One of the heartening aspects of last week's Royal Ascot meeting was the number of young stallions



which enjoyed stakes success. Among them were the nine-year-olds Medicean (Nannina and Dutch Art), Mull of Kintyre (Araafa) and Dixie Union (Sander Camillo); the eight-year-olds Ishiguru (Hellvelyn) and Noverre (Elhamri); and the

Action Plus seven-year-old Redback

(Gilded). The 10-year-old Montieu also struck gold with his second-crop three-year-olds, achieving a Group 2 double with Mont Etoile and Papal Bull, plus a third stakes success from Snoqualmie Boy.

But the younger brigade didn't have everything their own way, thanks principally to Northern Dancer's sons. Danzig had an unusual double, courtesy of Ad Valorem in the G1 Queen Anne S. over a mile and Soapy Danger in the G3 Queen's Vase over double that distance. while Sadler's Wells supplied the winner of the G1 Gold Cup for the third time, this time with the impressive Yeats. The 26-year-old Alzao, a grandson of Northern Dancer, got into the act with the G2 Hardwicke S. success of Maraahel.

You could say that the Royal meeting developed into something of a battle between the male lines developed by Danzig and Sadler's Wells, with the Danzig line being the winner. In addition to Danzig's own group double, there were group winners by his sons Mull of Kintyre and Ishiguru and his grandsons Danehill Dancer (the impressive Jeremy) and Cape Cross (the magnificent Ouija Board). Another of Danzig's sons, the Dewhurst S. winner Mujahid, also had a rewarding time thanks to his stamina-packed son Baddam, winner of the Ascot S. and Queen Alexander S. over extreme distances.

Coolmore had every reason to be pleased with the success of both these males lines, as Sadler's Wells, Montjeu, Danehill Dancer and Mull of Kintyre all stand under the Coolmore banner, and Ad Valorem, now a dual Group 1 winner, is scheduled to divide his time between Coolmore and Woodlands Stud in Australia.

As Mull of Kintyre was one of the lowest-priced stallions on the Coolmore roster when he retired at a fee of IR£5,000 in 2002, it is hardly surprising that quantity of his winners, rather than their quality, has been the hallmark of his stallion career so far. However, in Araafa, he has demonstrated that--given a well-bred mare--he is perfectly capable of siring a top-class performer.

Araafa didn't receive much credit for his victory over George Washington in the Irish 2000 Guineas, firstly because George Washington had a ready-made excuse in the heavy ground and secondly because he came out of the race with a problem. People were far happier to accept the form of the English 2000 Guineas, in which George Washington had finished nearly five lengths ahead of the 66-1 Araafa. However, the panache of Araafa's decisive victory in the St James's Palace S. suggests that a rematch between the two will be fascinating. Will Araafa, with his ability to kick for home a long way out, once again be able to blunt Gorgeous George's finishing speed?

American readers may remember that Mull of Kintyre made his main-track debut in the 1999 Breeders' Cup Juvenile, in which he was ignored at odds of nearly 30-1, despite having taken the G2 Gimcrack S. by three lengths on his last appearance. Although he never threatened the first three at Gulfstream, Mull of Kintyre handled the dirt well enough to be a closing fourth of 14, ahead of such as Dixie Union, Forest Camp and Captain Steve.

"Mull Of Kintyre ran a big race and I was very pleased with him," was Aidan O'Brien's verdict. "The lack of a race on dirt was always going to be a disadvantage, but he ran really well.

"Being by Danzig, there would have to be doubts about him getting a mile and a half next year," O'Briend added. "That would make a Derby bid in Europe unlikely. I see him as a possible Guineas horse, with the Kentucky Derby another target, all being well."

Mull of Kintyre's Kentucky Derby claims were certainly valid, as the bottom half of his pedigree is packed with horses who have excelled on dirt. His dam, Retrospective, had a sire, Easy Goer, and grandsire, Alydar, who finished second in the Kentucky Derby, and Retrospective was a half-sister to the admirable Broad Brush, the 1986 Kentucky Derby third. No wonder Mull of Kintyre cost \$1,000,000 as a yearling.

