SEEK AND YE SHALL FIND Seek Gold started out his career for owner Robert LaPenta and trainer Nick Zito, but, after a promising two-year-old campaign, had a forgettable sophomore season in 2003, when he failed to menace in four outings. The bay showed improvement as a four-year-old, when he captured allowance contests at Belmont and Saratoga, then ran a distant fourth to Ghostzapper and Saint Liam in the GI Woodward S. in September, and closed out 2004 with his aforementioned Clark effort on Thanksgiving weekend. After failing to land a blow in three stakes races to start 2005, Seek Gold ran second in a \$100,000 optional claimer over this surface Nov. 24 and ended the year with a second to stablemate Andromeda's Hero in the GIII Fred W. Hooper H. at Calder Dec. 17. He caught a sloppy track when seventh to Brass Hat (Prized) in the GI Donn H. Feb. 4 to kick off his latest campaign and, following a runner-up effort in Tampa's Budweiser Challenger H. Mar. 11, ran fifth in his return to Churchill in the Alysheba S. May 5, his final outing for Zito. Acquired by Ted Bowman and partners from LaPenta as part of a nine-horse package, the six-yearold gelding was looking to provide a bit of relief in the Stephen Foster for Bowman, whose mother was diagnosed with cancer earlier in the week.

Golden Ending...

After bumping a bit with favored Buzzards Bay (Marco Bay) at the start, Seek Gold was unhurried near the back of the pack as the longest shot on the board at 91-1. He still had the entire field in front of him turning for home, but an unconcerned Calvin Borel took him 12 wide and kept on riding him every inch of the stretch to get up in the final jump. Though it took a while for the official photo to confirm the result, Borel was confident. "I didn't want to go by him [Perfect Drift] because I know how he is," Borel explained. No contender deserves these laurels more than Dionisia, who has carried over her remarkable juvenile strike rate to her sophomore year. She registered at the top of her division with four Listed scores in 2005, and almost bested the colts in the G1 Gran Criterium, only to lose by a length to Lateral (GB) here in October. Following a return success in the Apr. 23 Listed Premio Torricola at the Capannelle, she could finish only sixth in the May 14 G2 Premio Regina Elena (Italian 1000 Guineas), but she rebounded in her customary style to take the ultimate dress rehearsal for this Classic, the G3 Premio Mario Incisa at this venue May 27. Wickwing was second in that event. Rising Cross has been purchased privately by owner Gary Tanaka, according to the Daily Racing Form, and is a 50-50 chance to travel to the U.S. for the July 2 GI American Oaks. The filly is as hardy as they come and, after dead-heating in the Listed Lupe S. at Goodwood May 6, finished runner-up to Alexandrova (Ire) in the G1 Epsom Oaks June 2. "She is tough," trainer John Best told PA Sport. "And while some of the other fillies might have problems with the heat and traveling, she won't. She is in really good form at the moment and has taken her Epsom race really well." Souvenance comes off a third in the May 14 G2 Schwarzgold-Rennen at Cologne, and her trainer, Sir Mark Prescott, is looking for his second European Classic in the space of a week, following the exploits of Confidential Lady (GB) in the G1 Prix de Diane. "Souvenance is not as good as Confidential Lady," he told PA Sport. "But she should have a good chance. She is crying out for that trip, she has a good jockey on board and, as usual, we wouldn't go if we didn't think she had a chance."

CLASSIC CLASH SET FOR CORONATION Pam Sly's Speciosa (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) and Marguerite Weld's Nightime (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) are set for an intriguing clash between the English and Irish 1000 Guineas heroines in Friday's G1 Coronation S. at Royal Ascot. While the former was fourth in the G1 Epsom Oaks after her May 7 Newmarket Classic success, Nightime burst onto the scene with a six-length victory in the Irish equivalent at The Curragh May 28. They were among 19 fillies left in the mile contest at the five-day stage, with trainer Andreas Lowe paying £20,000 to supplement Martin Schwartz's G2 German 1000 Guineas victress Lolita (Ger) (Lavirco {Ger}). Godolphin are set to be represented by last year's G1 Prix Morny winner Silca's Sister (GB) (Inchinor {GB}), who was fourth in the 1000 Guineas, while the French representation will come courtesy of Khalid Abdullah's Price Tag (GB) (Dansili {GB}), disqualified from first to third in the May 14 G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches at Longchamp.

DISTINCTION HEADS GOLD 13 Highclere Thoroughbred Racing's Distinction (Ire) (Danehill) yesterday headed the 13 stayers left in Thursday's G1 Ascot Gold Cup at the Royal meeting. Runner-up to Westerner (GB) 12 months ago, the seven-year-old was one of two veterans left in the 2 1/2-mile marathon by trainer Sir Michael Stoute, alongside Ballymacoll Stud's G3 Sagaro S.-winning nine-year-old Cover Up (Ire) (Machiavellian). 

British Report cont. OWNERS' PREMIUMS SCRAPPED

The British Horseracing Board has announced that the owners' premium scheme will be abolished at the end of 2006. Citing reduced income from the levy as the reason for the move, the BHB will concentrate its funds on the all-important issue of prize money, Chief Executive Greg Nichols said on Friday. "It is disappointing to now have to end the scheme, as we had high hopes at its inception that it would enhance the viability of the British breeding industry and go some way to levelling the playing field with our international competitors, notably in Ireland," he said. "The reality is that sustaining levels of prize money, which we have striven to augment from abysmal levels in the 1990s, must be the sport's priority."
