ARAAFA TAKES PALACE BY STORM

All the talk after the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas may have surrounded the vanquished George Washington (Ire), but now it's time to take Saleh Al Homaizi and Imad Al

comfortable two lengths to spare over **Stormy River (Fr)** (Verglas {Ire}) at the line. "He keeps progressing and his work had improved again since Ireland," trainer Jeremy Noseda explained. "Taking nothing away from George Washington, it will take a mighty one to beat [Araafa], and I look forward to the rematch." **Cont. p2**

COMING AROUND AT THE RIGHT TIME

Amongst Araafa's better efforts at two were a second to subsequent G1 Racing Post Trophy hero Palace Episode in the Listed Acomb S. at York in August and a third in the G3 Horris Hill S. at Newbury in October. His fourth-place finish in the May 6 G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket came on the heels of a troubled preparation, and he made a leap forward to best George Washington by two lengths in testing conditions in the Irish equivalent at The Curragh three weeks later. There would be no rubber match for the Guineas winners at Royal Ascot after it was announced that George Washington emerged from the Irish race with pulled muscles. But there was nothing to stop Araafa here. Positioned by Alan Munro in behind the Ballydoyle rabbit Arabian Prince (Fusaichi Pegasus) in the early stages, the bay took over before the quarter pole and was clear as Stormy River threaded his way through the pack from rear. "He was very impressive and is the mile champion now," asserted his jockey, who was riding his first Royal Ascot winner in 12 years. "He leaves the gate fast, travels very strongly and has a good turn of foot. He is uncomplicated and doesn't hesitate when he takes the lead--he's very responsive and willing and wants to win." Noseda is hoping that Araafa receives the plaudits now. "Sadly, he missed his prep for the Guineas and got sick 18 days before, but we decided to run and he's just moved forward since then," he explained. "I didn't go to Ireland for the sake of a run, and he did his job there. I feel today, hopefully he'll get the credit he deserves as he's a top horse, a tough horse and has a cruising speed and can kick." 

Ad Valorem was rated the joint-second top juvenile of 2004 following his victory in the G1 Middle Park S., but his sophomore season failed to take off in the expected manner. He was second to Shamardal in the G1 St James's Palace S. on his belated return 12 months ago at the Royal meeting, after which he was fifth in the G1 Prix Jean Prat at Chantilly and third behind Proclamation in the G1 Sussex S. at Goodwood in July. Sixth in Keeneland's GI Turf Mile and ninth in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile at Belmont in October, he was beaten over 30 lengths on his four-year-old debut in the G3 Gladness S. on deep ground at The Curragh last time Apr. 9. The bay was up on the front end early in this contest, but was soon settled in behind the leaders and rallied wide as favored Peeress (Pivotal {GB}) was committed at the three-furlong marker. Wearing down that rival at the furlong pole, he veered across her and the smoothtraveling Court Masterpiece, who was squeezed against the rail as Ad Valorem went clear. Queen Anne cont. p3

is was the right decision. "He won snug and seemed to have a nice bit up his sleeve," he said. "This is a horse that always wanted fast ground and he's a very tough, genuine and sound horse." As for the colt's misfirings last year, O'Brien continued, "We kept him in training, as last year we couldn't get fast ground any day and when we

got him right in the Sussex it came up soft again. "We were over the moon when he was third then, as we knew the difference between this horse on soft ground and on fast ground." Trainer Sir Michael Stoute was accepting of defeat for the 7-4 market leader Peeress, who did not get the run of the race. "The race went wrong for us from the start, as Frankie [Dettori on Proclamation] hit her up the backside and set her alight," Stoute said. "I was never happy throughout the race, as she was doing too much wide without cover, but the best horse won the race today." Court Masterpiece's trainer Ed Dunlop said, "Jamie [Spencer] was very upset, as he thinks he would have won and he's run a great race." Godolphin were upbeat about the run of Proclamation, who stayed on into third returning from a 290-day absence. "We were happy with Proclamation, as we were two weeks behind schedule," Racing Manager Simon Crisford commented. "He was a little bit rusty and you've got to be razor-sharp to win these races. He missed two gallops at a crucial time, and we knew we were coming here under-cooked, so I think he ran a solid race. I think you'll see him to much better effect in the second half of the season, when the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. There was plenty of drama over these five furious furlongs, and it was Takeover Target who emerged on top at the end to provide the fairytale result for the one-time taxi driver Joe Janiak. In a renewal marred by the falls of Orientor (GB) (Inchinor {GB}) and Tabaret (GB) (Bertolini), the Antipodean raider prevailed in a head-bobber to deny Benbaun after a pulsating final drive under Jay Ford. In doing so, the gelding who cost just A\$1,250 followed in the hoofprints of 2003 hero Choisir (Aus) and, like that ground-breaking horse, could now tackle the second leg on Saturday in the G1 Golden Jubilee S. Janiak indicated that he would wait and see how the seven-year-old came out of the race before committing his charge.

