PLETCHER TAKES CLASSIC AIM

Todd Pletcher has won numerous training titles and has secured Eclipse Awards as the nation's top conditioner the past two years, but he has yet to saddle a winner of a Triple Crown race. That could change Saturday, when he sends out the two favorites on the



morning line for the \$1-million GI Belmont S., Bluegrass Cat (Storm Cat) (3-1) and Sunriver (Saint Ballado) (4-1). Sunriver, who will break from post two with Rafael Bejarano in the irons, is coming off a rallying win in the GII Peter Pan S. May 20. "I thought it was a perfect prep for the Belmont," Bluegrass Cat Horsephotos said Pletcher. "He's a horse that has steadily improved every day

that we've had him. Around the barn, we were talking about him being our sleeper in January, February and March." Bluegrass Cat has been away since his runnerup finish to Barbaro in the GI Kentucky Derby May 6, and attempts to become the fourth colt in the last six years to win the 12-furlong Classic after skipping

the GI Preakness S. The bay has Pletcher's main man John Velazguez aboard and has drawn the nine hole. That Velazquez is able to take the mount on Bluegrass Cat is significant. It originally was thought that the Puerto Rican, injured in a spill Apr. 20, would be on the sidelines until late summer. But fans of Velazquez had to wait just six weeks to see him return to the saddle. Last Friday, he won a Belmont allowance race in his first start back. The horse's trainer? Todd Pletcher. "He's recovered quicker than we could have hoped for," said Pletcher. "We weren't sure when it first happened whether he would be back for Saratoga, even. So he's healed really quickly, and he's come back and ridden well a couple of times already in the past week." Velazguez, who like Pletcher has never won a Classic race, has been aboard Bluegrass Cat in six of the colt's eight races, including his win in the GIII Nashua S. over the Belmont strip last October. During the last 50 years of the 20th century, not a single horse went straight from a loss in the Kentucky Derby to a win in the Belmont Stakes without at least one race in between. However, three of the six Belmont winners since the turn of the century have used just that strategy. They are:

High Finance Schools at Belmont...

After taking a few questions from emcee Tom Durkin at vesterday's draw breakfast at Belmont Park, trainer Rick Violette, Jr. rushed out of the Garden Terrace restaurant and down to the track's paddock to oversee the schooling of High Finance (Talk Is Money), who will break from post five in the Belmont. If all goes well Saturday for the colt, who comes off an impressive one-mile allowance win at Belmont May 4, Violette may be rushing to the winner's circle, instead. "He's really starting to mature physically into an exceptional threeyear-old," the conditioner said. Violette added that the chestnut's versatility is a major advantage when it comes to drawing up tactics for the Belmont. "I'm not going to ask [jockey] Eibar Coa to throw him down not to be on the lead," said Violette. "Handicapping the race, we're probably the quickest, and if that comes to us easily and unpressured, we'll be glad to take it. But we don't have to be there, either."

Closers to be Closer?

Steppenwolfer (Aptitude) and Jazil (Seeking the Gold) have earned reputations as deep closers, and the style has paid dividends for both. Steppenwolfer got up for third in the GI Kentucky Derby, while Jazil, a comefrom-the-clouds second in the GI Wood Memorial S., rallied to be a dead-heat fourth in the Derby. With no confirmed speedballs in the Belmont and at a marathon 12 furlongs, expect them to be closer to the pace than normal, say their trainers. "I'm not expecting him to be that far back in the race, going a mile and a half," said Danny Peitz, Steppenwolfer's conditioner. "I don't see him more than five lengths back early. The distance of the Belmont separates a lot of these horses, and I don't think we'll have a problem with that." Jazil's trainer, Kiaran McLaughlin, had similar sentiments. "I don't see him being as far back as he was in the Wood or in the Derby," he said. "It looks like there should be an honest pace, and that can only help us."

Like many older sprinters, Yomalo's career took off without warning, and she has barely stopped improving since her second in the Listed Cathedral S. at Salisbury last June. Fourth in the valuable and highly competitive Ayr Gold Cup H. in September, she had been kept busy on the all-weather through the winter and finished sixth after a break in the Listed Lansdown S. back on turf at Bath last time May 2. The chestnut settled in third early, challenged wide in the straight and overhauled the game long-time leader Noelani in the final 50 yards. "She loves fast ground and has improved a lot in the last two years," trainer Rae Guest explained. "She's just changed and got stronger with maturity, and will probably creep into the Wokingham H. ECLIPSE OPTION FOR PERCY Anthony

