Aragorn (Ire) (Giant's Causeway) inhaled pacesetting Willow O Wisp (Misnomer) turning for home and pulled clear to a 1 3/4-length triumph in yesterday's GI Shoemaker Breeders' Cup Mile at Hollywood Park. The Ballygallon Stud homebred won the GII Oak Tree Derby in his second U.S. start last October and returned five months later to miss by just a head in the Mar. 4 GI Frank Kilroe Mile H. before finishing second again in the Apr. 29 GII San Francisco Breeders' Cup Mile H. last time out. The strapping chestnut tugged jockey Corey Nakatani along in the early going, eager to press Willow O Wisp through fractions of :24.61, :47.88 and 1:10.73. He came out of the turn in front and easily held sway over Charmo (Fr) (Charnwood Forest {Ire}) and Silent Name (Jpn) (Sunday Silence). "He's just a tremendous horse," said Nakatani. "He's always laid his body down every time you ask him to go out on the racetrack, and that's really all you can ask. It just feels great to be back riding him." Cont. p3

"The biggest difference in him now is that he used to be a 'head case.' He was scratched at the gate twice," trainer Dan Hurtak said. "It's been a team effort to get him where he is now. "He's a horse I think highly of, so he's an option and it'll be a tough decision," the rider commented. "I was impressed with him at Chester--if I'd gone a furlong earlier, he'd have put distance between himself and his rivals and he'd be a leading fancy." Aidan O'Brien left in five, including G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere winner Horatio Nelson (Ire) (Danehill). His Highness the Aga Khan's G2 Prix Greffulhe victor Visindar (GB) (Sinndar {Ire}) remains on course, and his trainer Andre Fabre also has Sean Mulryan's G3 Lingfield Derby Trial winner Linda's Lad (GB) (Sadler's Wells), who will bid to end Frankie Dettori's drought in the race. Marcus Tregoning has confirmed Anthony Pakenham's G1 2000 Guineas runner-up Sir Percy (GB) (Mark of Esteem {Ire}) for the mile-and-a-half Classic, while other notables are Championship Point (GB) (Lomitas {GB}) and 2000 Guineas third Olympian Odyssey (GB) (Sadler's Wells).

By the end of this week, British journalists will be desperately trying to arrive at a valuation for the latest colt to earn the historic title of "Derby winner." Chances are, though, that they will struggle to come up with the type of estimate which used to produce a sharp intake of breath at the sheer vastness of the valuation.

Times have changed (as illustrated by the reduction in the distance of the French Derby) and breeders--especially those in the commercial sector--have become increasingly hesitant about using mile-and-a-half Classic winners. To win their support, a modern-day Derby winner needs to have also shown excellent two-year-old form or enough speed to have shone over distances short of a mile and a half. Even a first-rate pedigree won't automatically help, if it represents stamina rather than speed.

Although it would be very wrong to suggest that winning the Derby was always an instant ticket to stallion success, victory at Epsom during the 1960s and '70s helped propel the likes of Sea-Bird, Sir Ivor, Nijinsky, Mill Reef, Roberto, The Minstrel and Shirley Heights to rewarding stallion careers. Since then, though--with the possible exception of Nashwan--you would struggle to describe any of the Epsom heroes as an unqualified success, with the picture being considerably clouded by a number of premature deaths, quick sales to Japan and even a kidnapping. The last century closed with Derby victories by Erhaab, Lammtarra, Shaamit, Benny The Dip, High-Rise and Oath, leaving the race desperately in need of a shot in the arm, from a bloodstock perspective. Although the 2003 winner Kris Kin is already being marketed as "the ultimate dual purpose prospect," there are encouraging signs that some of the other recent winners are capable of stopping the rot. Sinndar, an admirable winner in 2000, sired Shawanda (Irish Oaks and Prix Vermeille) in his first crop and this year's hot Derby favourite Visindar in his second. Next in line came Sadler's Wells's Derby winning sons Galileo and High Chaparral, both of whom cemented their solid reputations with other major successes before joining their sire at Coolmore.