Belying his inexperience of English tracks, jockey Jay Ford stayed cool aboard the blaze-faced bay while tracking the fast fractions, and was ideally positioned wide of the pack as the heat was turned on. Takeover Target quickened to lead passing the quarter pole and forged an advantage which was withered away with every stride by Benbaun, but the photo captured the Australian nose ahead where it mattered. "He drew poorly and had to work to come across, so probably first time up he just gave out the last bit," his rider explained. "He's all heart." For Janiak, the win was the culmination of a plan hatched after taking the Feb. 4 G1 Lightning S., the second part of his Flemington Group 1 treble which began in 2004 in the G1 Salinger S. and was completed in the G1 Newmarket H. on his last start Mar. 11. "It's a great result and now it's over, it wasn't that hard as he traveled over pretty good, and that was my biggest worry," Janiak explained. Benbaun's trainer Mark Wallace said of the runner-up, "He's the best sprinter we have over here. As long as he's alright, he might go to The Curragh on Irish Derby day [July 2] for the Listed Richard H Faught Memorial S. he won last year." Trainer Peter Makin revealed that third-place finisher Pivotal Point will return for the Golden Jubilee. Up close in the early going, Tabaret was tiring when he clipped heels and fell, and the rallying Orientor was unable to avoid him. Both horses' connections reported them unscathed, and Tabaret's jockey Dean McKeown was not seriously injured by the fall. On the day Electrocutionist beat proven dirt performers on Dubai's biggest stage, David Junior cemented his reputation as a top-class runner with an impressive score in the G1 Dubai Duty Free S. That confirmed the impression he created when taking the G1 Champion S. in Newmarket in October, and he has been prepared specifically for this challenge. Ouija Board, who found Shirocco too strong in the G1 Coronation Cup at Epsom June 2, is pitched in again against the colts. This race was the scene of her darkest day when she was injured 12 months ago, but has since reversed fortunes, staging a glorious comeback when annexing the G1 Hong Kong Vase at Sha Tin in December. Fortunes did not favor her when fourth in the Mar. 25 G1 Dubai Sheema Classic at Nad al Sheba and third in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II Cup at Sha Tin Apr. 23, and her trainer Ed Dunlop thinks that she may have improved since Epsom. "It's a very competitive race, but she's been a fantastic servant to everyone and we hope people enjoy seeing her," he commented. "She is against arguably two of the best mile-and-a-guarter horses in the world over a trip which is not her ideal and it will be tough, but we knew that when we kept her in training. She seems very well and I think she looks better physically now than when she went to Epsom. She did a good bit of work on Friday, so we're giving it a go." Aidan O'Brien relies on last year's runner-up Ace, who needs to step up off his fourth in the Coronation Cup, while Andre Fabre puts forward Manduro, who comes here off a second in the G1 Prix d'Ispahan at Longchamp last time May 21.

Asset and Red Clubs represent the form of the May 6 G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket, having finished ninth and 12th, respectively, in that mile Classic. While the latter is penalised for his success in the G3 Greenham S. at Newbury Apr. 22, Asset escapes the extra impost and bids to provide trainer Richard Hannon with his second renewal after the exploits of Sergeyev (Ire) in 1995. Third in the G3 Solario S. at Sandown in August, Asset bested subsequent G2 Mehl-Mulhens-Rennen (German 2000 Guineas) victor Royal Power (Ire) in the Apr. 1 Listed Easter S. at Kempton before his tame Guineas effort. "Asset seems in great form," Highclere Thoroughbred Racing's Managing Director Harry Herbert commented. "He has got a lot of speed and a stiff seven furlongs should be ideal. In hindsight, I think he ran well in the Guineas, only being beaten just under seven lengths, though the trainer and jockey felt he could have done better." Jeremy Noseda, who has won two of the last four renewals of this event, has made no secret of the regard in which the Apr. 19 Newmarket conditions scorer Secret World is held. "I think this horse has enormous potential," he said. "We were very tempted to run him in the St. James's Palace but have decided to go for the Group 3, rather than stepping straight into Group 1 company. I do feel he possesses plenty of speed, while ground and trip shouldn't be an issue." Levera followed handicap successes at Newmarket Apr. 18 and May 7 with an emphatic score in the Listed Merrion S. at York 10 days later and trainer Alan King is hopeful. "I couldn't be happier with him and it's all gone smoothly," he said. "His work has been A-1 and, while this is much his biggest test to date, he has earned his right to be in the field and I hope he'll run extremely well."

