ELEVEN FACE STARTER IN OAKS

A field of 11 will line up for tomorrow's G1 Vodafone Oaks at Epsom, with Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor & Derrick Smith's Alexandrova (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) holding onto favoritism in an open renewal. Bidding to provide Ballydoyle with its third renewal since 1998, she has to reverse placings with John Greetham's Short Skirt (GB) (Diktat {GB}), who bested her in York's G3 Musidora S. last time May 17. Jockey Kieren Fallon thinks there is more to come. "She looked great the other morning--the way Aidan's usually do when they've had a run," he said. "She was knocked over at the start of the Musidora and had the stuffing knocked out of her and then I went too soon on her. She did nothing wrong and if she improves on that, she's the one they have to beat." Alexandrova has already proven herself at the highest level, when second in the G1 Fillies' Mile at Newmarket in September, but it is her maiden success at the Tralee's August festival that convinces Fallon that she has the right material for this test. "I can't see why she wouldn't handle Epsom," he added. "She went around Tralee as a maiden, which is quite a tricky, sharp track and she travels well." Sir Michael Stoute carried out the most notable withdrawal at yesterday's stage when scratching Ballymacoll Stud's Scottish Stage (Ire) (Selkirk), leaving him twohanded in the Classic with John Greetham's Short Skirt and His Highness the Aga Khan's Listed Pretty Polly S. winner Riyalma (Ire) (Selkirk). Trainer Pam Sly, son Michael and Dr Tom Davies will be at the center of attention tomorrow after deciding to supplement their G1 English 1000 Guineas winner Speciosa (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}). For her conditioner, the guestion is one of stamina as she prepares the mile Classic heroine to tackle the extra four panels. "She just might stay, but if she doesn't there are other races she can go for," Sly commented. "I went there for the first time on Thursday and I was amazed at how steep the first two furlongs are and they're climbing for the first half mile, but then it levels off and goes downhill. I think she'll handle the track, because she's a very well-balanced filly and we hope she can finish in the first four."



Fair Hill Training Center to Install All Weather Surface: Fair Hill Training Center in Elkton, Maryland, announced that a new all-weather track will be installed, replacing the facility's woodchip training surface. The Tapeta surface, introduced six years ago to trainer Michael Dickinson's farm in North East, Maryland, is scheduled to be installed at Fair Hill later this summer. "Over the years our wood chip track has served us well as an "alternative" training surface, however, it is seasonal," said Sally Goswell, Fair Hill Training Center manager. "Training is difficult even during the mildest winters; track conditions are impacted directly by the weather making it extremely costly to keep the dirt track open and virtually impossible to have a consistent surface on a daily basis. Explaining the decision to add an all weather surface to the Fair Hill program, Goswell added, "We have been watching with growing interest the advent of all weather surfaces in this country. They are not affected by adverse weather conditions and do not freeze in the winter, thus providing uniform track conditions every day. Having done due diligence, we are confident that Tapeta is the best synthetic surface available to meet our needs from both a safety perspective and maintenance perspective."

I-Gaming Debate to Continue in June

The House of Representatives is expected to take up two I-gaming bills, the Internet Gambling Prohition Act (H.R. 4777), sponsored by Rep. Bob Goodlatte (R-VA), and the Unlawful Internet Gambling Enforcement Act (H.R. 4411), sponsored by Rep. Jim Leach (R-IA). It is not known which will be the "base bill" for the House debate, which is expected to begin in mid-June. Each bill contains a provision recognizing horse racing's authority to conduct online pari-mutuel wagering under the Interstate Horseracing Act. The bills are likely to be melded by the Rules Committee or House Leadership.
