THE HOMECOMING

After a one-year sojourn to York, the Royal meeting returns to its historical base at a newly renovated Ascot today. Now firmly entrenched as a five-day spectacle,

the festival kicks off against the backdrop of the state-of-the-art grandstand, which is the focal point of the £200million redevelopment program initiated in 2004. With prize money increased by 12.5 percent to a total of £3,665,000 and 17 group races in store, this could prove one of the most significant renewals in the rich heritage of the race meeting that fascinates the world.

the festival kicks off against the backdrop of the state-of-the-art grandstand, which is the focal point of the £200million redevelopment program initiated in 2004. With prize money increased by 12.5 percent to a total of £3,665,000 and 17 group races in store, this could prove one of the most significant renewals in the rich heritage of the race meeting that fascinates the world.

Back Where it Belongs...

While racing was introduced at this venue by Queen Anne in 1711, the Royal meeting was the amalgamation of several turning points in history. In 1768, the four-day format was created and in 1807 the inaugural running of the centrepiece Gold Cup took place. In 1825 the Royal Procession was born and 20 years later the Royal Enclosure followed, courtesy of King George IV. If the mainstays of the meeting were in evidence at York, these unique five days are essentially about this track. Today's action kicks off on good-to-firm ground, which has been watered to avoid jarring conditions. "We're doing our final bit of watering and its good-to-firm all the way round," Clerk of the Course Chris Stickels said yesterday. "It's looking fantastic and the forecast is predominantly dry." MAKING A STATEMENT

Doubts over the Godolphin string have been abated by a clutch of successes over the past week and that bodes well for the big gun Proclamation (Ire) (King's Best) in today's G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot. Trained by Jeremy Nosedo last term, the grey rose to prominence when besting Soviet Song (Ire) in the G1 Sussex S. at Goodwood in July. Off the board when dropped back to six furlongs for the G1 Haydock Sprint Cup the following month, he reverts to a mile as he bids to provide his new connections with a seventh renewal. "We have given Proclamation time," trainer Saeed bin Suroor said. "I am pleased with him and he is working nicely. He is healthy and sound, but it is going to be a very tough race on his seasonal debut. He has the class to run well hopefully." Cont. p3

Over the course of the week, equine stars will be in abundance and tomorrow's £350,000 G1 Prince of Wales's S. could prove the highlight as Godolphin's G1 Dubai World Cup hero **Electrocutionist** (Red Ransom) squares up against Roldvale Limited's G1 Dubai Duty Free scorer **David Junior** (Pleasant Tap), with Lord Derby's **Ouija Board (GB)** thrown in for good measure. The Elite Racing Club's **Soviet Song (Ire)** (Marju {Ire}) is due to contest the G2 Windsor Forest S. on the undercard, while the £100,000 Royal Hunt Cup H. and G2 Queen Mary S. for the juvenile fillies hold their traditional place.

Ladies On Display...

On Thursday, which is "Ladies' Day," the G1 Ascot Gold Cup will see Highclere Thoroughbred Racing's **Distinction (Ire)** (Danehill) bid to go one better than 12 months ago in the marathon showpiece, with the G2 Norfolk S. for juveniles and G2 Ribblesdale S. bolstering

Friday's action centres around the clash between the English 1000 Guineas winner **Speciosa (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) and **Nighttime (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire})--who took the Irish equivalent--in the G1 Coronation S. J Paul Reddam's **Red Rocks (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) will be a warm order for the same card's G2 King Edward VII S., while on Saturday the G2

Hardwicke S. serves as an appetizer before the £350,000 G1 Golden Jubilee S. gets underway. Joe Janiak's Takeover Target appears the leading Australian force, chasing the "Choisir double" this time. "Our horse is as good as, if not hopefully a bit better, than Choisir," his owner-trainer said. "Probably, the six furlongs [of the Golden Jubilee] will suit better, but nice and fresh, I reckon he'll run a good race in the five [furlong, King's Stand] as well. I'll see how he handles the first race, but I'm pretty sure I've got him right for both. If he puts in a good effort, it will have been worthwhile coming--it's a big buzz." As far as the jockeys are concerned, no individual has more of a love affair with Ascot than Frankie Dettori, who carved a piece of history with his "magnificent seven" 10 years ago. Godolphin's first call rider is relishing the prospect. "Ascot for me has been almost everything," he said. "I had my first Group 1 there, the seven-out-of-seven, and was leading rider at Royal Ascot five times, so it means a lot to me. For some reason, I seem to be very lucky there. This is probably the most important meeting of the year--its our Olympics."

