#### A DEPUTY IN MORE WAYS THAN ONE

Five weeks ago, jockey Edgar Prado piloted Barbaro to a scintillating victory in the GI Kentucky Derby and

thought he might have a potential Triple Crown winner on his hands. In an instant, that dream was dashed in the GI Preakness S. two weeks later when the Dynaformer colt sustained a career-ending injury. The lightly raced Bernardini, trained by Tom Albertrani, took the Preakness in fine style, but his connections opted to skip the final leg of the Triple Crown. As unlikely as it may have seemed a month ago, Prado and Albertrani will team up for another chance at Classic success in today's \$1-mil-

lion GI Belmont S. when Joseph LaCombe's homebred Deputy Glitters (Deputy Commander) steps into the starting gate. The bay defeated Bluegrass Cat (Storm Cat) in the GIII Tampa Bay Derby in March and, following a sixth over a sloppy track in the GI Wood Memorial, managed to finish eighth in the Kentucky Derby after racing 11 wide. "He ran well considering we were farther back than we thought we'd be," Albertrani said. "It goes to show you how important saving ground is because we were making our move the same time Jazil (Seeking the Gold) was. He saved all the ground and we went wide. He finished fourth and we finished eighth." Prado has twice won the Belmont, stopping the Triple Crown bids of War Emblem (2002) and Smarty Jones (2004) with Sarava and Birdstone, respectively. While Albertrani can't help but be thrilled to have a rider with that sort of experience aboard Deputy Glitters, he admitted to having mixed emotions. "Unfortunately, with Barbaro getting hurt, we were lucky enough to get him for this horse," Albertrani commented. That said, Albertrani feels he's saddling a live longshot. "I just feel he's in a race where [Deputy Glitters] should be competitive," he told Daily Racing Form. "On his best, I feel he'll run a good race against this field. Distance-wise, I feel he'll go a mile and a half, where hopefully the other ones can't get that trip." Cont. p2

"He was the only one making up any ground in the stretch," said Team Valor's Barry Irwin. "And he galloped out

past the winner." He will be first-time Lasix today.

#### Magic Carpet Ride...

Robert and Lawana Low's **Steppenwolfer** (Aptitude) surprised a few people with his third in the Kentucky Derby, but he won't be 16-1 this time. He's the son of a Belmont runner-up, and his trainer Dan Peitz is optimistic the stretch-running grey is sitting on a big race. "With the winner, a lot of it is going to be pedigree and it's also gonna be who's doing the best," Peitz said. "It's who has done the best since the Derby and who's done the best in the grind to get here. I feel I've got a horse that is in great shape

# Prix de Diane Hermes

#### 16 HUNTING FOR DIANE GLORY

Overseas raiders have not fared well recently in the G1 Prix de Diane Hermes at Chantilly, with the shock scorer Sil Sila (Ire) the last to take it from the home team 10 years ago. Cheveley Park Stud's Confidential Lady (GB) (Singspiel {Ire}), the sole British challenger in tomorrow's renewal, needs to rebound from a disappointing effort when sixth in the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas at The Curragh May 28. That subpar run came only three weeks after a draining sophomore debut, a runner-up effort behind Speciosa (Ire) in the G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket, and she deserves another chance to establish her credentials in the top league. "She seems very well," trainer Sir Mark Prescott told PA Sport. "I am quite surprised, as I thought she had a hard race in the Guineas and in Ireland, but she seems fine and, mathematically, she has got an excellent chance, as long as these hardish races haven't blunted her a bit. I feel she will be better over a bit further and this is 2 1/2 furlongs further, but it does look a very competitive race this year. She is fully entitled to be there and I am hopeful she will run well--she doesn't mind the fast ground and I think she will get the trip." Trainer Aidan O'Brien relies on Susan Magnier's Irish 1000 Guineas third Queen Cleopatra (Ire) (Kingmambo), who had previously taken Leopardstown's G3 Derrinstown Stud 1000 Guineas Trial May 14 and bids to become the first winner for Ballydoyle. Andre Fabre, who has captured four renewals, saddles Haras de la Perelle's G3 Prix Cleopatre winner Alloway (GB) (Rahy), who had His Highness The Aga Khan's Sanaya (Ire) (Barathea {Ire}) a length back in second in that Saint-Cloud trial May 1. Sanaya, who was also a half-length runner-up to Germance (Silver Hawk) in the G1 Prix Saint-Alary at Longchamp May 21, is one of a duo from the powerful axis of her owner-breeder and Alain de Royer-Dupre, successful four times between 1993 and 1999. The other is the May 14 G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches fourth Daltaya (Fr) (Anabaa), who annexed the Apr. 23 G3 Prix de la Grotte before the Longchamp Classic. She bids to become the first filly since Carling (Fr) in 1995 to place in the mile Classic before succeeding here.

