uled to be contested Sept. 4. The track is preparing to install slot machines. "After reviewing all of our options, for the safety and comfort of our patrons, we simply felt the most prudent thing to do would be to cancel the race," said Hal Handel, the track's chief executive officer. "With the facility extremely limited

because of all of the construction, we felt that we could not comfortably handle the kind of crowds that we expect here on Labor Day. While we all are disappointed that racing fans here will be denied the state's biggest race, we are very excited about the prospects for 2007 when we plan to bring back the Pennsylvania Derby bigger and better than ever."

STEPHEN FOSTER TOPS SUPER SATURDAY

Churchill Downs will host six graded races on its Super Saturday card, headlined by the GI Stephen Foster H. The co-highweights at 121 pounds for the \$750,000 event are **Buzzards Bay** (Marco Bay), a multi-

ple graded stakes winner this year; and Grade I winner **Brass Hat** (Prized), who will be making his first start since a controversial secondplace finish in the G1 Dubai World Cup Mar. 25. It's another trip East for Buzzards Bay, who annexed the GII Oaklawn H. last out Apr. 8. "To me, it's probably one of the top three or four most prestigious races in the country throughout the year," trainer Ron Ellis said. "That was factored into our decision. He's training

AN TADH MAKES ALL IN BALLYCORUS

Yesterday's G3 Ballycorus S. at Leopardstown promised to be a tactical affair, with just four horses signed on, but jockey Johnny Murtagh tore up the script, committing An Tadh (Ire) (Halling) from the outset before going on to win comfortably. The bay had shown the same willingness from the front when taking a conditions race at Naas nine days previously and adopted the same unforgiving stance this time, drawing away from odds-on favorite Misu Bond (Ire) (Danehill Dancer (Ire) in early stretch before comfortably holding Lord Admiral (El Prado {Ire}) in the closing stages. An Tadh captured a nursery at Galway last July before finishing third behind Art Museum in the Listed Blenheim S. at The Curragh in September. He had looked out of his depth back at that venue this term when he finished off the board behind Decado (Ire) in the Apr. 9 Listed Loughbrown S. and May 1 G3 Tetrarch S., but has turned the corner. His trainer Ger Lyons is set to look at his options now. "We'll look at the program book, but he's a straightforward, tough horse and is improving all the time," Lyons said. A daughter of Bold Promise (Aus) (Luskin Star {Aus}), the top filly on the 1990-91 Australasian Two-Year-Old Classification, the bay was sold in foal to More Than Ready. Santry indicated that his client was likely to send the mare to Encosta de Lago (Aus) for the 2006 breeding season. The Widden offerings included the Listed winner Taken (Aus) (Gilded Time), who was knocked down to E Thoroughbred's Tony Bott for A\$680,000. "She is a great mare," he offered. "I hoped to be able to buy her for between A\$500,000 and A\$600,000, but the market is very strong." Bott said the mare, sold not-in-foal, was purchased for an overseas client. The five-year-old was produced by Isle of Pines (GB) (Kris {GB}), a half-sister to Catchascatchcan (GB), the dam of Antonius Pius. Session three of the broodmare sale kicks off this morning at 11 a.m.

SOVIET SONG HEADED TO WINDSOR FOREST?

The venerable Soviet Song (Ire) (Marju {Ire}), slated to make her fourth consecutive appearance at Royal Ascot, will likely contest Wednesday's G2 Windsor Forest S. in lieu of the G1 Queen Anne S. on Tuesday's opening day, according to Racing Post. "We are looking more at the Windsor Forest at this stage," Matthew Budden, manager for Elite Racing, told Racing Post. "[Trainer] James [Fanshawe] is favouring going for the easier option before, hopefully, bringing her back up to the Group 1s again. She worked this morning and James is happy enough with her." The bay was second to Russian Rhythm in the 2003 G1 Coronation S. and second by a neck to Refuse to Bend (Ire) in the 2004 Queen Anne before running third to Peeress (GB) in last year's Windsor Forest. Following her Royal run, the sixyear-old will attempt a three-peat in the G1 Falmouth S. at Newmarket.

