BERRY TO CONTINUE TRAINING

Alan Berry has received the green light to continue training after a ruling by the Horseracing Regulatory



Authority in London vesterday. Berry was one of 11 people charged by the City of London Police Monday, but the HRA's special panel decided a ban on the Lancashire-based trainer would be a "disproportionate" punishment, as the case was not expected to reach court until next year. "This is a very long time over which to suspend a licence and to deprive a man of his livelihood," Sir Michael Connell,

Alan Berry in-focus.co.uk chairman of the HRA's three-man panel, told PA Sport. "If we suspend

Berry's licence we are satisfied that this would put him out of business. We realise, and this is fundamental, that a man is innocent until found guilty. In due course a jury must decide whether this charge against Alan Berry is proved." Jockeys Kieren Fallon, Darren Williams and Fergal Lynch, who are not allowed to ride in Britain under current restrictions, will have their cases heard by the HRA Friday, but Connell stressed the Berry decision did not set a precedent. "The charge [against Berry], if proved, would strike at the heart of racing; suggesting as it does that a trainer has improperly manipulated the outcome of a race," he said. "We observe, however, that the charge, albeit of conspiracy, relates to one race only. This is in contrast to other charges made against other people."

DIONISIA ON THE MOVE

Dionisia (Tejano Run), impressive six-length winner of the June 18 G1 Oaks d'Italia at Milan for trainer Riccardo Menichetti, has been purchased by Teruya Yoshida for an undisclosed sum and will transfer to Luca Cumani's Newmarket barn. "I'm very happy to be working with Mr. Yoshida again," Cumani told PA Sport. "I've seen the filly running in Milan and she was excellent. She looked top class and seems to have no problems in staying. Mr. Yoshida told me she will remain in training next year, so I've plenty of time with her." Italy's champion two-year-old filly last year, Dionisia has won nine of her 14 career starts.

Hoping that lightning might strike twice, owner John Oxley bought Strong Contender--the \$800,000 sales topper at Keeneland April 2005--from consignor Murray Smith. Smith sold Oxley another son of Maria's Mon in 2000, and the colt went on to become 2001 Kentucky Derby hero Monarchos. Strong Contender disappeared after a maiden win going six furlongs at Arlington Park last August, resurfacing to win an allowance test at Gulfstream Feb. 22. The chestnut looked destined to take the Triple Crown trail, but his Derby hopes were dimmed when he failed to draw into the field for the GII Lane's End S. at Turfway in March, and were dashed completely when he faded to be third in the Apr. 15 GI Blue Grass S. Regrouping, John Ward pointed for the May 20 GII Peter Pan S., where he tired late to be third again, then skipped the June 10 GI Belmont S. to await this test. The choice proved profitable. Strong Contender settled off the pace as favored Keyed Entry (Honour and Glory) took them through a half in :46.58. He grabbed the lead after six furlongs in 1:11.84 and opened up to win handily. In 2002, Murmur Farm in Maryland enjoyed a coup when its sire, Our Emblem (who had been moved from Kentucky after a handful of seasons) came up with the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness winner War Emblem. Having hit a home run by selling Our Emblem back to Kentucky at a very significant profit, Murmur Farm went back into the marketplace to purchase another relatively young horse who wasn't doing enough to retain popularity in Kentucky, but who had enough foals in crops to come to give him a shot at getting a significant runner in the next new years.

The farm's pick was Louis Quatorze, who was then standing at Ashford Stud in Versailles. Now it appears that history is somewhat repeating itself as, with his current crop of three-year-olds, Louis Quatorze has come up with Bushfire, who has assumed leadership of the three-year-old filly division with victories in the GI Ashland S., GI Acorn S. and GI Mother Goose S. FROM THE DESK OF... Bill Oppenheim



At the beginning of 2004, just 2 1/2 short years ago, Coolmore had reason to be concerned. Sadler's Wells had just turned 23, and Storm Cat, not theirs but in whom they had bought a big block of breeding rights, was 21. Most worryingly, Danehill, who had emerged as the undoubted successor of Sadler's Wells, had died in a paddock accident at the relatively young age of 17 the previous April. Though they were assured of several more crops to come by each of those veteran stalwarts, it was looking very unclear just what was to come afterwards.