The 2005 Manhattan was a thriller, with Good Reward getting a vintage Jerry Bailey ride and sneaking up the rail to deny Relaxed Gesture and Artie Schiller at the wire. Can this year's edition match up? It will be a tough task for those top-two finishers, since they will face several talented new faces. English Channel, the nation's best three-year-old turfer in 2005, has displayed his acceleration in winning both of his starts this year, including the GI Woodford Reserve Turf Classic at Churchill on the Kentucky Derby undercard. The chestnut handled yielding ground well last year, and while trainer Todd Pletcher is happy to stretch him out, he was cautious about his expectations. "What concerns me more than anything is it shapes up as kind of a paceless race," Pletcher said. "I don't want to be on the lead. He's got a good turn of foot. He showed he could get a mile and a half in the Turf Classic (second by a head] last fall, although I think a mile and a quarter might be his best distance." Grey Swallow, hero of the 2004 G1 Irish Derby and conqueror of Bago (Fr) in the 2005 G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup, ran third to Relaxed Gesture over yielding going in the GI Canadian International Oct. 23. The grey showed he hadn't lost a step in his seasonal bow, romping by five lengths in the GII Jim Murray Memorial May 13 at Hollywood. As for the consistent Relaxed Gesture, he had a forgettable opener this year, fading to 12th in the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic Mar. 25. "In Dubai he was very fresh, very rank and I wish I could have given him a race before, but I couldn't," trainer Christophe Clement explained. "He came back from Dubai in very good order and I had wanted to give him a long break, but I couldn't...because he was doing so well." The ground, at least, isn't a concern for the French-born conditioner. "This horse runs well on any ground, but compared to some of the other horses in the race his form is better on the soft," Clement added.

furlongs, not a mile and a sixteenth. The smashing effort established a new course record for Hollywood's lawn, and convinced trainer Doug O'Neill to leave his veteran on the surface for another race before a planned run in the July 8 GI Hollywood Gold Cup. Lava Man's Khaled

was preceded by a victory in the Mar. 4 GI Santa Anita H. and before that a romp in the \$1-million Sunshine Millions Classic Jan. 28. A Grade I win on the grass here would be an impressive addition to a resume that includes his 2005 wins in the Gold Cup and GII Californian S. Standing in his way is a talented group of turfers, including **Red Fort**, runner-up in this event last year. The six-year-old went missing for over 10 months off that one, and finished a solid fourth to Willow O Wisp in the 8 1/2-furlong GIII Inglewood H. Apr. 29 in his comeback. He will appreciate the added ground here. **King's Drama** comes off a popular win in the Mar. 25 GII San Luis Rey H., which pushed his earnings past the million-dollar mark.

Adieu, winner of the GI Frizette S. and the GII Spinaway S. last year, has her work cut out for her if she is to add another Grade I trophy to her case. Miraculous Miss may not best speed figures in the field, but who can argue with a filly who is five-for-six lifetime with three graded stakes victories? Following the blip in her record--a fifth in the slop in the GIII Old Hat S. at Gulfstream Feb. 4--the chestnut recovered to post rallying wins in the GII Stonerside Forward Gal S. at Gulfstream Mar. 5 and the GII Comely S. at Aqueduct Apr. 15. The latter was at a one-turn mile, and Miraculous Miss should get plenty of pace to run at here. Teammate trumped Wonder Lady Anne L by six lengths in the GII Bonnie Miss S. Mar. 5 at Gulfstream, but missed some time with a bruised foot and hasn't been out since. "It took a long time to heal," trainer Allen Jerkens told Daily Racing Form. "It didn't come out like it usually does. Hopefully she's ready. She worked good the other day. I think she might be better going longer. Eventually I think her best races will be around two turns. But a mile around one turn, most good horses can do it. It's long enough. And it's a Grade I." Bushfire wired the field in the GI Ashland S. at Keeneland Apr. 8. She showed she could rate in the GI Kentucky Oaks May 5, crossing the line third before being relegated to sixth for lugging in. The up-andcoming Ermine, who blossomed at Oaklawn, ran second in the Kentucky Oaks and has a versatile style. Another filly worth a long look is Hello Liberty, who proved very game in winning the seven-furlong GII Nassau County BC S. May 6 over this surface.

Prix de la Foret last year and completed the trifecta in the Jenny

Wiley. They will all have to catch **Pommes Frites**, who has wired the field in three consecutive starts, including the GIII Beaugay H. at Aqueduct Apr. 29 in her most recent outing. **Ozone Bere** landed the GIII Gallorette H. at Pimlico May 20 in her stateside bow. **Bright Abundance**, perfect in three starts over this course, including the GIII Noble Damsel H. Sept. 24, comes here following a troubled third in Calder's Hollywood Wildcat Breeders' Cup H. Apr. 29.

