

### Will State Budget Deadlock Threaten NJ Racing?

The New Jersey state government could shut down as of 12:01 a.m. Saturday if lawmakers cannot come to terms on a budget before the constitutional deadline at midnight, and that could have an impact on racing in the state. Monmouth Park and the Meadowlands are operated by the New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority, an agency of the state. If the deadline is not met, Governor Jon Corzine has threatened a shutdown, and all "non-essential" services will be closed, including the New Jersey Racing Commission. But Chris McErlean, vice president of racing operations for the NJSEA, said yesterday that, as far as he knows, it will be business as usual Saturday no matter what happens with the budget. "We are prepared to race," McErlean said. "I haven't been advised of anything to the contrary. I have been in contact with several people, but no one has been able to give me any direction, and I am taking that to mean we should move ahead as usual. The situation does seem to be changing constantly, so things might be different [Friday], but right here and now, it is full steam ahead [for Monmouth and the Meadowlandsl."

# PATIENT APPROACH PAYS OFF FOR

CENTENNIAL By Steve Sherack

You don't see too many five-year-old first-time starters and when you do, they are normally in need of a

race or two. In recent memory, Alumni Hall was able to buck the trend. He made a winning debut as a five-year-old at the Keeneland spring meeting in 2004 and has gone on to become a multiple graded stakes winner. More than two years later, Centennial Farms' Song for the Best (Unbridled's Song) added his name to that list with

a sharp score at Delaware Park June 19 (video). The gray, who was purchased for \$210,000 as a KEESEP yearling, battled for early command and won under wraps by 9 3/4 lengths, stopping the clock at 1:09 2/5 for six furlongs. He received a 92 Beyer Speed Figure.

"He was training as a two-year-old at Saratoga and he was really doing well," explained Centennial Farms spokesman Patrick Lamberty. "He had his final breeze right before he was going to go in the entries and he fractured his tibia. It was a very major injury. We sent him to our farm in Middleburg, Virginia, and he had a couple of minor setbacks after that. It's been a long process. One of our things is we always give horses time. He showed so much natural ability when he was a two-year-old that we figured we'd take a long-term approach and find a way to get him to the races... patience is something that we try to stress."

Song for the Best exited his debut in fine fashion and is currently in training at Laurel Park with trainer Rodney Jenkins. The Kentucky-bred will start next in a first-level sprint allowance at the beginning of the Saratoga meeting, which kicks off July 26.

Corinthian (Pulpit), who was disqualified from first to third in the GII Fountain of Youth S. last time out Mar. 4 (video), is nearing a return. In the Fountain of Youth, the Centennial colorbearer raced erratically in the stretch, veering in and out before crossing the line one-length clear of First Samurai. The chestnut exited that race with a minor fracture in his left hind ankle.

"He still very much has the same personality that he had--the alpha male racehorse," Lamberty commented. "He's always had the tendency to lay on horses and lug in. But when he drifted out in the stretch in the Fountain of Youth, that was something new for him. We speculated that it might have been him running away from the pain of that injury in his left rear hind. We're just speculating there, nothing to really prove it."

Original plans called for a start in the July 4 GII Dwyer S. for Corinthian, but a recent minor skin rash forced him to miss some training and he will likely not be ready in time. The \$385,000 FTSAUG yearling purchase most recently breezed four furlongs over the Belmont training track in :50 June 21. The summer goal for Corinthian is the Aug. 26 GI Travers S. at Saratoga.

Memphis Mon (Maria's Mon) ran a good second in his Big A unveiling Apr. 22, then earned his diploma by 2 1/4 lengths at Belmont May 20 (video). "He's going to be a nice colt," Lamberty said of the \$375,000 KEEAPR juvenile acquisition. "He missed a race last week with a bit of a minor cough, nothing major, just enough for him to miss the race. We'd like to get a race into him before Saratoga. We knew he'd be a horse that would be a little bit of a late-developing type, but we do think he has a bright future."

Last season, Reverberate (Thunder Gulch) was among

the top three-year-olds in the country, finishing second behind Oratory in the GII Peter Pan S. and also placing second in the GII Jim Dandy S. to Flower Alley. He closed out the season with a well-beaten sixth in the GI Travers S., and resurfaced last week with a fifth-place finish in an optional claimer at Belmont Park June 23.

"He's been battling quarter cracks and he threw the shoe on the foot that had the quarter crack during the race," Lamberty said. "He's a big horse and we think he'll move forward off that race in his next start."

Waiting in the wings to carry the red and tan colors of Centennial Farms are **Forest of Dreams** (Forestry-Desert Angel, by Desert Wine), who was picked up for \$600,000 earlier this year at KEEAPR, and **Emishi Warrior** (Orientate--French Line, by Boundary), a \$400,000 FTSAUG yearling last summer.

"He's a lovely colt," Lamberty said of Forest of Dreams. "He's very professional and has a great mind to him. He's on our farm in Virginia. As is the case when we buy horses from the two-year-old in training sales, we'll give them 30 to 60 days down there and then we'll start over with them. Plans for him are to go to either Jimmy Jerkens or Michael Matz." Forest of Dreams may make his debut at the Belmont fall meeting.

Emishi Warrior is also on the farm in Virginia and is close to shipping to either Jerkens or Matz as well. "He's coming along well," Lamberty said. "He's not as precocious as you think for an Orientate. He's more of a classic-type horse. He's really gotten big, but he's got a good temperament."
