



MEEKER PRESIDES OVER FINAL SHAREHOLD-ERS' MEETING

As the search for his successor continues, Churchill Downs Inc. president and chief executive officer Tom Meeker presided over his 22nd and final shareholders' meeting Thursday, painting a positive picture of the racetrack operating company's future while also accepting plaudits from fellow directors and company employees. "Over the next several months there will be dramatic changes in this company under the leadership of a new person," Meeker said as he opened the meeting. As the CDI executive search committee continues its work in choosing his successor, Meeker said he would like to see a new president and CEO who is a "proven leader with a sense of risk-taking who also understands technology and new products it will create." Meeker reiterated observations he has made in recent months that the horse industry needs to change the business model under which it operates by obtaining more revenues from simulcasting ventures. He also cited CDI's expansion into European wagering markets, in conjunction with Magna Entertainment, as a positive move that will fuel industry growth. Richard Duchossois, CDI's largest shareholder, would not provide specifics of the search for Meeker's successor because he is not on the search committee. But he said he believed the company is on the right course to position itself for future growth. Click for entire story.

TRF Horses Head Home to Breeders:

Under a new Thoroughbred Retirement Fund initiative to include breeders in the care and expenditures of caring for retired racehorses, two ex-campaigners are set to return to their birthplaces. "We know that there are many conscientious breeders out there who care about the horses they brought into the world and would never want anything bad to happen to them," explained TRF Executive Director Diana Pikulski. "Sometimes horses slip through the cracks and their breeders or original owners never know what happened to them. In many cases, they wind up with us. We want to give people the chance to take these horses back and care for them, just as they did when they were babies on their farms." Still in the initial stages of the program, the TRF has already received positive responses from breeders Marlene Brody of Gallagher's Stud and Arthur and Staci Hancock of Stone Farm. Aristan, a 15-yearold gelding, was bred by Brody and her late husband Jerry. He came to the TRF after finishing seventh in a \$5,000 claimer at Penn National in 1999. "I think all breeders should be willing to take back a horse that they bred who needs a home, if they have a farm," Brody said. "Or everyone should pay money into a fund to care for unwanted racehorses." The Stone Farm-bred Selznick, a nine-year-old son of Harlan, will also be returned to his birthplace. "Because of the on-going efforts of the TRF, we are bringing Selznick back to Stone Farm," said Staci Hancock. "I haven't seen him since he was sold as a yearling in 1998, but I remember him as a beautiful colt. I plan to turn him out with some other geldings who have found their way back to Stone Farm. I am looking to find them second careers."


