The four-year-old is no stranger to the States. Last year, she was fourth in the Oaks, then won Belmont's GI Garden City Breeders' Cup S. in September. The David Wachman trainee will be partnered with Aaron Gryder, who replaces the injured Jose Valdivia, Jr.

"Everyone at our yard is devastated by Mubtaker's death and it will take us time to get over it," he told the Post. "We adored him for his courage, his consistency and his wonderful outlook on life." Mubtaker, who also took three renewals of Newbury's G2 Geoffrey Freer S. between 2002 and 2004, was unable to be saved after suffering multiple fractures to the lower leg on Sheikh Hamdan's Farncombe Down gallops in Lambourn. "I doubt I'll see another similar to Mubtaker during my career," his conditioner added. "He loved racing. We had our greatest high this year with Sir Percy. Now, within a few weeks, we're suffering our worst low." In total, Mubtaker posted a record of 31-13-7-4 with his latest coming at his favored Newbury in the Apr. 22 G3 John Porter S. His career earnings totaled £704,819.

CONCERN OVER GUILD'S HIRING OF NATIONAL MANAGER

The apparent hiring of the team of sports agent Dwight Manley and civil rights activist the Rev. Jesse Jackson as national manager has created uneasiness among some members of the Jockeys' Guild who put their support behind Dave Stevenson, a former rider and consultant with knowledge of the inner workings and politics of the pari-mutuel industry. According to reports, jockeys based in the Eastern region of the country left a two-day Guild senate meeting in Louisville, Ky., early June 26 because of concerns over the direction the organization may be headed. On June 28, Mike Luzzi, a New York-based rider, told The Blood-Horse he had resigned from the Guild senate for personal reasons. Luzzi, who attended part of the Guild meeting June 26, was elected to the interim senate after the Guild fired Matrix Capital Associates, its previous management team, last November, and was re-elected to the senate this year. Matrix was headed by Dr. Wayne Gertmenian. "I resigned for personal reasons," Luzzi said. "It's time-consuming, but [the board] is doing things I didn't agree with. Some of us thought we could have gotten [former national manager] John Giovanni back, or felt that Dave Stevenson was the candidate who should have been hired." For complete story, click here.

"I'd like to see the TRF build on the foundation laid by its previous presidents, Terence Collier and John Stuart, and founder Monique Koehler, and broaden them," Miller said. I want to reach out to all areas of the industry and have a diverse board that represents the entire industry so that we are not just compassionate, but relevant to all areas of the sport. "I'd also like us to be more involved in educational issues so that owners and breeders become more involved in the issues pertinent to retired horses. I want the TRF to be seen as a safety net and not a group that runs what amounts to a large horse pound." Miller, who has served on the TRF's Board of Directors since 2001 and as the president of the Virginia committee, was involved in horse rescue long before he joined the TRF. He currently cares for 10 retirees on his farm in Paeonian Springs, Virginia, including Bowl Game, the 1979 Eclipse Award winner as the nation's outstanding turf horse. Collier, the director of marketing for Fasig-Tipton, served with distinction. Under his leadership, the TRF was able to care for a growing number of retirees and its program expanded to include three additional retirement farms based at correctional facilities. "Terence was a dedicated and innovative president," said TRF Executive Director Diana Pikulski. "It was a pleasure to work with him. In recent years, the TRF has made tremendous progress in its efforts to care for retirees and educate the public and the racing industry about the horrors of horse slaughter, and that would not have been possible without Terence." Founded in 1982, the TRF is the nation's oldest and largest Thoroughbred horse rescue group. The non-profit organization that provides lifetime retirement for hundreds of Thoroughbreds at farms and satellite facilities across the nation and adopts out hundreds of others after retraining them for second careers. The TRF is wholly dependent on public support.

House Re-Election Rates Favor GOP

The GOP currently enjoys a 29-seat margin in the U.S. House of Representatives. To win control, Democrats would need to pick up a net of 15 seats. Election analysts point to a dearth of strong candidates and a House re-election rate of 97 to 99.5 percent as arguments in favor of the GOP retaining control. The Cook Political Report rates about a dozen seats — mostly held by Republicans — as "toss ups" for the November 7 election.

BULLISH LUCK NAMED HK HORSE OF YEAR

Bullish Luck (Royal Academy), winner of the G1 Yasuda Kinen and the Asian Mile Challenge, was named Horse of the Year in Hong Kong at ceremonies held Tuesday evening. The seven-year-old was also crowned champion miler in the SAR for the second consecutive season. Silent Witness (Aus) (El Moxie), winner of the Sprinters' S. in Japan in October, failed to win in four subsequent starts on the season, but was nonetheless annointed champion sprinter for the third consecutive time. Vengeance of Rain (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}) became the first non-European based winner of the World Racing Championship with a popular victory in the G1 Cathay Pacific Hong Kong Cup and took home honors as champion middle distance horse. The Hong Kong Derby put up a rising star on the local scene as Viva Pataca (GB) (Marju {Ire}) stormed to victory in that event as well as the Champions and Chater Cup. The four-year-old, named champion stayer, will be pointed at the International meeting in December for Macau casino mogul Stanley Ho. Floral Pegasus (Aus) (Fusaichi Pegasus) won three of his first four starts and four of nine overall, good enough to be named the champion griffin, or newcomer, horse.