Unfortunately, all the speculation about his suitability for a Churchill Downs bid came to nothing, because Mull of Kintyre didn't make it to the races in 2000. O'Brien revealed why at his media open day the following spring:

"He was working with Giant's Causeway last spring and going every bit as well, so it was a real shame when he ripped a shoe off and a nail went right through his pedal bone. He was lucky to survive, but is back now and in great form."

Unfortunately, Mull of Kintyre failed to fulfill his connections' high expectations at four and failed to win in six attempts, coming closest to success when a neck second to King Charlemagne in a Listed race.

This sequence of defeats can't have helped attract quality mares to him, but he did receive one notable opportunity in the shape of Resurgence, a filly culled by Cheveley Park Stud for 31,000gns as an unraced two-year-old in 2000. Incidentally, the Thompsons' Cheveley Park Stud took the title of leading breeder at the Royal Ascot meeting, when Nannina followed Exclusive and Russian Rhythm as its third winner of the G1 Coronation S. In her post-race interview, Mrs Thompson stressed the importance her team places on keeping numbers in check at their highly successful stud, with 120 broodmares being the desired maximum. This means that some well-bred fillies can't be retained and some talented mares--such as Nannina's group-winning dam Hill Hopper--have to be culled if they appear not to be shaping up.

Resurgence came on the market at the end of 2000, the year that her brother Pivotal made a pleasing start with his first runners. Pivotal has since done so outstandingly well that he is now the highest-priced stallion standing in England. Resurgence's profile has also been rising. After visiting the inexpensive Danzig line stallions Foxhound, Mull of Kintyre and Orpen in her first three seasons, she visited Danehill Dancer in 2004, producing a colt May 7 last year.

Perhaps one of the reasons why Resurgence wasn't retained was the fact that her sire, Nureyev's fast son Polar Falcon, already had several daughters in the Cheveley Park broodmare band, including the G1 Coronation S. winner Exclusive and the Group 3 winners Icicle and Red Camellia. It was Red Camellia who supplied Cheveley with the Group 1 winner Red Bloom, while Exclusive has produced a pair of very talented daughters in Chic and Echelon.

Araafa's links with Pivotal must make him a very interesting stallion prospect, but, in the shorter term, he looks sure to add a lot of interest to the rest of this year's top mile events, with the Breeders' Cup Mile being one of the possibilities.

DANCER'S DERBY RUN IN DOUBT? John Pearce's Dragon Dancer (GB) (Sadler's Wells) may miss Sunday's

G1 Irish Derby at The Curragh due to the prevalent quick conditions, connections announced vesterday. Jockey Darryll Holland revealed that the G1 Epsom Derby runner-up could sidestep the Classic, for which he would need to be supplemented for €100,000 at today's five-day stage. "At the moment the going is guite firm over there and his participation is ground dependant," Holland said. "The decision will be made tomorrow and is not going to be taken lightly. If conditions aren't right, he won't run--he did come back a little bit sore from Epsom." The rider added that

the bay colt, who has yet to win a race, has thrived since his Blue Riband run. EMIRATES RACING AUTHORITY PANEL HEARS APPEAL IN BRASS HAT CASE

by Ron Mitchell, courtesy of www.bloodhorse.com A three-member panel of the Emirates Racing Authority on Monday heard the appeal of the connections of Brass Hat over the gelding's disqualification of his second-place finish in this year's G1 Dubai World Cup. During an international teleconference hearing Monday, the major U.S. principals were gathered in the Frankfort, Ky, law office of William Johnson, while the ERA representatives who were half a world away in Dubai. Following the two-hour hearing, in which owner Fred Bradley, trainer Buff Bradley and three veterinarians--Dr. Thomas Eric French, Dr. Tom Tobin and Dr. Doug Berry --addressed the three-member appeals panel, the matter was adjourned until Tuesday, June 27. Johnson represents the Bradleys. At issue is the disgualification of Brass Hat, forfeiture of the \$1.2 million runner-up purse, and a \$5,400 [fine] against trainer Bradley after tests revealed trace amounts of the drug methyl prednisolone acetate.