VAGUE COMEBACK J. Paul Reddam's Vague (Elusive Quality), sidelined by a stress fracture following a dominant win in the Listed UAE 1000 Guineas Feb. 16, is slated to return to action in next Friday's G1 Coronation S. Trainer Jeremy Noseda did caution that the chestnut might not be quite ready for the one-mile contest. "She would want fast ground back on turf and is likely to get it, and I feel she is definitely worth her place in the line-up for the Coronation S.," Noseda told Racing Post, "but I would have preferred another couple of weeks with her."

AUSSIES SET TO INVADE ASCOT Buoyed by the overseas successes of countrymate Choisir (Aus) and Cape of Good Hope (GB) at the Royal meeting, a trio of sprinters representing Australia are likely to start in both next Tuesday's G2 King's Stand S. and the G1 Golden Jubilee S. June 24. Favored among the trio is Takeover Target (Aus) (Celtic Swing {GB}), winner this season of the G1 Lightning S. and the G1 Newmarket H. Trained by Joe Janiak, a former taxi driver who operates a small operation outside of Canberra, the sixyear-old received a 5-1 quote for Tuesday's five-furlong event. Janiak is expecting a Choisir-like performance from Takeover Target. "Touch wood, things are working out real good for the horse and he looks good. I reckon he'll be about spot-on next week," Janiak told Racing Post. "He doesn't do a lot of fast work, although I will give him another proper gallop before the weekend." Takeover Target, purchased at auction for just A\$1,300, will be ridden at Royal Ascot by 22-year-old jockey Jay Ford. Glamour Puss (NZ) (Tale of the Cat) defeated Takeover Target in last October's G1 Salinger S., covering six furlongs in 1:08.93. However, the fiveyear-old mare is available at 10-1 with several bookmakers. The third member of the group is Falkirk (NZ) (Tale of the Cat), who got the better of Glamour Puss in the G3 Gilgai S. Oct. 1, but the Lee Freedman trainee is the longest price of the bunch at 25-1.



Maryland Racing Dates Set for 2006-07:

The Maryland Jockey Club and Maryland Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association reached an agreement concerning racing dates through the 2007 season. Approved by the Maryland Racing Commission, the remainder of the 2006 season will include an eight-day mini-meeting at Laurel Park from Aug. 16-25, with twilight racing (3:30 p.m. post time) Wednesday through Friday. "Racing is August was very important to the horsemen for the overall program," said Wayne Wright, executive secretary for the MTHA. "It took some time, but there was a mutual cooperation between the two parties." Added Wright, "Lou Raffetto [President and COO of the Maryland Jockey Club] went above and beyond to find the middle ground and we thank him for that on a local level. Horsemen rely on live racing and reaching the schedule is a positive and well received by our committee, chaired by Dale Capuano. We resolved the issue over expense contribution and collectively look to improve the business." The commission also approved the stakes schedule for the upcoming fall meeting, which begins at Laurel Sept. 4. The 73-day stand is headlined by the 21st Maryland Million (Oct. 14) and the Fall Festival of Racing (Nov. 25), which features the GI Frank J. De Francis Memorial Dash.

Irgun Dies in Illinois:

