Aidan O'Brien is committed to running Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith's Newmarket 2000 Guineas hero regardless of the deep ground, and the near two minutes it will take to run the mile Classic will answer some serious questions. "He's in very good form," his conditioner commented. "The ground could be very soft, so it will be far from ideal, but most of this year our ground has been soft here and it won't be the first time for him. Hopefully he'll be okay." George Washington, history is certainly on his side as four out of the five colts to have attempted the English-Irish 2000 Guineas double since 1987 have succeeded. There is no doubting his class, which was demonstrated with juvenile victories in the G1 Phoenix S. and G1 National S. and his scintillating 2 1/2-length defeat of Sir Percy (GB) on his sophomore bow in the May 6 Newmarket Classic. "He has natural speed and a great rhythm and stride," O'Brien explained. "He's just a very good horse and has all the things you need. He's very exciting in his work all the time and does everything effortlessly."

IRISH 1000 DRAWS 15

Tomorrow's G1 Irish 1000 Guineas at The Curragh promises to be one of the most open in recent years after 15 fillies were declared yesterday. Aidan O'Brien accounts for a third of the line-up, with Kieren Fallon opting to ride Susan Magnier's **Race for the Stars** (Fusaichi Pegasus), a 3/4-sister to Hawk Wing, who is coming off an eighth in the G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket May 7. Cheveley Park Stud's **Confidential Lady (GB)** (Singspiel {Ire}) and Malih L al Basti's **Nasheej** (Swain {Ire}) represent the form of the May 7 Newmarket Guineas, as they bid to improve on their second and third, respectively. **Cont. p3**

FILM MAKER STAYING HOME

Courtlandt Farm's **Film Maker** (Dynaformer) will miss her intended engagement in Monday's GI Gamely Breeders' Cup S. at Hollywood Park after popping a quarter crack. The six-year-old mare had been scheduled to fly from her Maryland base yesterday. The timing may be bad, but she is not expected to be out too long, according to trainer H. Graham Motion. "It's better that it happened here rather than in California," he told *Daily Racing Form*. "She could breeze next week." The bay mare, third in the 2005 GI Breeders' Cup F/M Turf, has not raced since taking the GII La Prevoyante H. at Calder Dec. 17.

SURGERY FOR BALANCE

Balance (Thunder Gulch), who began her sophomore season with victories in the GI Las Virgenes S. and the GI Santa Anita Oaks, is scheduled to undergo surgery today to have a bone chip removed from an ankle, reports *Daily Racing Form*. Trainer David Hofmans said the \$260,000 KEESep yearling purchase will need 90 days of rest and will be out until late fall. Balance has disappointed in her last two starts, finishing a well-beaten third as the 1-2 chalk in the GI Ashland S. Apr. 8 and 11th in the GI Kentucky Oaks May 5.

On "Dec"...

If the rain exposes a chink in the armor of George Washington, Catherine O'Flynn's **Decado (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) appears best placed to expose it, as he has proven winning form in these conditions. His Apr. 9 Listed Loughbrown S. and May 1 G3 Tetrarch S. wins suggest there is more to come, and trainer Kevin Prendergast was hopeful yesterday. "We've had an awful lot of rain, which is all good news, as he has gone on the ground twice and hopefully tomorrow will be no different," he said. "He just takes a furlong or so to get going, but he finishes well. I think he'll have no problem getting the mile...He seems to be very well in himself and we can't have him much better."

Outside Chance...

Trainers Jim Bolger and John Oxx, who have yet to win this Classic, saddle outsiders **Heliostatic (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) and **Caribbean (GB)** (Sadler's Wells), respectively. The former has been disappointing recently and has to bounce back from a tame eighth in the G2 Derrinstown Stud Derby Trial over 10 furlongs at Leopardstown May 14. "He's very well, but I have some worries about the ground," Bolger said. Oxx, on the other hand, is hopeful that Caribbean, who was fourth in that contest, will appreciate the conditions. "He has a bit to find to figure, but he's a nice horse who is better than his performance the last day," he commented. "The drop back to a mile will suit and he's won on soft before."

Bolstering the strong British challenge is Khalid Abdullah's **Short Dance**. The bay filly, a 12-length winner in last Friday's Listed Michael Seely Memorial Fillies' S. at York, represents Barry Hills, who saddled Nicer (Ire) to win this in 1993 and Hula Angel to follow up six years later. "I don't think we should get carried away about how far she won at York," the owner's Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe told *PA Sport* yesterday. "She did win very nicely, but you do tend to get exaggerated distances in those extreme conditions. She is very well, she has been doing everything right at home and we hope she has a good chance. She looks like she can handle that type of going, which is obviously going to be an advantage." Jim Bolger has yet to win this Classic, but in June Judd's **Abigail Pett** he has a live chance of burying that hoodoo. One of her country's leading juvenile fillies of 2005, she opened her stakes account in the Listed Silver Flash S. at Leopardstown in July before besting Aussie Rules in the G3 Round Tower S. at this track in September. Returning here in early October to split **Ugo Fire** and **Kamarinskaya** in the G3 C L Weld Park S., she finished third behind Speciosa (Ire) in the G2 Rockfel S. at Newmarket a fortnight later before signing off with a second to Frost Giant in the G3 Killavullan S. at Leopardstown later that month.