WARRSAN DIES MG1SW Warrsan (Ire) (Caerleon--Lucayan Princess (Ire), by High Line (GB)), retired in May after suffering a small chip on the sesamoid in his



left front leg, died Monday night after a brief illness. The eight-year-old, who was being cared for by Rossdales veterinary surgeons at Carlburg Stables, developed complications resulting from a tumor. Trainer Clive Brittain, who handled the france-galop.com classy veteran throughout his career, said, "It is an

absolute tragedy that Warrsan was unable to go onto the life that he so richly deserved as a stallion. He was one of the family to all of us here at Carlburg and we will miss him." Saeed Manana, Warrsan's owner, added, "I would like to thank all those who tried so hard to save him, but unfortunately, it was not to be. I feel so sorry for Clive Brittain and all his team who loved him as much as I did." Warrsan broke his maiden at Sandown in July of 2001. It took time for him to reach his peak, but he picked up his first group success in the G3 John Porter S. in April of 2003, and went on to win the G2 Sagitta Jockey Club S. and G1 Coronation Cup that season. He defended his title in that prestigious event the following year, and also captured the G1 Grosser Preis Von Baden, a victory he would repeat in 2005. Kerrin McEvoy, who partnered Warrsan to both victories at Baden-Baden, paid tribute at the time of his retirement. "He was a terrific old horse and he gave my career a big kick forward at a time when most people knew me only as Godolphin's second jockey," he told Racing Post. "He was so genuine, a real professional, and I will miss him a lot." The bay made his final start in the G1 Hong Kong Vase at Sha Tin in December, finishing off the board, but was preparing for a 2006 campaign when he was injured. He retired with nine wins from his 43 starts, earning £1,654,749.

For the 1999 breeding season, Adena Springs Kentucky retired two top-class sons of Deputy Minister, Awesome Again and Touch Gold. Awesome Again was unraced at two, and took the GII Jim Dandy S. and Queens Plate at three. His peak came at four, however, when he was undefeated in six starts, including the GI Whitney H. and GI Breeders' Cup Classic. Touch Gold was earlier to come to hand, winning a six-furlong maiden at two, and finishing second in the Swynford S., and third in the GII Grey Breeders' Cup S., at the same age. He really flourished at three, scoring his first stakes win with an 8 1/2-length tally over subsequent champion sprinter Smoke Glacken in the GII Lexington S. Pointed next for the GI Preakness S., Touch Gold stumbled at the start, but came flying at the finish to take fourth behind Silver Charm. In the GI Belmont S., Touch Gold showed what might have been in the Preakness, running down Silver Charm close home to end that horse's Triple Crown bid by a half-length. When that victory was followed up by a win in the GI Haskell Invitational, Touch Gold stood at the head of three-year-old class, but all was not well. When he stumbled in the Preakness, Touch Gold grabbed a quarter, and although he was successful on a patched foot in the Belmont and Haskell, the problem was to hamper his career from then on. This was evident when he ended the three-year-old season with a fourth in the GII Pegasus H. and an off-the-board finish in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic.

Away from the races for more than sixth months, Touch Gold came back at four to take a one mile Churchill Downs allowance in a time just 1/5 off the track record. Unfortunately, following this sparkling effort, Touch Gold, was to start only three more times. Unplaced in the GI Pacific Classic, he went down by a neck to Arch, as the pair set a new track record in Keeneland's GIII Fayette S. Touch Gold ended his career finishing eighth in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, as Awesome Again grabbed the glory.

With Awesome Again ending his career on a higher note, he retired to stand at \$50,000, with Touch Gold starting at \$30,000. When their runners hit the track, both were out of the gates fast with Grade I-winning first season two-year-olds: Toccet, for Awesome Again, and Composure, for Touch Gold. Of course, two years later, Awesome Again's career soared into the stratosphere, when on Breeders' Cup Day Wilko captured the GI Juvenile, and eventual Horse of the Year Ghostzapper annexed the GI Breeders' Cup Classic. Awesome Again has built on that momentum, and for the 2006 recent breeding season, his fee was at \$125,000, while Touch Gold stood at \$50,000. The most recent weekend, however, belonged to Touch Gold. For, while Awesome Again's Spun Sugar started favorite for the GI Ogden Phipps H., but produced an uncharacteristicly flat effort to finish fourth, Touch Gold's son, Seek Gold took the GI Stephen Foster H. at odds of 91.70-1.

A six-year-old gelding, Seek Gold is one of five stakes winners from Touch Gold's first crop, the others including the previously mentioned dual Grade I winner Composure; Midas Eyes, who earned a Grade I win in the Forego H.; and GIII Tampa Bay Derby victor Region of Merit. His second crop yielded five stakes winners, headed by GI Forego H. winner, Mass Media, and the extremely rapid three-time graded winner Medallist. There were three stakes winners in Touch Gold's third crop, and his fourth crop, currently three-year-olds, includes Sugar Swirl, successful in the Princess Elizabeth S., the top race for Canadian-bred two-year-old fillies.