Looking at the accompanying tables, you might say they needn't have worried, but it didn't necessarily look that way at the time. Of course, they had high hopes for their top young prospects, but their 2004 fees reflected the market situation: Fusaichi Pegasus down to \$85,000, Giant's Causeway down to \$75,000 and Montjeu just €30,000. Highly promising, sure; lead-pipe cinches--no way.

There's little doubt now, had Danehill lived into his twenties, he might have rewritten history in the Northern Hemisphere as he did in the south. Though his first foals were born in 1991 and he was an immediate sensation in Australia, as late as 1996 he spent the Northern season in Japan on lease. It was only in 1997 that Coolmore started to breed top mares to him, so it was just six Northern Hemisphere crops, foaled 1998-2003, which saw him transformed from a 2.50 APEX A Runner Index-level sire into one of the World Top Five--his A Runner index at the end of 2005 stood at 4.48. That included his penultimate crop, foaled in 2003. That crop included 11 two-year-old winners by Danehill in Aidan O'Brien's stable alone, among them champions, Classic winners or Group 1 winners George Washington, Rumplestilskin, Horatio Nelson, Aussie Rules and Dylan Thomas.

But, at the beginning of 2004, Coolmore couldn't even be sure that Danehill would be a sire of sires up north, as he was down south; it could all come down to Rock of Gibraltar. In the interim, Danehill Dancer has emerged as a first-rate sire, maybe even a World Top 12 sire (Danehill himself certainly never stopped improving as a sire), and George Washington has emerged as another major prospect in the Rock of Gibraltar class. Just 30 months ago, Coolmore could only be sure of two top sires, both in their 20s: Sadler's Wells and Storm Cat. Now they have six more top sires or major prospects, all but one of them (Fusaichi Pegasus) from one of three major Northern Dancer branches:

That's why these tables showing cumulative Northern Hemisphere progeny earnings (less Japan) for third-crop sires, both in North America and Europe, are so revealing. Of its three big prospects with first foals 2002, Coolmore has the one-two on both sides of the Pond: Giant's Causeway and Fusaichi Pegasus in America, and Montjeu and Giant's Causeway (who stood his first season in Ireland) in Europe. Fusaichi Pegasus isn't an unqualified success, so Coolmore hasn't totally gone three-for-three; but are 2 1/2-for-three, and in Giant's Causeway and Montjeu they have unqualifiedly got the runaway leaders of their generation.

Of course, it's important to remember that we may be looking at one sire list, but it will encompass several tiers of the Thoroughbred market.

The North American third-crop sire list is a case in point. Giant's Causeway and probably Fusaichi Pegasus are top-tier sires, standing for six-figure stud fees. But the next five sires on the list, all now standing in Kentucky (two started in Florida) for \$20,000-\$40,000 fees represent that broad, commercial "September Sale" pedigree, as we used to call it. They are really good sires for the rest of us, those legions of racehorse owners who aren't trying to compete, especially in America, with Coolmore and the Maktoums.

Titan Logic...

The 2006 major sales season kicks off in 12 days' time with Fasig-Tipton's again slimmed-down (relatively speaking, to 477) July Yearling Sale in Lexington, and one of the major questions at the yearling sales this year--especially in Europe, beginning with Deauville--will be whether or not the Maktoums will be buying any Coolmore stallions. With no more Danehill yearlings to come, as his final crop are now two-year-olds, it still seems like shooting yourself in the foot to pass on the yearlings by Giant's Causeway and Montjeu.