Apprentice Julien Leparoux, who has been winning everything in sight in Kentucky, makes the trip to Big Sandy to pilot **Asi Siempre**. The gray was a good second in the GI Garden City Breeders' Cup S. while making her U.S. bow Sept. 10 and closed out the season with a victory in Keeneland's GIII Valley View S. Oct. 21. The Martin Schwartz colorbearer kicked off her four-year-old campaign with a runner-up effort after rearing at the

start in the GII Jenny Wiley S. Apr. 15. "I thought she ran very well in her last start after rearing up at the gate," trainer Patrick Biancone commented. "She's a four-year-old filly and it may take her a couple of races to get her best. The distance will not be a problem for her." Likely favorite **Honey Ryder** figures tough in this spot, winning four of her last five, including Woodbine's GI E.P. Taylor S. Oct. 23 and Gulfstream's GIII Orchid H. last out Apr. 1. She has won three out of four at this distance, but is winless from five attempts over the Belmont lawn.

This race has luminaries Soviet Song (Ire) and Airwave (GB) on its brief honor roll, but this year's renewal appears weak after a clutch of scratches, including Alexander Goldrun (Ire), who is bound for tomorrow's G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup. **Jazz Princess** loves The Curragh and deep ground and she gets both here on her finest opportunity for major laurels. She had her ideal conditions when winning the G3 C L Weld Park S. at two, but her sophomore campaign was largely disappointing due to off-the-board efforts in the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas in May and the Listed Fairy Bridge S. at Tipperary in August. Sidelined after that race, she came back to win the May 1 G3 Athasi S. here on her four-year-old return. The dark bay filly may have most to fear from **Royal Alchemist**, who maintained her consistency in some fiercely contested races last term.

Second in the G3 Fred Darling S. at Newbury last April and fifth in the G1 Coronation S. at Royal Ascot at York in June, she rounded off with a second to Portrayal in the Listed Severals S. at Newmarket in October and a third the following month in the Listed Gillies' S. at Doncaster. She gained a deserved first stakes success at the expense of Violet Park (GB) in the Listed Snowdrop S. on Kempton's polytrack Apr. 15, then was second to that rival in the G3 Dahlia S. on testing ground at Newmarket last time May 7. Fairy Bridge S. winner **Fairy of the Night** came back after her winter break to be fifth in the May 14 Amethyst S. at Leopardstown and should improve in her second start of the season.

STEINBRENNER CAMP DENIES INTEREST IN NEW YORK RACING FRANCHISE A spokesperson for George Steinbrenner, the majority owner of the New York Yankees and prominent Thoroughbred owner, is denying a published report that Steinbrenner is interested in bidding for the franchise to operate the three major racetracks in New York State. But, according to a story in the "Page Six" section of Thursday's New York Post, Steinbrenner is part of a group that also includes Magna Entertainment Chairman Frank Stronach; Bill Mulrow, a Democrat from Westchester County who once ran for state comptroller; Scott Reed, a one-time campaign manager for Bob Dole; and former Donald Trump associate and developer Richard Fields. "Page Six" reports that a major Baltimore gaming company is also part of the group. Mulrow is reportedly a key cog, as he has ties to current New York State Attorney General Elliot Spitzer, a candidate for the state's governorship this November. "There's no truth to it. You have no story," Howard Rubenstein, a spokesperson for Steinbrenner, told the New York Post. The franchise, currently held by the New York Racing Association, expires Dec. 31, 2007.

CHRB Mandates Synthetic Surfaces:

The California Horse Racing Board has announced its final approval of a regulatory amendment requiring the installation of synthetic surfaces at major Thoroughbred tracks in the state by the end of 2007. The rule states that, effective Jan. 1, 2008, "No racing association that operates four weeks of continuous Thoroughbred racing in a calendar year shall be licensed to conduct a horse racing meeting at a facility that has not installed a polymer synthetic type racing surface." The tracks affected by this mandate are Bay Meadows, Del Mar, Golden Gate Fields, Hollywood Park and Santa Anita Park. CHRB Chairman Richard B. Shapiro said that the installation of synthetic surfaces could alleviate race-horse deaths and severe injuries, as evidence at the recently completed meeting at Turfway Park, which installed Polytrack in 2005. "While it is not just racing surfaces causing the problem, it is certainly a contributing factor," he said. "I think it is clear, given Turfway Park's experience, that California needs to move forward and continue our progress." The Board looked over presentations by representatives of four different polymer-based surfaces: Polytrack, Tapeta, Cushion Surface and StaLok. All four include a mixture of fibers and sand coated with wax, which is installed over a vertical drainage system. It is not yet known which surface will be selected by the individual racetracks. Ron Charles, president of Santa Anita and Golden Gate, said it was his understanding "there is very little difference" to the four surfaces being discussed, and there should be consistency even if different racing associations choose different products.
