There was a 48-hour deadline to either file an appeal or not, so we decided to file the appeal," said Dale Holly, racing and sales manager at ClassicStar. "We're still in the preliminary stages, examining our position to see if we have a strong enough case to carry on." Holly added, "I thought both fillies ran a good race, but I thought our filly should have won." Holly said that ClassicStar principals would meet Friday to discuss the appeal. "We don't want to waste a lot of time or money unnecessarily if we feel like we don't have a chance to win it."

#### LOST IN THE FOG TARGETS CHURCHILL RACE

After considering putting last year's champion sprinter **Lost in the Fog** (Lost Soldier) on the grass in a stakes at Lone Star Park, trainer Greg Gilchrist has decided instead to run the colt in the six-furlong GIII

probably would have
gone down there [to
Texas], but this race
came up five days later,"
explained Gilchrist. "And
we actually have another

horse, a filly named Victorina, that we're going to send over for a stakes on the same card, and that gave her a little more time between races. It just looked like the best thing to do. Timing wise it's a little bit better." Victorina (Delaware Township), a two-time stakes winner, will start in the one-mile GIII Dogwood Breeders' Cup S. Gilchrist said that, with a good effort in the Aristides, Lost in the Fog would next compete in the July 15 GII Smile Sprint H. as part of the Calder's Summit of Speed program. In his seasonal debut, Lost in the Fog finished second at 2-5 odds in the Apr. 22 Golden Gate Fields Sprint S., an effort that didn't concern Gilchrist. "We wanted to win the race, of course, but my instructions to [jockey] Russell [Baze] was not to beat the horse up," Gilchrist said. "He was giving a lot of weight away, and we got beat by a very nice horse. Being Lost in the Fog, the majority of people expect him to win every time you go over there. He's coming off a 10 out of 11 season, and I've told people not to expect another 10 out of 11 season." Gilchrist maintains the same cautious tone when speaking of what most would assume is Lost in the Fog's ultimate destination, the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint at Churchill. "That's a long way up the road," said Gilchrist. "The thing about racing, it's like winning the World Series: what you did last year doesn't mean anything. It's a whole new year, and you have to go prove yourself all over again."

#### **HUMBLE PRADO TALKS ABOUT PREAKNESS**

By all accounts, Edgar Prado's quick response to **Barbaro** (Dynaformer)'s devastating injuries in the GI Preakness S. is one of the main reasons the colt still alive. But the soft-spoken jockey shies away from tak-

ing credit for his gallant efforts. "I think anybody could have done the same job," Prado said, before adding of the chaotic situation, "I reacted pretty quickly and I tried to hold him together. The horse did his job by not fighting with me. I stopped thinking about the race and the Triple Crown right away. The only thing I could think of was him. I wanted to pull him up and comfort him as

soon as I could. Each second felt like an hour." Prado said the hours and days following Barbaro's breakdown were especially tough. "Saturday was a nightmare," he said. "I was heartbroken Monday and Tuesday. I'm trying to bounce back and concentrate on my riding. I guess the busier I stay, the better it will be for me." Prado is quick to recognize the extraordinary care given to Barbaro at the New Bolton Clinic, where Dr. Dean Richardson performed extensive life-saving surgery on the colt Sunday. "It goes to show you that in America, everything is possible," said Prado. "The technology here is superior to so many other countries. You have a better chance to survive any kind of injury or illness here than you do anywhere else." It would figure that a jockey would have a special relationship with the horse that gave him his first Kentucky Derby win, and Prado's ties to Barbaro have clearly grown stronger in the last few days. "Of all the tears I have cried, if tears could heal a wound, Barbaro would be healed by now," he said. "I've been thinking about him and I've been crying on and off. I can't do any more."

We met Sunday morning and talked a little about it, and he said, 'Rick, sometimes people who have been together a long time need a break from each other. 

#### H.R. 4777 MARKUP ON LEGISLATIVE AGENDA

The House Judiciary Committee is scheduled to debate the Internet Gambling Prohibition Act (H.R. 4777) on Thursday, May 25 beginning at 10:00 a.m. (ET). The hearing can be viewed via Webcast.

H.R. 4777 contains language that recognizes the horse industry's authority to continue to conduct online pari-mutuel wagering as allowed under the Interstate Horseracing Act.

The NTRA lobbying team has met with members of the Judiciary Committee and other allies in Congress to ensure that this important protection is retained and the \$1.5 billion market for account and Internet wagering on horse racing is protected.
