With a back-up that includes last year's G3 Horris Hill S. hero **Hurricane Cat** (Storm Cat), the remainder have it to do to deny another Ballydoyle victory. Best of the other Irish may be Catherine O'Flynn's

Decado (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), who bids to provide conditioner Kevin Prendergast with his first renewal. The bay colt looked impressive in the soft here when winning the May 1 G3 Tetrarch S. As for the British contingent, Jeremy Nosedo will be seeking his first Classic win with **Araafa (Ire)** (Mull of Kintyre), who was staying on up the rising ground when fourth behind George Washington in the Newmarket Classic May 6. "I feel that he shouldn't be inconvenienced by the soft ground," Nosedo said. "Prior to the Newmarket Guineas, I was actually a little bit concerned about running him on quick ground. I've been happy with him since he ran. My hope is that a reproduction of his Newmarket performance should put him in the frame again." The going at The Curragh is currently described as soft, with drying conditions forecast.

BARBARO CONTINUES TO PROGRESS

Barbaro (Dynaformer) was reported yesterday in "excellent condition" by Dr. Dean Richardson as the colt continues his recovery from last Sunday's surgery to repair his right hind leg. According to a brief update posted on the University of Pennsylvania's Veterinary Medicine website, the Lael Stables homebred is "progressing nicely" with "totally normal vital signs." Barbaro remains in the intensive care unit at the Widener Hospital for Large Animals at New Bolton Center.

Lucky Strike had ruled the roost in these contests in recent years, but Soave dealt a major blow to the ego of the 2004 and 2005 hero with this convincing success. The German-bred chestnut had always been at the forefront of his country's sprinting scene, with his successes including the G3 Sprint Preis at Munich in 2002, the G3 Prix de Seine-et-Oise and Listed Prix Contessina at Maisons-Laffitte the following season and G3 Badener Sprint-Cup last term. As strong as ever this season, he took Hanover's Sprint-Cup Apr. 17 before finishing third behind Lucky Strike in the Listed Sprintpreis at Cologne last time May 1. Never far off the early fractions, he was committed at the top of the straight as his arch-rival was taken to the far rail. Soave took command with a quarter-mile remaining, quickly asserted and was comfortably clear as Donatello closed late.

WAVES ON THE DOWNS Jaber Abdullah's Listed Fielden S. winner **Atlantic Waves (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) enjoyed a spin around Epsom racecourse yesterday morning ahead of his tilt at the June 3 G1 Vodafone Derby. Trainer Mark Johnston was pleased with the colt following his exercise under big-race rider Joe Fanning. "I am delighted that we brought him here," he told *PA Sport*. "It is very, very soft, but he's gone fine on it. He just tried to jump the first track and looked at the second one, but by the time he got past that he was fine. It was a new experience for him and I am glad that we did it." The Middleham-based conditioner is expecting a bold show from the bay colt, who beat the subsequent G1 2000 Guineas third Olympian Odyssey (GB) in the Apr. 20 Fielden, but remains realistic. "I really don't know if he can win," he admitted. "He's not a ridiculous outsider--he is a live contender, but he is an inexperienced live contender and it's not usual for me to be making the jump from Listed race to Group 1. It'll be in the lap of the gods, but we'll find out next Saturday just how good he is." Epsom's Clerk of the Course Andrew Cooper announced that the official going was soft after heavy recent rain on the Downs. "Our aim is to produce good ground and I certainly wouldn't be ruling that out even with it being soft now," he said.

VITAL SPIN FOR PERCY Anthony Pakenham's **Sir Percy (GB)** (Mark of Esteem {Ire}) faces an all-important workout this weekend to determine whether he runs in next Saturday's G1 Epsom Derby. On the easy list since returning sore from his second in the G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket May 6, last year's G2 Vintage S. and G1 Dewhurst S. winner has come to hand in the last few days. "We seem to have got around the problem and got it right," trainer Marcus Tregoning explained. "We've lost a bit of time, but he's a very athletic and agile horse who keeps himself fit in everyday exercise, so hopefully it won't be too much of a problem. It will be a good bit of work and Martin [Dwyer] will ride him."

SKIRT GOES FOR OAKS Trainer Sir Michael Stoute has confirmed that John Greetham's **Short Skirt (GB)** (Diktat {GB}) will line up in next Friday's G1 Epsom Oaks. Following the homebred's defeat of Alexandrova (Ire) in last Wednesday's G3 Musidora S. at York, her connections had cast doubt on her participation in the mile-and-a-half Classic, but Stoute revealed that she would take her chance alongside His Highness the Aga Khan's Listed Pretty Polly S. winner **Riyalma (Ire)** (Selkirk). "At this stage we are going to run the Musidora winner Short Skirt with Michael Kinane on and we are going to run the Pretty Polly winner Riyalma with Christophe Soumillon on her," Stoute told *PA Sport* yesterday. Ballymacoll Stud's Listed Swettenham Stud Fillies' S. winner **Scottish Stage (Ire)** (Selkirk) may wait for the G1 Prix de Diane (French Oaks) at Chantilly June 11, he added. "With Scottish Stage, we are going to make a late decision--she is also in the Diane, which would give us another nine days. I think she has come on for her run and in fact she is starting to thrive now, but I would have to say that she is doubtful for Epsom at this stage."

WINSTON FOR BULL? Jockey Robert Winston has been linked with Susan Magnier, Derrick Smith and Michael Tabor's G3 Chester Vase winner **Papal Bull (GB)** (Montjeu {Ire}) after partnering the colt in a pre-Derby workout on Wednesday. Although trainer Sir Michael Stoute has yet to get the go-ahead from the owners to run in next Saturday's G1 Epsom Derby, he was hoping that the May 11 trial victor would be supplemented on Monday at a cost of £75,000. "I thought it was a good trial at Chester and he is doing well," he told *PA Sport* yesterday. Stoute also has Gainsborough Stud's G2 Dante S. runner-up **Best Alibi (Ire)** (King's Best), so Winston was not confirming the partnership yesterday. "Papal Bull is a lazy type of horse at home--that's just his character," the rider commented. "Kieren [Fallon] says 'You haven't seen the best of him yet,' but Michael Kinane is first choice in Group 1s, so I wouldn't say he'd be likely to be my ride yet. Just to have a ride in that race would be an invaluable experience for me." Stoute stated that Best Alibi would not run if the ground was soft.

RACING WINS IN WASHINGTON The Internet Gambling Prohibition Act was approved yesterday after numerous amendments were defeated which would have canceled the horse racing exemption, tightened the regulations on account wagering or allowed dog racing and jai-alai to have a similar exemption. "This is huge for the racing industry," Greg Avioli, executive president of the National Thoroughbred Racing Association, told *Blood-Horse*. Avioli, who also serves as chief Washington lobbyist for the organization, added, "Today, this bill as reported to the House floor has specific language that preserves our industry's ability to conduct account wagering." H.R. bill 4777, introduced by Senator Bob Goodlatte (R-VA), was approved in a bipartisan vote of 25-11.