Although Seek Gold's Stephen Foster win was a tremendous upset, it's worth recalling that after successive wins in maiden and allowance races at he backend of his two-year-old season, he was ranked among then-trainer Nick Zito's Derby prospects.

Even though those hopes were never realized, Seek Gold did give occasional glimpses of the ability which caused him to have been held in such high regard, most notably in the 2004 GII Clark H.--over the Stephen Foster course and distance--where he finished well to take second 1 1/4 lengths behind Saint Liam. As an augury to the future, we can note that in third that day, a nose behind Seek Gold, was Perfect Drift, who was beaten precisely the same margin by Seek Gold in the Stephen Foster.

On the distaff side of his pedigree, Seek Gold comes from an historic Calumet family. His dam, Aly's Adita--winner of the listed Pippin S. at Oaklawn Park--is by Alydar, and is half-sister to Calumet's champion three-year-old Davona Dale. Davona Dale and Aly's Adita were the only stakes winners produced by their dam, Royal Entrance, but that mare is also ancestress of several other major winners around the world, including the GI Futurity S. victor, Agincourt; Jamelao, who took the GI Gran Premio de La Americas-International in Argentina; and Flying Snowdrop, heroine of the GI Stuttaford Fillies Guineas in South Africa. Royal Entrance also owns a pretty fancy pedigree, as she is by champion Tim Tam, winner of the Kentucky Derby and Preakness S., out of the Bed o' Roses H. winner, Prince's Gate; also granddam of the GI Preakness victor, Gate Dancer. For good measure, her second dam (Seek Gold's fourth dam), Siena Way, is a sister to Citation, generally regarded as one of the top four of five U.S. runners of the last century.

Seek Gold--bred on the same Deputy Minister/Alydar cross as earlier Grade I winners Victory Speech and Ten Most Wanted--is the product of a mating where both parents have quite close inbreeding of their own, but their offspring is more of an outcross. Touch Gold is inbred 4x4 to Northern Dancer. Aly's Adita has Calumet's great mare, Two Lea 4x3; Two Lea's sire, Bull Lea 5x5x4x4; and Bull Lea's sire, Bull Dog 6x6x5x5 x5.

It's notable that Northern Dancer himself did very well with mares carrying Bull Dog's sire, Teddy (seven times in Aly's Adita), a horse who had a genetic relationship to Gainsborough (doubled in Northern Dancer's pedigree).

Seek Gold does have one fairly close duplication of his own, that of Tom Fool, who is 4x4. Tom Fool sits between the close inbreeding in Touch Gold's pedigree, and it can often pay to duplicate a strain which is thus situated. With regard to Touch Gold and Tom Fool, we can note that Tom Fool appears in the dams of seven of his 14 stakes winners; four of his six graded winners; and three of his four Grade I winners. For good measure, Touch Gold Grade I winner Composure doesn't have Tom Fool, but does have Tom Fool's three-quarters relative Spring Run.

WOODBINE IMPOSES STIFF RULES ON SHIP-PERS TO MAJOR STAKES

By Jennifer Morrison, courtesty The Blood-Horse David Willmot, president and chief executive officer of Woodbine Entertainment Group, prides himself on protecting customers at his racetrack, and in June he implemented a new rule regarding shippers for major races at the Toronto track.

Horses that were pointed to the June 25 Queen's Plate and those intending to ship for the Atto Mile (Can-I) and Pattison Canadian International (Can-1) are required to ship into Woodbine 48 hours before entries close for the races.

Each horse arriving on the grounds will be strictly supervised by an assigned security guard who may accompany each one to and from the track for training. Those allowed access to the horses for feeding, grooming, and any medical treatments will be only those approved by security and everything will be documented. Any horse could have its blood tested at any time.

Willmot cites the arrests in New Jersey in March of Standardbred driver Eric Ledford and four associates over allegations of blood doping with erythropoietin (EPO) plus last year's controversial victory by Wild Desert in the Queen's Plate as reasons for the new rule. In order to pursue its strategy of integrating with international Totes and third-party partners, Tote Ireland will revert to a single retention rate for all win betting, in line with international practice. Nigel Roddis, ATR's international director, said, "This is an important agreement, further strengthening our ties with Irish racing. One of the principal aims of the channel is to increase the profile and revenue opportunities for our racecourse partners." Tote Ireland's Chief Executive Alexis Murphy added, "Irish racing will benefit not only from the increased exposure, but financially through the commission Tote Ireland will receive on each bet placed through the pools. The increased liquidity will also further increase the attractiveness of our pools to punters."