the Apr. 9 Listed Loughbrown S. and May 1 G3 Tetrarch S., but his conditioner Kevin Prendergast thinks he will handle the fast terrain here. "The quicker ground is a bit of an unknown, but he has a good action, so I can't see why he won't go on it," he told *PA Sport*

yesterday. "They didn't go any pace at the Curragh and he ran a little freely, because they went so slow. He ran like an inexperienced horse at the Curragh--it was only his fifth start, so hopefully he can improve for it and put up another good show. That was by far and away Araafa's best run of his life, so the assumption is that he's better on soft ground than he is on quicker, which could help us get the verdict." Kingmambo was the last French-trained winner of this race in 1993 and **Stormy River** gets to hoist the tricolore this time. Following an emphatic success in the Apr. 23 G3 Prix de Fontainebleau, he was sent off a warm favorite for the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains (French 2000 Guineas) at Longchamp May 14, but was mastered by the Ballydoyle duo Aussie Rules and **Marcus Andronicus**. The latter is one of a trio saddled by Aidan O'Brien in search of a fourth renewal, but Kieren Fallon has chosen last year's G2 July S. winner and G1 Prix Morny runner-up **Ivan Denisovich**, who was only seventh in that Longchamp Classic.

Minutes after Proclamation was delivering his trademark finishing kick to win the G3 Jersey S. at this meeting last year, **Peeress** was coming to the fore by winning the G2 Windsor Forest S. Third behind Soviet Song in the G1 Falmouth S. at Newmarket in July, she returned to the Rowley Mile in October to annexe the G1 Sun Chariot S. and finish fourth in the G2 Challenge S. With Proclamation on standby for the G1 Lockinge S., she took full advantage of his absence and the rain-softened surface to collect that Newbury showpiece May 20. She must adapt to faster conditions to provide trainer Sir Michael Stoute with his fourth renewal since the turn of the century. "We're very happy with her and she's in good form," owner/breeder Cheveley Park Stud's Managing Director Chris Richardson told *PA Sport*. "She's a very talented filly and I think she's improved, but she is perhaps a little better with some ease in the ground." Quick ground is also detrimental to **Court Masterpiece**, who had his optimum conditions of a testing surface over seven furlongs when capturing the G1 Prix de la Foret at Longchamp in October. Subsequently fifth in the G1 Hong Kong Mile at Sha Tin in December and sixth in the G2 Godolphin Mile at Nad al Sheba Mar. 25, he shaped as if a return to his best was imminent when third in the Lockinge. "It's well documented that seven furlongs on slower ground is his trip, but those races don't exist for him anymore with his Group 1 penalty," trainer Ed Dunlop said. "He seems well and should run very well, but I hope the ground is not very fast." Aidan O'Brien relies on last year's Sussex S. third **Ad Valorem**, and although he needs to find vast improvement on his return sixth in the G3 Gladness S. at The Curragh Apr. 9, that took place in desperate conditions and he warrants respect.

All eyes will be on the Australian trio and particularly **Takeover Target**, who boasts a record of three domestic Group 1 successes, latterly in his country's leading sprint, the G1 Newmarket H. He had **Glamour Puss** back in fourth in that Flemington contest Mar. 11,

turning around the form of the G1 Salinger S. in October, when he had trailed the mare in fourth. Owner/trainer Joe Janiak is confident he can make his mark. "I'm more than happy--he traveled fantastic and settled in good," he explained. "If he can reproduce what he's done in Australia

over here, I'm sure he'll be more than competitive." **Glamour Puss** is a dual scorer at the highest level and prepared for this venture with a second in the Apr. 15 G1 Sydney City Lexus T J Smith S. at Randwick. Trainer Danny O'Brien has been overseeing the mare's final works at Andrew Balding's Kingsclere base. "She is doing brilliantly well," O'Brien told *New Zealand Thoroughbred Marketing*. "She dropped only five kilograms on the 30 hour flight over and that went back on right away. The first thing she did when she arrived at the stable was eat, nothing seems to phase her." Of the home team, **Moss Vale** and **Tax Free** represents the Dandy Nicholls barn which has emerged in the past two seasons as the source of high-class sprinters. The former is on a three-timer, having won in the Curragh mud the May 27 G3 Greenlands S. before following up on quicker ground in the G2 Prix du Gros-Chene at Chantilly June 4, where he unleashed a devastating turn of acceleration to outclass **Benbaun** and **Tax Free**, who may need further than this trip to be seen in his best light. While sophomores are thin on the ground, **Dandy Man** looked out of the top drawer when taking the G3 Palace House S. at Newmarket May 6. Since 1990, **Dayjur**, **Pivotal** (GB), **Mitcham** (Ire) and **Dominica** (GB) have bested their elders in this fiercely competitive contest. **Reverence** delivered the high-profile success his record suggested when landing the G2 Temple S. at Sandown May 30, while **The Tatling** bids to repeat his success in this two years ago. "A big field and a strongly run race suits **The Tatling**," jockey Ryan Moore said. "If he comes back to his best, as he does at this time of year, he'll be there or thereabouts."