The gray colt is coming off a resounding nine-length win over Songster in a sloppy renewal of the Apr. 8 GIII Bay Shore S. "He's been training great," said Baffert. "He used to run off

in his races, but he's matured and [jockey Garrett Gomez] has really gotten this horse to relax. He's a fast son of a gun." Songster, meanwhile, rebounded from his Bay Shore defeat to win the May 20 GIII Hirsch Jacobs S. by 10 lengths. His trainer, Tom Albertrani, is eager for a rematch on what he hopes is a 'fast' track. "He didn't like the track [in the Bay Shore]," Albertrani said. "The first thing [jockey Edgar Prado] said was that he didn't handle the track that day. He looks like he's doing well and we'll hope for the best." Keyed Entry looks to get back on track after a disastrous last-place run in the GI Kentucky Derby. The colt was dazzling when he broke the track record defeating First Samurai in Gulfstream's 7 1/2-furlong GII Hutcheson S. in February and clearly has the tools to be a top sprinter. Likely romped by nine lengths in the Lafayette S. at Keeneland Apr. 9 and comes armed with a :46 4/5 four-furlong bullet at Turfway Park June 6.

of better sprinters on the East Coast. "Most people would have run him for a ham sandwich when he wasn't doing any good," trainer Jimmy Jerkens commented. "His owners really stood by him and deserve a lot of credit. I didn't know if he'd make it back. He had the EPM

so bad I didn't know if he'd ever get over it. He responded to the treatment, went down to Florida and started training real good." In his first start off a sixmonth absence, Tiger broke Gulfstream's six-panel track record winning an allowance in February. Two starts later, he earned a 109 BRIS figure winning an Aqueduct allowance Apr. 13, then easily annexed Belmont's GIII Bold Ruler H. by 3 1/2 lengths May 13. "The way he's going lately, he just loves those glib racetracks," said Jerkens. "He's been bouncing right over them and does things so easy." Jerkens also has entered the Moores' old war horse **Voodoo**, who makes his eight-year-old debut following a runner-up finish in last November's Fall Highweight H.

# Thoro-Graph Race of the Week

#### 1 Platinum Couple Tale of the Cat

Has now established tops three different times, and was set back by them each time. This is not exactly a healthy forward-moving pattern and, since he isn't close to fast enough and is by a sire of early developers, he's tough to like.

#### 2 Sunriver Saint Ballado 4-1

Established a two-year-old top slightly slower than that of Steppenwolfer, but has gotten a lot better this year. Because he failed to draw into the Derby, he had seven weeks rest into the Peter Pan, where he ran a new top. A repeat of that effort would make him very strong in the Belmont, and Pletcher's horses are running lights out. But there are also some negatives here, which can be seen by way of comparison to Steppenwolfer--he's already developed nine points to the other colt's six, and is coming off a new top, not one that he has already shown he can handle, like Steppenwolfer. Since he also had extra rest into his last and much less now following a big effort, this colt is a contender, but less likely to fire than some of the others.

#### 3 Hemingway's Key Notebook 15-1

Ran well in his second lifetime start, but has struggled since, finally getting back to that level in his last. It's not a good sign that it took so long, but at some point soon this colt should move forward, and Zito horses that have been stabled at Saratoga sometimes show sudden improvement. Still, he needs to improve quite a bit.

#### 4 Bob and John Seeking the Gold 5-1

Moved forward at two to establish a pair of solid tops by the end of the year, and developed further in healthy gradual fashion earlier this year. He finally made the jump to a big figure in the slop in the Wood, and that effort caused this colt's first bounce in the Derby, which may have been exacerbated by trouble in a roughly run race. Healthy spring three-year-olds usually run their top or a new one at least every other race, and this guy has now had five weeks rest, and nine weeks since the big effort. A new top is not that likely following the jump and high bounce, but running back to his previous top is likely, and would make him extremely competitive. Any rain would work in his favor.

#### 5 High Finance Talk Is Money 12-1

Didn't start at all last year, but this year has worked himself down to a level that makes him borderline competitive here. That amount of development in such a short time is likely to set him back, and he's never been past a mile or around two turns, making him highly questionable at this distance under the best of circumstances. Horses that have an iffy pattern are more likely to bounce if conditions are not favorable, and we're inclined to take a negative view of this one.

#### 6 Oh So Awesome Awesome Again 20-1

Didn't run well on grass in France, which fits the sire profile of Awesome Again, whose progeny has been much faster on dirt. His first dirt try after coming here was better, but still leaves him well short of competitive. It is worth noting this horse has not raced on Lasix yet, and could move up with the addition of the diuretic.

