Yesterday's G1 Golden Jubilee S. was set up for Takeover Target (Aus) (Celtic Swing {GB}) to complete the Royal Ascot sprint double, but there were no excuses as Willie McKay's Les Arcs (Arch) rushed by en route to a neck defeat of the fast-finishing Balthazaar's Gift (Ire) (Xaar {GB}) to cause a 33-1 upset. Campaigned over middle-distances and even over hurdles at Cartmel in 2004, the six-year-old became an accidental hero with this career-high for first-season trainer Tim Pitt. Never far away from the early tempo, he rolled by the eventual third Takeover Target inside the final quarter and was all out under John Egan's drive as Jamie Spencer closed late on Balthazaar's Gift. "He did it well, but if I'd known Balthazaar's Gift was coming with a late run, I might not have taken on Takeover Target so soon, but I wanted to put that one to bed early," his jockey commented. "He's a fantastic horse--we used to run him over a mile and a quarter and thought he was quirky because he didn't find anything, but he obviously didn't stay and we gradually got his trip right." For a \$140,000 Keeneland yearling and 32,000gns TATAUT purchase, Les Arcs has undertaken a bizarre route to the top, with his former trainer Richard Guest convinced that he was a distance runner. Not surprisingly, he was last on his only try over the jumps, but, when dropped to seven furlongs and a mile last year, started to show something, winning handicaps at Musselburgh and Chester. Switched to Pitt, he instantly rewarded the decision to drop him into sprint contests and reeled off a four-timer on the polytrack during the winter and spring.

Back on turf, he took the Listed Cammidge Trophy at Redcar Mar. 25 and finished runner-up in the Listed Abernant S. at Newmarket Apr. 18, but had been off the board in the May 30 G2 Temple S. at Sandown and in Tuesday's G2 King's Stand S. here. Handed a favorable low berth in this competitive affair, he was gifted a dream run up the rail and grabbed the long-time leader Takeover Target with 1 1/2 furlongs remaining. The race was seemingly his after he had brushed aside the 7-2 favorite, but John Egan had to pray for the line as Balthazaar's Gift rushed to his side late. "After he won at Lingfield and the Cammidge, he kept going up and up the handicap and there are only so many places you can enter them," Pitt explained. "This guy put us on the map at Lingfield in the winter and he'll probably go for the G1 July Cup [at Newmarket July 13] next."

For trainer Joe Janiak, the Takeover Target journey did not end in regret after the gelding battled on to hold third place. "I'm absolutely wrapped," he said. "I couldn't ask for more than that and he tried his hardest. Probably the four-day back-up just took its toll in the final furlong, as he couldn't pick his momentum up. I'm so pleased I've come over, as I would have regretted it all my life if I hadn't and we'll be back for the July Cup at Newmarket. The 1200 metres will suit him and then it will be on to Japan after that." Jockey Jay Ford echoed those sentiments. "I feel the four-day back-up just left him a little bit flat," he said. "He bounced out well and got across nice to the stands' side and only went steady. He traveled super throughout, but just passing the 400-metre mark he felt the pinch and, as game as he is, he boxed on well and finished the race right off."

This race was weakened by the late scratching of Godolphin's Shawanda (Ire) (Sinndar {Ire}) due to lameness, but featured a thrilling finish between the Sir Michael Stoute-trained duo of Maraahel and Mountain High. The former had finished runner-up to Bandari (Ire) (Alhaarth {Ire}) in this race 12 months ago, but jockey Richard Hills kept the faith and was rewarded with a game success from the visored bay, who had promised to hit this type of target on many occasions. Settled in mid-division off the genuine early fractions carved out by Bandari, he was full of run behind Mountain High as that rival struck for home inside the final quarter. Quickening past his stable companion in a matter of strides, he responded to a drive to maintain his advantage despite the renewed rally of the runner-up.

Maraahel was involved in many of the major dogfights of 2005 and underlined his quality when third, beaten a neck and a head by Electrocutionist and Zenno Rob Roy (GB), in the G1 Juddmonte International S. at York in August. He filled the same spot behind David Junior and Pride (Fr) in the G1 Champion S. at Newmarket in October and again in the G1 Hong Kong Cup at Sha Tin in December. Sixth on his first try on dirt in the G1 Dubai World Cup at Nad al Sheba Mar. 25, he returned to Europe to finish third in the Apr. 22 G3 John Porter S. at Newbury. Back on track when recording back-to-back successes in the G3 Huxley S. at Chester last time May 11, his victory here bodes well that he can finally hit the target at the top level. "He's threatened for a while and there were some great performances last year," Stoute said. "He has a short run and Richard gave him a great ride today, as he was very brave. I think there's a group one in him, but I don't know where. That was Mountain High's best performance by far and he's going the right way."



Pride is arguably the toughest mare in training in Europe and has held her form admirably throughout the last two years.

Unsighted until making a winning debut at Cologne Apr. 17, he followed up at Hannover May 7 before annexing the June 5 Listed Grosser Preis der Hannoverschen Volksbank, Andre Fabre puts forward Salutino, third in the G1 Preis von Europa in Cologne last September before finishing runner-up in the G1 Gran Premio del Jockey-Club at the San Siro the following month. He was runner-up to Policy Maker (Ire) in the G2 Grand Prix de Chantilly on his latest start June 4. Andreas Wohler, who saddled Lomitas (GB) to win in 1991 and doubled up with Sabiango (Ger) three years ago, relies on Simonas, who was third in this 12 months ago and had Salutino behind him when runner-up in the Preis von Europa. He has been off the track since finishing fifth in last October's GI Canadian International S. at Woodbine.



RECORD SATURDAY TOPS ASCOT'S WEEK

Officials at Ascot racecourse were celebrating a record attendance for yesterday's climactic card of the 2006 Royal meeting, which helped raise the total crowd by over 10,000 on two years ago. After absorbing a finalday figure of 60,595, Chief Executive Douglas Erskine-Crum expressed himself satisfied with the reaction to the redevelopment and the new facilities. "It's very pleasing to end the week with a record Saturday crowd," he commented. "The last day of the Royal Meeting continues to go from strength to strength. We are tremendously pleased with the way that the facilities have performed, given the tight deadlines we had to deliver the Royal Meeting in following 20 months of redevelopment. The track has performed particularly well, with feedback from jockeys and trainers almost wholly positive, particularly in relation to the cambered bends and actual turf surface. We are aware, of course, that there are still improvements to be made as anticipated and we will build on this week through the summer and indeed right up to the 2007 Royal Meeting. I would like to thank everybody who has come to Royal Ascot this week for their support and, in some cases patience, as we identify and begin to iron out some inevitable teething problems." The five-day festival saw a crowd of 310,967, compared to 300,666 the last time the meeting was staged at the track two years ago. Erskine-Crum was keen to stress that improvements will be the first priority. "This redevelopment should not yet be seen as the realisation of our ambitions for Ascot," he added. "We will continue to improve the facilities, specifically some areas of landscaping in order to provide the very best racing experience to our many and varied customers and participants." Tote turnover for the week was up slightly on 2004, at £8,573,920 compared to £8,562,607.