But the Maktoums may have formed the conviction that, if Coolmore cannot just survive but flourish, utilizing almost exclusively its own stallions, so can they. A look at the European third-crop sire list highlights the way in which the same principle may be translated into two different approaches. Coolmore will no doubt continue to focus its energies on a very small group of established, or potential, World Top 12 stallions: Giant's Causeway, Montjeu, Danehill Dancer, George Washington, possibly Fusaichi Pegasus and either Rock of Gibraltar and/or Johannesburg, should either make a top freshman sire. Probably two-thirds of the horses who go into training at Ballydoyle will be by these sires, or their great predecessors Storm Cat, Sadler's Wells, and, for the last time in 2006, Danehill.

The Maktoums will probably take a different tack, using a far wider variety of stallions. In America, several of the World Top 12 are controlled by neither of the Titans. The Maktoums had '06 U.S. Classic winners by "outside" stallions A.P. Indy and Seeking the Gold.

The operation has also enjoyed success with bloodlines from other parts of the world with Candy Stripes (Invasor), with up-and-coming American stallions like Songandaprayer (Songster), and with a top son of Coolmore stallion Hennessy (Henny Hughes).

In addition, they, as well as Coolmore, also use Storm Cat and Kingmambo quite a lot. The Maktoums' best sire in America is Elusive Quality and, if we had Betfair for sire rankings, I would bet heavily that he will be Leading Sire in North America one day. In Europe, the Maktoums control many more "second-tier" sires. The European third-crop list shows quite a few examples: European number three King's Best (Kingmambo), who had runners place in both the French and Irish Derbies; and Europe's number four, Xaar, is beginning to look like a quite useful son of Zafonic. They are good examples of the kind of sires the Maktoums could easily be sending 30 mares a year to every season. In fact, you could make a list of 15 or 20 of those sires and, if you just sent 30 mares to each, you would have mates for around 500 mares; but that's a list for another day.

only defeats coming in her two-year-old debut, in a sloppy renewal of the GII Davona Dale S. and when third to upset winner Lemons Forever in the GI Kentucky Oaks.

Louis Quatorze himself was a horse with an intriguing pedigree. By the Northern Dancer horse Sovereign Dancer out of a mare by On to Glory, he has the three-parts brother and sister, Bold Princess (dam of Sovereign Dancer) and Bold Lad (sire of On to Glory) 2x3 in his pedigree. The promise of the pedi-

gree was quickly fulfilled on the racetrack and, at two, Louis Quatorze won a maiden event and took second in the GI Hopeful and GI Futurity from four starts. He was even better at three, when he captured the GI Preakness and GII Jim Dandy. He was also beaten just inches by Alphabet Soup in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, with Cigar back in third, and took second in the GI Travers and GII Blue Grass and third in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup.

Louis Quatorze started his four-year-old season as if he might be better than ever, his first two starts resulting in wins in the GIII Creme Fraiche H. and GIII Ben Ali S., which he took by 13 lengths. Unfortunately, he then suffered an injury, and the Ben Ali proved to be his farewell.

Louis Quatorze has not been a prolific stallion, with 11 stakes winners in his first five Northern Hemisphere crops, but the quality of his best runners has been pretty high. In addition to Bushfire, they include Repent, a four-time graded-stakes winner who also took second in the GI Travers and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile; millionaire Choctaw Nation; and Second of June, who looked a potential classic horse when taking the GIII Holy Bull S., but whose subsequent career has been hit by injury. Louis Quatorze has also sired 13 stakes winners, several graded, from four South American crops.

Bushfire is the fourth stakes winner produced by her dam, Traki Traki, a daughter of the relatively obscure sire Mo Power (by Bold Native, a Raise a Native horse bred on a similar pattern to Mr. Prospector). Winner of the Old Hat S. at Gulfstream Park, Traki Traki is also dam of the Suffolk Downs stakes winners Frosty's Girl and Frosty's On Track, both daughters of Frosty the Snowman, and of Skip Trial's son, Maracaibo, a stakes winner at Delaware Park.

Prior to Traki Traki and her offspring, one has to go back to Bushfire's fourth dam, Quality Belle, to find the most recent stakes winner in the family, this being Mr. Clyde, a winner of the Rio Grande Futurity and Rio Grande S.