#### 7 Deputy Glitters <u>Deputy Commander</u> 15-1

Established about the same level as a juvenile as Bob and John, though he doesn't show the nice pattern of development late in the year. He jumped to a good one when beating Bluegrass Cat because of weight concession in his third start of this campaign, then, not surprisingly, bounced in slop he had already shown he didn't like. His Derby effort was much better than it looked--he was wide on both turns (5w6w), which cost him many lengths. Overall this pattern is forward moving, and the timing looks good for a return to his top, and possibly for a new top, especially since the barn is going very well. Albertrani in general is underrated--he has a positive ROI overall, which is unusual. This colt is a contender at a price, and value--but rain would hurt.

#### 8 Jazil Seeking the Gold 10-1

Wasn't too speedy last year, but jumped way up with the rest of the McLaughlin string this winter in Florida. He hasn't moved forward since, which is typical of the barn, whose runners tend to run well off layoffs and early in campaigns, and stay at about that level without much development or regression. This horse will take a little money as his last two look better than they werehe managed inside trips in both while others like Deputy Glitters were losing ground on the turns, but is at best a borderline contender.

#### 9 Bluegrass Cat Storm Cat 3-1

Established a very strong two-year-old top last year, much better than anyone else in here ran. He moved forward a couple of points in his second start this year before running a stinker over the Keeneland surface that so many hated, then immediately snapped back to his top in the Derby. Lots of plusses here: with only two points of development from his juvenile top, there is no reason that last should set him back, especially on five weeks rest. He goes into this as one of the fastest horses, and Pletcher is even more on fire than usual. Strong contender, probably the most likely to run well.

#### 10 Double Galore Grand Slam

Ran once, slowly, last year, and has inched forward in his four starts this year. With each forward move another becomes less likely and the chances of a bounce increase, and this guy would need an unlikely five-point jump to have a chance of having any impact here.

#### 11 Steppenwolfer Aptitude 9-2

Established a moderate juvenile top, but has developed since then in a healthy manner, with incremental forward moves and without ever bouncing. He's now put in his top four times in a row, which usually indicates a horse is capable of better in the relatively near future, and with five weeks rest it could be now. His top is a little slower than that of others coming in, but this guy's a contender.

#### 12 Sacred Light Holy Bull 15-1

Showed moderate ability last year, and moved forward to a decent figure in his third start this year, but it looked much better than it really was because he got a rail trip, and was getting seven pounds from Brother Derek. He had a big excuse in the Santa Anita Derby, and then quickly got back to his best in an allowance race last time. This horse is poised for a new top soon, but he has at last three points to make up to get seriously involved in this, which is almost eight lengths at this distance. And there's no reason to expect that kind of jump.

Bottom Line: There are five primary contenders for this year's Belmont S .-- Bluegrass Cat, Bob and John, Deputy Glitters, Steppenwolfer and Sunriver. Of those, Sunriver, who will be heavily bet, is one of the strongest in the race if he runs his best, but also is the most likely of the contenders not to run his race. If he bounces, he has a good chance to bounce out of the exotics altogether, so one way to play the race is to box all combinations of the other four horses. Another would be simply to bet Deputy Glitters to win, since he will be much longer than the other contenders, and protect by playing him underneath the others in the exotics. But the situation changes if there is an off track, and there is rain in the forecast. Deputy Glitters' two slop races were awful, while Bob and John ran his best in it. Bluegrass Cat and Steppenwolfer have never run on off tracks, but both have siblings that were at their best over them. It would take quite a bit of rain for the Belmont surface to get sloppy or muddy, but if that happens, the ones to use are Bluegrass Cat, Bob and John and Steppenwolfer.

#### MM WEANLING SALE CONTINUES STRONGLY

A colt by Encosta de Lago (Aus) realized a final bid of A\$300,000 to top Friday's second session of the Magic Millions National Weanling Sale on the Gold Coast. Consigned to the sale by Reavill Farm, the bay was hammered down to Magic Millions, acting as agent. An Aug. 27 foal, the colt is a son of Citirecruit (Aus) (Citidancer), a Listed stakes winner and runner-up in the 1999 G1 Queensland Oaks. He hails from the female family of King of Danes (Aus), a domestic Group 1 winner in Hong Kong. Redoute's Choice (Aus), responsible for the top four lots during Thursday's opening round of bidding, was represented by yesterday's second highest-priced horse. Hip 972, consigned to the sale by Wadham Park, agent, was knocked down for A\$265,000 to the bid of Magic Millions, agent. The bay was produced by Pure Bright (Aus) (Star Watch {Aus}), a half-sister to Group 3 winner Simply Believe (Aus). At the midway point of the weanling sale, 327 horses have been sold for A\$12,148,800, nearly 21 percent ahead of the corresponding figure from 2005. The average of \$A37,152 represents a 46.4-percent improvement over last year while the clearance rate has dipped to 81 percent from 91 percent.