Holy Roman Emperor is the sole Ballydoyle contender in a race used for their better residents in recent times. Successful on four earlier occasions, including with **Fasliyev** and **Landseer** (GB), Aidan O'Brien understands what is required and the raw material looked to be there when winning on debut at Leopardstown June 7. Bryan Smart tasted success at this meeting 12 months ago with **Titus Alone** (Ire) in the Listed Windsor Castle S. and puts forward **Hellvelyn**. He had **Always Fruitful** (GB) four lengths back when taking a May 26 Pontefract conditions event in impressive fashion and that form was given a solid look after the runner-up went within a length of beating **Sadeek** in the Listed Woodcote S. at Epsom June 3. Richard Hannon has only one renewal to his name courtesy of **Rock City** (Ire) back in 1989, but **Major Cadeaux** has the credentials to end the drought. He beat **Jo'Burg** in a Newbury maiden on debut May 20 and his conditioner is expecting a bold show. "He has worked very well and is a real Coventry horse," said Hannon.

Know that phrase about being born with a silver spoon in one's mouth? Well, it didn't apply to Tejano Run, as you might guess from his price-tag of only \$20,000 as a yearling.

For a start, Tejano Run came on the market when his young sire Tejano was already reaching crisis point in his stallion career. Tejano had been the second-best two-year-old of 1987, when he set record earnings for a juvenile, but a winless second season had detracted from his appeal.

Consequently, the son of Caro had limited ammunition in his first two crops and was still awaiting his first stakes winner when his third-crop yearlings, including Tejano Run, came on the market in 1993. Tejano was eventually sold to India in 1997, despite Tejano Run's developing into one of the best of his generation.

To be fair to Tejano Run's forebears, his yearling price wasn't a fair reflection of the quality of his bloodlines. His unraced dam Royal Run, who was later to become the dam of More Royal (GII Jersey Derby) and second dam of Palace Episode (G1 Racing Post Trophy), was a very well-connected mare, from the same illustrious female line as the exceptional Blushing Groom. This very accomplished family has also produced performers of the calibre of Alwuhush, Simply Majestic and Husband and, more recently, two Derby winners in The Deputy, who took the Santa Anita variety, and King Kamehameha, who excelled in the Japanese version.

Tejano Run's dam is a half-sister to three graded stakes winners out of Kazadancoa, but two of the three--the Grade II winner Changing Ways and Grade III scorer Jacodra's Devil--came along after Tejano Run had been sold. Tejano Run was also born too soon to benefit from a link with 1995's champion juvenile Maria's Mon, who was by Wavering Monarch out of a daughter of Caro, whereas Tejano Run is by a son of Caro out of a daughter of Wavering Monarch. **cont. p8**

Tejano Run is connected to plenty of good juveniles and not even a May 5 birthday could stop him from establishing himself among the best young colts of 1994, when he won three of his five starts, starting with a victory on April 17; more than two weeks before his actual second birthday. Like Tejano before him, Tejano Run filled the show spot in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile before enduring a winless second season. However, Tejano Run showed he had retained his ability by finishing second to Thunder Gulch in the Kentucky Derby and he held his form well enough to add to his graded successes at four (on turf) and five.

Unfortunately, the stigma of being a son of Tejano (who had only one other graded stakes winner among his 191 foals) made things difficult for Tejano Run when he retired to Hill 'n' Dale Farms at a fee of \$5,000 in 1998. A reduction in his fee to \$4,000 didn't stop his book falling to 41 mares in 1999, then to 35. Although his career revived briefly in 2002, when he attracted 93 mares on the strength of a first crop which featured the smart Canadian performers Anglian Prince and Shaws Creek, he was soon struggling again. He has now left Kentucky for Canada, where his daughter One For Rose became a champion.

As his first crop produced five stakes winners from 43 named foals, there was always a chance that his fifth crop--his largest--would come up with something of note. This it has done in the form of the tough Italian filly Dionisia, who was winning for the ninth time in 14 starts when she proved much too good for challengers from Britain and Germany in the Oaks d'Italia. She has now won seven stakes races, which is a tremendous achievement for a filly who cost as little as \$13,000 at Fasig-Tipton. You could be forgiven for expecting a \$13,000 filly to have very little pedigree, but Dionisia's dam Essie's Maid is a half-sister to the Florida Derby third Linnleur and to three minor stakes winners, their dam being the good Canadian racemare Essie Bs Venture.