We earlier mentioned that Louis Quatorze was inbred to the three-quarters relatives Bold Princess and Bold Lad, one a daughter of the great mare, Grey Flight, and the other a granddaughter. Louis Quatorze is also inbred to Native Dancer, whose third dam, La Chica, just happens to be the granddam of Grey Flight. Bushfire adds to this, as her broodmare sire, Mo Power, is a great-grandson of Native Dancer. What's more, Mo Power is inbred 4x3 to Native Dancer's sire, Polynesian, and also has Some Pomp, a three-quarters relative to Polynesian's dam, in the third generation of the pedigree.

MONMOUTH CLOSED TIL NJ BUDGET WOES

SOLVED The gates at Monmouth Park and the Meadowlands closed at the end the business day yesterday, and it is likely they will remain closed until an agreement is reached on the New Jersey state budget. "We don't plan to resume racing or simulcasting until the budget is resolved," said Bob Kulina, vice president and general manager of Monmouth Park. "Monmouth is dark [today], but we did have simulcasting scheduled, and the Meadowlands has a live card [tonight]. Like a lot of other people, we are just waiting to see what happens. As soon as the situation is settled, we will proceed with our normal operations." The New Jersey Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association and the Standardbred Breeders and Owners Association were able to get a temporary injunction that allowed the tracks to remain open through the July 4 holiday, but that stay ended at midnight last night, and the horsemen's groups have no plans to seek further relief from the courts. "Their intention was always to fulfilL the obligation of the cards that had been drawn before the government shutdown was ordered, and the judge issued the stay based on that," Kulina said. "But, hopefully something will be resolved soon."



TARGET ON TARGET Royal Ascot hero Takeover Target (Aus) (Celtic Swing {GB}) and fellow antipodeans Falkirk (NZ) (Tale of the Cat) and Glamour Puss (NZ) (Tale of the Cat) all remain on target for the £360,000 G1 Darley July Cup at Newmarket July 14, according to connections. Ben Janiak, assistant trainer to father Joe, is looking forward to Takeover Target's bid to become the first Australian-trained horse to win Europe's richest sprint and explained, "Takeover Target worked on the Al Bahathri gallop [Tuesday] morning. He worked over 1,000 meters and he ran up the last 600. The horse felt good and he's on track for the July Cup. We'll take him over to the course on Thursday morning to give him a look at the track and he'll only do a bit of three-quarter work, but I'll try and get him two looks at the track before race-day." The seven-year-old gelding won the G2 King's Stand S. at Royal Ascot June 20, but failed in his bid to emulate countrymate Choisir (Aus) when running third in the G1 Golden Jubilee S. four days later. "The King's Stand was a good run, but we thought he was a little bit under-done going into it, so he had a gut buster then and gave everything he had, which meant he was a little bit flat for the Golden Jubilee, and I believe that's why he didn't win," Janiak continued. "It was still a good effort in the Golden Jubilee. Jay [Ford] got off him and said he was gone probably 200 meters from the post but he just stuck to his guns and plugged away and ran a nice third. The Australian horses have thrived in the conditions over here, so we might even stay for the [G1] Nunthorpe at York [Aug. 24], but we're not sure yet." Falkirk, fourth in the King's Stand, is set to exercise at the track Saturday morning and Clinton Youngson, representing trainer Lee Freedman, said, "Falkirk's doing well at the moment and is working nicely. He'll probably do a bit more on the Limekilns on Thursday and then we'll give him a look at the track on Saturday. He's enjoying the weather at the moment, it's more like back home. He ran a good race in the King's Stand but he's much better over six furlongs. He would have a big chance so long as the track is not too hard, that would be our main worry." Of King's Stand seventh Glamour Puss, trainer Danny O'Brien said: "She's fit and well. She'll have a gallop on Saturday morning and if I'm happy with her work she'll go to the July Cup and then we'll head home. Quick ground wouldn't be a problem for her."