Galileo's first runners reached the track last year and I was sufficiently in awe of this horse's first-rate combi-



nation of impressive talent, conformation and bloodlines that I nominated him in these pages to end 2005 as the year's leading first-crop sire. As things turned out, I should have placed more emphasis on the fact that Galileo had raced only once at two, when he created a highly favourable impression in winning an end-of-season

maiden race on heavy ground. I was hoping that the presence of Miswaki as his broodmare sire might help him sire progeny more precocious than himself, but I was probably allowing my heart to rule my head.

Unfortunately Galileo proved no match for the speedsters Mozart and Bertolini, and he finished a remote seventh on the Anglo-Irish list of leading first-crop sires, with 10 winners from 41 runners, from a crop of 127 foals. Juddmonte's filly Innocent Air was his only stakes winner and only two others managed to earn black type. *Cont. p9*

So was Galileo going to provide ammunition for the critics who habitually snipe at Sadler's Wells's record as a sire of sires, despite the success of such as Montjeu, El Prado, In the Wings and the Japanese-based Opera House? (Incidentally, Opera House's son Meisho Samson recently added the Japanese Derby to his earlier success in the Japanese 2000 Guineas, raising hopes that he could develop into another champion for the sire of Horse of the Year T.M. Opera O.)

Although Galileo wasn't hitting the headlines with his two-year-olds, there were encouraging signs that people still had plenty of faith in him. For example, yearling colts from his second crop sold for 800,000gns and \in 950,000, and his son Fire and Rain was talked of as a Classic contender after his debut win at Newmarket. I'm delighted to say that this faith in Galileo wasn't misplaced.

He is rapidly moving up the list of stallions which covered their first mares in 2002. Indeed, he now figures as high as fourth among the stallions on the general sires' list in Britain and Ireland, thanks to a sequence of fine recent performances by his three-year-olds. Red Rocks shaped like a colt with a very bright future when he won Saturday's Fairway S. at Newmarket, where another son, Lake Poet, won a valuable handicap. Then Galileo's lightly raced daughter Nightime handled the heavy conditions far better than the others as she swept to an easy victory in the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas.

This victory made Nightime the second group winner by Galileo, as another daughter, Galatee, had maintained her unbeaten record in the G3 Blue Wind S. earlier in May--with Galatee winning in a style which suggests she will be a major force in the Irish Oaks. Galileo also had a runner in the Irish 2000 Guineas, in which his son Heliostatic finished a respectable sixth. He has also been well represented by Rockmaster (third in the G1 Derby Italiano), Guilia (a head second in a Listed Oaks trial), Purple Moon, The Last Drop, Galiant and High Command.

In view of Sadler's Wells' stock's reputation for preferring give in the ground, people are sure to jump to the conclusion that Galileo's progeny also benefit from the type of very soft ground which has been widespread in Europe this year. Galileo himself handled heavy conditions very well, but he possessed a magnificent action which adapted equally well to firm ground on Derby Day and to good-to-firm going on King George day. There's therefore no reason why the Galileo tribe shouldn't continue to impress when the ground firms up. It is worth adding at this point that Galileo's first crop runners in Australia--where the ground is usually fast--have also shaped encouragingly.

Although it is too soon to make any sweeping statements about Galileo, it looks as though he might benefit from mares with comparatively speedy backgrounds. Galatee's broodmare sire is Mountain Cat, a Storm Cat colt who won six of his eight starts at two, and Nightime's first two dams, Caumshinaun and Ridge Pool, were both by winners of the five-furlong King's Stand S. Her third dam, Casting Couch, was also by a leading sprinter in Thatching, but that didn't stop Caumshinaun staying a mile, as she showed by winning a Listed race on her final appearance.

Nightime's breeder, Mrs C.L. Weld, must be doing something right, as the filly follows Grey Swallow as the second Classic winner she has bred in recent years, from only a handful of mares. Nightime's fifth dam, Drury Nell, was a half-sister to Moment of Truth, America's broodmare of the year in 1972. Drury Nell's finest effort was Nightime's fourth dam, the speedy Sir Ivor filly Drama who won the G3 Greenlands S. Drama went on to produce a pair of notable broodmares in the Grade III winner Tycoon's Drama and the Listed-placed Last Drama, with Last Drama in turn producing the high-class turf performer King's Drama. Coincidentally, King's Drama was also sired by a major mile-and-a-half winner by Sadler's Wells, his sire being King's Theatre. As King's Drama stays a mile and a half, Nightime has every chance of staying a mile and a quarter.