Judging by the way Princess Haya's Corum powered away to win a maiden race at Sandown last Saturday, this twice-raced son of Galileo may one day be good enough to merit a whole article of his own. Until that day, though, I will have to content myself with a quick appraisal of his unusual pedigree.

His dam Vallee des Reves, who has already hit the Group 1 target with her Giant's Causeway filly Maids Causeway, has the distinction of being inbred 3x2 to Nureyev (by Northern Dancer out of Special).

It was therefore a bold move to select Galileo as her 2002 mate, this impressive Derby winner being a son of Nureyev's three-parts brother Sadler's Wells. This pairing produces 3x5x4 inbreeding to Northern Dancer and 4x5x4 to Special. Although this formula appears to have worked well with Corum, it didn't when Vallee des Reves visited Sadler's Wells himself. That mating resulted in Dream Valley. A filly inbred 2x5x4 to Northern Dancer and 3x5x4 to Special, but she retired without any earnings after six starts.

It will be interesting to see what Alec Wildenstein does with Vallee des Reves' relative Vallee Enchantee in the years to come, as this high-class racemare is inbred 2x3 to Nureyev.

Corum's pedigree puts me in mind of the outstanding Japanese horse El Condor Pasa, who was inbred 4x3 to Northern Dancer and 5x5x4 to both Forli and Thong, with two of these lines coming via Special and the other via her sister Lisadell. The other top winner with a similar pedigree was Lisadell's short-lived son Fatherland, who was inbred 4x2 to both Forli and Thong, through Special and Lisadell.

Corum is also inbred 4x3 to Mr. Prospector, through Miswaki and Kingmambo, so he could develop into another advertisement for doubling up on both Northern Dancer and Mr. Prospector.

Calder Inducts Four into Hall of Fame:

Calder Race Course announced Monday that four individuals will be inducted into the Hall of Fame during a winner's circle ceremony at Calder Sept. 3. The inductees are Shocker T. (Nodouble), a winner of 13 of 18 starts, including the GI Delaware H., GII John A. Morris H. and GII Black Helen H. The filly, owned by Thomasina Caporella and trained by George Gianos, retired with \$510,900 in earnings. Among the human inductees, trainer Eddie Plesa Jr., who was the leading trainer at the Tropical meeting at Calder in 1994/95 and 2003/04, campaigned numerous stakes winners, including J J's Dream, Vaguely Double, Three Ring, Tekken and Best of the Rest. Plesa currently is the leading trainer of the 2006 Calder meet. Also honored this year are owners Herb and Ione Elkins, who were best known for campaigning stakes-winner Seacliff, one of only five horses to sweep the Florida Stallion stakes series for colts at Calder; and Rosemary Homeister Jr., a winner of 1,726 races, who holds the distinction of being the first female rider to win an Eclipse Award as an apprentice. During her riding career, she led the standings at the Calder Tropical meeting during the 1992/93 season, and was later the leading jockey at Hialeah Park in 2001. Retired in 2004, the rider recently decided to return to racing.

MOTIVATOR BACK HOME

Motivator (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}--Out West, by Gone West) has returned to the Royal Studs at Sandringham following investigations into the lameness that caused his withdrawal from his first season in the breeding shed. According to the *Racing Post*, last year's G1 Epsom Derby hero had sustained an injury in April and had spent two days at the local Rossdale & Partners veterinary practice undergoing scans to determine the cause. Syndicate Manager John Warren confirmed that the injury was unrelated to the fractured pelvis suffered in the build-up to the Breeders' Cup in October. "The horse went down to the practice for investigation over the past couple of days," he told the *Post*. "It's nothing to do with the old injury that stopped him from racing. It's just a grumbling lameness. We spent the last eight weeks not knowing the exact state of the injury, so it seemed unnecessary to move down to Newmarket when he probably just needed rest." Motivator covered 80 mares before the forced withdrawal from duties. He is expected to cover a full book in 2007.

WINSTON HANDED LENGTHY BAN

Robert Winston felt the full force of the stewards' wrath at Carlisle yesterday when suspended for 28 days after being found guilty of dropping his hands. The leading British rider was beaten on Confide (Ire) in a handicap at the meeting after easing his mount before the line. His ban will run from June 30 to July 27 inclusive, which rules out Newmarket's July meeting and Sandown's G1 Eclipse S. meeting. "I will just have to take it on the chin," Winston told *PA Sport*. "I was looking at the big screen and saw that I was three lengths clear and just eased my momentum--I didn't stop riding."