Grade I winner Irgun (Sunny's Halo--Late From Lunch, by Secretariat) died May 23 from a stomach rupture at Three Way Horse Farm near Nashville, Illinois, according to The Blood-Horse. The 15-year-old stallion, who had been standing at the farm since 2003, was listed at a fee of \$1,250. "He was a nice horse," farm manager John Kottkamp told the publication. "It is just a horrible way for a horse to go. When that happens it is pretty tough." The chestnut kicked off his career with wins in three of his first four starts in 1994, taking the GII Gotham S. at Aqueduct before defeating Go for Gin in the GI Wood Memorial S. He was sidelined thereafter with a abscessed foot while Go for Gin went on to land the GI Kentucky Derby, and made just one subsequent outing at four, finishing fifth in an allowance at Santa Anita. Irgun began his career at Walmac International in Kentucky, with Grade II winner Irguns Angel topping his five stakes winners from six crops of racing age. TRIBUTES PAID TO HAUGHEY Irish racing and bloodstock has responded to the death on Tuesday of former Irish President Charles Haughey, who played a major part in revolutionising the domestic breeding scene. Following his death in Dublin after a long battle with cancer at the age of 80, the political giant and renowned industry figure, who introduced tax exemption for stallion owners in 1968, was the subject of tributes from Irish racing's leading forces. "We would like to express our condolences to the family and friends of Charles Haughey on their sad loss," John Magnier, who served as one of Haughey's personal nominees on the Irish Senate, commented. "It is widely recognised that the transformation of Irish bloodstock breeding from a cottage industry in 1969 to a world-class one today can be largely attributed to his far-sightedness and strategic thinking." Haughey, whose colors were carried to success by Flashing Steel (GB) in the Irish Grand National in 1995, was closely allied with Captain Tim Rogers of Airlie Stud and owned Abbeville Stud, which became the widely recognised Abbeville and Meadow Court Studs under the care of his daughter Eimear in 1989. He had also been an honorary member of the Irish Turf Club since 1991, but it was his exploits as Minister of Finance which will endure. "The introduction of a tax exemption on stallion fees enabled Ireland to build on its natural attributes and to stand the best stallions rather than exporting them, benefitting the rural economy and associated businesses," Magnier added. "Through its introduction, Charles Haughey created something out of nothing, and at no cost. His legacy to Ireland will be fully appreciated by future generations and history will be kind to this man." Horse Racing Ireland's Chief Executive Brian Kavanagh was of the same opinion. "Throughout his career Charlie Haughey could only be described as a true friend of Irish racing," he said. "His innovative approach to the breeding industry through the introduction of progressive tax policies has stood the test of time and has been the cornerstone of the recent worldwide success of Irish racing and breeding. Our deepest sympathies are extended to the entire Haughey family, including of course Eimear Mulhern, chairman of Goffs Bloodstock Sales." There will be a state funeral held on Friday in Dublin, with the Requiem Massat at Our Lady of Consolation Church, in Donnycarney.

Regarding the spacing of the Triple Crown races:

As another year has come and gone without a Triple Crown winner, much discussion has been sparked about whether the spacing of the races needs to be altered. Such suggestions are widely argued against, as many say that changing the series would cheapen one of the most difficult achievements in all of sports. This assertion is based largely on the assumption that the spacing of the Triple Crown has always been the same and that all of its winners have gone through the same test. We want the horses of today to be measured against the greatness of Secretariat and Citation. However, this commonly held view that the series has remained unchanged from its inception is incorrect. In fact, only three horses have won the Triple Crown in its current format: Secretariat, Seattle Slew and Affirmed. All the other Triple Crown winners had varying schedules during the series. For instance, when Omaha won the Triple Crown in 1935, the Derby and Preakness were a week apart and there was four weeks from the Preakness to the Belmont. Omaha was even defeated in the Withers S. two weeks after the Preakness, before going on to win the Belmont. In 1948, Citation won the Derby, followed by the Preakness a week later. With a four-week gap to the Belmont, trainer Jimmy Jones ran Citation in the Jersey Derby as a prep for the Belmont. Imagine that. History shows that the spacing of the races has changed over the years, so perhaps it is worth further discussion to consider changing the series again. If the Triple Crown races were four or five weeks apart it could actually make the series stronger. Lengthening the time between races could make the Triple Crown even more difficult to win, as the winning horse would have to defeat large, quality fields of equally rested horses three straight times. It would be a supreme test of quality, rather than the battle of attrition it has become. It would be a win-win situation for the fans, the trainers, the owners, and the bettors.