Pakenham's G1 Epsom Derby winner Sir Percy (GB) (Mark of Esteem {Ire}) may sidestep the Irish equivalent in favor of a tilt at the G1 Eclipse S. at Sandown July 8. Trainer Marcus Tregoning is looking at the 10-furlong contest for last Saturday's Blue Riband hero, who was initially thought certain to be headed to The Curragh for the July 2 G1 Irish Derby after his short-head success. "He stayed a mile and a half really well, but I want him to have the chance to show his speed," Tregoning said yesterday. "He showed plenty of speed as a two-yearold and won the G1 Dewhurst S., but it would be nice to see if he can win a top-class mile-and-a-quarter race, so I want to monitor it. Having said that, he would take on his own age group in Ireland and will be much more solid and stronger in the autumn, when it is much easier to take on the older horses." The Lambourn conditioner believes there is more to come from the colt, who had troubled preparations before finishing runner-up in the May 6 G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket and the Epsom Classic. He is drawing on his time working for Dick Hern, who prepared Nashwan to win the G1 2000 Guineas, G1 Epsom Derby, G1 Eclipse S. and G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S., before flopping in his prep for the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. "His preparation for the Guineas was not straightforward, as he wrenched a joint and it held him up and he won the Derby off two pieces of work," Tregoning continued. "He's still physically and mentally immature and if we rush his next race, it could be his undoing, so it is fairly crucial to what happens in the autumn. We cannot expect him to go spring, summer and autumn, and if he is to run in the [Oct. 1] Arc, he will need a lengthy summer break before one prep race. It was incredible what Dick Hern did with Nashwan, but he had gone over the top by the autumn, and we don't want to go to the well too often."

At 9:00, he came out of another barn and saw the stallion barn engulfed with flames. They didn't have a chance." An investigation into the cause of the fire is underway. Eleven-year-old Favorite Trick began his stallion career at John T.L. Jones Jr.'s Walmac International near Lexington and later stood at John Sykes' Cloverleaf Farms II in Florida, Twenty-fouryear-old Saratoga Six started out at Franklin Groves' North Ridge Farm near Lexington, then later stood at Walmac. CONTESSA RUNNERS CONTINUE TO IMPRESS

After posting another strong winter at the Big A, the Gary Contessa barn continues to roll along this spring at Belmont Park. **Mayan King** (Stephen Got Even), **Magnolia Jackson** (Cape Canaveral) and **No Sleep** (Robyn Dancer) all ran career best efforts recently and appear headed for bigger and better things.

David Cassidy, Edward Lipton and Our Canterbury Stables' Mayan King opened his account last season with two straight tallies before finishing seventh in the

mud behind Flower Alley in the GII Lane's End S. He exited the Lane's End with a fractured sesamoid bone in his hind ankle. "It was a very tricky surgery," Contessa commented. "We sent him to Cornell and it took a year to heal. He came back 100 percent, knock on wood. It's like he never left. It's one of those sur-

geries that the prognosis isn't good. He has healed amazingly and he wound up coming back great. It's something that we don't even worry about anymore, but at the time, it was somewhere between career ending and maybe he'll make it back in a year."

After spending more than a year on the shelf, the \$210,000 OBSMAR two-year-old purchase finally resurfaced with a smart win in the Aqueduct slop on the Wood Memorial undercard Apr. 8. "I knew he was ready to win," Contessa added. "If it wasn't a muddy track, I'd be in a new tax bracket today." Mayan King followed that effort with a good second behind Rathor (Ire) in a \$75,000 optional claimer at Belmont May 4, then reported home a game 3 3/4-length wire-to-wire winner over Noble Causeway in a \$100,000 optional May 28 (Video).

The chestnut will start next in either the nine-furlong GII Prairie Meadows Cornhusker BC H. or the 10-furlong GI Suburban H. Both races will be run July 1. "My first choice is to go the Cornhusker," he continued. "It's 1 1/8 miles, two turns and I think that's the natural next distance for him. The Suburban isn't out of the question, it's going to be either or." Mayan King will be pointed for the GI Whitney H. at Saratoga Aug. 5 if he continues to impress his conditioner.

"I've said from day one, my ultimate goal is the Whitney," the 48-year-old commented. "He is going to let me know in the next race or two if he's as good as I think he is. So far, so good."

Magnolia Jackson enjoyed a profitable winter over the Aqueduct inner track reeling off three straight deci-

sions, including the Correction H. Feb. 4 and the Broadway H. against New York breds Mar. 12. The Ted Taylor colorbearer placed a valiant second in her final attempt over that surface in the Mar. 25 GII Distaff Breeders' Cup H. and proved that she was more than an inner track specialist in her latest victory over the

Aqueduct main in the GII Bed o' Roses Breeders' Cup H. Apr. 22 (<u>Video</u>). That latter race marked the return of champion Smuggler, who finished a non-threatening fifth.

The Empire bred is slated to race next in Sunday's GII Vagrancy H. at Belmont. "With that mare, she seems to get better with more time between races," the Long Island native said. "It's not easy to find graded stakes races for her. She deserves the time off. I love that she's going to run once every four or six weeks. I'm happy with that. That's her destiny. She's training off the charts and is doing really well. No question, she's ready to go."

Looking a little further down the road Contessa added, "There's a nice sprint graded stakes at Saratoga and there's also a New York-bred stakes race at Saratoga and the bottom line is, I want to win at Saratoga. So don't be surprised if you see her in a New York bred-stakes race at the Spa."

If Contessa decides to run Mayan King in the Cornhusker, he will be accompanied to lowa by No Sleep, who will try her luck in the lowa Distaff Breeders' Cup that same day. Owned by Maggi Moss, the four-year-old filly handed GISW Sis City a 7 1/2-length defeat in Monmouth Park's May 28 Fort Monmouth S. Contessa claimed the gray for \$25,000 last October. "It looks like a great spot for her," Contessa said of the lowa Distaff. "She's a better horse going two turns and is just a real sound filly. You don't make claims like her too often. It's a beautiful thing when you do."
